GNAC RED LION PLAYERS OF THE WEEK: Patrick Simon, Seattle Pacific (F, 6-8, Sr., Ephrata, WA) scored 42 points, including 29 in a ROOT SPORTS regionally-televvised game against Western Washington to lead the Falcons to a 76-60 win over the 19th ranked Vikings, halting WWU's GNAC and school-record home winning streak at 36 games. Simon shot 72.7 percent from the floor (16 of 22), missing just once (6 of 7) from the three-point

line where he has the fourth best career percentage in GNAC history, converting 109 of 232 (47.0 percent). Simon also had 12 rebounds in two contests, including a game-high seven in a 73-49 win Saturday at Simon Fraser. He also contributed four steals to SPU's two victories, its first two wins this season on an opponent's home court.

HONORABLE MENTION: Andrew Kelly, Alaska Fairbanks (F, 6-7, Sr., Gilbert, AZ – Chandler-Gilbert) scored 30 points to lead the Nanooks to home wins over Central Washington and Northwest Nazarene. Kelly, who made 11 of 14 field goal attempts, also had 16 rebounds, seven assists, five steals and three blocks ... JB Pillard, Central Washington (F, 6-7, Sr., Kirkland, WA – Juanita) had back-to-back road double-doubles, scoring 13 points and grabbing 13 rebounds in an 84-80 overtime loss at Alaska Fairbanks and producing 23 points and 12 rebounds in a 95-88 win at Alaska Anchorage ... Anye Turner, Western Washington (F, 6-7, Jr., Olympia, WA – Black Hills & South Puget Sound) led the Vikings in four categories – points (36), rebounds (19), steals (7) and blocks (4) – as they split two games ... Travis Thompson, Alaska Anchorage (G, 6-1, Jr., Anchorage, AK – Dimond) recorded his fourth 30-point game of the season, scoring 34 points in a 92-83 home win over Northwest Nazarene. In two contests, Thompson had 56 points and eight assists.

MORE MENTIONABLES: Austin Hudson, MSU Billings (F, 6-7, Jr., Salt Lake City, UT – Brighton & Central Wyoming) notched his third and fourth double-doubles of the season in road games at Simon Fraser (25 points, 12 rebounds) and Western Washington (14 points, 11 rebounds) ... Derek Isaak, Northwest Nazarene (G, 6-2, Fr., Coulee City, WA) scored 45 points – all on three-pointers (15 of 28) – in two games in Alaska. Isaak, who came into the week averaging 5.6 points per game, had 21 point at Anchorage and 24 at Fairbanks in nine and 10-point losses. He also had eight assists ... Ryan Rogers, Saint Martin's (F, 6-4, Jr., Auburn, WA – Lower Columbia) had 19 points and seven rebounds to lead the Saints to a 79-73 road win at Western Oregon.

FROM THE RECORD BOOK: Kyle Fossman of Alaska Anchorage and Mark McLaughlin of Central Washington became the 56th and 57th members of the GNAC 1000-Point Club. Fossman had 12 points to increase his total to 1,010, while McLaughlin had 54 increasing his career total to 1,009. McLaughlin is the quickest player in GNAC history to reach 1,000 in terms of games played reaching the milestone in his 42nd career game. His career average of 24.02 is the best in conference history. Next to reach the grand mark should be UAA's Travis Thompson who currently has 948 career points ... CWU's Kevin Davis had six blocks improving his career blocked shot average to a GNAC-record 2.28 and replacing Brannon Stone of Seattle Pacific (2.26 between 1998 and 2002) as the all-time leader.

STREAK ENDS AT 36: Western Washington had its 36-game home win streak snapped by Seattle Pacific Wednesday (76-60). The Vikings hadn't lost in Carver Gymnasium since Jan. 7, 2012, when Western Oregon

prevailed 83-73 ... Of the 36 wins, 14 were by single-digit margins, including one-point decisions over Central Washington (86-85 on Jan. 10, 2013) and Western Oregon (67-66 on Dec. 5, 2013). One of the wins was in overtime (83-76 over Seattle Pacific on Feb. 2, 2013) ... Nineteen of the victories were conference games (one short of WWU's own GNAC record) and six were West Regional playoff contests, including two regional title games against the Seattle Pacific (56-50 in 2012 and 62-58 in 2013). SPU's last win against Western Washington in Bellingham was 84-70 on Feb. 22, 2011 ... Seattle Pacific now has the longest current home win streak in conference games. Its streak of 12 is the fourth longest streak in conference history ... In all games, Alaska Fairbanks now has the longest streak. The Nanooks have won 10 straight at The Patty Center dating back to a 71-54 loss to Central Washington on Feb. 2, 2013. UAF's 10-game streak is the 20th double-digit home win streak in GNAC history. It's the second by the Nanooks, who had an 11-game streak between Nov. 7, 2002 and Feb. 13, 2003.

