GNAC RED LION PLAYERS-OF-THE-WEEK: Offense – Trey Wheeler, Simon Fraser (QB, 6-1, 190, So., Seattle, WA – Liberty) completed 32 of 47 passes for 378 yards and four touchdowns as the Clan matched the GNAC record for most points scored in a conference game in a 66-

38 home win against Azusa Pacific. Wheeler, who has had four of the five highest passing totals this fall in the GNAC (404, 378, 312 and 310), led SFU to a 654-yard offensive output in the contest. SFU matched Humboldt State's record for most points it accomplished in a 66-20 win on Nov. 13, 2010 against the Clan. **Defense** – Kraig Akins, Western Oregon (DE, 6-2, 280, So., Springfield, OR – Thurston) had seven tackles, including two quarterback sacks as the Wolves held previously nationally 24th-ranked Humboldt State to 230 yards in a 42-14 win at the Redwood Bowl. **Special Teams** – Austin Haslem, Dixie State (K, 5-9, 170, Fr., Philomath, OR) averaged 55 yards on kickoffs and also scored five points, kicking two extra points and a 27-yard field goal as the Red Storm beat first-place Central Washington 29-21. **Honorable Mention** – Joe Harris, WOU; Mitch Frei, Dixie State; Kris Williams, Dixie State; Casey Chin, Simon Fraser.

HISTORIC DAY FOR PALMER: Last Saturday was a historic day for Simon Fraser running back Bo Palmer. First of all, Palmer rushed for 186 yards on 16 carries, scoring on runs of 12, 5 and 67 yards. He also had 113 yards on five pass receptions including a 75-yarder for a touchdown. His 299 all-purpose yardage total is the second highest in GNAC history, trailing only a 322-yard effort by CWU's Nat Conley (all rushing) against Humboldt State on Oct. 27, 2001. His 75-yard pass reception from quarterback Trey Wheeler equaled the 15th longest in GNAC history and his 67-yard touchdown run equaled the 16th longest. Those two plays came during a 92-second span of the fourth quarter. He also became the first player in GNAC history to score four or more touchdowns in back-to-back games as he had four rushing touchdowns on Sept. 29 in a 41-28 win over Dixie State.

THE PASSING GAME: Azusa Pacific and Simon Fraser combined to throw for 832 yards and had 1,128 yards in total offense as the Clan tied a GNAC single-game record for points scored in a conference game in their 66-38 win. Azusa QB Nick Owens had a GNAC-season high 425 passing yards, while SFU had 407 yards, including 378 by Trey Wheeler. Both QBs had four touchdown passes ... Three receivers had 100 or more yards including Palmer (113), APU's Nick Perez (3-112) and SFU's Lemar Durant (7-106). Both Durant and Perez scored two touchdowns. Durant has had five 100-yard receiving games this fall, three shy of the GNAC single-season record of eight set by CWU's Johnny Spevak in 2008 ... Two different Dixie State quarterbacks threw for 200 yards in the Red Storm's win over Central Washington. Griff Robles completed 12 of 19 for 244 yards and Kaleo Nawahine had 234 yards on 16 completions in 31 attempts. Dixie gained 585 yards as it

ended a eight-game losing streak to the Wildcats ... Humboldt State's Alex Rump had his string of passes without an interception end at 136 (134 this year) early in the first quarter of the Lumberjacks' 42-14 loss to Western Oregon. Rump, who had tied a GNAC record by going five consecutive games without an interception, later left the game with an arm injury after completing 12 of 20 for 91 yards.

RECORD-TYING INTERCEPTION: Kevin Puckett equaled the GNAC record with a 100-yard interception return in the third quarter of Central Washington's loss at Dixie State Saturday. CWU's Jerome Williams set the record against Western Oregon on Oct. 17, 2009. It will be a record that can never be broken as under NCAA rules all returns in the end zone are measured from the goal line. CWU has the three longest returns in conference history including a 97-yarder by Brandon Kennedy against Western Oregon on Oct. 1, 2005. No one else has had a return longer than 73 yards ... CWU quarterback Ryan Robertson became the sixth player in GNAC history to surpass the 6,000-yard mark in career offense and passing offense in the contest. Robertson completed 11 of 29 passes for 174 yards and rushed for 11 yards and has now thrown for 6,032 career yards and has 6,120 yards in total offense.

