### SPU Closing In On First-Round Bye

PORTLAND, Ore. – Either Seattle Pacific or Northwest Nazarene will earn the GNAC's second first-round bye in next week's GNAC Men's Basketball Championships at Alterowitz Gymnasium in Billings, Mont.

The Falcons can earn the bye with a win Saturday against Northwest Nazarene. SPU would also gain the tournament's No. 2 seed if either MSUB beats Central or if Alaska Anchorage defeats Saint Martin's Saturday.

NNU must beat SPU and hope CWU and SMU win their games to earn the No. 2 seed.

Western Oregon will be the top-seed in the tournament and will play in Friday's semifinals against the winner of a Thursday game between the No. 4 and No. 5 seeds.

The other Friday semifinal will match the No. 2 seed against the winner of a Thursday game between the No. 3 and No. 6 seeds.

The first-round games and the semifinal games will both be played at 5:15 and 7:30 p.m. on the respective dates, however, the order is yet to be determined.

WOU is the only team that has locked in its exact seed. Depending on what happens Saturday, NNU could be seeded anywhere between second and sixth.

Seattle Pacific could end up as the No. 2 or No. 3 seed. Central Washington could be the third, four or sixth seed.

Alaska Anchorage could wind up as the third, fourth or fifth seed and Western Washington, which will take an eight-game win streak into the tournament, will either be the fifth or sixth seed.

### WOU Ranked 20th in NABC, 23rd in D2SIDA Polls

Western Oregon fell five positions to No. 20 in this week's NABC national poll after splitting two games last week.

In this week's official NCAA West Regional poll, WOU is ranked fourth and Seattle Pacific is 10<sup>th</sup>.

The third of three NCAA regional polls will be released next Wednesday. Then next weekend the NCAA selection committee will choose the five teams which will join the GNAC, CCAA and PacWest champions in the NCAA West Regional, which begins Friday, March 13 at a site to be determined.

The qualifiers will be announced Sunday night (March 8) at 7:30 p.m. Pacific on a webcast on [ncaa.com](http://ncaa.com).

### Turner Remains 4th in Division II Blocked Shots

Western Washington forward Anye Turner remains as the highest ranked GNAC player in the NCAA Division II national statistical report (through Feb. 26). He ranks fourth in blocked shots averaging 3.04 per game.

Turner has had one or more blocks in 28 consecutive games dating back to the final game of the 2013-14 season.

Two Central Washington players also rank in the Top 10. Dom Williams ranks seventh in three-pointers made (3.55) and Joseph Stroud is eighth in blocks (2.79).

Two other players have Top 10 national rankings. Sango Niang of Simon Fraser ranks 10th in assists (6.4) and Julian Nichols of Western Oregon is sixth in assist/turnover ratio (3.33).

In team categories, Simon Fraser ranks first in Division II in scoring (104.2), steals (12.7) and turnover margin (8.0). The Clan also ranks second in three-pointers (12.4).

Seattle Pacific is second in rebound margin (13.3), sixth in field goal percentage (51.6) and eighth in scoring margin (15.6).

After outrebounding CWU 60-25 in a 69-47 win Thursday at Brougham Pavilion, SPU is closing in on the national rebounds leader trailing Slippery Rock by just 1/10 of a rebound per game (13.4 to 13.3).

Western Washington ranks fifth in blocked shots (5.5) and Alaska Anchorage is ninth in both free throw percentage (76.8) and assists (18.0) to complete the list of GNAC teams ranked in the Top 10.

### Thursday's Game Notes

**Alaska:** Almir Hadzisehovic scored 20 points and Anthony Reese nearly had a triple-double (10 points, 13 rebounds, 8 assists) leading the Nanooks to a home overtime win over Saint Martin's. UAF also got 16 points from Kyle Tomlinson, 14 from Alex Duncan and 11 from Ashton Edwards in improving to 2-2 over its last four games. UAF shot 51.8 percent (29-of-56) and outrebounded the Saints 39-25.

**Alaska Anchorage:** Christian Leckband scored 13 of his 16 points in the second half, making all five of his shots, as the Seawolves defeated first-place Western Oregon. Derrick Fain also had 16 points and Dom Hunter had 14. Brian McGill earned eight assists. UAA shot 55.8 percent, making 29 of 52 shots, including 12-of-22 from the arc. Leckband was four-of-four from the three-point line.

