### WOU Finishes Season With 5 of 7 Games On Road

PORTLAND, Ore. – With seven games left on its regular-season schedule, Western Oregon has a two-game lead in the loss column on its four closest pursuers.

The Wolves (18-3, 10-1) also have the toughest schedule during the final four weeks of the season playing five of its final seven games on the road including a challenging road trip to Ellensburg and Nampa this week.

WOU, which is 7-2 on the road including a neutral site win, opens this week's trip Thursday against Central Washington (12-5, 7-3) before taking on Northwest Nazarene (9-11, 7-3) Saturday.

Both CWU and NNU have eight games remaining, four at home and four on the road.

Meanwhile, Seattle Pacific (16-5, 8-3) and Alaska Anchorage (12-9, 8-3), who are tied for second each finish their season with five home games and just two away contests.

One of UAA's home games is during the final week when it host Western Oregon on Thursday (Feb. 26). WOU's only remaining home games are a week earlier against Western Washington and Simon Fraser.

Nine GNAC eligible teams are all looking to earn one of the six playoff berths available for the conference tournament which will be played during the first week of March at Billings, Mont.

The men's tournament begins Thursday, March 5 with the No. 3 and No. 6 and the No. 4 and No. 5 seeds facing off in the opening round. Game times are at 5:15 and 7:30.

The No. 1 and No. 2 seeds, meanwhile, receive byes in the opening round.

The semifinals will be played Friday at 5:15 and 7:30 p.m. with the championship game played Saturday at 7:30.

The winner earns an automatic berth in the eight-team NCAA West Regional tournament beginning the following Friday (March 13).

In addition to the WOU-CWU game, this Thursday's schedule will also send Saint Martin's (6-15, 3-8) to Northwest Nazarene, Western Washington (11-10, 4-7) to Seattle Pacific and Simon Fraser (8-11, 3-8) to MSU Billings (4-17, 2-9).

Alaska (5-14, 2-9) and Alaska Anchorage are idle until playing their rivalry game Saturday at the Alaska Airlines Center in Anchorage.

### WOU Ranked 20th in NABC Coaches Poll

Western Oregon moved up to 20th place from 24<sup>th</sup> in this week's NABC national poll after earning home wins over Montana State Billings and Seattle Pacific last week.

The Wolves earned their first ranking of the season last week.

SPU is the only other GNAC team that earned points in this week's poll. The Falcons received two ballot points and are 35<sup>th</sup> overall.

In this week's D2SIDA national poll, Western Oregon is ranked 23<sup>rd</sup>. The Wolves are ranked third and Seattle Pacific is ranked seventh in the D2SIDA regional poll.

### Nichols 5<sup>th</sup>, Turner 6<sup>th</sup> in National Statistics

Julian Nichols of Western Oregon is ranked fifth in assist/turnover ratio and Anye Turner of Western Washington is ranked sixth in blocked shots in this week's NCAA Division II national statistical poll.

Nichols is averaging 3.37 for every turnover, while Turner is averaging 3.05 blocks per game.

Also ranked in the Top 10 is Simon Fraser's Sango Niang, seventh in assists (6.6) and ninth in scoring (23.5), and Central Washington's Joseph Stroud, ninth in blocked shots (2.65).

In team categories, Simon Fraser is the Division II national leader in scoring (110.5), three-pointers made (12.9), steals (13.7) and turnover margin (9.7). The Clan also ranks third in offense rebounds (16.2).

Seattle Pacific ranks second in rebounding margin (13.2), fourth in field goal percentage (52.1) and seventh in scoring margin (18.0).

Western Oregon ranks fifth in free throw percentage (78.0). Western Washington is fifth in blocked shots (5.6).

### Team Notes

**Alaska:** Eric Fongue led the Nanooks with 23 points and 16 rebounds in a pair of losses at Burnaby and Bellingham. Anthony Reese had a double-double (14 points, 10 rebounds) in the 79-71 loss at Simon Fraser. He also finished the two-game set with 13 rebounds.

