Central Oklahoma's Kate Killion named Division II Conference Commissioners Association Women's Soccer Player of the Year



ADA, Okla. - Senior forward Kate Killion claimed the Ron Lenz National Player of the Year to headline the 2018 Division II Conference Commissioners Association Women's Soccer All-America Teams.

Killion helped the Bronchos to a 20-1 regular-season record and then to two victories in the NCAA Division II Central Regional (Oklahoma Baptist/Minnesota State Mankato) before falling in overtime to Central Missouri in the regional final. On the way, she was named the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletic Association Offensive Player of the Year and the 2018 D2 CCA Central Region Player fo the Year.

Killion joined 12 other student-athletes on an All-America First Team, including nine fellow first-time All-American honorees. Forward Alimata Rabbo, from Southwestern Oklahoma State, is the lone member of the first team to have earned two previous All-America honors, while defender Cecilia Steinwasher from Grand Valley State and defender Natalie Saddic from the University of California San Diego earned one honor in the past.

Barry and Grand Valley State are the only schools with two members on the All-America First Team. Barry saw midfielder Christy Grimshaw and defender Jade Adams on the list, while GVSU was represented by midfielder Riko Sagara and Steinwasher.

Forwards Maegan Doyle (Bridgeport) and Thuto Ramafifi (Salem), midfielders Anna Gregg (Colorado-Colorado Springs) and Dakota Wendell (Minnesota State Mankato), defenders Natalie Saddic (California-San Diego) and Emily Townsend (Colorado School of Mines) and goalkeeper Esthefanny Barreras (West Florida) round out the First Team.

The First Team consists of three members from the Central, South and South Central Regions; two from the Midwest Region, and one from the Atlantic, East, and West Regions.

The Ron Lenz National Player of the Year award was named for long-time South Dakota State sports information director Ron Lenz in 2008. Lenz was instrumental in the foundation of the NCAA Division II All-America program, which honors outstanding student-athletes across eight NCAA Division II sports.

Sports information directors from NCAA Division II schools and conferences selected the three D2 CCA All-America teams. The process begins at the regional level with all first-team all-region picks advancing to the national ballot. A total of 39 student-athletes representing 22 different institutions filled out the three teams.

The Division II Conference Commissioners Association encourages and promotes Division II athletics and high standards of sportsmanship as important elements of higher education. The CCA is a key communications link among the conferences as they discuss views, policies and regulations that impact Division II intercollegiate athletics and works closely with the NCAA as a communications channel to NCAA Division II member colleges and universities.