**Central Washington:** The Wildcats' starting lineup scored just 25 points, 15 by Joseph Stroud, who made six of nine shots, in a loss at Seattle Pacific. CWU was 7-of-34 in the first half drawing a blank in seven three-point attempts in digging itself a 32-16 halftime deficit.

**MSU Billings:** Emmanuel Johnson had 20 points and Antoine Hosley had 14 in a 91-67 home loss to Northwest Nazarene. Jordan Perry had 13 points and tied Johnson for team rebounding honors with five.

**Northwest Nazarene:** Erik Kinney scored 19 points to lead five players in double figures in a 24-point win at Billings. Kevin Rima added 16 points. Alex Birketoft made four-of-four three-pointers and finished with 12 points. Bouna N'Diaye also had 12 points and Pol Olivier netted 11 points. The Crusaders shot 54.7 percent (35-of-64), including 41.7 on treys (10-of-24).

**Saint Martin's:** Trey Ingram had 27 points and six steals at Fairbanks, making 9 of 10 two-point shots (and 2-of-8 three-pointers). The Saints also got 15 points from Isaac Bianchini, who made 4-of-5 three-pointers, and 11 from Tyler Idowu.

**Seattle Pacific:** The Falcons limited Central Washington to one three-pointer in 13 attempts and a 30.6 percent shooting percentage in a 69-47 win. Matt Borton had 15 points and 17 rebounds, only eight fewer than the entire CWU team as SPU controlled the backboards 60-25. Corey Hutsen had a game-high 17 points.

**Simon Fraser:** Sango Niang scored 20 points increasing his career total to 979 to finish his career in 65<sup>th</sup> place on the GNAC career scoring list. SFU also got 12 points from Hidde Vos on 4-of-6 three-point shots, 11 from Daniel Deflorimonte and 10 from Patrick Simon.

**Western Oregon:** Devon Alexander scored 20 points and Andy Avgi had 19 points and eight rebounds in a two-point loss at Anchorage. WOU shot 48.2 percent from the floor (7-of-12), but was 9-of-28 from the three-point line. Avgi is shooting 61.0 percent on the season making 183 of 300 and has a 59.1 career percentage, eighth all-time in the conference.

**Western Washington:** The Vikings will take an eight-game win streak as either the No. 5 or No. 6 seed in next week's conference tournament at Billings, Mont. Jeffrey Parker paced WWU with 31 points, becoming the fourth GNAC player to have two 30-point games this winter. Parker made 14-of-21 shots and was a perfect 11-of-11 inside the arc. He also had nine rebounds. Joey Schreiber had 22 points and eight rebounds and Anye Turner had 14 points and 14 rebounds, posting his sixth double-double of the season.

### Last Week's GNAC Team Notes

**Alaska:** Almir Hadzisehovic led the Nanooks with 33 points and also had 11 rebounds in contests at Nampa and Ellensburg. Eric Fongue had 21 points in the two contests, making 5-of-9 shots from the arc. Anthony Reese grabbed the most rebounds (16) and tied Alex Duncan for the most steals with five.

**Alaska Anchorage:** Travis Thompson and Derrick Fain both had 30-point games and both made 7-of-10 three-pointers last Saturday at Northwest Nazarene. Thompson scored 33 points and set a GNAC career-record in the process for three-pointers increasing his total to 295, three more than Jake Linton of Saint Martin's (2006-09). For the weekend, both players scored 44 points. Dom Hunter made 7-of-10 three-pointers to account for his team-high 21 points in the Seawolves' 13-point loss at Ellensburg, but didn't play Saturday.

**Central Washington:** Dom Williams scored 26 points in an 80-67 home win against Alaska Anchorage, then added 27 more in a 75-66 win versus Alaska recording his 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> 20-point games of the season. Williams, who ranks sixth in NCAA Division II in three-pointers made (3.74 per game), made 10 of 22. Joseph Stroud had 14 rebounds and four blocks and Marc Rodgers had eight assists. Rodgers made 4-of-6 shots, 3-of-4 from the arc.

**MSU Billings:** Marc Matthews registered his fifth 20-point game of the season scoring 21 of the Yellowjackets' 59 points in a ROOT SPORTS game at Seattle Pacific Saturday. Also in double figures for the Yellowjackets were Antoine Hosley with 15 points and Emmanuel Johnson with 10 points.

