GNAC RED LION PLAYERS-OF-THE-WEEK:
Offense - Bo Palmer, Simon Fraser (RB, 5-9, 209, Sr., North Vancouver, BC) rushed for 145 yards on just 17 carries and scored four touchdowns leading the Clan to a 41-28 home win over Dixie State. Palmer earned *Red Lion*

Offense Player of the Week honors scoring in each period - from two yards in the first quarter, 37 early in the second period, 54 late in the third stanza and one midway through the fourth quarter as the Clan earned their first conference victory of the season. Palmer, who averaged 8.5 yards per rush, also caught four passes for 23 yards as SFU had a total of 463 yards in total offense. **Defense -** Isaiah Davis, Central Washington (CB, 6-0, 176, Fr., Bremerton, WA - South Kitsap) had 10 tackles and broke up three passes (including two in the end zone) leading the Wildcats to a 31-3 win over ninth-ranked Humboldt State, which came into the contest ranked ninth nationally in scoring averaging 42.5 points. The *Red Lion Defensive Player of the Week* award winner also had 98 return yards, including 42 yards on five punt returns and 56 on two kickoffs. His 40-yard return on the game's opening kickoff set up a 56-yard, 11-play touchdown drive. **Special Teams -** Alexander Bradt, Western Oregon (P, 6-1, 210, Fr., Salem, OR - West Salem) averaged 42.8 yards on eight punts including a long of 54 in the Wolves' 20-7 road win at Azusa Pacific to take *Red Lion Special Team Player of the Week* honors. Bradt currently ranks eighth nationally in punting averaging 44.1 yards per attempt. **Honorable Mention -** Demetrius Sumler, Central Washington; Casey Chinn, Simon Fraser; Cody VonAppen, Western Oregon; Kraig Akins, Western Oregon.

THE RUSHING GAME: Humboldt State running back Nick Ricciardulli rushed for 106 yards on 27 carries in Saturday's game against Central Washington surpassing the 100-yard barrier for the fifth week in a row. He is two short of the GNAC record of seven consecutive 100-yard games set by Eliot Vinzant of Western Oregon in 2005. Vinzant is one of four running backs in GNAC history to rush for 100 yards seven times in the same season. Lyndon Rowells of Humboldt State did it in back-to-back seasons (2010-11). Simon Fraser's Bo Palmer also had seven 100-yard rushing games last season and Emilio Iniguez of Central Washington had seven during the 2004 season. Ricciardulli currently ranks sixth nationally in rushing averaging 146.8 yards per game. CWU's Demetrius Sumler ranks 20th averaging 114 yards per contest. Sumler had his third 100-yard game of the season in Saturday's win over the Lumberjacks, netting 152 yards on 27 carries, including second-half touchdowns of 68 and nine yards.

THE PASSING GAME: Trey Wheeler of Simon Fraser leads the GNAC this fall with four 200-yard passing games, including 312 yards in Saturday's 41-28 home win against Dixie State. Wheeler had a GNAC season-high 404 passing yards two weeks ago against Western Oregon and he has three of the four 300-yard passing games recorded in

the GNAC this season. The only other GNAC quarterback to throw for 300 yards this season is Humboldt State's Alex Rump who threw for 306 against Simon Fraser on Sept. 15 ... Rump hasn't been intercepted this fall in 133 pass attempts. His five consecutive games without an interception ties the GNAC record set by Scott Mitchell of Western Washington over a two-year span in 2001 and 2002. Dating back to the 2011 season, Rump has thrown 135 consecutive passes since his only career interception on Oct. 29 against Simon Fraser. The GNAC record for consecutive passes without an interception is 184 by Central Washington's Mike Reilly during the 2008 season ... Rump, Central Washington's Ryan Robertson and Cody VonAppen of Western Oregon have all had three 200-yard passing games this fall ... Simon Fraser receiver Lemar Durant has had four 100-yard receiving yards game. He is the only receiver in the conference with more than one.

