GNAC RED LION PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Offense – Lemar Durant, Simon Fraser (WR, 6-2, 226, So., Coquitlam, BC) caught 12 passes for 228 yards and four touchdowns to lead the Clan to a 58-47 win over Dixie State and earn *Red Lion Offensive Player of the Week* honors. Durant tied a GNAC single-game record for most touchdown receptions and his yardage total was just eight yards shy of the GNAC single-game record. He had TD catches of 10, 73, 27 and six yards, four of a GNAC single-game record six thrown by Clan quarterback Trey Wheeler. **Defense** – Ryan Moreno, Humboldt State (LB, 6-0, 207, Poway, CA) and Sean Barber, Azusa Pacific (LB, 6-1, 225, Jr., Edgewood, WA – Puyallup) ... Moreno scored the Lumberjacks' first touchdown on a 20-yard interception return. The true freshman then forced Central Washington, which was trailing 14-7, to settle for a fourth-quarter field goal after breaking up a pass attempt on third down. He also made five tackles as the defending champion 'Jacks took command of the GNAC race with a 14-10 victory ... Barber had 11 tackles, including one for a loss, and also had an interception, leading Azusa Pacific to a 19-3 win over Western Oregon, which came into the game with a five-game win streak. The win was the second straight for the Cougars after opening the season with seven losses. **Special Teams** – Jamie Cacciatore, Azusa Pacific (K, 5-8, 175, Fr., Orange, CA – El Modena) tied a GNAC single-game record kicking four field goals (from 25, 18, 33 and 25 yards) to provide all his team's scoring prior to a touchdown in the final 11 seconds of the game. Cacciatore leads the GNAC in field goals this season, making 12 of 17. **Honorable Mention** – Griff Robles, Dixie State; Cache Morgan, Dixie State; Victor Spencer, Humboldt State; Tavoy Moore, Central Washington.

QBs Combine for 821 Yards, 11 Touchdowns: Quarterbacks Trey Wheeler and Griff Robles combined for 821 yards and 11 touchdowns in Simon Fraser's 58-47 win at Dixie ... Wheeler completed 36 of 54 passes for 482 yards and a GNAC-record six touchdowns. Wheeler's 482 yards were just six shy of the GNAC single-game record of 488 yards set by Josh Riddell of Western Oregon against Humboldt State in 2008. His six touchdown passes broke the GNAC record of five previously held by nine different

players, including Central Washington's Mike Reilly who did it three different times ... Robles, who tied the old record tossing five touchdown passes, had 392 yards of total offense, rushing for 53 yards and a touchdown and completing 32 of 45 passes for 339 yards.

Big Days for HSU, CWU Receivers: While running backs Nick Ricciardulli and Demetrius Sumler have put up big numbers this fall for Humboldt State and Central Washington, last Saturday was a day for the receivers in the 'Jacks 14-10 win ... HSU's Victor Spencer caught seven passes for 116 yards. Included in Spencer's receptions was a 47-yard catch that placed the ball on the CWU 7-yard line, setting up the game-winning touchdown on Ricciardulli's 1-yard run ... CWU's Tavoy Moore had 226 all-purpose yards, catching nine passes for 94 yards and also earning 132 return yards, 59 on four punt returns and 83 on three kickoffs.

Another Long Return For Morgan: Dixie State's Cache Morgan had 169 yards on five kickoff returns, including a GNAC-record setting third career kickoff touchdown return. Unlike his first two which were 100-yarders, this one was a mere 97 yards. Morgan also had 10 tackles and the game's only interception ... Just a week ago, Morgan also had a long return for a two-point defensive PAT conversion following a blocked kick. That was the fifth defensive PAT in conference history. The sixth came Saturday as Chandler Gayton returned a blocked PAT for the final two points in Simon Fraser's victory with just 16 seconds remaining.

GNAC Rushing, Receiving Records in Jeopardy: GNAC single season records for rushing and receiving are both in jeopardy ... Humboldt State running back Nick Ricciardulli has rushed for 1,321 yards and needs 96 more yards to match the record of 1,417 set by HSU's Lyndon Rowells last season ... Simon Fraser wide receiver Lemar Durant, a transfer from UNLV, has 75 catches for 1,096 yards and 14 touchdowns. With two games remaining he needs 16 catches, 346 yards and six touchdowns to match the single-season records of 91, 1442 and 20 set by Central Washington's Johnny Spevak during the 2008 campaign.

