



The Division II Administrative Committee continues to meet via teleconference to take action on Division II regulations and policies impacted by COVID-19. This afternoon, the committee discussed the timing of the current recruiting dead period and prohibition on issuing institutional athletics aid; eligibility for winter sport student-athletes; adjustments to tuition, fees, room and/or board costs and their impact on student-athlete athletics aid; transfer portal/permission to contact issues; and two-year college transfer requirements.

Among the updates, the committee adopted **emergency legislation to extend the recruiting dead period through at least May 31**. The committee also adopted a resolution to **allow schools to issue institutional athletics aid agreements beginning April 16**. Also, the committee **did not provide relief for winter sport student-athletes' season of competition or provide an extension of eligibility because they completed their full regular season and conference championships**.

The Division II Administrative Committee also discussed the Division II budget on the call. With Division II projected to receive \$30 million less than anticipated in 2020 from its annual NCAA revenue allocation, several in-person Division II programs have been canceled for the remainder of 2020. The Administrative Committee tasked staff with determining if any of the programs could be held remotely. The in-person programs that have been canceled are:

- Faculty Athletics Representative Institute
- Coaches' Identity Workshop
- Internship grant orientation
- Division II Athletics Directors Association mentor program
- New athletics director orientation
- Compliance professional development workshop with NAAC

We will continue to provide further updates as necessary. A document containing common questions and answers related to COVID-19 is continuing to be updated on the DII compliance page.
