Dan Bauer went 9-for-15, a .600 batting average, in the four-game sweep of Northern State in a nonconference series at the H.H.H. Metrodome Sunday (10-2, 17-4) and Monday (4-2, 4-3 (8)). Two of those nine hits were game-winners, both coming in Monday's doubleheader with the game tied, two outs and in the late innings (bottom 6th in game one and top 8th in game two). He had a team-high in hits and tied a team-high in RBI in the four games with seven. Bauer added three runs, hit his first home run of the season and recorded a double. He stole one base, recorded 11 assists and six putouts playing second base, going all four games without an error. He recorded at least one hit and one RBI in each contest, going a perfect 3-for-3 in the second game of Sunday's doubleheader, adding three RBI and two runs scored.

AUGUSTANA COLLEGE

Derek Hansen (6-2, 195, Fr., Infielder / RHP, Fergus Falls, Minn.) helped the Vikings to three wins this season in the MetroDome. After pitching game one with Morningside, Hansen was 3 for 3 in game two, with two RBI and a stolen base. He kept up his efficiency at the plate, going 2 of 4 in the first game with Nebraska-Kearney with two RBI. In game two with the Lopers, Hansen was 1 of 3 with two more RBI. For the weekend he had a .545 average, going 6 of 11 from the plate and collecting six RBI.

Per Nestigen (6-6, 230, Sr., RHP, Minneapolis, Minn.) got his first start and first win of the season against Nebraska-Kearney this weekend, helping the Vikings to an 8-2 win. He went five innings, only allowing one earned run on three hits. Nestigen faced 17 batters and struck out five.

BEMIDJI STATE

#27 Dan Bauer (Jr., MIF/RHP, 6-0, 190, R/R, Bemidji, Minn., University of North Dakota) went 9-for-15, a .600 batting average, in the four-game sweep of Northern State in a nonconference series at the H.H.H. Metrodome Sunday (10-2, 17-4) and Monday (4-2, 4-3 (8)). Two of those nine hits were game-winners, both coming in Monday's doubleheader with the game tied, two outs and in the late innings (bottom 6th in game one and top 8th in game two). He had a team-high in hits and tied a team-high in RBI in the four games with seven. Bauer added three runs, hit his first home run of the season and recorded a double. He stole one base, recorded 11 assists and six putouts playing second base, going all four games without an error. He recorded at least one hit and one RBI in each contest, going a perfect 3-for-3 in the second game of Sunday's doubleheader, adding three RBI and two runs scored.

#15 Ethan Branum (So., LHP, 6-0, 175, R/L, Brainerd, Minn., Brainerd HS) made two appearances, pitching 3.1 shut-out innings in a four-game sweep of Northern State in a nonconference series at the H.H.H. Metrodome Sunday (10-2, 17-4) and Monday (4-2, 4-3 (8)). He allowed just two hits and struck out five batters without giving-up a walk. He earned the win in the 4-3 victory, pitching the final 2.2 innings, allowing two hits and fanning four batters. The win moves the Branum to 2-1 on the season and improves his ERA to 1.35.

CONCORDIA-ST. PAUL

Senior Brenden Furrow (Johnston, Iowa) was clutch for Concordia last week, hitting a walk-off solo home run to left center in the eighth inning against region-contender Nebraska-Kearney at the Metrodome, a part of the stadium that is at least 365 feet for a homer. He led Concordia in slugging pct. in three games with a .571 mark in 14 at bats, hitting .286 at the plate. His three RBI included a double, home run and base hit. More importantly, his glove work aided the Golden Bears. As the most experienced player on a very young team, Furrow moved from his regular right field position to the hot corner for Sunday mornings games against UNK. Although he committed an error in the first game, he bounced back for a solid second game getting CU out of a 1st and 3rd with no outs jam, taking a grounder to get the first out at home before another grounder bounced his way as he stepped on third and rifled a throw to first for an inning ending double-play.

Junior right hander Nick Anderson (Plymouth, Minn.) appeared in all three of Concordia's games, working eight innings with seven strikeouts and a 2.25 earned run average. Anderson posted a 1-1 record, taking the loss in the 12th inning against St. Cloud State after pitching

five shutout innings from the seventh through 11th innings before surrendering a walk-off two run home run. He rebounded on Monday by pitching two shutout innings to earn the relief win against Nebraska-Kearney out of the bullpen, again working into extra innings as he polished off the seventh and eighth innings and was called upon again in game two for another shutout inning. He struck out a batter in all three appearances with five against the Huskies. He only allowed six hits between the three outings and eight innings. It was his 10th career victory on the mound

Junior slugger Blake DeVries (Eden Prairie, Minn.) hit a pair of home runs in Concordia's 12 inning 9-8 loss to St. Cloud State last week. DeVries' two home runs were among the farthest hit by an amateur at Metrodome and were both clutch. In the seventh, he capped a six run inning with a game-tying three run shot to right center (opposite field) and in the 12th inning he led off with a go-ahead solo shot to dead center. He has three hits on the season, and all are either tying or go-ahead home runs. Concordia was without their slugger on Sunday morning as he was married on Saturday, February 20. The NSIC and the Concordia athletic department congratulate Blake and Nikki DeVries on their marriage!