GNAC Switches to Super Regional III: The GNAC will compete in Super Regional III this fall after spending the past few years in Super Regional IV. Also part of the 44-team Super Regional III is the MIAA (Mid-America), the Great American Conference and the Northern Sun. The MIAA was also part of Super Regional IV last season. Six teams from each of the four regions qualify for the playoffs. "Earned access" berths are awarded to certain conferences which have a team ranked in the Top 10 in their region. With only five playoff-eligible members, the GNAC does not receive an earned access berth. Azusa Pacific is a provisional NCAA member and is not eligible for the playoffs.

GAME RECAPS AND NOTES

Humboldt State 14, Central Washington 10 (at Arcata, CA): Humboldt State drove 54 yards in four plays in the

fourth quarter for its only offensive touchdown of the night in a 14-10 win over Central Washington before 4,996 fans at the Redwood Bowl ... A 47-yard catch by Victor Spencer, one of seven receptions for 116 yards for the wide receiver, set up a first-and-goal at the seven-yard line. Three players later Nick Ricciardulli scored from the one-yard line for the go-ahead score ... Humboldt's defense helped set up the score, forcing CWU to punt from its own nine-yard line giving HSU the ball near mid-field ... CWU later drove 71 yards in 13 plays, but had to settle for a 29-yard field goal by Sean Davis with 5:31 remaining when freshman linebacker Ryan Moreno broke up a third-and-nine CWU pass from the HSU 12-yard line ... Humboldt's first touchdown came on a 20-yard interception return by Moreno in the second quarter to tie the game 7-7 at halftime. Central's first-half touchdown came on a four-yard run by running back Demetrius Sumler, his league-leading 17th touchdown of the season. That is just three shy of the GNAC single-season record of 20 set by wide receiver Johnny Spevak in 2008 ... CWU controlled the football for 38:02 compared to just 21:58 by HSU, but had just 14 more yards (309-295) in the game which was dominated by the respective defenses ... HSU defensive back Tanner Webb had a team-high 10 tackles, including six solos. Humboldt also had nine tackles for losses of 28 yards – two each by defensive end Silas Sarvinski and DB Marcus Graves. Both of Sarvinski's were among four sacks by the 'Jacks. Moreno and DB Jeremiah Maluia had interceptions ... CWU linebacker Louie Bruketta also had 10 tackles, matching Webb's total, while linebacker Stan Langlow had nine. The Wildcats had just three tackles for losses, none of the sacks ... CWU punter Matt Burke averaged 46.6 yards on five punts and Tavoy Moore had 132 return yards, 59 on four punts and 73 on three kickoffs. Wildcat kicker Sean Davis, however, missed 37 and 30 yard field goals in the first half before converting in the fourth period ... Offensively, CWU had 112 rushing yards, 66 on 23 carries by Sumler and 59 by nine totes by Jordan Todd. QB Ryan Robertson completed 20 of 34 passes for 184 yards as Moore had 94 yards on nine catches and Anthony Spain had 47 on seven carries ... Ricciardulli had 52 yards on 22 carries for Humboldt, which had 84 yards rushing. QB Casey Mintz completed 11 of 20 passes for 211 yards.

Azusa Pacific 19, Western Oregon 3: Kicker Jamie Cacciatore connected on field goals from 25, 18, 33 and 25 yards to tie a GNAC single-game record for most field goals as Azusa Pacific won its second consecutive game after opening the season with seven losses ... The game's only touchdown came on a four-yard run by Terrell Watson with 11 seconds remaining in the contest after the Wolves turned the ball over on downs deep in their territory in the game's final minute ... Neither team generated much offense. Azusa had 248 yards, including 110 rushing and 138 passing, while the Wolves had 211 yards, 106 rushing and 105 passing ... Watson had 49 yards on 24 rushes and quarterback Nick Owens completed seven of 26 passes for all his team's passing yardage. Mike Martens had three receptions for 71 yards ... Kenneth Haynes led the Wolves with 60 yards on 14 rushes. Two Wolf quarterbacks combined to complete 12 passes in 35 attempts. Antoine

Wafer had four receptions for 37 yards ... Linebacker Sean Barber led Azusa's defense with 11 tackles. He also had a tackle for a loss and one of APU's three interceptions. Defensive backs Spencer Danielson and Darrell Wilson also had interceptions ... Defensive end Gustave Benthin led the Wolf defense with four tackles for losses, totaling 25 yards. Benthin, defensive back Patrick Tepea and linebacker Devin Wells all had seven tackles.

