Western Oregon Earns First NABC Ranking

PORTLAND, Ore. - Western Oregon has received its first NABC national ranking of the 2014-15 season.

The Wolves (16-3), who had been "among others receiving votes" in the last six polls, debuted in the Top 25 at No. 24 after sweeping road games at Simon Fraser and Western Washington last weekend running its winning streak to six games.

Seattle Pacific (15-4) and Central Washington (12-4) were "among others receiving votes" in this week's rankings and were 32nd and 41th overall.

The Falcons and Wildcats are tied for second place at the midway point of the conference race with 7-2 GNAC records, trailing Western Oregon (8-1) by one game each.

In this week's D2SIDA West Regional poll, Western Oregon is ranked fourth and Seattle Pacific is ranked fifth.

The Wolves are "among others receiving votes" in the D2SIDA national poll and are 34th overall. They are the first GNAC teams to receive votes in the D2SIDA national poll since Dec. 9.

Western Oregon opens the second half of the conference season at home Thursday hosting Montana State Billings (4-15, 2-7) Thursday before facing Seattle Pacific Saturday in a showdown for first place.

The Falcons open their week Thursday with a road game at Saint Martin's (5-14, 2-7).

Elsewhere Thursday, Alaska (5-12, 2-7) plays at Simon Fraser (7-10, 2-7) and Alaska Anchorage (10-9, 6-3) visits Western Washington (10-9, 3-6).

Meanwhile, Central Washington will take Thursday off before traveling to Nampa to play Northwest Nazarene (8-11, 6-3) Saturday.

Avgi Joins 1000-Point Club

Western Oregon center Andy Avgi scored 44 points last weekend to become the 60th player in GNAC history to score 1,000 or more career points.

Avgi made 18-of-29 field goal attempts. He also had 13 rebounds and three steals and also converted on 7-of-7 free throws. Avgi currently ranks 60th in GNAC history in scoring with 1,020 points.

The next player likely to join the 1,000-point career club is Kevin Rima of Northwest Nazarene. He has 946 career points. Rima also needs 40 rebounds to reach 600. Riley Stockton of Seattle Pacific needs four assists to reach 400.

In this week's national statistical report, Sango Niang of Simon Fraser ranks fourth in assists (6.9) and ninth in scoring (23.5).

Also in the Top 10 are Anye Turner of Western Washington, Julian Nichols of Western Oregon and Joseph Stroud and Dom Williams of Central Washington.

Turner ranks fourth (3.28) and Stroud is eighth (2.75) in blocked shots. Nichols is fifth (3.36) and Williams is eighth (3.31) in assist/turnover ratio (3.36).

In team categories, Simon Fraser leads Division II in scoring (113.1), three-pointers (13.1), steals (14.1) and turnover margin (10.5) and also ranks second in offensive rebounds (16.7) and ninth in assists (18.9).

Seattle Pacific is second in rebounding margin (13.7) and fifth in scoring margin (18.7) and field goal percentage (52.0).

Western Washington is fifth in blocked shots (5.9) and Western Oregon is sixth in free throw percentage (77.9).

Central Washington: Dom Williams had 36 points and Joseph Stroud made 11-of-14 shots and had 23 points, 10 rebounds and three blocks as the Wildcats earned a sweep in Alaska. After nearly letting a 16-point first-half lead get away Thursday in a 77-68 win at Anchorage, CWU outscored the Alaska Nanooks 12-2 over the final 3:40 to pull out a 74-70 win Saturday at Fairbanks.

Montana State Billings The Yellowjackets are in a four-way tie for seventh and trail sixth-place Western Washington by just one game as all 10 GNAC teams are within one game of earning a possible playoff berth at the midway point of the conference season.

Northwest Nazarene: Erik Kinney scored 35 points as the Crusaders divided two games in Alaska. Kinney made 17-of-23 foul shots, taking more than half of NNU's 44 attempts. Alex Birketoft scored 24 points and led NNU with 14 rebounds. He made 6-of-9 three-pointers.

Saint Martin's: Tyler Idowu had 24 points and 12 rebounds in road losses at Bellingham and Simon Fraser. Riley Carel scored 19 points and led the Saints with 18 rebounds and 10 assists. Sixteen of his rebounds came off the defensive glass.

Offensively, Matt Borton paced SPU with 15 points and nine rebounds.

Simon Fraser: Sango Niang scored 31 points as the Clan split two home games to finish the first half of the conference season in a four-way tie for seventh. Niang also had nine assists. Justin Cole had 27 points. Cole and Roderick Evans-Taylor each had 11 rebounds.

Western Oregon: Jordan Wiley (see GNAC Player of the Week notes) made 7-of-8 three-pointers and scored 26

points in a 39-point win at Simon Fraser Thursday. Julian Nichols had 15 assists, equaling the eighth highest singlegame total in GNAC history. Nichols finished the week with 23 assists as WOU shot 57.4 percent from the floor (74-of-129).

Western Washington: The Vikings ran their home win streak to 14 with a 64-61 win over Saint Martin's Thursday before Western Oregon ended the streak Saturday with a 90-87 victory ... Ricardo Maxwell had 37 points including 31 against the Wolves.