**Alaska Anchorage:** Travis Thompson had 45 points, converting 9-of-18 three-pointers, in wins at Western Washington and Simon Fraser. Thompson now has 278 career treys, 14 shy of the GNAC all-time career record. The Seawolves also got 42 points from Derrick Fain and 39

points and 15 assists from Brian McGill. Dom Hunter had 34 points, 22 in Thursday's win at Western Washington,

**Central Washington:** Joey Roppo led Central Washington with 13 points and Devin Matthews had 11 points in a 66-64 road loss at Northwest Nazarene. Roppo made 5-of-6 shots including all three of his three-point attempts. CWU played the game without Jordan Russell. Russell, who was averaging 10.6 points, has been dismissed from the team.

**Montana State Billings:** Antoine Hosley came off the bench to score 23 points, making 10 of 17 shots, in MSUB's 94-74 loss at Western Oregon. He added 14 more points in Saturday's 75-64 loss at Saint Martin's and did not commit a turnover in 24 minutes. In the two games, he shot 48.4 percent (15-of-31). Emmanuel Johnson had 24 points, 15 rebounds and three of MSUB's four blocked shots.

**Northwest Nazarene:** Freshman forward Alex Birketoft had 16 points, eight rebounds, five blocks, two steals and two assists as the Crusaders edged Central Washington 66-64 to complete a two-game sweep of their season series. Kevin Rima had 14 points and 10 rebounds, recording his conference best sixth double-double of the season. Rima has 960 career points and 573 career rebounds.

**Saint Martin's:** Isaac Bianchini and Trey Ingram each had 21 points as the Saints split two home games. Ingram also had a team-best nine assists. Bianchini made 5-of-8 three-pointers and currently leads the GNAC in three-point percentage, connecting on 50.7 percent (36-of-71). The GNAC record is 53.1 percent by Brandon Foote of Central Washington in 2007-08.

**Seattle Pacific:** Shawn Reid had 30 points and Riley Stockton and Cory Hutson had 29 points each as the Falcons split two road games, losing in double overtime to Western Oregon 94-84 after beating Saint Martin's 84-52. Reid came off the bench to score 23 points in 20 minutes in the win. Stockton had eight assists increasing his career total to 404 and becoming the 12<sup>th</sup> player in GNAC history to record 400 or more assists.

**Simon Fraser:** Sango Niang had 47 points (9-of-20 three-pointers), 12 rebounds and eight assists as the Clan split two games defeating Alaska and losing to Alaska Anchorage. In two games this winter against UAF, the Clan launched 102 three-point attempts, including the two highest single game totals in GNAC history in conference games - 55 on Jan. 3 and 47 Thursday.

**Western Oregon:** In addition to Avgi's 46 points (see *GNAC Player of the Week* notes), the Wolves were led by Devon Alexander's 30 points in their sweep of MSUB and SPU. Julian Nichols had 25 points, 17 assists and 10 rebounds. Alexander hit a three-point at the buzzer to force overtime Saturday against SPU completing a

comeback from a five-point deficit with 17 seconds remaining. WWU shot 55.2 percent (69-of-125) in the two wins.

**Western Washington:** Jeffrey Parker scored 41 points and Anye Turner had 26 points and 23 rebounds as the Vikings split two games. Turner had 24 of his points and 15 of his rebounds in a 81-76 loss to Alaska Anchorage, a game in which WWU rallied from a 25-point deficit, pulling to within three points twice in the final minute.

