SPU, WOU Look To Reverse Regular-Season Results

PORTLAND, Ore. — GNAC tournament champion Seattle Pacific opens the 2015 NCAA Division II West Regional Friday at 2:30 p.m. against BYU-Hawaii at Azusa, Calif.

The opening round will also feature a 7:30 p.m. game between host and top-seed Azusa Pacific and GNAC regular-season champion Western Oregon.

The winner of the tournament advances to the NCAA Elite Eight March 25-28 at the Ford Center at Evansville, Indiana. The championship game will be televised by CBS.

Both games will be the second this season between the respective teams.

BYU-Hawaii defeated the Falcons 87-74 on Nov. 22 at Laie, Hawaii.

The Seasideers are 4-0 against GNAC teams this season. They also defeated Central Washington at Laie and Alaska Anchorage and Alaska at Anchorage.

In the first game between the two schools, GNAC Tournament MVP Cory Hutson led SPU with 23 points while Scott Friel paced the Seasideers with 20 points and 11 rebounds.

The first game was not typical of SPU's season as the Falcons were outrebounded (27-25) for the only time this season. SPU leads Division II in rebounding margin outrebounding its opponents by a margin of 13.3 per game.

The Falcons lead the GNAC in field goal percentage defense this season, allowing its opponents to shoot just 41.8 percent.

The PacWest school, however, shot 62.5 percentage, making 35 of 56 shots. Only two other SPU opponents shot 50 percent or better — Academy of Art on Nov. 14 (50.0) and Western Washington on Feb. 5 (55.8).

SPU, which has won seven straight games, lost both of those contests.

The Falcons are 2-2 against West Region tournament teams, defeating Dixie State 76-66 on Dec. 17 at Las Vegas and splitting two games with Western Oregon, winning at Brougham Pavilion 83-76 on Jan. 1 and losing 94-84 in two overtimes at Monmouth on Jan. 31.

Western Oregon is also 2-2 against tournament teams. In addition to its two contests with SPU, the Wolves lost 81-74 at home on Nov. 21 to Azusa Pacific and defeated Dixie State 67-52 on Nov. 25 at St. George, Utah.

In the loss to APU, WOU shot just 40.6 percent (28-of-69) and were outrebounded 45-35. APU's Troy Leaf scored 33 points, making 10 of 15 shots including 5-of-8 three-pointers.

GNAC regular-season MVP Andy Avgi led WOU with 18 points and also had six rebounds and four steals.

TOURNAMENT NOTABLES: Seattle Pacific is making its 25th NCAA appearance and has an all-time record of 29-24. It's finished third twice – losing in the semifinals in both 2000 and 2006. BYU Hawaii will be playing in its 11th tournament and has a 12-10 record. The Seasideers were the national runner-ups in 2011 ... Both Western Oregon and Azusa Pacific are playing in their first NCAA tournaments. This is APU's first season of NCAA playoff eligibility after transitioning from the NAIA ... GNAC teams were 15-27 against West Region teams this winter, including 13-20 against the PacWest and 2-7 against the CCAA ... Conference teams were 2-9 against teams that are competing this week in the West Regional – 2-2 against Dixie State, 0-4 against BYU-Hawaii, 0-2 against Azusa Pacific and 0-1 against Chico State. No GNAC team played either Cal Baptist or Cal Poly Pomona.

Four Qualifiers Ranked in NABC Poll

Four West Region tournament teams are ranked in this week's NABC national poll.

Region top-seed Azusa Pacific is ranked 14th, No. 2 seed BYU-Hawaii is ranked 16th, third-seed California Baptist is ranked 21st and fifth-seed Cal Poly Pomona is ranked 24th.

Western Oregon (27th overall), Seattle Pacific (31st), Chico State (37th) and Dixie State (39th) are among "others receiving votes."

Following are the final NCAA and D2SIDA regional polls. The official NCAA poll is taken prior to the conference tournaments and doesn't necessarily reflect the seedings for the regional tournament.

SPU's Hutsen Sets Three Records in Earning MVP

Corey Hutsen set GNAC tournament single-game records for points (34), field goals made (15) and field goal attempts (23) in leading Seattle Pacific to a 81-68 win over Western Washington in last Saturday's Great Northwest Athletic Conference championship game at Billings.

Two individual records were also tied in the tournament as Dom Williams of Central Washington, who scored 29 points in a 79-73 loss to Northwest Nazarene, tied the record for most three-point attempts (12) and Alex

Birketoft of Northwest Nazarene tied the record for most blocks (4) in the same game.

Western Washington set a tournament record for highest shooting percentage making 61.1 percent of its shots (33-of-54) in its semifinal victory over Western Oregon Friday.

Seattle Pacific launched 26 three-point attempts in its semifinal game against Northwest Nazarene to tie the tournament record. It's the fifth time a team has taken 26 treys.

