GNAC RED LION PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Austin Hudson, MSU Billings (F, 6-7, Jr., Salt Lake City, UT – Central Wyoming) scored 47 points and had 32 rebounds as the Yellowjackets split two games, earning their first win at Anchorage since Jan. 29, 1998 ... Hudson scored 24 points and had 22 rebounds, including a GNAC record 13 offensive caroms, in a 88-74 loss Thursday at Alaska Fairbanks. He then led MSUB to a 75-62 win against Alaska Anchorage scoring 23 points and grabbing 10 rebounds. In the two games, Hudson made 20 of 32 shots (62.5 percent) and also had four assists, four steals and two blocks. Half of his 32 rebounds came off the offensive glass. His 22 rebounds at UAF equal the second highest individual single-game total in GNAC history.

HONORABLE MENTION: Mitch Penner. Seattle Pacific (F, 6-5, So., Seattle, WA – Kennedy) came off the bench to lead the Falcons with 38 points as SPU ran its win streak to nine games with a pair of victories in Alaska. Penner missed just six shots, two from inside the arc (9-of-11), two from beyond the arc (4-of-6) and two from the foul line (8of-10), He also had nine rebounds and a pair of assists ... Richard Woodworth, Western Washington (G, 6-3, Sr., Bellevue, WA - Newport) scored 33 points and also had four rebounds, four assists and five steals in a one-point road win at Simon Fraser. Woodworth was perfect from the foul line (13-of-13) and also made 4-of-8 three-pointers ... Mario Donaldson, Northwest Nazarene (G, Sr., Rockton, IL) scored 22 points and had seven rebounds and four steals in a 80-73 overtime loss at Saint Martin's. He added 12 more points and seven more rebounds in Monday's contest at Western Oregon.

MORE MENTIONABLES: Evan Coulter, Saint Martin's (G, 5-10, Sr., Mount Vernon, WA – Whatcom CC) scored 48 points and had nine rebounds, five assists and four steals as the Saints split two nail-bitters, winning in overtime against Northwest Nazarene (80-73) before dropping a four-point decision to Central Washington (77-73) ... Andy Avgi, Western Oregon (F, 6-6, So., Woodburn, OR) led the Wolves to a 12-point win over Central Washington scoring 18 points and also contributing six rebounds and three steals. Avgi also had a double-double (12 points, 11 rebounds), his second of the year, in Monday's win over NNU.

FROM THE RECORD BOOK: Patrick Simon of Seattle Pacific, who ranks second in Division II in three-point percentage this winter (52.2), also ranks second in GNAC history in career three-point percentage shooting 48.5 percent (126-260). Joel Ryman of Northwest Nazarene is the career leader shooting 48.6 (136-of-280) ... MSUB's Hudson eclipsed the old GNAC record for offensive rebounds of 12 set by Stanley Ratcliff of Western Oregon vs. Northwest Nazarene on Jan. 7, 2006. Hudson's 22 total rebounds equaled the second most in GNAC history. Blake Poole of Saint Martin's had 24 versus Western Oregon on

Jan. 11, 2011 (in a ROOT Sports televised contest) and 22 against the Wolves on Jan. 31, 2009.

TEAM NOTES

Alaska Anchorage: Kyle Fossman scored 34 points and also had nine assists in a pair of home losses. Brian McGill added 25 points and Travis Thompson had 22 points and 11 rebounds. UAA shot just 29.2 percent from the arc, making 19 of 65.

Alaska Fairbanks: Stefan Tica shot 70 percent from the floor (14-of-20) including 66.7 percent (6-of-9) on treys, as the Nanooks split two home games. Tica had 38 points. Andrew Kelly added 31 points on 13-of-19 shooting and also led UAF with 12 rebounds and six assists. Saturday's home loss to Seattle Pacific snapped UAF's 11-game home win streak.

Central Washington: Marc McLaughlin scored 41 points and had nine rebounds as the Wildcats split two road games. McLaughlin, who had made 25 of 45 three-pointers in his previous eight games, took just three shots from the arc, making one. CWU also got 31 points from Jordan Russell and 25 points and 24 rebounds from JB Pillard.

Montana State Billings: In addition to winning at Anchorage for the first time since 1998 (see Player *of the Week* notes), MSUB completed its first season series sweep of Alaska Anchorage since 1986-87 with Saturday's 75-62 win. In addition to Hudson (47 points, 32 rebounds), MSUB was led on the trip by Devon Wallace (26 points, 10 assists), Jonathan Mesghna (25 points, 12 rebounds), Marc Matthews (23 points) and Kalob Hatcher (15 points, 18 assists, 10 rebounds).

Northwest Nazarene: Mario Donaldson had 34 points, 14 rebounds and six steals in the Crusaders' extended trip (Thursday through Monday due so snow in the Monmouth

area). Grayson Moore chipped in with 26 points and Kevin Rima had 19 points and 24 rebounds.

Saint Martin's: Evan Coulter and Ryan Rogers combined for 93 points in the Saints' two contests. Coulter had 48 on 15-of-27 shooting (2-of-6 three-pointers) from the floor and 16-of-18 from the foul line. Rogers pumped in 45 points and also had a team-high 17 rebounds. He made 5-of-9 three-pointers, but was just 8-of-25 inside the arc.