Simon Fraser 58, Dixie State 47 (at Saint George, Utah):

Simon Fraser scored on a 37-yard pass from quarterback Trey Wheeler to tight end Jamal Kett early in the fourth quarter to snap a 35-35 tie and went on to defeat Dixie State 58-47 before a Homecoming crowd of 3,127 at Hansen Stadium ... The two teams combined for 1,094 yards of total offense, 575 by the Clan and 519 by the Red Storm with most of it coming through the air ... SFU quarterback Trey Wheeler completed 36 of 54 passes for 482 yards and a GNAC-record six touchdowns. Wheeler's 482 yards were just six shy of the GNAC single-game record of 488 yards set by Josh Riddell of Western Oregon against Humboldt State in 2008. His six touchdown passes broke the GNAC record of five previously held by nine different players, including current BC Lion quarterback Mike Reilly who did it three different times while playing for Central Washington ... Dixie's Griff Robles, who tied the old record tossing five touchdown passes, had 392 yards of total offense, rushing for 53 yards and a touchdown and completing 32 of 45 passes for 339 yards ... SFU wide receiver Lemar Durant had 12 catches for 228 yards, falling eight yards shy of the GNAC single-game record of 236 yards set by Central Washington's Nate Brookreson against Carroll in 2008 ... Durant had four TD catches, tying the conference record set by Dustin Creager of Humboldt State against Montana Tech in 2001 and equaled by CWU's Johnny Spevak against West Texas A&M in 2008 ... Simon Fraser, which outscored Dixie 28-20 in the second quarter and 23-20 in the fourth quarter, also got 96 rushing yards from Bo Palmer. In addition to Durant, two receivers had six catches each – Kyle Kawamoto (70 yards) and Bobby Pospischil (62 yards) ... Zack Fox (7-73) and Mitch Frei (6-62) each had two receiving touchdowns for Dixie State. Cache Morgan had 169 kickoff return yards, including 97 on his third career touchdown return. That is a GNAC record. Morgan also had 10 tackles and a pass interception ... The top tacklers were SFU defensive back Casey Chin and Dixie DB Cameron Greene with 11 each.

PREVIOUS RED LION PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Week of Aug. 27-Sept. 2: Offense - Nick Ricciardulli, Humboldt State (RB, 5-8, 190, Jr., Poway, CA) rushed for 159 yards on 24 carries, scoring on touchdown runs of one and 74 yards in the Lumberjacks' 38-13 win over Colorado Mesa. Ricciardulli also had three receptions and finished with 162 all-purpose yards. His 74-yard jaunt equals the fifth longest in conference history. **Defense** – Alex Markarian, Humboldt State (DE, 6-4, 245, So., Chino Hills, CA) had nine tackles including six solos and three quarterback sacks for losses of 16. **Special Teams** – Kelly Morgan, Western Oregon (K, 5-10, 170, Sr., Sherwood,

OR) kicked a 53-yard field goal – the second-longest in GNAC history - and also connected from 30 yards and on both of his extra point attempts extending his streak to 58 in the Wolves' 48-20 loss to Grand Valley. He also averaged 65.6 yards on five kickoffs, two of which were touchbacks.

Week of Sept. 3-9: Offense - Demetrius Sumler, Central Washington (RB, 5-10, 220, Sr., San Diego, CA – Cathedral Catholic) rushed for 154 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Wildcats to a GNAC record setting rushing performance in a 56-28 win at Simon Fraser. CWU, which finished with 316 rushing yards, scored six touchdowns on the ground equaling the GNAC single-game record. **Defense** – Jeremiah Maluia, Humboldt State (DB, 5-11, 202, Jr., Compton, CA) forced two fumbles and also intercepted a pass leading to three touchdowns as the defending GNAC champions opened their conference season with a 42-17 home win over Azusa Pacific. In the first quarter, he forced a fumble to set up Humboldt's first touchdown, a 26-yard pass from Alex Rump to Victor Spencer. Later in the period he had a 25-yard interception to set up a two-yard touchdown run by Nick Ricciardulli. Early in the third quarter he forced a fumble, which he returned 62 yards for a touchdown. He and the rest of the Jacks' secondary held Azusa Pacific to 132 net passing yards, and now rank No. 5 nationally in pass efficiency defense. Maluia also had two tackles. **Special Teams** – Alexander Bradt, Western Oregon (LB, 6-1, 210, Fr., Salem, OR – West Salem) averaged 47.4 yards on five punts, including a long of 73 that was just one yard shy of the GNAC record.

