GNAC RED LION PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Austin Bragg, Western Washington (F, 6-9, Sr., Longview, WA - Clark CC) had 31 points, 26 rebounds and 13 assists and recorded the first triple-double in the GNAC in 10 years in leading the Vikings to wins over Alaska Fairbanks (53-51) and Alaska Anchorage (99-76). Bragg had one-third of WWU's points (18 of 53) and rebounds (14 of 42) in Thursday's win against the Nanooks before recording the third triple-double (13 points, 12 rebounds, 10 assists) in GNAC history in Saturday's regionally televised win over Alaska Anchorage. In the two contests, Bragg made 12 of 20 field goal attempts and all five of his free throw attempts.

HONORABLE MENTION: Kalob Hatcher, MSU Billings (G, 5-11, Sr., San Diego, CA - Irvine Valley) scored 57 points and also had 12 assists, accounting directly or indirectly for at least 55 percent of the Yellowjackets' points in home losses to Western Oregon and Saint Martin's. Hatcher made 16-of-27 field goal attempts, including 4-of-6 treys ... Evan Coulter, Saint Martin's (G, 5-10, Sr., Mount Vernon, WA - Whatcom CC) scored 42 points, including 35 in a 83-70 win at MSU Billings. Coulter made 10-of-14 shots, including 5-of-7 treys against the Yellowjackets ... Ibrahim Appiah, Simon Fraser (F, 6-6, Sr., Montreal, QC - Champlain) had back-to-back double-doubles, his fifth and sixth of the year as the Clan earned a split for the second week in a row. Appiah, who is the GNAC career-active rebounding leader with 556 (ranks 23rd overall), had 23 points and 23 rebounds in a pair of contests.

MORE MENTIONABLES: Mark McLaughlin, Central Washington (G, 6-6, Sr., Bothell, WA - Inglesmoor & Tacoma CC) recorded his eighth consecutive 20-point game, scoring 29 points in a 86-66 home win over Northwest Nazarene. During that stretch he has scored 30 or more points five times and is averaging 33.4 points per contest ... Mario Donaldson, Northwest Nazarene (G, 6-3, Sr., Rockton, IL - Ellsworth CC) scored a career-high 21 points and also had a team-high four assists in NNU's loss to CWU.

FROM THE RECORD BOOK: Bragg joins Jason Burrell of Western Washington (16 points, 11 rebounds, 11 assist versus Alaska Fairbanks, Jan. 16, 2003) and Robert Day of Western Oregon (21 points, 11 rebounds, 11 assists versus Montana State Billings, Dec. 16, 2003) as the only male players in GNAC history to record a triple-double in GNAC history.

FINDING HIS AIM: For a season and a half, Central Washington's Marc McLaughlin, who leads Division II in scoring (28.4) was a 24 percent career three-point shooter, making just 37 of 154 from beyond the arc. But, since Jan. 4, he has made 25 of 45 treys to raise his career percentage to 31.2. In conference games, he ranks third in three-point percentage (26-of-50, 52.0) trailing only Patrick Simon of Seattle Pacific who is shooting 61.9 percent (26-of-42) and Evan Coulter of Simon Fraser who has a 52.5 conference-game percentage (21-of-40). During that same stretch McLaughlin has made 71-of-78 free throws, a 91.0

percentage compared to his career percentage of 82.2. One of his seven misses was intentional.

TEAM NOTES

Alaska Anchorage: Travis Thompson scored 41 points in two games including the game-winning basket in a 65-64 win over Simon Fraser with 3.8 seconds left as the Seawolves rallied from a 17-point deficit. Point guard Brian McGill had 29 points and 10 assists and Kyle Fossman had 25 points in the two road contests.

Alaska Fairbanks: Andrew Kelly scored 34 points, missing just four shots (16-of-20) in road games at Western Washington and Simon Fraser. Kelly also had 12 rebounds. Joe Slocum had 22 points and team-highs for assists (9) and steals (7). Stevan Tica led UAF with 13 rebounds.

Central Washington: Mark McLaughlin scored 29 points in Saturday's 86-66 home win against Northwest Nazarene increasing his total in his last three games to 112. That's the third highest total in GNAC history for a three-game stretch. JB Pillard had 14 points in the win making 6-of-7 shots.

Montana State Billings: In addition to Hatcher's 57 points, the Yellowjackets were paced by Jonathan Mesghna with 33 points in home contests with Western Oregon and Saint Martin's. Marc Matthews added 20 points.

Northwest Nazarene: Mario Donaldson scored 21 points and Michael Loomis had 20 points, accounting for two-thirds of the Crusader points in their 20-point loss at Ellensburg. Donaldson made 10-of-10 free throws as NNU converted on 20-of-22. Kevin Rima made his first two field goal attempts extending his string of field goals made to 14 before missing twice late in the first half. That matches the fifth longest FG streak in GNAC history.