ROAD WARRIORS: Central Washington, which is scheduled to host Simon Fraser this Saturday, has played on the road in six consecutive weeks. Two of those games were played at Pop Keeney Stadium in Bothell due to poor air quality in the central Washington area due to wild fires. Under NCAA rules those games count as neutral site contests. Ten of CWU's last 11 games have been played away from Ellensburg. The only home game during that stretch was on Nov. 12, 2011 against Dixie State. The Wildcats won that contest 42-14.

GNAC SWITCHES TO SUPER REGIONAL III: The GNAC will compete in Super Regional III this fall after spending the past few years in Super Regional IV. Also part of the 44-team Super Regional III is the MIAA (Mid-America), the Great American Conference and the Northern Sun. The MIAA was also part of Super Regional IV last season. Six teams from each of the four regions qualify for the playoffs. "Earned access" berths are awarded to certain conferences which have a team ranked in the Top 10 in their region. With only five playoff-eligible members, the GNAC does not receive an earned access berth. Azusa Pacific is a provisional NCAA member and is not eligible for the playoffs.

GAME RECAPS AND NOTES

Dixie State 29, Central Washington 21 (at Saint George): Dixie State scored the game's final 19 points, including 13 in the final 4 ½ minutes as the Red Storm earned its first win against Central Washington in nine all-time meetings ... Dixie led 10-7 at halftime before CWU used two interceptions early in the third quarter to go ahead 21-10 ... First defensive back Kevin Puckett had a 100-yard return with 10:45 left in the third quarter to put his team

ahead 14-10. Moments later linebacker John Koopman had a 14-yard return to set up a 40-yard, five-play drive that culminated with a 22-yard touchdown run by Demetrius Sumler. Sumler also scored on a 33-yard pass from quarterback Ryan Robertson for CWU's only first-half touchdown. Sumler had 149 all-purpose yards, rushing for 96 on 21 carries and catching three passes for a team-high 52 yards ... Dixie dominated the remainder of the game as Matt Porrazzo caught a 56-yard touchdown pass from Griff Robles with 3:18 left in the third quarter. Then with 4:23 remaining in the final period, A.J. Johnson scored from one yard to finish off a 12-play, 99-yard drive and put the Red Storm up 22-21. Dixie converted two third down plays on the drive and a fourth-down – a 19-yard pass from Robles to Mitch Frei to the CWU two-yard line right before the touchdown. Frei finished the contest with a game-high six receptions for 95 yards ... Dixie's clinching score was a two-yard run by Robles with 1:39 remaining ... CWU had a chance to tie the game with a touchdown and two-point conversion, but Robertson was intercepted in the end zone on a first-down pass from the 40 by Nick Porrazzo ... Robles (12-19-0, 244 yards) and Kaleo Nawahine (16-31-2, 234 yards) combined to complete 28 of 50 passes for 478 yards. Zack Fox had four catches for 120 yards, while Andre Aron had five for 98. Dixie finished the game with a 585-297 advantage in total offense converting on 10 of 20 third-down plays ... Puckett led Central's tacklers with 14, including 10 solos. Linebacker Stan Langlow had 11 and also broke up two passes ... Nose tackle Kris Williams had seven tackles to lead the Red Storm.

Western Oregon 42, Humboldt State 14 (at Arcata, CA): Quarterback Cody VonAppen rushed for 90 yards and three touchdowns and had 187 yards of total offense as the Wolves snapped Humboldt State's home win streak at eight with a 28-point win ... The Lumberjacks hadn't lost at home since falling to Western Oregon 26-24 on Nov. 6, 2010 ... The Wolves used a eight-yard touchdown interception return by 330-pound defensive lineman Sipili Tuigamalala – the first interception this season off HSU QB Alex Rump - before adding touchdowns on a 15-yard run by Joe Harris and on a three-yard pass from VonAppen to Lucas Gonsalves to go ahead 21-0 after one quarter ... After Nick Ricciardulli got the 'Jacks on the board in the second quarter on a 12-yard run, VonAppen scored on runs of 16 and three yards to give his team a 35-7 lead midway through the second period ... Western Oregon outgained Humboldt State 347-230 in total offense, including 250-57 rushing. Harris had 126 yards on 17 carries, including a long of 61 yards. Ricciardulli had 78 yards on 18 carries for Humboldt, failing to rush for 100 for the first time in six games this season ... Rump completed 12 of 20 passes for 91 yards before leaving the game with an arm injury. Casey Mintz, a redshirt freshman, finished up completing eight of 24 for 82 yards ... Defensive end Kraig Akins led the WOU defense with seven tackles, including two of the Wolves' five sacks. Tackle Gustave Benthin had six, including 2 ½ for losses of six yards. Nose tackle Sean McDonald led the HSU defense with 12 tackles. Defensive end Alex Markarian had nine, including a sack.

