GNAC RED LION PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Brian McGill, Alaska Anchorage (G, 6-2, So., Clackamas, OR) scored 29 points and also had 10 assists to lead the Seawolves to a 96-76 win over Alaska Fairbanks Saturday at the Wells Fargo Sports Complex. McGill, a transfer from Western Oregon, made eight of 12 shots, including two of two three-pointers. He also converted on 11 of 12 foul shots. On the season, McGill ranks fifth in the GNAC in scoring (17.2) and second in assists (6.2).

MILESTONES: Seattle Pacific coach Ryan Looney recorded his 100th and 101st career wins with the Falcons with Thursday's 73-54 victory against Northwest Nazarene and Saturday's 80-67 win against Central Washington. Looney, who has lost 30, is the fourth SPU coach to reach 100 and accomplished it in the fewest number of games. Including five seasons at Eastern Oregon, Looney now has a career record of 196-85.

MOST POINTS, 10 ASSISTS: McGill's 29 points equaled the fifth highest in GNAC history in which the player also recorded at least 10 assists. Emmanuel Jenkins of Alaska Fairbanks scored 37 points and also had 12 assists in a game against Montana State Billings on Jan. 17, 2009 to set the record for the most points in a point/assist double-double.

TEAM NOTES

Alaska Anchorage: In addition to McGill's 29-point effort (See *Player of the Week*), Travis Thompson scored 20 points and Teancum Stafford had 12 rebounds to lead the Seawolves to a 96-76 win over Alaska Fairbanks extending their win streak in their series with the Nanooks to 16 games.

Alaska Fairbanks: Ronnie Baker scored 21 points and Andrew Kelly had 12 points and 12 rebounds in the Nanook's road loss at Anchorage. Joe Slocum had 11 points and seven assists.

Central Washington: Mark McLaughlin scored 47 points and also had 12 rebounds and five assists in road losses at MSU Billings (82-67) and Seattle Pacific (80-67). The Wildcats were also led by JB Pillard who had 29 points and 10 rebounds. Pillard converted on 12 of 16 shots.

MSU Billings: Jonathan Mesghna had 24 points and 12 rebounds and Austin Hudson chipped in with 22 points and 13 rebounds as the Yellowjackets split two home games. Kalob Hatcher had 16 assists, including seven in an 82-67 win over Central Washington and nine in a two-point loss to Northwest Nazarene.

Northwest Nazarene: Michael Loomis scored 33 points as the Crusaders split two road games. Loomis made 11 of 23 shots from the floor, five of 15 from the arc. He was perfect from the foul line, making all six of his attempts. Derek Isaak scored 25 points, all but four from beyond the arc where he made seven of 12 attempts.

Saint Martin's: Ryan Rogers scored 42 points and also had 14 rebounds and three steals as the Saints split two games, getting their first win of the season Thursday at Simon Fraser (78-62). Evan Coulter added 35 points, nine

rebounds and nine assists. Coulter made 11 of 17 shots, including three of four three-pointers.

Seattle Pacific: David Downs scored 33 points and Patrick Simon had 28 points and 16 rebounds in double-digit wins over Northwest Nazarene and Central Washington. Downs made 11 of 19 shots, including five of 10 treys, while Simon made 10 of 21, converting on seven of 15 three-pointers. Downs was hampered by an ankle injury Saturday, but still scored 26 points in 24 minutes against the Wildcats.

Simon Fraser: Taylor Dunn netted 44 points in a pair of losses, including 25 in Saturday's game at Western Oregon. Dunn made 18 of 33 shots, six of 10 from the three-point line. Justin Cole added 31 points, making six of 13 three-pointers.

Western Oregon: Andy Avgi scored 33 points and Rodney Webster added 32 as the Wolves split two games, nearly ending Western Washington's long home win streak before losing 67-66 and then defeating Simon Fraser 87-83. Avgi made 13 of 22 shots and also had 12 rebounds. Webster converted on 12 of 24 field goal attempts. Marwan Sarhan chipped in with 30 points.

Western Washington: Austin Bragg scored 35 points and also had 20 rebounds, five assists and five blocks as the Vikings extended their home win streak to 33 games with victories over Western Oregon and Saint Martin's. Richard Woodworth hit two free throws with 1.9 seconds left in Thursday's 67-66 victory over the Wolves.

PREVIOUS RED LION PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Week of Nov. 3-10 - David Downs, Seattle Pacific (G, 6-2, 195, Sr., Kirkland, WA – Bellevue Christian) was selected the MVP in the CCA (Conference Commissioners Association) Division II Tipoff Classic as he led the Falcons to a 3-0 record. Downs averaged 25 points, shooting 62.1 percent from the field (18-29) and 76.5 percent from the arc (13-17). He also made 26 of 29 free throws (89.7 percent). In addition he led SPU with 11 assists and also had seven rebounds.

Week of Nov. 11-17 - Mark McLaughlin, Central Washington (G, 6-6, Sr., Bothell, WA - Inglemoor) scored 60 points in a pair of contests, including 42 in a 95-90 win over Colorado Christian to earn all-tournament honors in the SPU Sodexo Tipoff tournament. That equaled the ninth highest point total in GNAC history and was the most since John Allen of Western Washington and Parrish West of Alaska Fairbanks had 43-point games in January, 2011. McLaughlin made 17 field goals against CCU, one off the GNAC single-game record of 18 by Gerrit Eades of Saint Martin's against Alaska Anchorage in 2002.

Week of Nov. 18-24 - Ronnie Baker, Alaska Fairbanks (G, 6-3, Sr., Vallejo, CA – Diablo Valley) scored 59 points and also had 16 rebounds, 12 assists and four steals in leading the Nanooks to three wins and the tournament title in the GCI Alaska Invitational at Fairbanks. Baker, who was

named to the all-tournament team, scored a career-high 29 points in Saturday's 83-72 win over Fresno Pacific. For the tournament, Baker shot 54.1 percent from the floor (20-37), 53.8 percent from the three-point line (7-13) and 80 percent from the foul line (12-15).

Week of Nov. 25-Dec.1: Austin Bragg, Western Washington (C, 6-9, Sr., Longview, WA – Clark CC) scored 20 points and also had 13 rebounds and five blocked shots to lead the Vikings to a 72-69 win over No. 1 ranked Metro State. Bragg hit a driving layup with 11.8 seconds to give WWU, which extended its home court win streak to a school and GNAC-record 31 games, a four-point lead.