TEAM NOTES

Alaska Anchorage: In addition to Thompson (56 points), the Seawolves were led by point guard Brian McGill with 37 points. McGill made 11 of 22 shots, including both of his three-point attempts. UAA shot just 39.0 percent (53 of 136) in splitting two games, while its opponents shot 53.9 percent (69 of 128). Teancum Stafford, who had 25 points, had one-third (25 of 74) of the Seawolves' rebounds. UAA was outrebounded 77-74 but had just 11 turnovers compared to 24 by its opponents.

Alaska Fairbanks: Sergey Pucar had 37 points, including 26 in an 84-80 overtime win over Central Washington, as the Nanooks extended their home win streak to 10, its second longest in the GNAC era. The Nanooks have won four straight overtime games (one this season) and are 4-1 in OT contests in Mick Durham's three seasons. With 10 wins, they've clinched back-to-back double-digit win seasons for the first time since 2005-06 and 2006-07.

Central Washington: Mark McLaughlin recorded his fifth 30-point games of the season – and the ninth of his career - netting 32 in CWU’s overtime loss at Alaska Fairbanks. His season total equals the fourth most in GNAC history. His career total ranks seventh. Parrish West of Alaska Fairbanks is the leader in both single-season 30-point games (13 in 2010-11) and career (14 in 2009-10 and 2010-11). McLaughlin made all nine of his foul shots in producing 54 points, extending his streak of free throws made without a miss to 32.

Montana State Billings: Austin Hudson had 25 points and 12 rebounds in Thursday’s win at Simon Fraser, then netted 14 points and 11 rebounds Saturday at Bellingham, doubling his season double-double total to four. Kalob Hatcher had 16 assists (and only three turnovers) becoming the 39th player in GNAC history to record 250 career assists.

Northwest Nazarene: Derek Isaak made eight of 12 three-pointers against Alaska Fairbanks after converting on seven of 14 at Alaska Anchorage in recording back-to-back career highs (21, 24). Matyas Hering didn’t miss a shot (4-4 FGs including two treys) in producing a double-double (10 points, 11 assists) in Thursday’s loss at Anchorage. Kevin Rima had 33 points, 13 rebounds and a team-high five blocks.

Saint Martin’s: The Saints built a 45-28 halftime lead, then held on to defeat Western Oregon at Monmouth to move ahead of the all-time series with the Wolves 30-29. Ryan Rogers (19 points) was joined in double figures by Lucas Shannon with 15 points on six of eight shooting, Isaac Bianchini with 14 (4 of 5 on treys) and Even Coulter with 12. Riley Carel had 10 assists and five steals.

Seattle Pacific: Patrick Simon made 10 consecutive shots – including five three-pointers - on the way to a 29-point performance against Western Washington. Riley Stockton had 16 rebounds, 10 in a 10-point, 10-rebound double-double Saturday at Simon Fraser. In addition to Simon’s 42-point, two-game total, the Falcons also got 32 points and 11 assists from David Downs and 30 points from Corey Hutson. Downs has 218 career three-pointers and needs two more to move into a tie for 10th place on the GNAC all-time list with his brother, Jeff.

Simon Fraser: Ibrahim Appiah had 16 points and 11 rebounds against Montana State Billings and 10 points and 10 rebounds against Seattle Pacific as he became the 33rd player in GNAC history to record 500 career rebounds, finishing the weekend in 29th place with 520. In addition to Appiah’s 26 points, SFU was led by Sango Niang with 29 points and Taylor Dunn with 28.

Western Oregon: Jordan Wiley scored 14 points and Devon Alexander and Rodney Webster each scored 11 in the Wolves’ home loss to Saint Martin’s. Wiley also had seven rebounds. WOU shot just 34.6 percent on treys (9 of 26), allowing the Saints eight in 16 attempts.

Western Washington: Anye Turner had 36 points and 19 rebounds and Austin Bragg had 26 points and 12 rebounds in the Vikings’ two contests. Bragg ranks ninth in GNAC history in most rebounds per game averaging 7.92 per game.

GNAC SPLITS 28 GAMES WITH PACWEST: GNAC teams posted a 54-34 record (.614) in the non-conference portion of their schedule. That percentage ranks just ninth during the 13-year history of the conference and is the second lowest since the 2006-07 season. GNAC teams finished 29-28 against Division II non-conference opponents, including 24-25 in regional contests. The GNAC split 28 games with the PacWest (14-14), lost six of nine games against the CCAA and posted a 7-5 record in games that count as regional contests under the NCAA “contiguous” state rule.

PREVIOUS RED LION PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Week of Nov. 3-10 - David Downs, Seattle Pacific (G, 6-2, 195, Sr., Kirkland, WA – Bellevue Christian) was selected the MVP in the CCA (Conference Commissioners Association) Division II Tipoff Classic as he led the Falcons to a 3-0 record. Downs averaged 25 points, shooting 62.1 percent from the field (18-29) and 76.5 percent from the arc (13-17). He also made 26 of 29 free throws (89.7 percent). In addition he led SPU with 11 assists and also had seven rebounds.