Simon Fraser 66, Azusa Pacific 38 (at Burnaby): Simon Fraser had a pair of 20-point quarters including 20 in the second period and 28 in the fourth in outscoring Azusa Pacific at Terry Fox Field ... The Clan outgained the Cougars 654-474 producing the most yards in a GNAC game since Western Oregon gained 684 against Simon Fraser on Sept. 18, 2010 ... The two teams combined for 1,128 yards including 832 passing. Simon Fraser rushed for 247 yards as Bo Palmer had 187 on 16 rushes. The Clan had 407 passing yards, 378 by Trey Wheeler who completed 32 of 47, four for touchdowns. Palmer had 113 receiving yards on five catches and finished with 299 all-purpose yards, the second most in GNAC history. He had two of the longest scoring plays in GNAC history – just 92 seconds apart in the fourth quarter. His 75-yard touchdown reception equaled the 15th longest in conference history. Moments later Palmer, who had four touchdowns for the second game in a row, ran 67 yards for a TD, equaling the 16th longest rush in GNAC history ... SFU's Bobby Pospischil had 12 receptions for 95 yards. Four times this season, Pospischil has had 10 or more catches in a game. Lemar Durant had seven receptions for 106 yards, scoring on catches of 14 and 37 yards. He has had five 100-yard receiving games this fall ...APU's Nick Owens had GNAC season highs for total offense (462) and passing (425). His total offense figure is the fourth highest in conference history. Owens completed 26 of 40, including two touchdowns to Nick Perez (3 catches-112 yards) and one each to Mike Martens (4-52) and David Trifeletti. Erik Johnson had six receptions for 73 yards ... Safety Nick Grunsky had 13 tackles to lead the Cougar defense, while cornerback Silas Goma had six tackles, an interception, a blocked kick and three pass breakups. DB Casey Chinn led Simon Fraser with eight tackles, two for losses of six yards.

PREVIOUS RED LION PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Week of Aug. 27-Sept. 2: Offense - Nick Ricciardulli, Humboldt State (RB, 5-8, 190, Jr., Poway, CA) rushed for 159 yards on 24 carries, scoring on touchdown runs of one and 74 yards in the Lumberjacks' 38-13 win over Colorado Mesa. Ricciardulli also had three receptions and finished with 162 all-purpose yards. His 74-yard jaunt equals the fifth longest in conference history. **Defense –** Alex Markarian, Humboldt State (DE, 6-4, 245, So., Chino Hills, CA) had nine tackles including six solos and three quarterback sacks for losses of 16. **Special Teams –** Kelly Morgan, Western Oregon (K, 5-10, 170, Sr., Sherwood, OR) kicked a 53-yard field goal – the second-longest in GNAC history - and also connected from 30 yards and on both of his extra point attempts extending his streak to 58 in the Wolves' 48-20 loss to Grand Valley. He also averaged 65.6 yards on five kickoffs, two of which were touchbacks.

Week of Sept. 3-9: Offense - Demetrius Sumler, Central Washington (RB, 5-10, 220, Sr., San Diego, CA – Cathedral Catholic) rushed for 154 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Wildcats to a GNAC record setting rushing performance in a 56-28 win at Simon Fraser. CWU, which finished with 316 rushing yards, scored six touchdowns on the ground equaling the GNAC single-

game record. **Defense –** Jeremiah Maluia, Humboldt State (DB, 5-11, 202, Jr., Compton, CA) forced two fumbles and also intercepted a pass leading to three touchdowns as the defending GNAC champions opened their conference season with a 42-17 home win over Azusa Pacific. In the first quarter, he forced a fumble to set up Humboldt's first touchdown, a 26-yard pass from Alex Rump to Victor Spencer. Later in the period he had a 25-yard interception to set up a two-yard touchdown run by Nick Ricciardulli. Early in the third quarter he forced a fumble, which he returned 62 yards for a touchdown. He and the rest of the Jacks' secondary held Azusa Pacific to 132 net passing yards, and now rank No. 5 nationally in pass efficiency defense. Maluia also had two tackles. **Special Teams –** Alexander Bradt, Western Oregon (LB, 6-1, 210, Fr., Salem, OR – West Salem) averaged 47.4 yards on five punts, including a long of 73 that was just one yard shy of the GNAC record.

