Strong Field To Compete in 41st Viking Cross Country Classic

THIS SATURDAY: Western Washington Classic (Alaska Anchorage, Central Washington, Seattle Pacific, Simon Fraser, Western Oregon, Western Washington), 10 a.m.; George Fox Invitational (Saint Martin's).

PORTLAND, Ore. - With the GNAC Championship meet just three weeks away, all seven of the conference's teams - three men's and four women's - that are ranked in this week's NCAA West Regional rankings head to Bellingham Saturday to compete in the 41st Viking Cross Country Classic at Lake Padden Park.

Its a race that certainly could be looked on as a preview for the GNAC championship meet which will be held Nov. 1 at Monmouth, Ore.

In this week's men's regional rankings, Alaska Anchorage is ranked second for the third week in a row. Western Washington is ranked fifth and Simon Fraser is seventh.

Led by No. 2 Simon Fraser, four GNAC women's teams are ranked including Western Washington (5th), Central Washington (6th) and Alaska Anchorage (7th).

Four of the seven are also ranked in this week's USTFCCCA national poll.

Alaska Anchorage's men are ranked seventh and Simon Fraser's women are ranked eighth. Western Washington's men and women are ranked 25th and 23rd, respectively.

In addition to Alaska Anchorage, Simon Fraser, Central Washington and the host Vikings, the field will also include GNAC members Western Oregon and Seattle Pacific.

Also competing Saturday will be British Columbia, Everett CC, Thompson Rivers, Trinity Western, Skagit Valley CC and Victoria.

The men's 10,000-meter race will begin at 10 a.m. followed by the women's 6K at 11 a.m.

Those are the same distances the athletes will run in late November at the NCAA West Regional at Amend Park in Billings.

One GNAC team - Saint Martin's - will compete in the George Fox Invitational at Newberg, Ore. Saturday

Last week GNAC teams competed at three venues.

Montana State Billings swept the team titles at the MSUB Yellowjacket Invitational at Amend Park as the Yellowjackets' Robert Peterson and Nocona Frame finished first in times of 25:18.83 (8,000 meters) and 22:25.65 (6,000 meters).

At Bush Park in Salem, Central Washington's Dani Eggleston was the top collegiate finisher (and second overall) in the women's 5,000 meter race at the Wiliamette Charles Bowles Invitational.

The top GNAC finisher in the men's 8,000 meters was Isaac Mitchell of Northwest Nazarene, who placed 28^{th} in an 8,000-meter time of 25:31.2.

Central Washington finished fifth in the men's team race and third in the women's for the top finishes by GNAC teams.

CWU also competed at the Pacific Lutheran University Invitational, finishing in a tie for second in the women's team competition.

Week of Sept. 1-7: Men – Robert Peterson, MSU Billings (Jr., Billings, MT – Skyview) was the lone runner to break 19 minutes in winning the Carroll College Early Bird Invitational Friday at Helena in a 6,000-meter time of 18:52.07. MSUB finished first with 26 points, 25 ahead of the host Saints. Women – Beatrice Decker, Alaska Anchorage (Jr., Erfurt, Germany) won the University of Hawaii Big Wave Invitational in a 5,000-meter time of 19:18.4. It was her second Top 2 finish of the young season. She finished second in a meet at Hawaii Hilo on Aug. 30 in a 5K time of 19:16, leading the Seawolves to wins in both meets.

Week of Sept. 8-14: Male - Henry Cheseto, Alaska Anchorage (Fr., Kapenguria, Kenya) and Oliver Jorgensen, Simon Fraser (So., Abbotsford, BC – Robert Bantem) ... Cheseto remained unbeaten in three races leading the Seawolves to their third consecutive perfect score in a 15-50 home dual meet win over Willamette. Cheseto was clocked in a 4,200-meter time of 12:39. Jorgensen led the Clan to a win at the WOU Ash Creek Invitational at Monmouth. Led by Jorgensen's 5,900-meter time of 18:03.5, the Clan placed four runners in the Top 7 and five in the Top 10. **Women** - Rebecca Bassett, Simon Fraser (So., Nanaimo, BC) won the WOU Ash Creek Invitational in a 4,200-meter time of 14:27.9 as the Clan cruised to an easy team victory, placing six runners in the Top 11.

Week of Sept. 15-21: Men - Oliver Jorgensen, Simon Fraser (So., Abbotsford, BC) finished third in the open division of the University of Washington Sundodger Invitational at Lincoln Park in an 8,000-meter time of 24:39, finishing just five seconds back of Jack Williams of UBC. Women – Katelyn Steen, Western Washington (Sr., Sammamish, WA - Lakewood) finished eighth in the UW Sundodger Invitational division in a 6,000-meter time of 21:12. She finished in back of five athletes from Division I schools and two from Canada's Trinity Western. Her time was also better than all but one athlete competing in the open division.
