Key notes to consider

► The women's hockey team finishes the regular season with a road trip to Bemidji State this weekend, Feb. 22-23. Friday's game will be played at 7 p.m., while Saturday's will begin at 4 p.m.

► Brianna Decker leads the nation with 203 shots on goal and is eighth with 25 goals scored.

► Decker is one point shy of tying Meghan Duggan for second-most career points at Wisconsin (238).

► Coach Johnson needs one more win to record his 300th career win.

► Since opening LaBahn Arena, the Badgers have posted a 12-3-1 (.781) record at home.

Postseason picture

► With the weekend sweep, the Badgers will host the first round of WCHA playoffs, March 1-3. Wisconsin's opponent for the best-of-three series will be determined following the conclusion of this weekend's games, but will be one of the three: Minnesota State, St. Cloud State or Bemidji State.

► Tickets for the first two games of the series will go on sale Tuesday. If a third game is needed, tickets will be made available following the second game of the series.

► For Wisconsin to finish in second place in the WCHA, Minnesota Duluth needs to claim at least two points from its series with North Dakota this weekend. In addition, the Badgers need to finish its series with Bemidji State claiming at least two points more than what UND gets from its series from UMD.

► The weekend sweep of UMD also moved Wisconsin up to eighth in the PairWise, the closest attempt to mimic the method used to determine participants for the NCAA tournament.

Last time out

► The Badgers secured at least a third-place finish in the WCHA after sweeping Minnesota Duluth last weekend, Feb. 16-17. Wisconsin scored three power-play goals, with Madison Packer scoring two and assisting on one, to down the Bulldogs 3-1. In the second outing, the Badgers came back from a 2-1 deficit in the third period, with Brianna Decker scoring the game-winner in overtime.

► In a game riddled with penalties, the Badgers went 3-for-9 on the power play, scoring one power-play goal in each period of the first game against UMD. Alev Kelter scored the first goal and Madison Packer tallied the final two. Minnesota Duluth scored in the final minutes of regulation, but it was too-little too-late as the Badgers held on for the 3-1 win.

► The second game of the series served as senior day for the Badgers, and Brianna Decker made sure her last regular-season home game was one to remember. Decker opened the scoring in the second period, but the Bulldogs responded with two goals giving them their first lead of the weekend. Blayre Turnbull then scored off a turnover in front of the UMD net with less than six minutes left in regulation to force overtime. Decker then secured the sweep scoring an unassisted goal off of an offensive-zone face off.

Wisconsin vs Bemidji State

► Wisconsin owns a 49-4-3 overall record against Bemidji State. The Beavers have been the Badgers' opponents in three of the most historic regular-season games for UW: The Camp Randall Hockey Classic (Feb. 6, 2010), Fill The Bowl (Jan. 28, 2012) and the first game in LaBahn Arena (Oct. 19, 2012).

► Earlier this season, the Badgers hosted Bemidji State during the opening weekend of LaBahn Arena. BSU spoiled the occasion as the Badgers struggled to get it's offense going and suffered a 1-0 defeat, Oct. 19. Wisconsin rebounded in the next game, Oct. 21, to take a 3-2 lead in the third period, but Bemidji State scored with an extra attacker to force an eventual 3-3 tie. Wisconsin scored with it's first two shooters to win the shootout in two rounds.

► Bemidji State enters the weekend after falling to No. 1 Minnesota 8-0 on Feb. 15 and 3-2 in overtime on Feb. 16. The Beavers were the first team to take the top-ranked Gophers into overtime this season, and ended their streak of multi-goal wins at 35 games.

Johnson's milestones

► Coach Johnson recorded his 200th WCHA victory on Feb. 9, as the Badgers downed St. Cloud State, 5-1. He is also one win shy of recording his 300th overall win.

Don't look back

► Wisconsin has scored the first goal of a game 16 times this season and has gone undefeated (16-0-0) in those games when taking the lead first.

Coming through clutch

► The Badgers are undefeated (8-0-6) in their last 14 games that have gone into overtime. So far this season, the Badgers have played in three overtime games, winning one (Feb. 17 vs UMD) and tying two (Sept. 28 vs MSU, Oct. 21 vs BSU).

Badgers in the new barn

► Wisconsin has swept two nationally ranked opponents in LaBahn Arena: No. 8 North Dakota (Dec. 8-9) and No. 9 Ohio State (Jan. 11-12).

► Brianna Decker has scored a total of 17 goals at LaBahn Arena, including the first on Oct. 21 at the 13:56 mark of the second period.

► Wisconsin currently owns the best average home attendance in the nation with 1,851 fans per game.

Rigsby, what a champ!

► Rigsby is currently third in the nation in minutes played with 1798:03, but ranks first in percentage played (99.2). She is seventh in the nation with 741 saves.