Week of Sept. 10-16: Offense - Nick Ricciardulli, Humboldt State (RB, 5-8, 190, Jr., Poway, CA) rushed for a career-high 204 yards on 33 carries, averaging 6.2 yards to lead the Lumberjacks to a 41-21 home win against Simon Fraser. Ricciardulli scored a touchdown and broke a long run of 48 yards to set up another. He also caught two passes for 18 yards as the 'Jacks improved to 3-0. **Defense -** Cedrique Chaney, Central Washington (DB, 6-0, 188, Fr., Kelso, WA) saved four potential Western Oregon touchdowns in the Wildcats' 21-14 overtime win at Monmouth. Chaney had a GNAC-record tying three interceptions, two in the end zone and another at the Wildcat 11-yard line. He also forced a fumble deep in CWU territory in the fourth quarter which was returned 56 yards by defensive back Kevin Puckett to set up a 34-yard, five-play drive which culminated with a nine-yard touchdown run by Johri Fogerson to tie the game with 4:13 remaining in regulation. Chaney, who also had five tackles, got his first interception in the end zone on a third-and-goal play from the 10-yard line, on Western Oregon's first drive of the game. In the second quarter, on a first-and-10 play from the 13, he earned another end zone interception to set up a CWU kneel down to end the first half. In the third quarter, he intercepted a pass on a first-and-10 from the 36-yard line to end another WOU drive. His fourth-quarter forced fumble came after Western Oregon had drove to CWU to set up a potential game-clinching score. **Special Teams -** Cache Morgan, Dixie State (KR/DB, 5-11, 190, Sr., West Jordan, UT – Utah State) had three kickoff returns for 135 yards, including the second 100-yard return of his career to equal his own GNAC record. He also had a five-yard interception return and a total of six tackles from his defensive back position as the Red Storm beat Azusa Pacific 24-22 to improve to 2-0 in GNAC play.

Week of Sept. 17-23: Offense – Demetrius Sumler, Central Washington (RB, 5-10, 220, Sr., San Diego, CA – Cathedral Catholic) rushed for 148 yards including touchdowns from three, four and 50 yards leading the Wildcats to a 41-17 win against Azusa Pacific at Pop Keeney Stadium in Bothell. Sumler's second touchdown came with 3:56 left in the first half and his third touchdown

came early in the third quarter opening up a 27-7 lead. Sumler also had two receptions for 11 yards. **Defense** – Scotland Foss, Western Oregon (LB, 6-3, 235, Sr., Albany, OR – West Albany) had two interceptions, including one in the end zone with 24 seconds remaining, to seal the Wolves’ 20-16 home win against Simon Fraser. The clinching interception came after Simon Fraser quarterback Trey Wheeler had completed seven consecutive passes driving his team from his own 22 to the WOU 14. Foss also had six tackles, including four primaries. **Special Teams** - Chris Campbell, Humboldt State (P/LB, 5-11, 230, Jr., San Diego, CA) averaged 42.3 yards on three punts including a fourth-quarter boot that traveled 48 yards before it hit the ground with backspin and remained in place at the DSC 4-yard line.

Week of Sept. 24-30: Offense – Bo Palmer, Simon Fraser (RB, 5-9, 209, Sr., North Vancouver, BC) rushed for 145 yards on just 17 carries and scored four touchdowns leading the Clan to a 41-28 home win over Dixie State. Palmer scored in each period – from two yards in the first quarter, 37 early in the second period, 54 late in the third stanza and one midway through the fourth quarter as the Clan earned their first conference victory of the season. Palmer, who averaged 8.5 yards per rush, also caught four passes for 23 yards as SFU had a total of 463 yards in total offense. **Defense** – Isaiah Davis, Central Washington (CB, 6-0, 176, Fr., Bremerton, WA – South Kitsap) had 10 tackles and broke up three passes (including two in the end zone) leading the Wildcats to a 31-3 win over ninth-ranked Humboldt State, which came into the contest ranked ninth nationally in scoring averaging 42.5 points. Davis also had 98 return yards, including 42 yards on five punt returns and 56 on two kickoffs. His 40-yard return on the game’s opening kickoff set up a 56-yard, 11-play touchdown drive. **Special Teams** – Alexander Bradt, Western Oregon (P, 6-1, 210, Fr., Salem, OR – West Salem) averaged 42.8 yards on eight punts including a long of 54 in the Wolves’ 20-7 road win at Azusa Pacific Bradt currently ranks eighth nationally in punting averaging 44.1 yards per attempt.