**Northwest Nazarene:** Alex Birketoft (39 points), Erik Kinney (31 points) and Kevin Rima (30 points) combined for exactly 100 of NNU's 167 points in wins over UAF and UAA. Birketoft, who made all 10 of his foul shots, was 7-of-14 from the three-point line and 11-of-20 overall. He also had a team-high 17 rebounds ... Kinney had a team-high 17 points in the Crusaders' 67-56 ROOT SPORTS win against the Nanooks, which clinched a GNAC tournament berth for NNU, its first under the GNAC six-team, one-site format. NNU was the fifth seed, splitting two games, in the 2011 eight-team tournament which was played at host sites.

**Saint Martin's:** Tyler Idowu scored 39 points, shooting 75 percent (18-of-24) in SMU's contests with Simon Fraser and Western Washington. Idowu had a career-high 24 points making 12 of 17 field goals against the Vikings. Ryan Rogers finished with 26 points and a team-high 18 rebounds. Riley Carel had team-highs for assists (14) and steals (4).

**Seattle Pacific:** Matt Borton had his third double-double of the season, scoring 20 points and grabbing 10 rebounds in the Falcons' 81-59 home court win against MSU Billings Saturday. Cory Hutsen also had 20 points. SPU, which ranks second in Division II in rebounding, outboarded the Falcons 45-25. SPU ranks fifth in field goal percentage at 51.6 and improved that mark slightly by making 31 of 58 (53.4).

**Simon Fraser:** Michael Harper, who averages nine points per game, scored 34 points, making 13 of 17 shots including 6-of-10 from the arc. Justin Cole had 33 points, including 23 in a 103-87 win at Saint Martin's. Sango Niang had 27 points and 18 rebounds, including a 15-point, 12-assist double-double against the Saints. Niang's assist total was his fourth double-digit total of the season. SMU's point total against SMU was its 12<sup>th</sup> 100-point game of the season.

**Western Oregon:** Julian Nichols scored 47 points, including a career-high 34 – 24 in the second half - in a 93-91 win against Simon Fraser Saturday as the Wolves clinched their first GNAC regular-season title in the 14-year history of the conference. Nichols, who made 18-of-33 shots, also had 11 assists, eight rebounds and eight steals. Both Nichols and Jordan Wiley (28 points), made 5-of-11 three-pointers. WOU played both of its games last week without Andy Avgi and were outrebounded by eight a game (79-63). On the year, it outrebounded its opponents by 4.1 per game to rank third in the conference.

**Western Washington:** The Vikings outshot their opponents 47.7 (21-of-44) to 28.1 percent (9-of-32) from the three-point line in their wins at Western Oregon and Saint Martin's as GNAC Player of the Week Jeffrey Parker made 9-of-15, Ricardo Maxwell converted on 5-of-9 from the arc and Joey Schreiber cashed in on 5-of-10. Maxwell finished with 31 points and Schreiber had 25. Mac Johnson had a team-high 17 rebounds. ... WWU scored 16 consecutive points to break a 44-44 tie on the way to a 73-50 upset of Western Oregon in Thursday's game.

### Players of the Week – Week By Week

**Nov. 10-16** – Jeffrey Parker, Western Washington (F, 6-6, So., Richmond, CA – Salesian) and Joseph Stroud, Central Washington (F, 6-8, Jr., Las Vegas, NV – Sierra Vista/Pierce College) ... Parker scored 43 points and also had 18 rebounds leading the Vikings to two wins in the 13<sup>th</sup> Chuck Randall Classic. Parker made seven of 17 3-pointers and shot 51.7 percent overall, cashing in on 15-of-29. He was named the tournament's MVP ... Stroud earned all-tournament honors leading the Wildcats to two wins in the Seattle Pacific Sodexo Tip-Off tournament. He came

off the bench to score 24 points, making nine of 10 shots. He also led CWU in rebounds (11) and blocked shots (7). His last basket with one second half came on a dunk to break a 68-68 tie in Saturday's 70-68 win over Academy of Art.

**Nov. 17-23:** Ruben Silvas, Alaska (G, 6-3, 175, Jr., Tucson, AZ) had 33 points, shooting 62.5 percent (15-of-24) as the Nanooks made their 2014-15 season debut in the GCI Alaska Invitational. The JC transfer from Arizona also had 16 rebounds, two assists and a steal and wasn't charged with a turnover in earning all-tournament honors as the Nanooks won one of three contests.

