GNAC News & Notes

AWARDS SEASON: The GNAC 2019 Baseball All-Conference Team was released earlier this week and a total of 47 players were named to the squad. Leading all selections was Montana State Billings first baseman **Daniel Cipriano**, named the GNAC Player of the Year after having one of the most explosive seasons in program history.

In all, a total of 16 honorees were repeat selections to the team. Montana State Billings led all teams with 13 selections to the GNAC Baseball All-Conference Team while Western Oregon and Saint Martin's had 11 and eight selections, respectively.

REPRESENTATION IN REGIONAL RANKINGS: In the 12th NCBWA West Region Rankings of the season, Montana State Billings is ranked No. 5 while Western Oregon is slotted at No. 6. The two teams finished the season in first and second in the GNAC standings.

UC San Diego tops the region, earning each of the possible eight first-place votes. The Tritons are 35-10 so far this season.

IT'S AUTOMATIC: For the first time in conference history, the GNAC will receive an automatic bid into the NCAA Division II Baseball Tournament in 2019. The winner of the GNAC Championships, held this week in Portland, will receive that automatic berth. Montana State Billings, Western Oregon, Northwest Nazarene and Saint Martin's qualified for the GNAC Championships after finishing the regular season inside the top four in the conference standings.

The defending GNAC Championships title-holders, Western Oregon, have won the tournament four times in the event's history. Northwest Nazarene enters with one tournament title.

Around The GNAC

MONTANA STATE BILLINGS



- Montana State Billings met Concordia in Billings last weekend, coming away with a sweep to clinch its fourth regular-season title in the last five years. The contests marked the club's final games of the regular season.
- The team was led offensively by senior **Jalen Garcia**, who hit at a .400 average while tallying five RBI and six runs over the series. Garcia enters the postseason ranked

fourth in the GNAC in both batting average (.366) and home runs (9). He was named to the GNAC All-Conference Team on Wednesday along with 12 of his teammates, a mark that led the league.

- Senior Steen Fredrickson was named GNAC Pitcher of the Week after a strong performance in Friday's regular-season title clinching victory. The righthander went 6.2 innings, allowing just one run while striking out eight Cavaliers.
- Montana State Billings leads the conference with 79 home runs as the fourth month of the season begins. GNAC Player and Newcomer of the Year Daniel Cipriano tops the league with 17 homers, while senior Matt Dillon (15) and sophomore Wyatt Setian (12) round out the top three.
- The Yellowjackets will return to the field on Wednesday at the GNAC Championships, starting the postseason at 6 p.m. (PDT) against Saint Martin's.

NORTHWEST NAZARENE



- •The Nighthawks were back in action for four games last week, taking three contests against Central Washington. The club opened up the set with a 4-1 victory on Thursday, then outscored the Wildcats 27-9 en route to a Friday sweep.
- •Northwest Nazarene was led by freshman **Ben Johnson**. Johnson tallied six RBI and three runs while

hitting at a .364 batting average on the week. That brings Redford's average to .379 on the season. The mark leads the team among players with at least 50 at-bats, with senior **Kyle Redford** right behind at a .327 clip.

- Northwest Nazarene ranks third in the league with a 5.40 earned run average.
 Senior Jesse Hilyard's 4.12 ERA has him slotted at No. 3 in the GNAC individually.
- The Nighthawks are back in action this week, taking to Portland as the No. 3 seed in the conference tournament. Their week will start on Wednesday at 2:30 p.. (PDT) against second-seeded Western Oregon.

SAINT MARTIN'S



- Saint Martin's was back in action for four games against Western Oregon last week. The Saints were unable to come away with a victory against the Wolves.
- Senior **Colton Peha** led the team against the Wolves. The outfielder hit .286 while notching a .333 on-base percentage.
- Third baseman Micah McNicoll tops the team at the plate with a .309 batting average and 15 RBI.
- As a team, Saint Martin's ranks second in the league with a 5.01 earned run average. The club's 388 strikeouts also rank second in the conference.
- The Saints placed eight players on the GNAC All-Conference team, led by first team selections **Mickey Walker** and **Tanner Inouye**. Walker has recorded a league-high seven saves in his senior season in Lacey while Inouye was SMU's most consistent starting pitcher, tallying four wins and a 4.59 earned run average.
- The Saints will return to action at the GNAC Championships this week, opening the tournament against regular-season champion Montana State Billings. The game is set for a 6 p.m. start on Wednesday in Portland.

WESTERN OREGON



- •Western Oregon hit the road and earned a crucial series sweep to improve its NCAA at-large hopes last week. The set was highlighted by a blowout, 18-0 victory in Friday's lid-lifter in Lacey.
- •Senior **Blayze Arcano** led the club offensively against SMU, tallying nine RBI while going 8 for 13 at the plate.