CLIMBING THE CAREER CHARTS: CWU quarterback Ryan Robertson has thrown for 5,858 career yards and has 5,935 yards in total offense. He ranks sixth in GNAC history in both categories ... Simon Fraser running back Bo Palmer joined the 2,000-yard career rushing club Saturday netting 145 yards on 17 rushes. Palmer, who scored four touchdowns, has exactly 2,000 career yards. He is the ninth player in conference history to reach that level. Palmer's yards per carry average of 5.67 ranks second all-time in the GNAC trailing only a 5.71 average by Western Oregon's Eliot Vinzant's 5.71 (371-2119). . .Western Oregon kicker Kelly Morgan also reached a milestone, scoring eight points (two touchdowns, 2 extra points) to increase his career point total to exactly 200. He joins Garrett Rolsma of Central Washington (330 between 2006 and 2009) and Michael Koenen of Western Washington (272 between 2001 and 2004) as the only kickers to score 200 or more points.

HIGHEST RANKING: Humboldt State's No. 9 ranking in last week's AFCA national poll is the highest national ranking in school history. The Lumberjacks played in the 1960 Holiday Bowl for the national championship losing 15-14 to Lenoir Rhyne and in the 1968 Camelia Bowl for the West Region title defeating Fresno State 29-14. But, both of those seasons pre-dated national polls. They finished 39th in the final 2010 AFCA poll and 20th in last year's final poll.

ROAD WARRIORS: Central Washington takes the road for the sixth consecutive week heading to St. George, Utah, to play Dixie State. Two of those games have been played at Pop Keeney Stadium in Bothell due to poor air quality in the central Washington area due to wild fires. Under NCAA rules those games count as neutral site contests. Nine of CWU's last 10 games have been played away from Ellensburg. The only home game during that stretch was on Nov. 12, 2011 against Dixie State. The Wildcats won that contest 42-14.

GNAC SWITCHES TO SUPER REGIONAL III: The GNAC will compete in Super Regional III this fall after spending the past few years in Super Regional IV. Also part of the 44-team Super Regional III is the MIAA (Mid-

America), the Great American Conference and the Northern Sun. The MIAA was also part of Super Regional IV last season. Six teams from each of the four regions qualify for the playoffs. "Earned access" berths are awarded to certain conferences which have a team ranked in the Top 10 in their region. With only five playoff-eligible members, the GNAC does not receive an earned access berth. Azusa Pacific is a provisional NCAA member and is not eligible for the playoffs.

GAME RECAPS AND NOTES

Central Washington 31, Humboldt State 3 (at Bothell): Running back Demetrius Sumler rushed for 152 yards including second-half touchdowns of 68 and nine yards as Central Washington defeated ninth-ranked Humboldt State 31-3 to end the Lumberjacks win streak at seven games dating back to the end of the 2011 season ... CWU held Humboldt without a touchdown, the first time that has occurred during the five-year tenure of Rob Smith as HSU's head football coach. The Lumberjacks came into the contest ranked ninth nationally in scoring averaging 42.5 points per game Still the game was close until the Wildcats used a 32-yard run on a fake punt by Riley Wall to start a run of 21 consecutive points ... Leading 10-3 after a 43-yard field goal by Matt Bruder got the 'Jacks on the board early in the second half, CWU was facing a fourth-and-one from its own 48 when Wall raced to his own 20 on the fourth-down play. CWU took advantage seven plays later going ahead 17-3 on a seven-yard pass from quarterback Ryan Robertson to wide receiver Greg Logan. . .Then on the first play after a HSU punt, Sumler raced 68 yards to stretch CWU's lead to 24-3. Sumler scored again in the fourth quarter on a nine-yard run to cap off a five-play, 64-yard drive to cap the scoring ... Central's defense limited Humboldt to 339 yards though 'Jack running back Nick Ricciardulli ran for 100 yards for the fifth consecutive game. That's two short of the GNAC record. He finished with 106 on 27 totes. . .CWU had exactly 400 yards, rushing for 214 and passing for 186. Robertson completed 21 of 31 passes, including seven to Anthony Spain for 86 yards ... Humboldt quarterback Alex Rump completed 23 of 39 for 217 yards. Neither quarterback was intercepted, Rump for a GNAC record-tying fifth game in a row ... CWU linebacker Stan Langlow had a game-high 12 tackles. Freshman defensive back Isaiah Davis had 10 ... Linebackers JJ Evans and Chris Peterson had eight each for Humboldt.

