## **GNAC RED LION ATHLETES OF THE WEEK**

**Male** – Matt Lutz, Western Washington (Fr., Bremerton, WA – Olympic) and Mitch Burgess, Alaska Fairbanks (Fr., Temecula, CA) ... Lutz and Burgess had Top 15 finishes in events hosted by Division I teams. Lutz finished  $13^{th}$  in the University of Washington Sundodger, covering the 8,000-meter course in a time of 25:18.00 and leading the Vikings to a third-place team finish in back of Chico State and British Columbia. Burgess placed ninth in the University of Hawaii Invitational in a 5K time of 16:42.47 to lead the Nanooks to a third-place team finish.

**Female** – Lindsey Butterworth, Simon Fraser (Sr., North Vancouver, BC – Handworth) finished third in the women's open division at the University of Washington Sundodger Invitational Saturday with a 6,000-meter time of 21:29.63. Butterworth led the Clan to a second-place finish one ahead of regionally pre-season top ranked Chico State.

**FIRST ATHLETE OF THE WEEK AWARD FOR UAF MEN:** Mitch Burgess' GNAC Athlete of the Week award was the first one for a UAF male cross country athlete in the 13-year history of the conference. UAF women have won 11. Burgess shared the award with Western Washington freshman Matt Lutz.

**WINNERS**: Western Oregon's Brady Beagley and Annie Wade finished first in the WOU Ash Creek Invitational and Chase Cunningham of Northwest Nazarene won the men's title in the NNU Roger Curran Invitational. Beagley led the Wolves to a second-place team posting a time of 18:35 over the 5,900-meter layout. Wade was clocked in 15:22 over 4,200 meters as the Wolves outpointed Southern Oregon 18-47 for the team title. Cunningham was clocked in a time of 19:58.71 at West Park in Nampa.

**NATIONAL PREVIEW SATURDAY AT SPOKANE:** Five GNAC teams including nationally-ranked Simon Fraser will compete Saturday in the Erik Anderson Invitational at the Plantes Ferry Sports Stadium in Spokane. Joining the Clan will be Central Washington, Montana State Billings, Western Oregon and Western Washington. Plantes Ferry will also be the site of the NCAA Division II West Regional and NCAA Division II National meet Nov. 9 and Nov. 23. The GNAC is the host for both events.

**SEAWOLVES, CLAN NATIONALLY RANKED:** Alaska Anchorage is ranked fifth and Simon Fraser is ranked sixth in this week's USTFCCCA women's national poll. The poll is the first regular-season poll of the 2013 season. UAA is also ranked ninth in the men's national poll. In the women's West Regional poll, UAA and SFU rank 1-2. Western Washington and Seattle Pacific rank seventh and eighth. In the men's regional poll, Alaska Anchorage ranks second. Also ranked are Western Washington (6<sup>th</sup>), Montana State Billings (9<sup>th</sup>) and Western Oregon (10<sup>th</sup>).

**5 TEAM BERTHS AVAILABLE FOR NATIONALS:** The NCAA Division II West Regional Nov. 9 at Plantes Ferry Sports Stadium will qualify five teams (per gender) for the national meet Nov. 23 at the same site. In addition, the top three individuals not on one of the five qualifying teams will also advance to the national meet hosted by the GNAC.

## PREVIOUS GNAC ATHLETES OF THE WEEK

Week of Sept. 2-8: Male: Robert Peterson, MSU Billings (So., Billings, MT - Skyview) won a pair of races and led the Yellowjackets to their first perfect score in 25 years. On Thursday, Peterson won the Alaska Fairbanks Invitational in a 8,000-meter time of 26:12.8 as MSUB swept the first five places. Two days later, Peterson repeated his victory winning the UAF Short-Course Invitational in a 4,000-meter time of 12:40.9 as the Yellowiackets won the team title with a team score of 17. Female: McKayla Fricker, Seattle Pacific (Sr., Canby, OR) posted her first two collegiate cross country victories leading the Falcons to a pair of team victories at Fairbanks. On Thursday, the 2012 Indoor 800 meter All-American was clocked in a 6,000-meter time of 22:58.3 to finish 15 seconds ahead of teammate Anni Patti. She posted another 15-second win Saturday in a 4K time of 15:09.4 as Renae Hepfner of MSUB finished second in 15:224.8.