Week of Sept. 10-16: Offense - Nick Ricciardulli, Humboldt State (RB, 5-8, 190, Jr., Poway, CA) rushed for a career-high 204 yards on 33 carries, averaging 6.2 yards to lead the Lumberjacks to a 41-21 home win against Simon Fraser. Ricciardulli scored a touchdown and broke a long run of 48 yards to set up another. He also caught two passes for 18 yards as the 'Jacks improved to 3-0. **Defense** - Cedrique Chaney, Central Washington (DB, 6-0, 188, Fr., Kelso, WA) saved four potential Western Oregon touchdowns in the Wildcats' 21-14 overtime win at Monmouth. Chaney had a GNAC-record tying three interceptions, two in the end zone and another at the Wildcat 11-yard line. He also forced a fumble deep in CWU territory in the fourth quarter which was returned 56 yards by defensive back Kevin Puckett to set up a 34-yard, five-play drive which culminated with a nine-yard touchdown run by Johri Fogerson to tie the game with 4:13 remaining in regulation. Chaney, who also had five tackles, got his first interception in the end zone on a third-and-goal play from the 10-yard line, on Western Oregon's first drive of the game. In the second quarter, on a first-and-10 play from the 13, he earned another end zone interception to set up a CWU kneel down to end the first half. In the third quarter, he intercepted a pass on a first-and-10 from the 36-yard line to end another WOU drive. His fourth-quarter forced fumble came after Western Oregon had drove to CWU to set up a potential game-clinching score. **Special Teams** - Cache Morgan, Dixie State (KR/DB, 5-11, 190, Sr., West Jordan, UT – Utah

State) had three kickoff returns for 135 yards, including the second 100-yard return of his career to equal his own GNAC record. He also had a five-yard interception return and a total of six tackles from his defensive back position as the Red Storm beat Azusa Pacific 24-22 to improve to 2-0 in GNAC play.

Week of Sept. 17-23: Offense – Demetrius Sumler, Central Washington (RB, 5-10, 220, Sr., San Diego, CA – Cathedral Catholic) rushed for 148 yards including touchdowns from three, four and 50 yards leading the Wildcats to a 41-17 win against Azusa Pacific at Pop Keeney Stadium in Bothell. Sumler's second touchdown came with 3:56 left in the first half and his third touchdown came early in the third quarter opening up a 27-7 lead. Sumler also had two receptions for 11 yards. **Defense** – Scotland Foss, Western Oregon (LB, 6-3, 235, Sr., Albany, OR – West Albany) had two interceptions, including one in the end zone with 24 seconds remaining, to seal the Wolves' 20-16 home win against Simon Fraser. The clinching interception came after Simon Fraser quarterback Trey Wheeler had completed seven consecutive passes driving his team from his own 22 to the WOU 14. Foss also had six tackles, including four primaries. **Special Teams** - Chris Campbell, Humboldt State (P/LB, 5-11, 230, Jr., San Diego, CA) averaged 42.3 yards on three punts including a fourth-quarter boot that traveled 48 yards before it hit the ground with backspin and remained in place at the DSC 4-yard line.

Week of Sept. 24-30: Offense – Bo Palmer, Simon Fraser (RB, 5-9, 209, Sr., North Vancouver, BC) rushed for 145 yards on just 17 carries and scored four touchdowns leading the Clan to a 41-28 home win over Dixie State. Palmer scored in each period – from two yards in the first quarter, 37 early in the second period, 54 late in the third stanza and one midway through the fourth quarter as the Clan earned their first conference victory of the season. Palmer, who averaged 8.5 yards per rush, also caught four passes for 23 yards as SFU had a total of 463 yards in total offense. **Defense** – Isaiah Davis, Central Washington (CB, 6-0, 176, Fr., Bremerton, WA – South Kitsap) had 10 tackles and broke up three passes (including two in the end zone) leading the Wildcats to a 31-3 win over ninth-ranked Humboldt State, which came into the contest ranked ninth nationally in scoring averaging 42.5 points. Davis also had 98 return yards, including 42 yards on five punt returns and 56 on two kickoffs. His 40-yard return on the game's opening kickoff set up a 56-yard, 11-play touchdown drive. **Special Teams** – Alexander Bradt, Western Oregon (P, 6-1, 210, Fr., Salem, OR – West Salem) averaged 42.8 yards on eight punts including a long of 54 in the Wolves' 20-7 road win at Azusa Pacific Bradt currently ranks eighth nationally in punting averaging 44.1 yards per attempt.