All five of Concordia's games have been decided by one run with two extra inning games. In addition, Concordia and St. Cloud State had a game suspended with Concordia leading 1-0 and coming up to bat in the bottom of the fourth inning. The game will be resumed later in the season and could be a sixth one-run decision.

UNIVERSITY OF MARY

Poor weather conditions prevented the Marauders from opening their season at Mesa State last weekend, U-Mary prepares to take to the field with ten games in Winter Haven, FL, on February 28-March 6. First up is a double-header with Findlay.

NORTHERN STATE

#8 Lucas Jung (Jr., P/O, R/R, 6-0, 175, Aberdeen, S.D. / Central HS) had a healthy .667 batting average for the Wolves in their 0-4 week while playing in three games. He slugged a healthy .889 while going 6-9 at the plate with two doubles, two RBI, and a run scored. In Monday's 4-2 loss to Bemidji State, Jung finished 3-3 with a two-RBI double. Jung also pitched all eight innings for Northern State in Monday's 4-3 loss to Bemidji State. The junior allowed four runs (all earned) on ten hits while striking out one Beaver batter.

SOUTHWEST MINNESOTA STATE

The Mustangs are idle until March 7th when they take on Concordia-St. Paul at the RussMatt Baseball Invitational in Winterhaven, Fla.

ST. CLOUD STATE

Nick Anderson (RHP, So., Brainerd, Minn.) helped guide the Huskies to a 3-2 victory over Winona State at the Metrodome on Feb. 21. Anderson posted a complete game victory which included nine strikeouts, six hits allowed, two earned runs allowed and just one walk in the game. Anderson retired the side in order in the top of the seventh inning, to ice the game, after SCSU scored two runs in the bottom of the 6th to earn the go ahead runs...Anderson is now 2-0 with 15 strikeouts and a 2.08 ERA this season.

As a team, SCSU is now 5-1 on the season, which includes a split against Winona State on Feb. 21 at the Dome...Tyler Horning leads the club with a .500 batting rate (seven hits), while Jordan Smith is batting .450 with nine hits and five RBIs.

UPPER IOWA

The Upper Iowa Peacock baseball team opened the 2010 season Thursday night by visiting Metrodome in Minneapolis, Minn. for a non-conference doubleheader against Wayne State. WSC jumped out to early leads in both games and swept the twinbill, 6-1 and 3-1. Senior Lucas Wilsing threw three complete innings in the opener. Wilsing allowed four hits and two earned runs while striking out three Wildcats. Offensively, UIU was held to just three hits and one unearned run. Wayne State picked up right where they left off in the second game as they held a 3-0 advantage through the top half of the seventh. Upper Iowa inched closer in the bottom of the seventh when a Rory Kolo single to left field scored Ryan Brown from third to cut the deficit to 3-1. Unfortunately, the Peacocks would not complete the comeback losing by two runs. Sophomore hurler Matt Treybig gave up three hits and three runs, all earned, while striking out six batters in four innings of work. Relievers Josh McKeon and Chris Wlezien combined to shut the Wildcat offense down in the final three innings, allowing just a pair of hits between the two of them. Upper Iowa will be in action again on Saturday and Sunday, Feb. 27-28, when they travel to Rolla, Missouri for a three-game series with the Miners of Missouri S&T.

WAYNE STATE

Wayne State swept a non-conference doubleheader over Upper Iowa at the Metrodome on Thursday, February 18th by scores of 6-1 and 3-1.

In the first game, senior catcher John Plasha was 3 for 3 with a double and two RBI's while freshman third baseman Jerad Barth contributed a two-run triple in the win. Sophomore pitcher Austen Wisroth was solid on the mound, pitching two-hit ball over six innings allowing an unearned run with seven strikeouts. The second game saw three Wildcat pitchers combine for nine strikeouts while holding the Peacocks scoreless until the bottom of the seventh inning in a 3-1 win. Treye Hacker hit a solo homer while Justin Beranek added an RBI double for key WSC hits in the game. Sophomore Tom Doran worked 4 1/3 innings, allowing five hits and no runs to earn the win. Relievers Tadd Johansen and Eric Dye combined for six strikeouts in the final 2 2/3 innings to preserve the win.

WINONA STATE

Winona State University opened its season with a split of a non-conference doubleheader against St. Cloud State. Joe Kley (OF, Sr., Lester Prairie, Minn.) compiled a .667 batting average against the Huskies by going four-for-six with a double and a run batted in. He also had an .833 slugging percentage, .667 on base percentage and was perfect in the three total chances he had.

Ross Hellenbrand (P, Sr., Middleton, Wis.) pitched five innings of shutout ball in WSU's 6-1 win over the Huskies. He finished with two strikeouts and one walk, while allowing four hits.
