U.S. HOCKEY HALL OF FAME FACE OFF CLASSIC

LAST TIME OUT

After a program-best weekend at Wisconsin, Bemidji State was swept on the road by Ohio State. On Friday, the Buckeyes scored four goals in the first 9:01 of the second period to go on to a 4-1 win. On Saturday, the Buckeyes tallied three power-play markers in the first period and added five more goals in the second and two more in the third to cruise to a 10-1 win. The ten-goal outburst was the most-ever in a game between Ohio State and BSU and capped OSU's first sweep of the Beavers since Oct. 24-25, 2008. For BSU, sophomore Natasha Kostenko scored both goals and senior Emily Erickson assisted on each marker. MacKenzie Thurston and Tess Dusik also picked up assists. Both Abby Ryplanski and Jessica Havel saw time between the pipes in each game.

BSU vs. MINNESOTA WHITECAPS

The Beavers last played the Whitecaps on Oct. 22-23, 2010. The Whitecaps won the first game 3-1 and BSU came back the next day with a 5-1 victory. Their lone meeting in the preseason a year prior was cancelled.

ABOUT THE WHITECAPS

The Minnesota Whitecaps are one of two members of the Western Women's Hockey League and their roster consists of many accomplished former NCAA Division I players. Among those players are former Beavers Jenny Schnickel and Erin Cody (reserve). BSU assistant coach Amber Fryklund and equipment manager Andrea Nichols both spent time with the Whitecaps after their college hockey days were done. The Whitecaps began their season with a pair of exhibition games at Minnesota Duluth. UMD scored the first three goals in each game and staved off Whitecaps rallies to win 5-3 and 5-2.

HEAD COACH STEVE SERTICH



Steve Sertich is now in his seventh season as head coach of the Bemidji State women's hockey program. Sertich has helped propel the program to heights never seen before. In 2011-12, the team achieved a national ranking for the first time ever, reaching as high as No. 7 and won a program record 17 games. The team's 11 conference wins last

season were also a Bemidji State best.

At the conclusion of the 2010-11 season, the team finished in sole possession of fifth place in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association, the highest finish in team history. The same season saw the Beavers open their new home, the Sanford Center, and claim the best home winning record in program history at 9-5-2. The Beavers also captured their first-ever wins over a top-ranked team, a 5-3 win over then-No. 1 Mercyhurst Oct. 16, 2010, and their first-ever win over Minnesota Duluth, a 1-0 win Nov. 5, 2011.

In the spring on 2010, Sertich was inducted into the Minnesota High School Hockey Coaches Hall of Fame. The honor, which is bestowed by the Minnesota Hockey Coaches Association, is given to coaches that have outstanding contributions to the sport of hockey in the state of Minnesota.

Sertich has coached two Olympians while at Bemidji State: Nina Ziegenhals who played for Team Germany in the 2002 Winter Olympics in Salt Lake City, and Zuzana Tomickova who played for Team Slovakia in the 2010 Winter Olympics in Vancouver.

During summer of 2008, Sertich served as an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's Under-22 Select team that played in the annual three-game Women's Under-22 Series with Canada, which took place from Aug. 20-23.

Sertich was a member of the U.S. National Team from 1973-75 He was also a member of the 1976 U.S. Olympic team, which finished fifth at the Innsbruck, Austria games. The U.S. team recorded wins over Finland and Poland en route to a 2-3 finish in Group A.

He also played two years in the German Professional League, spending the 1974-75 season as captain for Fussen and two seasons from 1978-80 playing for Nurnburg.

Sertich is a 1974 graduate of Colorado College with a bachelor's degree in elementary education and humanities. He received a master's degree in elementary education from Minnesota State in 1999.

NOTEBOOK

U.S. HOCKEY HALL OF FAME GAME

BSU will be playing in its fourth-ever Hall of Fame Game Face Off Classic in Eveleth, Minn. on Thursday. It will be the Beavers' lone exhibition contest of the season and will be their only competition until Maine visits on Nov. 9-10. The Beavers lost 9-0 to then-No. 1 Wisconsin in their first Hall of Fame Game on Oct. 18, 2008, dropped a 3-1 decision against the Minnesota Whitecaps on Oct. 22, 2010, and routed Lindenwood 11-0 in their third game in Eveleth on Nov. 10, 2011. BSU Head coach Steve Sertich is currently the Vice President of the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame.

SCORING STREAKS

The Beavers didn't do much scoring at Ohio State, but on the weekend, Natasha Kostenko scored twice, becoming the first BSU player to score twice this season and the first to score in back-to-back games. Emily Erickson, who assisted on both goals, now has a three-game point streak. Erickson is the second Beaver to accomplish that feat this season after Whitney Wivoda opened 2012-13 with points in each of her first three games.

ON THE BOARD

Also recording points on the weekend were MacKenzie Thurston and Tess Dusik. Thurston's point on Friday was her team-leading fifth of the season, while Dusik's on Saturday was her first.

NO SOPHOMORE SLUMP OR SENIORITIS

BSU's seven-member sophomore class has scored 63.6 percent of the team's goals (seven of 11) in 2012-13. No other class has more than two. The senior class, which also includes seven players and is headed by leading-scorer MacKenzie Thurston, leads the team with 11 total points.

SETTLE IN

After traveling to Providence, Wisconsin, and Ohio State, its three longest trips of the season, Bemidji State will play at home in four out of its remaining five series before Winter Break. The Beavers will only leave the state of Minnesota one more time in the regular season, when they head to North Dakota in February.

AGAINST OHIO STATE

After losing both games to Ohio State last weekend, Bemidji State dropped to 17-29-10 all-time against the Buckeyes. The Beavers are also now just 6-18-4 in 28 games in Columbus and are winless against OSU in the month of October at 0-7-3.

WITHOUT WIVODA

Sophomore Whitney Wivoda has missed the last three games and the Beavers have missed her, going 0-2-1 without the Fairbanks, Alaska native in the lineup. Wivoda was the team's leading scorer prior to being injured in BSU's 1-0 win over Wisconsin on Oct. 19.

SCORING FIRST

Getting the game's first goal can go a long way and BSU has only done that twice this season. The Beavers earned a win and a tie against Wisconsin and got the game's first goal in both contests. After erasing a 2-0 deficit to win against Providence in its season opener, BSU has lost five straight games in which it has conceded the first goal.

NEW MONTH

Bemidji State finished October with a 2-5-1 record and is still seeking its first home win.