► Her five shutouts this season is tied for third-most in the nation. She is also tied for eighth all-time in NCAA history with 21 career shutouts.

► With 2415 career saves, Rigsby surpassed Jessie Vetter for second-place at UW for career saves. Jackie MacMillan holds the record with 2527 saves.

► She recorded a season-high 37 saves against Minnesota on Dec. 1. She followed up her performance with 36 saves the following night, for a total of 73 saves on the weekend against Minnesota. Rigsby's .936 save percentage against Minnesota during the Dec. 1-2 series, ranks as the highest percentage the Gophers have faced all season.

► She recorded a career-long shutout streak spanning 214:20 minutes. The streak started on Oct. 26 and lasted until Nov. 16.

Climbing the ranks

► Brianna Decker keeps climbing in the record book at Wisconsin. In her career, the senior has 237 points from 111 goals and 126 assists.

► Decker needs two more points to surpass Meghan Duggan for second-most at Wisconsin.

► In the NCAA Division I women's hockey record book, Decker currently ranks ninth for career points (237), eighth in career goals (109) and 16th in assists (124).

Triple-deke

► The Badgers lead the nation having scored two penalty-shot goals this season.

Shoot the puck

► With 1029 total shots on goal so far this season, the Badgers are averaging 34 shots on goal per game, sixth most in the nation.

Offensive defensemen

► The Wisconsin defensemen are currently 10th in the nation for most points (70), having contributed 26 goals and 44 assists. Freshman Courtney Burke leads the UW defensive corps with four goals and 17 assists.

Weekly Winners

► Three Badgers have been named WCHA Player of the Week five times honors this season.

► Courtney Burke garnered her first weekly-honor of her career, being named the WCHA's Rookie of the Week on Jan. 16. With three assists on the weekend, Burke helped the Badgers sweep No. 9 Ohio State on Jan. 11-12. Two assists came on the power play, while the third was short-handed.

► Earning her third weekly award this season, Rigsby was named the WCHA's Defensive Player of the Week on Dec. 12 for her efforts against North Dakota on Dec. 8-9. The junior netminder made 59 of 62 saves over the weekend, conceding only one even-strength goal, as the Badgers claimed the weekend sweep.

► After recording seven points off of four goals and three assists, and scoring her 100th career goal, Brianna Decker was named Offensive Player of the Week on Nov. 28. Decker scored two goals in both games against St. Cloud State, Nov. 23-24, while also adding one assist in the first game and two on the following day.

► Rigsby was named Defensive Player of the Week for a second time after posting back-to-back shutouts against Minnesota State on Nov. 2-3. On the weekend, Rigsby made a total of 36 saves, extending her shutout streak to 189:29 minutes.

► Backstopping the Badgers to their first win, sweep and shutout in LaBahn Arena, Rigsby was named Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 31 for her efforts against New Hampshire. Rigsby made a total of 50 saves on the weekend (Oct. 26/28), while only conceding one goal to UNH.

Century Club

► Brianna Decker became just the third Badger in program history to score 100 career goals, doing so with her second goal of the game against St. Cloud State on Nov. 23. The previous two Badgers to break the century mark for goals were Hilary Knight (143) and Meghan Duggan (108).

► Decker was the 15th player in NCAA history to record 100 goals.

200-point plateau

► Brianna Decker became the fifth Badger to reach 200 career points. She joins the company of UW greats, Hilary Knight (262), Meghan Duggan (238), Sara Bauer (218) and Brooke Ammerman (215).

► Decker reached 200 points in just 112 games, marking the faster Badger to reach the milestone. Knight was the previous record holder, reaching 200 points in 120 games. Duggan reached 200 points in 141 games, Bauer in 142 and Ammerman in 145.

► Decker was the 17th player in NCAA history to record 200 points.

Tip of the hat

► Two hat tricks have been recorded by two Badgers so far this season.

► Brianna Decker recorded the first hat trick of the season for Wisconsin. Her eighth career hat trick came in the 7-2 win over Lindenwood on Oct. 5. One of her three goals included a goal off a penalty shot.

► Alev Kelter tallied the second hat trick for the Badgers, one day after Decker's, in the 9-1 win over Lindenwood on Oct. 6. The senior's first-career hat trick included two unassisted goals.

Shootout snipers

► The Badgers have scored on every shootout attempt so far this season. Brianna Decker and Madison Packer have two shootout goals apiece and Brittany Ammerman has one, as Wisconsin has five goals in a total of five shootout rounds this season. Wisconsin is 2-0 in shootouts, beating Minnesota State, 3-2, in three rounds on Sept. 28 and downing Bemidji State, 2-0, in two rounds on Oct. 21.

Starting on the road

► The six-games to start the 2012-13 season is the longest stretch without a home game to start a season in program history. The Badgers have only opened the season on the road twice before, 2001-02 & 2007-08, but have had home games within the first two weeks of the season's beginning since the program started in 1999-2000.

