## Gonzalez and Hines headline Conference Commissioners Association NCAA Division II All-America baseball team

MARSHALL, Minn. - Senior right-handed pitcher Skylar Gonzalez from the University of Tampa and senior shortstop Jack Hines from Augustana University (S.D.) headline the 2024 NCAA Division II Conference Commissioners Association All-America baseball team, earning the Ron Lenz Pitcher and Player of the Year awards, respectively. A total of 48 student-athletes were named to either the first, second or third team All-America squad while 16 were named honorable mention.

The CCA All-America and All-Region baseball teams, which are selected by College Sports Communicators (CSC) from schools playing Division II baseball, were first established in 2007. This is the ninth year in which the program is solely sponsored by the Division II Conference Commissioners Association.

Gonzalez, a native of Fort Lauderdale, Fla., is 15-0 on the season in helping the Spartans advance to the NCAA Championships in Cary, N.C. In 17 starts this season, Gonzalez has compiled a 2.25 ERA in 96 innings with 64 strikeouts. In the latest NCAA statistics (May 26), he ranks first in victories, seventh in ERA and 27th in WHIP (1.07). Gonzalez has allowed one earned run or less in 11 of his 17 starts on the season.

Hines, a native of Lombard, Ill., helped lead Augustana to the NCAA Central Region Tournament, while batting .445 with 21 home runs, 89 RBIs, 77 runs scored and 178 total bases. In the latest NCAA statistics (May 26), he ranks first in RBIs, seventh in hits, seventh in home runs, ninth in batting average, ninth in runs, 15th in hits per game (1.6) and 17th in home runs per game (0.37).

Joining Gonzalez and Hines on the CCA All-America first team include Tripp Clark (C, Angelo State), David Lewis (1B, North Greenville), Jonathan Logsdon (2B, Albany State), Mikey Kocen (3B, Lewis), Carson Boles (OF, Lincoln Memorial), Rob Sharrar (OF, Colorado Mesa), Brennen van Breusegen (OF, Central Missouri), Joey Rezek (DH, UNC Pembroke), Mackenzie Wainwright (utility non-pitcher, Salem), Hayden Jatczak (utility pitcher, Saginaw Valley State), Brent Francisco (SP, East Stroudsburg), Caleb Marks (SP, Trevecca Nazarene), Alex Mykut (SP, Millersville) and James Sashin (RP, Point Loma Nazarene).