Nov. 10-16 – Jeffrey Parker, Western Washington (F, 6-6, So., Richmond, CA – Salesian) and Joseph Stroud, Central Washington (F, 6-8, Jr., Las Vegas, NV – Sierra Visa/Pierce College) ... Parker scored 43 points and also had 18 rebounds leading the Vikings to two wins in the 13th Chuck Randall Classic. Parker made seven of 17 3-pointers and shot 51.7 percent overall, cashing in on 15-of-29. He was named the tournament's MVP ... Nov. 24-30: Julian Nichols, Western Oregon (G, 6-2, 175, Jr. Upland, CA) scored 51 points and also 10 rebounds, a team-high 14 assists and six steals in leading the Wolves to three road West Region victories, including a 67-52 win at

2014 playoff qualifier Dixie State. Nichols made 15 of 31 field goal attempts and also converted on 19 of 20 foul shots. Twenty-six of his points came in Saturday's 83-73 win at the Academy of Art.

Dec. 1-7: Dom Williams, Central Washington (G, 5-11, Sr., Tacoma, WA – Curtis & Tacoma CC) scored 50 points and also had 10 assists and just one turnover in wins over Montana State Billings and defending GNAC champion Seattle Pacific. He had a career-high 31 points and five assists in an 88-79 win over MSUB Thursday, connecting on 11 of 20 shots, including 5-of-7 three-pointers. Williams then added 19 points and five assists in a 73-67 victory against SPU Saturday, converting on 4-of-7 three-point shots. The win snapped a four-game CWU losing streak to the Falcons. For the week, Williams made 18-of-37 shots (48.6 percent), including 9-of-14 three-pointers. He also converted on 5-of-6 foul shots.

Dec. 8-14: Mitch Penner, Seattle Pacific (F, 6-5, Jr., Seattle, WA — Kennedy) scored 26 points and also had 11 rebounds, three steals and two blocks to lead the Falcons to a 100-67 win over George Fox. Penner, who made 7-of-12 field goal attempts, was perfect from the foul line connecting on 11-of-11.

Dec. 15-21: Shawn Reid, Seattle Pacific (F, 6-4, Sr., Post Falls, ID) scored a team-best 36 points shooting 71.4 percent in leading the Falcons to wins over Dixie State (76-66) and Rollins (74-54) in the Las Vegas Challenge. Reid made 15-of-21 shots, including 5-of-9 three-pointers. He also led the Falcons with three steals. Reid came off the bench against Dixie State with SPU trailing 17-2 and scored 30 points in just 18 minutes to rally SPU to the 10-point win. Reid, whose previous SPU career-high was 13, made 12 of 15 shots, including 5-of-7 from the arc.

Dec. 29-Jan. 4: Ashton Edwards, Alaska (G, Jr., Compton, CA - Long Beach CC) and Brian McGill, Alaska Anchorage (G, 6-2, Jr., Clackamas, OR – Western Oregon) ... Edwards scored 53 points including 30 in Thursday's 64-60 home win against Western Washington and 23 in Saturday's 121-111 victory against Simon Fraser. Edwards made 16-of-32 field goal attempts including 7-of-12 three-pointers and 14-of-15 free throws. He also had seven rebounds and four assists. His point total against the Vikings represented nearly 47 percent of the Nanooks' team total ... McGill had 48 points, nine rebounds and nine assists as the Seawolves also swept SFU (108-86) and Western Washington (62-60). McGill scored 28 points and had six rebounds in 26 minutes against the Clan Thursday and had a game-high 20 points, including the game-winning shot with 6.5 seconds left, in Saturday's win against Western Washington. In that contest, McGill was perfect from the foul line, converting on 8-of-8 attempts.

Gataric scored 45 points and shot 72.7 percent from the floor (16-of-22) as the Yellowjackets split two games defeating Simon Fraser 111-104 Saturday for their first conference win of the season. He had 25 points on 10 of 14 shooting in a 88-68 loss to Western Washington before contributing 20 points, five assists and four assists against the Clan ... Avgi scored 41 points as the Wolves defeated Northwest Nazarene and Central Washington to extend their home win streak to eight and take over sole possession of first place in the GNAC. Avgi made 17 of 29 shots, including a key tip-in with 23 seconds remaining in the win against NNU.

Jan. 12-18: Kevin Rima, Northwest Nazarene (F/C, 6-7, Sr., Fairbanks, AK - Hutchison) and Sango Niang, Simon Fraser (G, 6-0, Sr., Paris, France - Chaffey CC) ... Rima, who is averaging 12.2 points per game, scored 47 points and also had 19 rebounds to lead the Crusaders to their fourth and fifth wins in their last six games. He had 18 points and 12 rebounds, recording his 13th career double-double, in a 107-103 victory against Simon Fraser Thursday. Saturday, he tallied 29 points and grabbed seven rebounds in a 80-73 conquest of Western Washington. Rima, who made 18 of 25 field goal attempts and 11 of 13 foul shots, helped rally NNU from double-digit second-half deficits in both games ... Niang scored 71 points, including 46 in a 104-95 loss Saturday at Central Washington. That is the second highest single-game point total in GNAC history trailing only Western Washington's Ryan Diggs who scored 47 in 2006. Niang made 18 field goals equaling the GNAC single-game record set by Gerrit Eades of Saint Martin's in 2002. In two games, he made 27 of 46 field goal attempts and also had 11 assists.

Jan. 19-Jan. 25: Jordan Wiley, Western Oregon (G, 6-6, Jr., McKenzie River, OR) scored 26 points in a 114-75 win at Simon Fraser and had 15 points including a key three-pointer with 1:49 left in a 90-87 victory at Western Washington as the Wolves completed the first half of the conference race with an 8-1 record and a one-game lead over Seattle Pacific and Central Washington. Wiley shot 75.0 from the field (12-of-16) and also had nine rebounds, four assists and three steals in the two wins. He made 7-of-8 three-pointers against SFU equaling the second highest total for three-pointers made in a game with just one miss in GNAC history.