### Players of the Week – Week By Week

**Nov. 10-16** – Jeffrey Parker, Western Washington (F, 6-6, So., Richmond, CA – Salesian) and Joseph Stroud, Central Washington (F, 6-8, Jr., Las Vegas, NV – Sierra Vista/Pierce College) ... Parker scored 43 points and also had 18 rebounds leading the Vikings to two wins in the 13<sup>th</sup> Chuck Randall Classic. Parker made seven of 17 3-pointers and shot 51.7 percent overall, cashing in on 15-of-29. He was named the tournament's MVP ... Stroud earned all-tournament honors leading the Wildcats to two wins in the Seattle Pacific Sodexo Tip-Off tournament. He came off the bench to score 24 points, making nine of 10 shots. He also led CWU in rebounds (11) and blocked shots (7). His last basket with one second half came on a dunk to break a 68-68 tie in Saturday's 70-68 win over Academy of Art.

**Nov. 17-23:** Ruben Silvas, Alaska (G, 6-3, 175, Jr., Tucson, AZ) had 33 points, shooting 62.5 percent (15-of-24) as the Nanooks made their 2014-15 season debut in the GCI Alaska Invitational. The JC transfer from Arizona also had 16 rebounds, two assists and a steal and wasn't charged with a turnover in earning all-tournament honors as the Nanooks won one of three contests.

**Nov. 24-30:** Julian Nichols, Western Oregon (G, 6-2, 175, Jr. Upland, CA) scored 51 points and also 10 rebounds, a team-high 14 assists and six steals in leading the Wolves to three road West Region victories, including a 67-52 win at 2014 playoff qualifier Dixie State. Nichols made 15 of 31 field goal attempts and also converted on 19 of 20 foul shots. Twenty-six of his points came in Saturday's 83-73 win at the Academy of Art.

**Dec. 1-7:** Dom Williams, Central Washington (G, 5-11, Sr., Tacoma, WA – Curtis & Tacoma CC) scored 50 points and also had 10 assists and just one turnover in wins over Montana State Billings and defending GNAC champion Seattle Pacific. He had a career-high 31 points and five assists in an 88-79 win over MSUB Thursday, connecting on 11 of 20 shots, including 5-of-7 three-pointers. Williams then added 19 points and five assists in a 73-67 victory against SPU Saturday, converting on 4-of-7 three-point shots. The win snapped a four-game CWU losing streak to the Falcons. For the week, Williams made 18-of-37 shots (48.6 percent), including 9-of-14 three-pointers. He also converted on 5-of-6 foul shots.

**Dec. 8-14:** Mitch Penner, Seattle Pacific (F, 6-5, Jr., Seattle, WA – Kennedy) scored 26 points and also had 11 rebounds, three steals and two blocks to lead the Falcons to a 100-67 win over George Fox. Penner, who made 7-of-12 field goal attempts, was perfect from the foul line connecting on 11-of-11.

**Dec. 15-21:** Shawn Reid, Seattle Pacific (F, 6-4, Sr., Post Falls, ID) scored a team-best 36 points shooting 71.4 percent in leading the Falcons to wins over Dixie State (76-66) and Rollins (74-54) in the Las Vegas Challenge. Reid made 15-of-21 shots, including 5-of-9 three-pointers. He also led the Falcons with three steals. Reid came off the bench against Dixie State with SPU trailing 17-2 and scored 30 points in just 18 minutes to rally SPU to the 10-point win. Reid, whose previous SPU career-high was 13, made 12 of 15 shots, including 5-of-7 from the arc.

**Dec. 29-Jan. 4:** Ashton Edwards, Alaska (G, Jr., Compton, CA – Long Beach CC) and Brian McGill, Alaska Anchorage (G, 6-2, Jr., Clackamas, OR – Western Oregon) ... Edwards scored 53 points including 30 in Thursday's 64-60 home win against Western Washington and 23 in Saturday's 121-111 victory against Simon Fraser. Edwards made 16-of-32 field goal attempts including 7-of-12 three-pointers and 14-of-15 free throws. He also had seven rebounds and four assists. His point total against the Vikings represented nearly 47 percent of the Nanooks' team total ... McGill had 48 points, nine rebounds and nine assists as the Seawolves also swept SFU (108-86) and Western Washington (62-60). McGill scored 28 points and had six rebounds in 26 minutes against the Clan Thursday and had a game-high 20 points, including the game-winning shot with 6.5 seconds left, in Saturday's win against Western

Washington. In that contest, McGill was perfect from the foul line, converting on 8-of-8 attempts.

