Stats: 4.33 K/S, .304 Hitting %, 2.97 D/S, 0.63 B/S

Alongside teammate Allee Stelogeannis, become the second pair of Belles to garner AVCA First-Team All-American accolades the same year (2012: Madie Huth + Alex Woolsey).

Madi Farrell, Northwest Nazarene, MB

Stats: 3.38 K/S, .354 Hitting %, 1.31 B/S

The first AVCA All-American in program history.

Riley Hanson, Concordia-St. Paul, MB

Stats: 3.03 K/S, .439 Hitting %, 0.91 B/S

Earned AVCA First-Team All-American honors for the third consecutive year...Becomes just the 19th player in Division II history to take home first-team honors three times...She's the fourth player in program history to do it (Kayla Koenecke, 2011-2013; Amanda Konetchy, 2011-2013; Maggie McNamara, 2007-2009).

Two-time AVCA All-American (2015: Second-Team)...Twelfth player in Coyotes history to be a multiple All-American.