Hutsen and SPU's Riley Stockton each tied the GNAC career record for games played increasing their totals to 124 each.

They are the third and fourth players in GNACC history to reach that number joining Chris Mitchell of Western Washington (2008-14) and David Downs of Seattle Pacific (2010-14).

Seattle Pacific Ranked in 5 Categories; WOU in 4

Seattle Pacific takes a Top 30 national ranking in five categories into this week's West Regional tournament, including its No. 1 ranking in rebounding (13.3).

The Falcons are also ranked eighth in scoring margin (15.5), ninth in field goal percentage (50.4), 10th in 3-point defense (31.0) and 17th in scoring defense (63.5).

Western Oregon is 17th in steals (9.4), 27th in assist/turnover ratio (1.34) and turnover margin (3.6) and 29th in fewest turnovers (11.4).

Simon Fraser finished its campaign ranked No. 1 in Division II in scoring (104.2), three-pointers (12.4), steals (12.7) and turnover margin (8.0).

Western Washington is ranked fifth in blocked shots (5.3). Alaska Anchorage has two Top 10 ranks – seventh in assists (18.1) and eighth in free throw percentage (77.0).

In individual statistics, WOU's Julian Nichols is the highest ranked GNAC player. He ranks fifth in assist/turnover ratio (3.33).

Anye Turner of Western Washington ranks seventh in blocked shots (2.80). He had a string of 28 consecutive games with a block end in WWU's first game at the GNAC tournament.

Sango Niang of Simon Fraser ranks eighth in assists (6.4) and Joseph Stroud is ninth in blocked shots (2.65).

Stroud was the nation leader in field goal percentage last week, but fell out of the rankings as he missed by one field goal made to have the minimum number made to qualify.

Stroud ended his season making 129 of 183 for a 70.5 percentage to lead the GNAC. However, the NCAA national standard is five made per game (for Stroud who played 26 games that would be 130).

GNAC Tournament Notes

Alaska Anchorage: Derrick Fain had 17 points, making four of nine three-point shots in UAA's opening round loss to Western Washington. The Seawolves were outshot by the Vikings 52.5 percent to 35.5 percent.

Central Washington: Dom Williams hit 5-of-12 three-point shots and scored 29 points in Central's loss to Northwest Nazarene, just missing his fourth 30-point game of the season.

Northwest Nazarene: Erik Kinney led the Crusaders with 33 points and 11 rebounds as NNU split its two tournament games. Mike Wright had 26 points, including 20 in its first-round win over Central Washington.

Seattle Pacific: MVP Cory Hutsen had 41 points and nine rebounds in the Falcons' two victories. Mitch Penner added 24 points and 15 rebounds as SPU claimed its third straight GNAC title. Riley Stockton had 22 points and eight assists.

Western Oregon: Andy Avgi scored 29 points, making 11 of 17 shots in the Wolves' semifinal loss to Western Washington. WOU had just three turnovers in the game and the two teams combined for just 12. WOU's total matched the lowest ever in a GNAC game against a GNAC opponent. It's now been done four times.

Western Washington: Joey Schreiber scored a tournament high 51 points, making 18 of 32 shots, including 8-of-16 from the arc. Mac Johnson led the Vikings with 22 rebounds WWU shot 52.1 percent in its three games, running its win streak to 10 before losing in the championship game.

Players of the Week – Week By Week

Nov. 10-16 – Jeffrey Parker, Western Washington (F, 6-6, So., Richmond, CA – Salesian) and Joseph Stroud, Central Washington (F, 6-8, Jr., Las Vegas, NV – Sierra Vista/Pierce College) ... Parker scored 43 points and also had 18 rebounds leading the Vikings to two wins in the 13th Chuck Randall Classic. Parker made seven of 17 3-pointers and shot 51.7 percent overall, cashing in on 15-of-29. He was named the tournament's MVP ... Stroud earned all-tournament honors leading the Wildcats to two wins in the Seattle Pacific Sodexo Tip-Off tournament. He came off the bench to score 24 points, making nine of 10 shots. He also led CWU in rebounds (11) and blocked shots (7). His last basket with one second half came on a dunk to break a 68-68 tie in Saturday's 70-68 win over Academy of Art.

Nov. 17-23: Ruben Silvas, Alaska (G, 6-3, 175, Jr., Tucson, AZ) had 33 points, shooting 62.5 percent (15-of-24) as the Nanooks made their 2014-15 season debut in the GCI Alaska Invitational. The JC transfer from Arizona also had 16 rebounds, two assists and a steal and wasn't charged with a turnover in earning all-tournament honors as the Nanooks won one of three contests.