**Jan. 5-11:** Momir Gataric, MSU Billings (F, 6-5, Jr., Sunnyvale, CA – West Valley College) and Andy Avgi, Western Oregon (F, 6-6, Jr., Woodburn, OR) ... Gataric scored 45 points and shot 72.7 percent from the floor (16-of-22) as the Yellowjackets split two games defeating Simon Fraser 111-104 Saturday for their first conference win of the season. He had 25 points on 10 of 14 shooting in a 88-68 loss to Western Washington before contributing 20 points, five assists and four assists against the Clan ... Avgi scored 41 points as the Wolves defeated Northwest Nazarene and Central Washington to extend their home win streak to eight and take over sole possession of first place in the GNAC. Avgi made 17 of 29 shots, including a key tip-in with 23 seconds remaining in the win against NNU.

**Jan. 12-18:** Kevin Rima, Northwest Nazarene (F/C, 6-7, Sr., Fairbanks, AK - Hutchison) and Sango Niang, Simon Fraser (G, 6-0, Sr., Paris, France – Chaffey CC) ... Rima, who is averaging 12.2 points per game, scored 47 points and also had 19 rebounds to lead the Crusaders to their fourth and fifth wins in their last six games. He had 18 points and 12 rebounds, recording his 13<sup>th</sup> career double-double, in a 107-103 victory against Simon Fraser Thursday. On Saturday, he tallied 29 points and grabbed seven rebounds in a 80-73 conquest of Western Washington. Rima, who made 18 of 25 field goal attempts and 11 of 13 foul shots, helped rally NNU from double-digit second-half deficits in both games ... Niang scored 71 points, including 46 in a 104-95 loss Saturday at Central Washington. That is the second highest single-game point total in GNAC history trailing only Western Washington's Ryan Diggs who scored 47 in 2006. Niang made 18 field goals equaling the GNAC single-game record set by Gerrit Eades of Saint Martin's in 2002. In two games, he made 27 of 46 field goal attempts and also had 11 assists.

**Jan. 19-Jan. 25:** Jordan Wiley, Western Oregon (G, 6-6, Jr., McKenzie River, OR) scored 26 points in a 114-75 win at Simon Fraser and had 15 points including a key three-pointer with 1:49 left in a 90-87 victory at Western Washington as the Wolves completed the first half of the conference race with an 8-1 record and a one-game lead over Seattle Pacific and Central Washington. Wiley shot 75.0 from the field (12-of-16) and also had nine rebounds, four assists and three steals in the two wins. He made 7-of-8 three-pointers against SFU equaling the second highest total for three-pointers made in a game with just one miss in GNAC history.

**Jan. 26-Feb. 2:** Andy Avgi, Western Oregon (F, 6-6, Jr., Woodburn, OR) and Derrick Fain, Alaska Anchorage (G, 6-4, Sr., Dallas, TX – The Master's) ... Avgi scored 46 points, including a career-high 33 in a 94-84 overtime win against Seattle Pacific Saturday as the Wolves opened up a two-game in the conference race with wins over Montana State Billings and the Falcons. Avgi made 17 of 28 shots and 11 of 12 foul shots. He also had nine rebounds, five assists, three steals and two blocks. WOU extended its win streak to eight games and its home win streak to 11 with the two wins ... Fain scored 42 points and also had 15 rebounds as Alaska Anchorage, which plays five of its final seven games at home, improved to 5-2 in conference road contests with wins at Western Washington and Simon Fraser. Fain made 13-of-22 shots, including 9-of-15 from the three-point line. He also converted on 7-of-8 free throws as the Seawolves shot 81.2 percent (56-of-69) from the line.