Simon Fraser 41, Dixie State 28 (at Burnaby, BC): Trey Wheeler threw for 312 yards and two touchdowns and running back Bo Palmer rushed for 145 yards and four touchdowns as Simon Fraser opened up a 20-point lead in the third quarter and cruised to a 41-28 win at Terry Fox Field ... Palmer scored in each period – from two yards in the first quarter, 37 early in the second period, 54 late in the third stanza and one midway through the fourth ... Wheeler, meanwhile, tossed TD passes of seven yards to Mathis Baumbach on his team's first possession of the game and 23 yards to Lemar Durant on its first offensive snap of the third period after a 17-yard punt return by Tore Corrado ... Wheeler completed the contest with 26 completions – nine

to Durrant (116 yards) and six to Bobby Pospischil (79 yards) – in 40 attempts and wasn't picked off ... SFU outgained Dixie 463-410. Red Storm quarterback Kaleo Nawahine completed 24 of 43 for 284 yards and two touchdowns, but was picked off twice – by Chandler Gayton and Derek Jones. Dixie's Randon Willard had seven receptions for 112 yards, 43 of them on a touchdown with 42 seconds left in the contest ... Defensive back Kyle Miller had a game-high 10 tackles, including one for a three-yard loss. He also had a fumble recovery ... Linebacker Jake Duncan led the Red Storm with nine tackles.

Western Oregon 20, Azusa Pacific 7 (at Glendora, CA):

Quarterback Cody VonAppen tossed a 35-yard touchdown pass to Tyrell Williams and ran 36 yards for a TD as Western Oregon built a 14-0 halftime lead on the way to a 20-7 victory over Azusa Pacific at Citrus Stadium ... Kelly Morgan tacked on field goals of 37 and 23 yards in the second half increasing his career point total to exactly 200 points in the process ... Azusa finally got on the board in the fourth quarter with 1:35 remaining as Nick Owens tossed a 20-yard TD pass to Wade Struiksma to finish off a five-play, 64-yard drive ... Western Oregon's defense limited Azusa to just 239 yards, equaling the second best defensive effort by a GNAC team this fall ... Azusa held Dixie State to 232 yards on Sept. 15 for the lowest total, while Dixie held Western Oregon to 239 yards on Sept. 8 ... VonAppen had 260 yards on his own – recording his first 100-yard rushing game (127 on 18 carries) and passing for 133. Owens passed for 186 yards completing 22 of 36 to account for most of the Cougars' offense. Erik Johnson (42 yards) and Kyle Dravis (23 yards) each had five catches ... WOU punter Alexander Bradt averaged 42.8 yards on eight punts. Meanwhile defensive lineman Kraig Akins led WOU's defense with nine tackles, 2 ½ for losses of four yards. Defensive tackle Sipili Tuigamalala had four tackles for losses of 14 yards, including a nine-yard sack ... Azusa linebacker Sean Barber had a game-high 11 tackles to lead the Cougar defense.

PREVIOUS RED LION PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Week of Aug. 27-Sept. 2: Offense - Nick Ricciardulli, Humboldt State (RB, 5-8, 190, Jr., Poway, CA) rushed for 159 yards on 24 carries, scoring on touchdown runs of one and 74 yards in the Lumberjacks' 38-13 win over Colorado Mesa. Ricciardulli also had three receptions and finished with 162 all-purpose yards. His 74-yard jaunt equals the fifth longest in conference history. **Defense** – Alex Markarian, Humboldt State (DE, 6-4, 245, So., Chino Hills, CA) had nine tackles including six solos and three quarterback sacks for losses of 16. **Special Teams** – Kelly Morgan, Western Oregon (K, 5-10, 170, Sr., Sherwood, OR) kicked a 53-yard field goal – the second-longest in GNAC history - and also connected from 30 yards and on both of his extra point attempts extending his streak to 58 in the Wolves' 48-20 loss to Grand Valley. He also averaged 65.6 yards on five kickoffs, two of which were touchbacks.