Saint Martin's: Evan Coulter's 35-point performance Saturday at Billings was a total surpassed this season only by CWU's Marc McLaughlin, who has done it four times (43, 42, 40 and 39). Coulter is the first Saint to score 30 or more points since Jeremy Green had back-to-back 30-point games against Central Washington (34 on Feb. 23, 2012) and Northwest Nazarene (32 on Feb. 25, 2012) to close out the 2011-12 campaign. In addition to Coulter's 42-point effort in two contests, Ryan Rogers led the Saints last weekend with 31 points and 15 rebounds.

Seattle Pacific: Patrick Simons scored 33 points and Riley Stockton had 31 as the Falcons posted 23-point and 32-point home wins over Saint Martin's and Western Oregon extending their conference game home win streak to 14 games. That's the fourth longest in conference history. Simon made 12-of-19 field goal attempts and Stockton converted on 13-of-19. Stockton, Matt Borton and Brendan Carroll all had 12 rebounds as SPU controlled the backboards 86-36.

Simon Fraser: The Clan shot 50.5 percent, making 48-of-95 shots in games with Alaska Anchorage and Alaska Fairbanks. Justin Cole led SFU with 30 points and four steals. He made 11-of-22 shots. Ibrahim Appiah was 8-of-12 from the floor in scoring 23 points.

Western Oregon: Jordan Wiley scored 31 points and Rodney Webster had 23 points to lead the Wolves to a road split. Adam Hastings had a team-high 12 rebounds and Devon Alexander led WOU with five assists and six steals.

Western Washington: In addition to Bragg, the Vikings were led by Jeffrey Parker (29 points, 10 rebounds), Richard Woodworth (27 points), Robert Harris (22 points) and Anye Turner (18 points, 24 rebounds) in their home wins over Alaska Fairbanks and Alaska Anchorage. WWU outshot the Nanooks and Seawolves 50.9 to 39.1 percent, but perhaps more importantly outrebounded them 82-50. Woodworth made 6-of-7 treys and Parker converted on 5-of-9 as the Vikings converted on 16-of-27 shots from beyond the arc against UAA.

GNAC SPLITS 28 GAMES WITH PACWEST: GNAC teams posted a 54-34 record (.614) in the non-conference portion of their schedule. That percentage ranks just ninth during the 13-year history of the conference and is the second lowest since the 2006-07 season. GNAC teams finished 29-28 against Division II non-conference opponents, including 24-25 in regional contests. The GNAC split 28 games with the PacWest (14-14), lost six of nine games against the CCAA and posted a 7-5 record in games that count as regional contests under the NCAA "contiguous" state rule.

PREVIOUS RED LION PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Week of Nov. 3-10 - David Downs, Seattle Pacific (G, 6-2, 195, Sr., Kirkland, WA – Bellevue Christian) was selected the MVP in the CCA (Conference Commissioners Association) Division II Tipoff Classic as he led the Falcons to a 3-0 record. Downs averaged 25 points, shooting 62.1 percent from the field (18-29) and 76.5 percent from the arc (13-17). He also made 26 of 29 free throws (89.7 percent). In addition he led SPU with 11 assists and also had seven rebounds.

Week of Nov. 11-17 - Mark McLaughlin, Central Washington (G, 6-6, Sr., Bothell, WA - Inglemoor) scored 60 points in a pair of contests, including 42 in a 95-90 win over Colorado Christian to earn all-tournament honors in the SPU Sodexo Tipoff tournament. That equaled the ninth highest point total in GNAC history and was the most since John Allen of Western Washington and Parrish West of Alaska Fairbanks had 43-point games in January, 2011. McLaughlin made 17 field goals against CCU, one off the GNAC single-game record of 18 by Gerrit Eades of Saint Martin's against Alaska Anchorage in 2002.

Week of Nov. 18-24 - Ronnie Baker, Alaska Fairbanks (G, 6-3, Sr., Vallejo, CA – Diablo Valley) scored 59 points and also had 16 rebounds, 12 assists and four steals in leading the Nanooks to three wins and the tournament title in the GCI Alaska Invitational at Fairbanks. Baker, who was named to the all-tournament team, scored a career-high 29 points in Saturday's 83-72 win over Fresno Pacific. For the tournament, Baker shot 54.1 percent from the floor (20-37), 53.8 percent from the three-point line (7-13) and 80 percent from the foul line (12-15).

Week of Nov. 25-Dec.1: Austin Bragg, Western Washington (C, 6-9, Sr., Longview, WA – Clark CC) scored 20 points and also had 13 rebounds and five blocked shots to lead the Vikings to a 72-69 win over No. 1 ranked Metro State. Bragg hit a driving layup with 11.8 seconds to give WWU, which extended its home court win streak to a school and GNAC-record 31 games, a four-point lead.

Week of Dec. 2-8: Brian McGill, Alaska Anchorage (G, 6-2, So., Clackamas, OR) scored 29 points and also had 10 assists to lead the Seawolves to a 96-76 win over Alaska Fairbanks Saturday at the Wells Fargo Sports Complex. McGill, a transfer from Western Oregon, made eight of 12 shots, including two of two three-pointers. He also converted on 11 of 12 foul shots. On the season, McGill ranks fifth in the GNAC in scoring (17.2) and second in assists (6.2).