**Nov. 24-30:** Julian Nichols, Western Oregon (G, 6-2, 175, Jr. Upland, CA) scored 51 points and also 10 rebounds, a team-high 14 assists and six steals in leading the Wolves to three road West Region victories, including a 67-52 win at 2014 playoff qualifier Dixie State. Nichols made 15 of 31 field goal attempts and also converted on 19 of 20 foul shots. Twenty-six of his points came in Saturday's 83-73 win at the Academy of Art.

**Dec. 1-7:** Dom Williams, Central Washington (G, 5-11, Sr., Tacoma, WA – Curtis & Tacoma CC) scored 50 points and also had 10 assists and just one turnover in wins over Montana State Billings and defending GNAC champion Seattle Pacific. He had a career-high 31 points and five assists in an 88-79 win over MSUB Thursday, connecting on 11 of 20 shots, including 5-of-7 three-pointers. Williams then added 19 points and five assists in a 73-67 victory against SPU Saturday, converting on 4-of-7 three-point shots. The win snapped a four-game CWU losing streak to the Falcons. For the week, Williams made 18-of-37 shots (48.6 percent), including 9-of-14 three-pointers. He also converted on 5-of-6 foul shots.

**Dec. 8-14:** Mitch Penner, Seattle Pacific (F, 6-5, Jr., Seattle, WA – Kennedy) scored 26 points and also had 11 rebounds, three steals and two blocks to lead the Falcons to a 100-67 win over George Fox. Penner, who made 7-of-12 field goal attempts, was perfect from the foul line connecting on 11-of-11.

**Dec. 15-21:** Shawn Reid, Seattle Pacific (F, 6-4, Sr., Post Falls, ID) scored a team-best 36 points shooting 71.4 percent in leading the Falcons to wins over Dixie State (76-66) and Rollins (74-54) in the Las Vegas Challenge. Reid made 15-of-21 shots, including 5-of-9 three-pointers. He also led the Falcons with three steals. Reid came off the bench against Dixie State with SPU trailing 17-2 and scored 30 points in just 18 minutes to rally SPU to the 10-point win. Reid, whose previous SPU career-high was 13, made 12 of 15 shots, including 5-of-7 from the arc.

**Dec. 29-Jan. 4:** Ashton Edwards, Alaska (G, Jr., Compton, CA – Long Beach CC) and Brian McGill, Alaska Anchorage (G, 6-2, Jr., Clackamas, OR – Western Oregon) ... Edwards

scored 53 points including 30 in Thursday's 64-60 home win against Western Washington and 23 in Saturday's 121-111 victory against Simon Fraser. Edwards made 16-of-32 field goal attempts including 7-of-12 three-pointers and 14-of-15 free throws. He also had seven rebounds and four assists. His point total against the Vikings represented nearly 47 percent of the Nanooks' team total ... McGill had 48 points, nine rebounds and nine assists as the Seawolves also swept SFU (108-86) and Western Washington (62-60). McGill scored 28 points and had six rebounds in 26 minutes against the Clan Thursday and had a game-high 20 points, including the game-winning shot with 6.5 seconds left, in Saturday's win against Western Washington. In that contest, McGill was perfect from the foul line, converting on 8-of-8 attempts.

**Jan. 5-11:** Momir Gataric, MSU Billings (F, 6-5, Jr., Sunnyvale, CA – West Valley College) and Andy Avgi, Western Oregon (F, 6-6, Jr., Woodburn, OR) ... Gataric scored 45 points and shot 72.7 percent from the floor (16-of-22) as the Yellowjackets split two games defeating Simon Fraser 111-104 Saturday for their first conference win of the season. He had 25 points on 10 of 14 shooting in an 88-68 loss to Western Washington before contributing 20 points, five assists and four assists against the Clan ... Avgi scored 41 points as the Wolves defeated Northwest Nazarene and Central Washington to extend their home win streak to eight and take over sole possession of first place in the GNAC. Avgi made 17 of 29 shots, including a key tip-in with 23 seconds remaining in the win against NNU.