Future Badgers

► The Badgers signed five student-athletes to National Letters of Intent. Melissa Channell (Oakville, Ontario), Sydney McKibbin (Oakville, Ontario), Sarah Nurse (Hamilton, Ontario), Annie Pankowski (Laguna Hills, Calif.), and Jenny Ryan (Victor, N.Y.) plan to attend the University of Wisconsin and play hockey for the Badgers beginning in the 2013-14 season.

Four Nations Cup Standouts

► Former Badger Hilary Knight led all players at the 2012 Four Nations Cup with six goals, scoring four in the round-robin game against Finland and one on the power play against Canada in the gold-medal game. Brianna Decker was second among the tournament's goal scorers with five goals, having also scored four in the game against Finland.

► The tournament was also a huge success for Badger goaltending. Alex Rigsby earned her first start, win and shutout as a member of the senior women's national team in the opening game against Sweden. Former netminder Jessie Vetter earned a win in the 15-1 blowout against Finland in the prelims, before leading Team USA to a 26-save shutout against Canada in the gold-medal game.

Hockey Canada notebook

► Two Badgers were invited to attend the Canadian women's under-22 camp this summer. Defenders Saige Pacholok and Katarina Zgraja skated in Calgary, Alberta for the camp, while assistant coach Jackie Friesen was asked to help coach the camp.

► Former Badgers Meaghan Mikkelson, Bobbi-Jo Slusar and Carlyne Prévost were among 40 players invited to at Canada's National Women's Team September Camp/Fall Festival in Calgary, Alberta, Sept. 22-29.

► During the fall camp, Meghan Mikkelson tallied the shootout-winning goal for Team White against the Midget AAA Red Deer Chiefs on Sept. 26. Slusar scored the second goal for Team White on Sept. 27 against the Midget AAA Calgary Flames. Prévost tallied a goal in a shootout on Sept. 29 in the intrasquad game for Team Red.

► Meaghan Mikkelson and Bobbi-Jo Slusar were part of the silver-medal winning team at the 2012 Four Nations Cup in Finland. Both former Badgers played all four games on the blue line.

► Former Badger Carlyne Prévost won gold with the Canadian Women's U-22 team that participated in the 2013 Meco Cup in Germany, Jan. 2-6.

► Future Badgers Sydney McKibbin and Sarah Nurse won gold with the Canadian Women's U-18 team that participated in the 2013 IIHF World Championship. Canada used a 2-1 overtime win against the U.S. to claim the gold medal.

► Five Badgers, two current and three former, won gold with Team USA at the 2012 Four Nations Cup in Finland. Brianna Decker and Alex Rigsby were the two current Badgers, while Meghan Duggan, Hilary Knight and Jessie Vetter were also on the squad.

► Current Badgers Courtney Burke, Brianna Decker and Alex Rigsby, along with Hilary Knight and Jessie Vetter, were invited to the U.S. senior women's national team's winter training camp, which was held Dec. 27-31 in Blaine, Minn. It was the first winter training camp for Burke, who was also the camps youngest participant.

► Future Badger Jenny Ryan took home silver with the U.S. Women's U-18 team that participated in the 2013 IIHF World Championships. Team USA lost a 2-1 decision in overtime to Canada.

HEAD COACH MARK JOHNSON

With strong ties to Wisconsin hockey as a coach's son, player and assistant coach, Johnson stepped into the role of head women's hockey coach beginning with the 2002-03 season. In nine seasons, Johnson and the Badgers have shattered both school and national records.

Johnson has established Wisconsin's rank among the elite in college women's hockey. Under his direction, Wisconsin has compiled four NCAA titles, four Western Collegiate Hockey Association playoff titles and three WCHA regular season crowns. Johnson and the Badgers were the first team ever to land in the NCAA championship game in four consecutive seasons and win the title three times (2006, 2007, 2009).

A four-time American Hockey Coaches' Association Division I Coach of the Year, Johnson led the Badgers to their fourth national title in 2010-11 while posting a 37-2-2 record, setting a NCAA record for most wins in a single season. The Badgers also claimed the WCHA regular-season and playoff titles en route to winning their fourth national championship in six years.

Johnson has led the Badgers to an 14-2 record in the NCAA Tournament, which includes nine Frozen Four wins. Johnson celebrated his 200th career win on Feb. 1, 2008 against Ohio State. He leads all active women's college-hockey coaches with a winning percentage of .830 after compiling an impressive record of 247-41-24 in his first seven years at Wisconsin.

Three Badgers have won the Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award under Johnson. Sara Bauer became UW's first award recipient in 2006, Jessie Vetter received the award in 2009 and Meghan Duggan won in 2011.