Seattle Pacific: The Falcons earned a sweep in Alaska for the second year in a row as four players averaged in double figures, including Mitch Penner (19.0), Patrick Simon (16.5), David Downs (13.0) and Matt Borton (12.5) ... Borton led SPU in rebounds (17) and Downs led in assists (11). The Falcons, who secured their fifth straight 20-win season for the first time in school history, outshot its two opponents 49.1 percent (52-of-106) to 39.5 (47-of-119) and outrebounded them 74-53.

Simon Fraser: The Clan shot 50 percent from the floor (30-of-60) in a one-point home loss to Western Washington (84-83). Sango Niang led SFU with 20 points, eight assists and four steals and also ranked second on the team to Ibrahim Appiah (9 rebounds) with seven caroms.

Western Oregon: Andy Avgi had 30 points and Rodney Webster had 21 leading the Wolves to two home wins. The Wolves shot just 37.9 percent from the floor (47-of-124) including 26.8 percent (11-of-41) on treys, but held their opponents to percentages of 36.4 percent (40-of-110) and 31.1 (14-of-45) and also forced nearly twice as many turnovers (33-17).

Western Washington: The Vikings extended their win streak to six games as Richard Woodworth, who has made his last 16 foul shots, had 33 points and five steals in an 84-83 win. The Vikings also were led by Austin Bragg with 16 points and Jeffrey Parker with 14 in the victory.

GNAC SPLITS 28 GAMES WITH PACWEST: GNAC teams posted a 54-34 record (.614) in the non-conference portion of their schedule. That percentage ranks just ninth during the 13-year history of the conference and is the second lowest since the 2006-07 season. GNAC teams finished 29-28 against Division II non-conference opponents, including 24-25 in regional contests. The GNAC split 28 games with the PacWest (14-14), lost six of nine games against the CCAA and posted a 7-5 record in games that count as regional contests under the NCAA "contiguous" state rule.

PREVIOUS RED LION PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Week of Nov. 3-10 - David Downs, Seattle Pacific (G, 6-2, 195, Sr., Kirkland, WA – Bellevue Christian) was selected the MVP in the CCA (Conference Commissioners Association) Division II Tipoff Classic as he led the Falcons to a 3-0 record. Downs averaged 25 points, shooting 62.1 percent from the field (18-29) and 76.5 percent from the arc (13-17). He also made 26 of 29 free

throws (89.7 percent). In addition he led SPU with 11 assists and also had seven rebounds.

Week of Nov. 11-17 - Mark McLaughlin, Central Washington (G, 6-6, Sr., Bothell, WA - Inglemoor) scored 60 points in a pair of contests, including 42 in a 95-90 win over Colorado Christian to earn all-tournament honors in the SPU Sodexo Tipoff tournament. That equaled the ninth highest point total in GNAC history and was the most since John Allen of Western Washington and Parrish West of Alaska Fairbanks had 43-point games in January, 2011. McLaughlin made 17 field goals against CCU, one off the GNAC single-game record of 18 by Gerrit Eades of Saint Martin's against Alaska Anchorage in 2002.

Week of Nov. 18-24 - Ronnie Baker, Alaska Fairbanks (G, 6-3, Sr., Vallejo, CA – Diablo Valley) scored 59 points and also had 16 rebounds, 12 assists and four steals in leading the Nanooks to three wins and the tournament title in the GCI Alaska Invitational at Fairbanks. Baker, who was named to the all-tournament team, scored a career-high 29 points in Saturday's 83-72 win over Fresno Pacific. For the tournament, Baker shot 54.1 percent from the floor (20-37), 53.8 percent from the three-point line (7-13) and 80 percent from the foul line (12-15).

Week of Nov. 25-Dec.1: Austin Bragg, Western Washington (C, 6-9, Sr., Longview, WA – Clark CC) scored 20 points and also had 13 rebounds and five blocked shots to lead the Vikings to a 72-69 win over No. 1 ranked Metro State. Bragg hit a driving layup with 11.8 seconds to give WWU, which extended its home court win streak to a school and GNAC-record 31 games, a four-point lead.

Week of Dec. 2-8: Brian McGill, Alaska Anchorage (G, 6-2, So., Clackamas, OR) scored 29 points and also had 10 assists to lead the Seawolves to a 96-76 win over Alaska Fairbanks Saturday at the Wells Fargo Sports Complex. McGill, a transfer from Western Oregon, made eight of 12 shots, including two of two three-pointers. He also converted on 11 of 12 foul shots. On the season, McGill ranks fifth in the GNAC in scoring (17.2) and second in assists (6.2).