Week of Dec. 9-15: Grayson Moore, Northwest Nazarene (G, 6-6, So., Logan, UT – Sheridan College) had back-to-back career highs in scoring 47 points as the Crusaders split two games. He scored 22 points and also had nine rebounds, three assists, three blocks and a steal in a 79-62 loss to College of Idaho Wednesday. Moore accounted for 35.5 percent of the Crusaders' points and 26.5 percent of its rebounds in the contest. He converted on six of 10 three-pointers as NNU cashed in on 11 of 27 overall. Moore

followed that up with a 25-point, seven-rebound performance Saturday in an 88-82 win over Walla Walla. He made four of seven treys in that contest finishing the week with a 58.8 percentage from the arc (10 of 17) after beginning the week shooting just 21.6 percent on treys (8 of 37).

Week of Dec. 16-22: Rodney Webster, Western Oregon (G, 6-1, Sr., Hanford, CA – Hanford West & Fresno City CC) came off the bench to lead the Wolves in scoring (35), assists (9) and steals (5) as WOU ran its win streak to four games with a pair of victories, including a 84-76 regional counting-win over South Dakota Mines. Webster also had eight rebounds, the third most on the team, and shot 56 percent from the field (14-25) including three of four from beyond the three-point arc. He also had one of WOU's two blocks as the Wolves evened their regional record at 4-4.

Week of Dec. 30-Jan. 5: Riley Carel, Saint Martin's (G, 6-2, Jr., Enumclaw, WA) and Andrew Kelly, Alaska Fairbanks (F, 6-7, Sr., Gilbert, AZ – Chandler-Gilbert) ... Carel scored 29 points, including 17 in the Saints' 73-69 win over nationally 11th ranked Seattle Pacific as the Saints beat the Falcons for just the third time in the 13-year history of the conference. Carel also had career highs for assists (8) and steals (5) in the win, while also grabbing six rebounds and making seven of 12 shots. Kelly scored 26 points and also had 19 rebounds and three blocked shots in wins over Simon Fraser (67-58) and nationally 15th ranked Western Washington (65-61) as the Nanooks beat the Vikings at The Patty Center for the second year in a row.

Week of Jan. 6-12: Mark McLaughlin, Central Washington (G, 6-6, Sr., Bothell, WA – Inglemoor & Tacoma CC) scored 66 points, including 39 in a 106-103 double overtime win over Western Oregon. McLaughlin, who is averaging nearly 30 points per game (29.4) in five conference contests and 26.3 overall, made seven of nine three-pointers in the two contests, including a trey with 10 seconds left in the first overtime to force the second extra five-minute period against WOU. Overall, he connected on 17 of 34 shots and 25 of 26 foul shots, including 16 of 16 against the Wolves.

Week of Jan. 13-19: Patrick Simon, Seattle Pacific (F, 6-8, Sr., Ephrata, WA) scored 42 points, including 29 in a *ROOT SPORTS* regionally-televised game against Western Washington to lead the Falcons to a 76-60 win over the 19th ranked Vikings, halting WWU's GNAC and school-record home winning streak at 36 games. Simon shot 72.7 percent from the floor (16 of 22), missing just once (6 of 7) from the three-point line where he has the fourth best career percentage in GNAC history, converting 109 of 232 (47.0 percent). Simon also had 12 rebounds in two contests, including a game-high seven in a 73-49 win Saturday at Simon Fraser. He also contributed four steals to SPU's two victories, its first two wins this season on an opponent's home court.

Week of Jan. 20-26: Mark McLaughlin, Central Washington (G, 6-6, Sr., Bothell, WA – Inglemoor & Tacoma CC) and Travis Thompson, Alaska Anchorage (G, 6-1, Jr., Anchorage, AK) ... McLaughlin became just the second player in GNAC history to record back-to-back 40-point games scoring 83 points. He was efficient in producing 43 points in a 99-94 loss to Western Washington and 40 points in a 96-79 win against Simon Fraser, shooting 68.3 percent from the floor (28-of-41), including 5-of-9 three-pointers. McLaughlin, who leads Division II in scoring averaging 28.3 points per game, also made 22-of-26 free throws, extending his streak of foul shots made to 42 before missing late in Thursday's contest ... For the second straight week, Thompson scored 56 points in a pair of contests increasing his career total to 1,004 and becoming the 58th player in GNAC to reach 1,000. He had 29 points in a 92-58 win at Western Oregon and 27 in a 79-78 victory at Saint Martin's. In the latter game, he also drew a charge with seven seconds left to secure the win. Thompson, who had six rebounds, five assists and a team-high four steals, shot 59.3 percent from the floor (16-of-27), 52.6 percent from the arc (10-of-19) and 93.3 percent from the foul line (14-of-15).