Week of Oct. 1-7: Offense – Trey Wheeler, Simon Fraser (QB, 6-1, 190, So., Seattle, WA – Liberty) completed 32 of 47 passes for 378 yards and four touchdowns as the Clan matched the GNAC record for most points scored in a conference game in a 66-38 home win against Azusa Pacific. Wheeler, who has had four of the five highest passing totals this fall in the GNAC (404, 378, 312 and

310), led SFU to a 654-yard offensive output in the contest. SFU matched Humboldt State's record for most points it accomplished in a 66-20 win on Nov. 13, 2010 against the Clan. **Defense** – Kraig Akins, Western Oregon (DE, 6-2, 280, So., Springfield, OR – Thurston) had seven tackles, including two quarterback sacks as the Wolves held previously nationally 24th-ranked Humboldt State to 230 yards in a 42-14 win at the Redwood Bowl. **Special Teams** – Austin Haslem, Dixie State (K, 5-9, 170, Fr., Philomath, OR) averaged 55 yards on kickoffs and also scored five points, kicking two extra points and a 27-yard field goal as the Red Storm beat first-place Central Washington 29-21.

Week of Oct. 8-14: Offense - Cody VonAppen, Western Oregon (QB, 5-10, 200, Sr., Kailua, HI) and Demetrius Sumler, Central Washington (RB, 5-10, 220, Sr., San Diego, CA – Colorado) are the *Red Lion Offensive Co-Players of the Week*. VonAppen completed 16 of 27 passes for 424 yards and four touchdowns as the Wolves used a 21-point first quarter and a 28-point fourth quarter to cruise to a 66-20 win over Dixie State. VonAppen had one of the most efficient games in GNAC history by a quarterback averaging a GNAC-record 26.5 yards per completion. The previous record for yards per completion was 25.5 by WOU's Josh Riddell (13-332) against CWU in 2008. Sumler rushed for 226 yards and tied a GNAC record with five rushing touchdowns to lead the Wildcats to a 51-10 Homecoming win before 5,120 fans at Tomlinson Stadium. Sumler scored on runs of one and 47 yards in the first quarter, 27 in the second quarter, eight in the third quarter and 37 in the fourth quarter moving into third place in the nation in scoring with 84 points. He also caught three passes for four yards. **Defense** - Colton Russi, Humboldt State (LB, 6-2, 240, Jr., Meadow Vista, CA) who was coming back from a leg injury that kept him out of the lineup for three games, made several big hits and led the Jacks in tackles with nine in a 24-20 win over Azusa Pacific in earning *Red Lion Defensive Player of the Week* honors. **Special Teams** - Chris Campbell, Humboldt State (P, 5-10, 170, So, Granite Bay, CA) averaged 40.8 yards on eight punts, including a long of 51 yards in the Lumberjacks' 24-20 win over Azusa Pacific. Campbell placed two punts inside the 20-yard line and didn't have a touchback to claim the *Red Lion Special Teams Player of the Week* award.

Week of Oct. 22-28: Offense - Nick Ricciardulli, Humboldt State (RB, 5-8, 190, Jr., Poway, Calif.) rushed for 206 yards on only 18 carries, scoring three touchdowns and surpassing 200 yards for the third time this season and the second consecutive game to claim his third *Red Lion Player of the Week* award this fall. He was also the Jacks' leading receiver with four catches for 83 yards, including a 60-yard touchdown hook-up from quarterback Casey Mintz. Ricciardulli, who ranks third in NCAA Division II rushing with 158.6 yards per game, has gone over the 100-yard mark in all but one of the 'Jacks eight games to equal a GNAC single-season record for most 100-yard rushing games of seven. **Defense** - Nick Grunsky, Azusa Pacific (SS, 5-10, 190, Jr., Folsom, CA – Vista del Lago) had an interception at the Cougars' 11-yard line with 12 seconds left to seal a 24-17 upset of Central Washington. Just prior

to the interception, he was credited with a pass breakup. Grunsky also earned eight tackles in the win in earning *Red Lion Defensive Player of the Week* honors. **Special Teams** - Gustave Benthin, Western Oregon (DL, 6-2, 285, Jr., Nampa, ID) blocked an 18-yard field goal attempt that would have tied the game with 6:30 left in the fourth-quarter as the Wolves extended their win streak to five games with a 20-17 road win at Simon Fraser earning him *Red Lion Special Team* honors. He also had seven tackles and assisted on a tackle for a loss.