Week of Sept. 3-9: Offense - Demetrius Sumler, Central Washington (RB, 5-10, 220, Sr., San Diego, CA – Cathedral Catholic) rushed for 154 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Wildcats to a GNAC record setting rushing performance in a 56-28 win at Simon Fraser. CWU, which finished with 316 rushing yards, scored six touchdowns on the ground equaling the GNAC single-game record. Sumler's performance earned him GNAC *Red Lion Offensive Player of the Week* honors. **Defense** – Jeremiah Maluia, Humboldt State (DB, 5-11, 202, Jr., Compton, CA) forced two fumbles and also intercepted a pass leading to three touchdowns as the defending GNAC champions opened their conference season with a 42-17 home win over Azusa Pacific. Maluia claimed GNAC *Red Lion Defensive Player of the Week* honors with the performance. In the first quarter, he forced a fumble to set up Humboldt's first touchdown, a 26-yard pass from Alex Rump to Victor Spencer. Later in the period he had a 25-yard interception to set up a two-yard touchdown run by Nick Ricciardulli. Early in the third quarter he forced a fumble, which he returned 62 yards for a touchdown. He and the rest of the Jacks' secondary held Azusa Pacific to 132 net passing yards, and now rank No. 5 nationally in pass efficiency defense. Maluia also had two tackles. **Special Teams** – Alexander Bradt, Western Oregon (LB, 6-1, 210, Fr., Salem, OR – West Salem) is the GNAC *Red Lion Special Teams Player of the Week*. Bradt averaged 47.4 yards on five punts, including a long of 73 that was just one yard shy of the GNAC record.

Week of Sept. 10-16: Offense - Nick Ricciardulli, Humboldt State (RB, 5-8, 190, Jr., Poway, CA) rushed for a career-high 204 yards on 33 carries, averaging 6.2 yards to lead the Lumberjacks to a 41-21 home win against Simon Fraser. Ricciardulli scored a touchdown and broke a long run of 48 yards to set up another. He also caught two passes for 18 yards as the 'Jacks improved to 3-0. **Defense** - Cedrique Chaney, Central Washington (DB, 6-0, 188, Fr., Kelso, WA) saved four potential Western Oregon touchdowns in the Wildcats' 21-14 overtime win at Monmouth. Chaney had a GNAC-record tying three interceptions, two in the end zone and another at the Wildcat 11-yard line. He also forced a fumble deep in CWU territory in the fourth quarter which was returned 56 yards by defensive back Kevin Puckett to set up a 34-yard, five-play drive which culminated with a nine-yard touchdown run by Johri Fogerson to tie the game with 4:13 remaining in regulation. Chaney, who also had five tackles, got his first interception in the end zone on a third-and-goal play from the 10-yard line, on Western Oregon's first drive of the game. In the second quarter, on a first-and-10 play from the 13, he earned another end zone interception to set up a CWU kneel down to end the first half. In the third quarter, he intercepted a pass on a first-and-10 from the 36-yard line to end another WOU drive. His fourth-quarter forced fumble came after Western Oregon had drove to CWU to set up a potential game-clinching score. **Special Teams** - Cache Morgan, Dixie State (KR/DB, 5-11, 190, Sr., West Jordan, UT – Utah State) had three kickoff returns for 135 yards, including the second 100-yard return of his career to equal his own GNAC record. He also had a five-yard interception return

and a total of six tackles from his defensive back position as the Red Storm beat Azusa Pacific 24-22 to improve to 2-0 in GNAC play.

Week of Sept. 17-23: Offense – Demetrius Sumler, Central Washington (RB, 5-10, 220, Sr., San Diego, CA – Cathedral Catholic) rushed for 148 yards including touchdowns from three, four and 50 yards leading the Wildcats to a 41-17 win against Azusa Pacific at Pop Keeney Stadium in Bothell. Sumler’s second touchdown came with 3:56 left in the first half and his third touchdown came early in the third quarter opening up a 27-7 lead. Sumler also had two receptions for 11 yards. **Defense** – Scotland Foss, Western Oregon (LB, 6-3, 235, Sr., Albany, OR – West Albany) had two interceptions, including one in the end zone with 24 seconds remaining, to seal the Wolves’ 20-16 home win against Simon Fraser. The clinching interception came after Simon Fraser quarterback Trey Wheeler had completed seven consecutive passes driving his team from his own 22 to the WOU 14. Foss also had six tackles, including four primaries. **Special Teams** - Chris Campbell, Humboldt State (P/LB, 5-11, 230, Jr., San Diego, CA) averaged 42.3 yards on three punts including a fourth-quarter boot that traveled 48 yards before it hit the ground with backspin and remained in place at the DSC 4-yard line.
