## TREVOR BASSITT OF ASHLAND, IDA NARBUVOLL OF MARY HEADLINE CoSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA® DIVISION II TRACK & FIELD/CROSS COUNTRY TEAMS

**AUSTIN, Texas** | Senior **Trevor Bassitt** of Ashland University and graduate student **Ida Narbuvo**ll of the University of Mary headline the 2020-21 Academic All-America® Division II Men's and Women's Track & Field/Cross Country teams as selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA).

Bassitt and Narbuvo

ll are the CoSIDA Academic All-America® Team Member of the Year for their respective teams.

The Academic All-America® program is being financially supported by the NCAA Division II national governance structure to assist CoSIDA with handling the awards fulfillment aspects for the 2020-21 Division II Academic All-America® teams' program.

Bassitt, who is from Bluffton, Ohio, is a two-time CoSIDA Academic All-America® selection after being named to the second team in 2019-2020. Bassitt finished with a 3.56 cumulative grade-point average as a sport management major, and a 4.00 GPA in post-graduate work.

Bassitt helped the Eagles capture their third consecutive NCAA Division II Indoor Track & Field team title in 2021. He claimed national titles in the 60-meter hurdles, 200 dash and 4 x 400 relay this season as he was named the United States Track & Field Coaches Association NCAA Division II Men's Indoor Track Athlete of the Year. He set new Division II records in the 200 and 400 dashes this season. He recorded four Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference titles and was named the GLIAC Track Athlete of the Year, Track Athlete of the Meet and High Point Athlete of the Meet.

During the outdoor season, Bassitt registered a national title in the 4 x 400 relay as he was named the USTFCCA Midwest Region Men's Outdoor Track Athlete of the Year. Bassitt won four GLIAC titles as he was named the conference's Track Athlete of the Year, Track Athlete of the Meet and High Point Athlete of the Meet.

A two-time national champion and the USTFCCA Women's Outdoor Track Athlete of the Year, Narbuvo

ll posted a 3.76 GPA while earning a bachelor's degree in engineering and owns a 4.00 GPA while pursuing a master's degree in project management.

Narbuvo

ll was the 2021 Northern Sun Women's Outdoor Track Athlete of the Year after winning three titles at the conference championships and the North Dakota Associated Press Sportscasters and Sportswriters College Female Athlete of the Year. The native of Norway won the 10,000 and the 5,000 meter runs at the 2021 NCAA outdoor championships, breaking a 36-year meet record in the 5K by over 20 seconds and now owns the second-best mark ever recorded in Division II history. A three-time NSIC Athlete of the Week in 2021 who won all eight times she raced this spring, Narbuvoll is a nine-time All-American.

Nineteen men and 12 women are repeat performers on this year's track & field/cross country teams. Sixteen (eight women, eight men) student-athletes on the CoSIDA Academic All-America® Division II Track & Field/Cross Country Teams have a 4.00 undergraduate GPA. The CoSIDA Academic All-America® Division II Women's Track & Field/Cross Country First Team had an overall 3.90 GPA, while the CoSIDA Academic All-America® Division II Men's Track & Field/Cross Country First Team had an overall 3.83 GPA.

Tiffin University's **Cameron Burrows** and Pittsburg State University's Levi Wyrick earned CoSIDA Academic All-America® Division II Track & Field/Cross Country recognition for the fourth time in their respective careers. Eight others – Pittsburg State's **Joshua Hudiburg** and **Haven Lander**, University of Central Missouri's **Jan Jansky**, Queens University of Charlotte's **Martin Knauer**, University of Colorado Colorado Springs' **William Ross**, Harding University's **Matt Hipshire**, University of Southern Indiana's **Austin Nolan**, Colorado State University-Pueblo's **Hailey Streff** and Florida Southern College's **Hannah Flemming**.