Arcano earned GNAC Player of the Week honors for his performance, marking his club's fourth such award this season.

- Western Oregon is hitting .326 as a team, a mark that currently leads the conference. Its .417 on-base percentage also tops the GNAC.
- The team and conference leader in both strikeouts and ERA is right-hander **Alex Roth**. The Peoria, Ariz product currently tops the league with a 2.65 ERA and 80 strikeouts and was named the GNAC Pitcher of the Year on Wednesday.
- The club will return to the field on Wednesday to open up its postseason run against Northwest Nazarene. First pitch is set for 2:30 p.m. at Porter Park in Portland.

GNAC Championships Preview

PORTLAND, Ore. – After earning its fourth regular-season title in five years, Montana State Billings tops the field for the 2019 GNAC Baseball Championships, beginning Wednesday at Porter Park on the campus of Concordia University.

A pair of conference tournament mainstays in addition to two teams anxious to return to the postseason make up the field. Entering the final week of the regular season, Montana State Billings, Western Oregon and Northwest Nazarene had all secured tournament berths while Saint Martin's clinched its spot last Saturday.

For the first time, the four teams will have something more than a trophy to play for with the tournament champion earning the GNAC's first-ever automatic berth into the NCAA Division II Championship.

Montana State Billings dominated throughout the conference season, winning eight of its final nine GNAC series while splitting the other. The Yellowjackets have smashed 79 home runs this year, smashing the conference's single-season record in the process.

The team leads the league in plenty of other offensive categories, including RBI (342), slugging percentage (.546) and runs scored (378).

Topping MSUB at the plate has been first baseman **Daniel Cipriano**. Cipriano won the GNAC's batting title with a .409 average and also paces the conference with 50 RBI, 17 home runs and a .534 on-base percentage.

Third baseman **Chris Arpan** and senior **Jalen Garcia** have also lit it up offensively. Arpan ranks second in the conference with a batting average of .370, while Garcia is hitting .366 and is slotted second in both hits (63) and doubles (14).

Back to defend its GNAC Championships title will be Western Oregon. Returning to the tournament for a seventh straight season, the Wolves may be the most balanced team in the field as they top the conference in both batting average (.326) and earned run average (3.96).

The Wolves pitching staff has thrown seven shutouts on the season, with one of the most recent coming in no-hit fashion from southpaw **Austin Crowson**. The performance marked just the fifth no-hitter in GNAC history.

Also dominant on the mound this season has been right-hander **Alex Roth**. Roth leads the league in earned run average (2.65) and enters the postseason with a perfect 6-0 record.

At the plate, the duo of **Jared McDonald** and **Griffey Halle** have been a handful for opposing staffs throughout the season. McDonald finds himself at the top of multiple GNAC statistical categories, ranking third with a batting average of .367, second in runs scored at 46 and fourth with a .457 on-base percentage. Halle enters the postseason hitting .333 and is slotted second in the conference with 48 RRI

Northwest Nazarene is making its fourth GNAC Championships appearance in the last five years and its first under new head coach **Joe Schaeffer**.

The club is led by slugger **Kyle Redford**, who tops the team with a .327 batting average and 34 RBI. He is one of four Nighthawks to appear in all 46 games this

On the mound, senior **Jesse Hilyard** has been NNU's most consistent starting pitcher this year. Leading the team with a 4.12 earned run average, Hilyard has compiled a near-spotless record of 6-1 while striking out 38. Teammate **Cooper Webster** has thrown three complete games on the 2019 campaign, notching a team-leading 59 strikeouts in the process.

Rounding out the field is Saint Martin's, which will make its second-ever appearance in the GNAC Championships and its first since 2014. The Saints went .500 through a crucial month of April and then clinched a spot in the tournament on the penultimate day of the regular season.

Entering with one of the deepest pitching staffs in the field, right-hander **Tanner Inouye** tops the team with four wins and 77 strikeouts. The club also boasts the league-leader in saves with seven from senior **Mickey Walker**.

Freshman **Aaron Renaud** has made plenty of noise at the plate in his first collegiate season, hitting at a .307 average while tallying 26 RBI.

Action at the GNAC Championships begins on Wednesday with No. 2 seed Western Oregon facing third-seeded Northwest Nazarene at 2:30 p.m. Regular-season champion Montana State Billings will then take on No. 4 seed Saint Martin's at 6 p.m. The title game in the double-elimination tournament will begin on Friday at noon with a second game to follow if necessary.