Week of Dec. 9-15: Grayson Moore, Northwest Nazarene (G, 6-6, So., Logan, UT – Sheridan College) had back-toback career highs in scoring 47 points as the Crusaders split two games. He scored 22 points and also had nine rebounds, three assists, three blocks and a steal in a 79-62 loss to College of Idaho Wednesday. Moore accounted for 35.5 percent of the Crusaders' points and 26.5 percent of its rebounds in the contest. He converted on six of 10 threepointers as NNU cashed in on 11 of 27 overall. Moore followed that up with a 25-point, seven-rebound performance Saturday in an 88-82 win over Walla Walla. He made four of seven treys in that contest finishing the week with a 58.8 percentage from the arc (10 of 17) after beginning the week shooting just 21.6 percent on treys (8 of 37).

Week of Dec. 16-22: Rodney Webster, Western Oregon (G, 6-1, Sr., Hanford, CA – Hanford West & Fresno City

CC) came off the bench to lead the Wolves in scoring (35), assists (9) and steals (5) as WOU ran its win streak to four games with a pair of victories, including a 84-76 regional counting-win over South Dakota Mines. Webster also had eight rebounds, the third most on the team, and shot 56 percent from the field (14-25) including three of four from beyond the three-point arc. He also had one of WOU's two blocks as the Wolves evened their regional record at 4-4.

Week of Dec. 30-Jan. 5: Riley Carel, Saint Martin's (G, 6-2, Jr., Enumclaw, WA) and Andrew Kelly, Alaska Fairbanks (F, 6-7, Sr., Gilbert, AZ – Chandler-Gilbert) ... Carel scored 29 points, including 17 in the Saints' 73-69 win over nationally 11th ranked Seattle Pacific as the Saints beat the Falcons for just the third time in the 13-year history of the conference. Carel also had career highs for assists (8) and steals (5) in the win, while also grabbing six rebounds and making seven of 12 shots. Kelly scored 26 points and also had 19 rebounds and three blocked shots in wins over Simon Fraser (67-58) and nationally 15th ranked Western Washington (65-61) as the Nanooks beat the Vikings at The Patty Center for the second year in a row.

Week of Jan. 6-12: Mark McLaughlin, Central Washington (G, 6-6, Sr., Bothell, WA – Inglemoor & Tacoma CC) scored 66 points, including 39 in a 106-103 double overtime win over Western Oregon. McLaughlin, who is averaging nearly 30 points per game (29.4) in five conference contests and 26.3 overall, made seven of nine three-pointers in the two contests, including a trey with 10 seconds left in the first overtime to force the second extra five-minute period against WOU. Overall, he connected on 17 of 34 shots and 25 of 26 foul shots, including 16 of 16 against the Wolves.

Week of Jan. 13-19: Patrick Simon, Seattle Pacific (F, 6-8, Sr., Ephrata, WA) scored 42 points, including 29 in a *ROOT SPORTS* regionally-televised game against Western Washington to lead the Falcons to a 76-60 win over the 19th ranked Vikings, halting WWU's GNAC and school-record home winning streak at 36 games. Simon shot 72.7 percent from the floor (16 of 22), missing just once (6 of 7) from the three-point line where he has the fourth best career percentage in GNAC history, converting 109 of 232 (47.0 percent). Simon also had 12 rebounds in two contests, including a game-high seven in a 73-49 win Saturday at Simon Fraser. He also contributed four steals to SPU's two victories, its first two wins this season on an opponent's home court.

Week of Jan. 20-26: Mark McLaughlin, Central Washington (G, 6-6, Sr., Bothell, WA – Inglemoor & Tacoma CC) and Travis Thompson, Alaska Anchorage (G, 6-1, Jr., Anchorage, AK) ... McLaughlin became just the second player in GNAC history to record back-to-back 40-point games scoring 83 points. He was efficient in producing 43 points in a 99-94 loss to Western Washington and 40 points in a 96-79 win against Simon Fraser, shooting 68.3 percent from the floor (28-of-41), including 5-of-9 three-pointers. McLaughlin, who leads Division II in scoring averaging 28.3 points per game, also made 22-of-26 free throws, extending his streak of foul shots made

to 42 before missing late in Thursday's contest ... For the second straight week, Thompson scored 56 points in a pair of contests increasing his career total to 1,004 and becoming the 58th player in GNAC to reach 1,000. He had 29 points in a 92-58 win at Western Oregon and 27 in a 79-78 victory at Saint Martin's. In the latter game, he also drew a charge with seven seconds left to secure the win. Thompson, who had six rebounds, five assists and a teamhigh four steals, shot 59.3 percent from the floor (16-of-27), 52.6 percent from the arc (10-of-19) and 93.3 percent from the foul line (14-of-15).

Week of Jan. 27-Feb. 2: Austin Bragg, Western Washington (F, 6-9, Sr., Longview, WA - Clark CC) had 31 points, 26 rebounds and 13 assists and recorded the first triple-double in the GNAC in 10 years in leading the Vikings to wins over Alaska Fairbanks (53-51) and Alaska Anchorage (99-76). Bragg had one-third of WWU's points (18 of 53) and rebounds (14 of 42) in Thursday's win against the Nanooks before recording the third triple-double (13 points, 12 rebounds, 10 assists) in GNAC history in Saturday's regionally televised win over Alaska Anchorage. In the two contests, Bragg made 12 of 20 field goal attempts and all five of his free throw attempts.