**Jan. 12-18:** Kevin Rima, Northwest Nazarene (F/C, 6-7, Sr., Fairbanks, AK - Hutchison) and Sango Niang, Simon Fraser (G, 6-0, Sr., Paris, France – Chaffey CC) ... Rima, who is averaging 12.2 points per game, scored 47 points and also had 19 rebounds to lead the Crusaders to their fourth and fifth wins in their last six games. He had 18 points and 12 rebounds, recording his 13<sup>th</sup> career double-double, in a 107-103 victory against Simon Fraser Thursday. On Saturday, he tallied 29 points and grabbed seven rebounds in a 80-73 conquest of Western Washington. Rima, who made 18 of 25 field goal attempts and 11 of 13 foul shots, helped rally NNU from double-digit second-half deficits in both games ... Niang scored 71 points, including 46 in a 104-95 loss Saturday at Central Washington. That is the second highest single-game point total in GNAC history trailing only Western Washington's Ryan Diggs who scored 47 in 2006. Niang made 18 field goals equaling the GNAC single-game record set by Gerrit Eades of Saint Martin's in 2002. In two games, he made 27 of 46 field goal attempts and also had 11 assists.

**Jan. 19-Jan. 25:** Jordan Wiley, Western Oregon (G, 6-6, Jr., McKenzie River, OR) scored 26 points in a 114-75 win at Simon Fraser and had 15 points including a key three-pointer with 1:49 left in a 90-87 victory at Western Washington as the Wolves completed the first half of the

conference race with an 8-1 record and a one-game lead over Seattle Pacific and Central Washington. Wiley shot 75.0 from the field (12-of-16) and also had nine rebounds, four assists and three steals in the two wins. He made 7-of-8 three-pointers against SFU equaling the second highest total for three-pointers made in a game with just one miss in GNAC history.

**Jan. 26-Feb. 1:** Andy Avgi, Western Oregon (F, 6-6, Jr., Woodburn, OR) and Derrick Fain, Alaska Anchorage (G, 6-4, Sr., Dallas, TX – The Master's) ... Avgi scored 46 points, including a career-high 33 in a 94-84 overtime win against Seattle Pacific Saturday as the Wolves opened up a two-game in the conference race with wins over Montana State Billings and the Falcons. Avgi made 17 of 28 shots and 11 of 12 foul shots. He also had nine rebounds, five assists, three steals and two blocks. WOU extended its win streak to eight games and its home win streak to 11 with the two wins ... Fain scored 42 points and also had 15 rebounds as Alaska Anchorage, which plays five of its final seven games at home, improved to 5-2 in conference road contests with wins at Western Washington and Simon Fraser. Fain made 13-of-22 shots, including 9-of-15 from the three-point line. He also converted on 7-of-8 free throws as the Seawolves shot 81.2 percent (56-of-69) from the line.

**Feb. 2-8:** Anye Turner, Western Washington (F, 6-7, Sr., Olympia, WA – Black Hills) scored 23 points and also had 23 rebounds and nine blocks in leading the Vikings to a pair of 10-point road wins at Seattle Pacific (82-72) and MSU Billings (75-65). Turner played a key role defensively in WWU's win at SPU. He had all five of the Vikings' blocked shots as WWU held SPU to a 44.4 shooting percentage. The Falcons came into the game ranked fourth nationally in field goal percentage shooting 52.1 percent. Turner, who ranks sixth in GNAC history in career blocked shots with 152, converted 58.8 percent of his attempts, making 10 of 17. He also had four assists and a steal without committing a turnover.

**Feb. 9-15 -** Cory Hutson, Seattle Pacific (C, 6-8, Sr., Sammamish, WA - Skyline) scored 43 points, including 23 in a 73-72 overtime win at Alaska Anchorage Saturday as the Falcons kept alive their chances to earn a first-round bye in next month's conference playoffs with two victories. Hutson, who made 11 of 15 shots against the Seawolves, scored a basket with 2:18 left in overtime to give SPU its final lead at 70-68. In two wins in Alaska, Hutson made 20 of 29 field goal attempts and also had nine rebounds and a team-best three blocks helping SPU limit the Seawolves and Alaska Nanooks to a combined 40.7 shooting percentage.

**Feb. 16-22:** Jeffrey Parker, Western Washington (F, 6-6, So., Richmond, CA - Salesian) led the Vikings to two wins, including a 73-50 victory at Western Oregon snapping the Wolves' 11-game win streak. In the two contests, Parker

scored 42 points, connecting on 16 of 25 shots, including 9-of-15 three-pointers. He also had six rebounds and three assists. WWU has won seven straight, six by double-digit margins.