Week of Nov. 11-17 - Mark McLaughlin, Central Washington (G, 6-6, Sr., Bothell, WA - Inglemoor) scored 60 points in a pair of contests, including 42 in a 95-90 win over Colorado Christian to earn all-tournament honors in the SPU Sodexo Tipoff tournament. That equaled the ninth highest point total in GNAC history and was the most since John Allen of Western Washington and Parrish West of Alaska Fairbanks had 43-point games in January, 2011. McLaughlin made 17 field goals against CCU, one off the GNAC single-game record of 18 by Gerrit Eades of Saint Martin's against Alaska Anchorage in 2002.

Week of Nov. 18-24 - Ronnie Baker, Alaska Fairbanks (G, 6-3, Sr., Vallejo, CA – Diablo Valley) scored 59 points and also had 16 rebounds, 12 assists and four steals in leading the Nanooks to three wins and the tournament title in the GCI Alaska Invitational at Fairbanks. Baker, who was named to the all-tournament team, scored a career-high 29 points in Saturday's 83-72 win over Fresno Pacific. For the tournament, Baker shot 54.1 percent from the floor (20-37), 53.8 percent from the three-point line (7-13) and 80 percent from the foul line (12-15).

Week of Nov. 25-Dec.1: Austin Bragg, Western Washington (C, 6-9, Sr., Longview, WA – Clark CC) scored 20 points and also had 13 rebounds and five blocked shots to lead the Vikings to a 72-69 win over No. 1 ranked Metro State. Bragg hit a driving layup with 11.8 seconds to give WWU, which extended its home court win streak to a school and GNAC-record 31 games, a four-point lead.

Week of Dec. 2-8: Brian McGill, Alaska Anchorage (G, 6-2, So., Clackamas, OR) scored 29 points and also had 10 assists to lead the Seawolves to a 96-76 win over Alaska Fairbanks Saturday at the Wells Fargo Sports Complex. McGill, a transfer from Western Oregon, made eight of 12 shots, including two of two three-pointers. He also converted on 11 of 12 foul shots. On the season, McGill ranks fifth in the GNAC in scoring (17.2) and second in assists (6.2).

Week of Dec. 9-15: Grayson Moore, Northwest Nazarene (G, 6-6, So., Logan, UT – Sheridan College) had back-to-back career highs in scoring 47 points as the Crusaders split two games. He scored 22 points and also had nine rebounds, three assists, three blocks and a steal in a 79-62 loss to College of Idaho Wednesday. Moore accounted for 35.5 percent of the Crusaders' points and 26.5 percent of its rebounds in the contest. He converted on six of 10 three-pointers as NNU cashed in on 11 of 27 overall. Moore followed that up with a 25-point, seven-rebound performance Saturday in an 88-82 win over Walla Walla. He made four of seven treys in that contest finishing the week with a 58.8 percentage from the arc (10 of 17) after beginning the week shooting just 21.6 percent on treys (8 of 37).

Week of Dec. 16-22: Rodney Webster, Western Oregon (G, 6-1, Sr., Hanford, CA – Hanford West & Fresno City CC) came off the bench to lead the Wolves in scoring (35), assists (9) and steals (5) as WOU ran its win streak to four games with a pair of victories, including a 84-76 regional counting-win over South Dakota Mines. Webster also had eight rebounds, the third most on the team, and shot 56 percent from the field (14-25) including three of four from beyond the three-point arc. He also had one of WOU's two blocks as the Wolves evened their regional record at 4-4.

Week of Dec. 30-Jan. 5: Riley Carel, Saint Martin's (G, 6-2, Jr., Enumclaw, WA) and Andrew Kelly, Alaska Fairbanks (F, 6-7, Sr., Gilbert, AZ – Chandler-Gilbert) ... Carel scored 29 points, including 17 in the Saints' 73-69 win over nationally 11th ranked Seattle Pacific as the Saints beat the Falcons for just the third time in the 13-year history of the conference. Carel also had career highs for assists (8) and steals (5) in the win, while also grabbing six rebounds and making seven of 12 shots. Kelly scored 26 points and also had 19 rebounds and three blocked shots in wins over Simon Fraser (67-58) and nationally 15th ranked Western Washington (65-61) as the Nanooks beat the Vikings at The Patty Center for the second year in a row.

Week of Jan. 6-12: Mark McLaughlin, Central Washington (G, 6-6, Sr., Bothell, WA – Inglemoor & Tacoma CC) scored 66 points, including 39 in a 106-103 double overtime win over Western Oregon. McLaughlin, who is averaging nearly 30 points per game (29.4) in five conference contests and 26.3 overall, made seven of nine three-pointers in the two contests, including a trey with 10 seconds left in the first overtime to force the second extra five-minute period against WOU. Overall, he connected on 17 of 34 shots and 25 of 26 foul shots, including 16 of 16 against the Wolves.
