2014 *Don Hansen* All-Super Region Three Team Abenoja, Gordon, Allen, Revis, Hoffner Earn Top Regional Honors

PITTSBURG, Kan. — The Don Hansen Football Committee has released the 2014 Don Hansen NCAA Division II All-Super Region Three squad today (Dec. 10).

Pittsburg State quarterback **Anthony Abenoja**, a national finalist for the 2014 Harlon Hill Trophy, was named the Super Region Three Offensive Player of the Year, while Minnesota State defensive end **Josh Rodgers** was selected the Defensive Player of the Year. Ouachita Baptist return specialist **Etuaj Allen** garnered Special Teams Player of the Year honors, while Western Oregon all-purpose back **Paul Revis** received Freshman of the Year recognition. Minnesota State head coach **Todd Hoffner**, who has guided the Mavericks to a 13-0 record and a berth in the NCAA Division II national semifinals this Saturday (Dec. 13), was named the Super Region Three Coach of the Year.

Abenoja, a senior from Overland Park, Kan., passed for 3,871 yards and 32 touchdowns and set a Division II record with 314 pass attempts without an interception while leading the Gorillas to MIAA co-championship and the second round of the NCAA-II playoffs. Gordon, a junior from Milwaukee, Wis., has made 73 tackles (35 solo) with 20.0 tackles-for-loss and 16.5 quarterback sacks for the Mavericks as they prepare for an NCAA-II semifinal matchup against undefeated Concord (W. Va.) University. Allen, a senior from San Antonio, Texas, led Division II with three punt return TDs, while averaging 31.5 yards per return. Revis, from Scappoose, Ore., compiled 2,029 all-purpose yards (184.5 ypq) on the season for the Wolves.

Hoffner returned from a two-year absence as head coach to guide the Mavericks to a 13-0 record to date, including the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference co-championship. Hoffner's offensive unit ranks ninth in Division II in scoring (42.5 ppg), while the Mavs defense leads the country in points allowed (12.8 ppg).

The *Don Hansen* team carries out the legacy of long-time small college football advocate Don Hansen, who passed away at age 75 on Aug. 29, 2010. Hansen, from Brookfield, Ill., started and published *Don Hansen's National Weekly Football Gazette* for three decades, selecting NCAA Division II All-America teams for the first time in 1988. Don Hansen's Football Gazette began selecting Division II All-Region squads in 2003.

The first-team and second-team All-Region selections advance to a national ballot from which the 2014 Don Hansen NCAA Division II All-America team will be named in January.

Minnesota State led the way with 11 honorees, followed by MIAA co-champions Pittsburg State and Northwest Missouri each with nine honorees apiece. Great American Conference champion Ouachita Baptist University, Harding University and the University of Minnesota Duluth each received six selections.

A total of 113 players earned some form of *Don Hansen* All-Super Region Three honors. Players from 37 of the 49 football-playing schools in Super Region Three earned All-Region accolades.