Named the 2003 WCHA Co-Coach of the Year and an AHCA DI Coach of the Year award finalist, Johnson guided UW to a 22-8-5 record in his first season. After going 25-6-3 in 2003-04, the Badgers made history in Johnson's third season, winning a then-program-record 28 games (28-9-1), earning their first NCAA tournament berth and reaching a No. 2 national rank.

In 2005-06, Wisconsin debuted at No. 1 and went on to validate that distinction with a 36-4-1 record and a national championship. As an encore in 2006-07, the team successfully defended all three championships while posting a 36-1-4 record.

Over that two-year span, Johnson's team won more games in a two-year period (72) than another other team in women's college hockey history. During the 2006-07 campaign, Johnson's team broke or tied 18 NCAA team and individual records, including wins in a season (36), fewest losses (one), best winning percentage (.927) and most shutouts (18). The Badgers fell to Minnesota Duluth in the 2008 championship game before rebounding in 2009 with the program's third NCAA championship as Johnson's 2008-09 squad led the nation in nearly every category.

Johnson's Badgers reached 29 victories in four straight seasons, something no other program has accomplished. From the 2005-06 season to 2008-09, Wisconsin recorded 135 wins, more than any other team in the nation.

The third head coach in UW women's hockey history, Johnson joined the staff after serving as an assistant coach with the men's program from 1996-2002. He also coached the professional Madison Monsters and at both Verona HS and Madison Memorial HS.

Johnson's most notable accomplishments as a player occurred when he led the 1980 U.S. Olympic Team's gold medal-winning effort with 11 points, including two goals in the "MiracleOn-Ice" against the Soviet Union and an assist on the game-winning goal against Finland in the final contest. Following his Olympic experience, Johnson embarked on a successful 11-year NHL career. Johnson earned his B.S. degree in kinesiology from Wisconsin in 1994. He and his wife Leslie have five children – Douglas, Christopher, Patrick, Mikayla and Megan.

- ▶ LaBahn Arena, is set to open on Oct. 19, 2012, and is the new home for the UW men's and women's hockey teams. The rink, which features a 200' x 90' ice surface, serves as the main practice facility for both squads and is the primary home venue for the women's team.
- ▶ On Nov. 17 2010, the Wisconsin State Building Commission gave final approval to the multi-level, hockey and swimming competition and training facility to be constructed adjacent to the Kohl Center on the UW-Madison campus. LaBahn Arena is named after Charles (UW-Madison '49) and Mary Ann LaBahn, the lead donors for the project.
- ▶ La Bahn Arena is a tri-level complex that includes, among other items:
 - Seating for 2,273 spectators
 - Women's hockey office suite and associated support spaces
 - Underground connection to the Kohl Center
 - A connecting skywalk to the Southeast Recreation Facility (SERF)

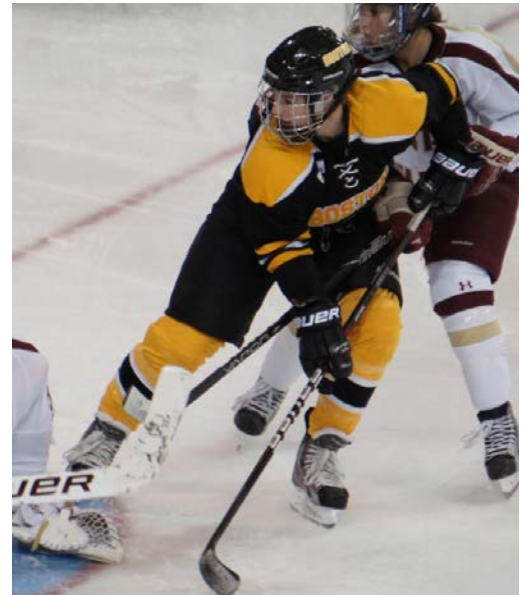

- ▶ Nine former and current Badgers have represented their home countries by competing in the Winter Olympic Games, including two Canadians and seven Americans.
- ▶ Canadian defenseman Carla MacLeod leads Wisconsin's Olympians as a two-time Olympic gold medalist. MacLeod led Canada to gold in both 2006 and 2010. Meanwhile, Meaghan Mikkelson picked up her first Olympic gold with Canada in 2010.
- ▶ Six Badgers skated with Team USA in their first Olympic Games in 2010. Duggan and Knight joined former Badgers Erika Lawler, Jessie Vetter, Kerry Weiland and Jinelle Zaugg-Siergiej in taking home the silver in their Olympic debut, while Molly Engstrom added a silver medal to her bronze from 2006.
- ▶ The United States and Canada are the only gold-medal winners in Olympic Winter Games history. Team USA won the inaugural Olympic gold medal in 1998, while Canada took the top prize in 2002, 2006 and 2010.
- ▶ A total of 13 former and current Badgers have represented their home countries by competing in either the IIHF Women's World Championship or the Four Nations Cup, which includes four Canadians and nine Americans.