Nov. 24-30: Julian Nichols, Western Oregon (G, 6-2, 175, Jr. Upland, CA) scored 51 points and also 10 rebounds, a team-high 14 assists and six steals in leading the Wolves to three road West Region victories, including a 67-52 win at 2014 playoff qualifier Dixie State. Nichols made 15 of 31 field goal attempts and also converted on 19 of 20 foul shots. Twenty-six of his points came in Saturday's 83-73 win at the Academy of Art.

Dec. 1-7: Dom Williams, Central Washington (G, 5-11, Sr., Tacoma, WA – Curtis & Tacoma CC) scored 50 points and also had 10 assists and just one turnover in wins over Montana State Billings and defending GNAC champion Seattle Pacific. He had a career-high 31 points and five assists in an 88-79 win over MSUB Thursday, connecting on 11 of 20 shots, including 5-of-7 three-pointers. Williams then added 19 points and five assists in a 73-67 victory against SPU Saturday, converting on 4-of-7 three-point shots. The win snapped a four-game CWU losing streak to the Falcons. For the week, Williams made 18-of-37 shots (48.6 percent), including 9-of-14 three-pointers. He also converted on 5-of-6 foul shots.

Dec. 8-14: Mitch Penner, Seattle Pacific (F, 6-5, Jr., Seattle, WA – Kennedy) scored 26 points and also had 11 rebounds, three steals and two blocks to lead the Falcons to a 100-67 win over George Fox. Penner, who made 7-of-

12 field goal attempts, was perfect from the foul line connecting on 11-of-11.

Dec. 15-21: Shawn Reid, Seattle Pacific (F, 6-4, Sr., Post Falls, ID) scored a team-best 36 points shooting 71.4 percent in leading the Falcons to wins over Dixie State (76-66) and Rollins (74-54) in the Las Vegas Challenge. Reid made 15-of-21 shots, including 5-of-9 three-pointers. He also led the Falcons with three steals. Reid came off the bench against Dixie State with SPU trailing 17-2 and scored 30 points in just 18 minutes to rally SPU to the 10-point win. Reid, whose previous SPU career-high was 13, made 12 of 15 shots, including 5-of-7 from the arc.

Dec. 29-Jan. 4: Ashton Edwards, Alaska (G, Jr., Compton, CA – Long Beach CC) and Brian McGill, Alaska Anchorage (G, 6-2, Jr., Clackamas, OR – Western Oregon) ... Edwards scored 53 points including 30 in Thursday's 64-60 home win against Western Washington and 23 in Saturday's 121-111 victory against Simon Fraser. Edwards made 16-of-32 field goal attempts including 7-of-12 three-pointers and 14-of-15 free throws. He also had seven rebounds and four assists. His point total against the Vikings represented nearly 47 percent of the Nanooks' team total ... McGill had 48 points, nine rebounds and nine assists as the Seawolves also swept SFU (108-86) and Western Washington (62-60). McGill scored 28 points and had six rebounds in 26 minutes against the Clan Thursday and had a game-high 20 points, including the game-winning shot with 6.5 seconds left, in Saturday's win against Western Washington. In that contest, McGill was perfect from the foul line, converting on 8-of-8 attempts.

Jan. 5-11: Momir Gataric, MSU Billings (F, 6-5, Jr., Sunnyvale, CA – West Valley College) and Andy Avgi, Western Oregon (F, 6-6, Jr., Woodburn, OR) ... Gataric scored 45 points and shot 72.7 percent from the floor (16-of-22) as the Yellowjackets split two games defeating Simon Fraser 111-104 Saturday for their first conference win of the season. He had 25 points on 10 of 14 shooting in an 88-68 loss to Western Washington before contributing 20 points, five assists and four assists against the Clan ... Avgi scored 41 points as the Wolves defeated Northwest Nazarene and Central Washington to extend their home win streak to eight and take over sole possession of first place in the GNAC. Avgi made 17 of 29 shots, including a key tip-in with 23 seconds remaining in the win against NNU.

Jan. 12-18: Kevin Rima, Northwest Nazarene (F/C, 6-7, Sr., Fairbanks, AK – Hutchison) and Sango Niang, Simon Fraser (G, 6-0, Sr., Paris, France – Chaffey CC) ... Rima, who is averaging 12.2 points per game, scored 47 points and also had 19 rebounds to lead the Crusaders to their fourth and fifth wins in their last six games. He had 18 points and 12 rebounds, recording his 13th career double-double, in a 107-103 victory against Simon Fraser Thursday. On Saturday, he tallied 29 points and grabbed seven rebounds

in an 80-73 conquest of Western Washington. Rima, who made 18 of 25 field goal attempts and 11 of 13 foul shots, helped rally NNU from double-digit second-half deficits in both games ... Niang scored 71 points, including 46 in a 104-95 loss Saturday at Central Washington. That is the second highest single-game point total in GNAC history trailing only Western Washington's Ryan Diggs who scored 47 in 2006. Niang made 18 field goals equaling the GNAC single-game record set by Gerrit Eades of Saint Martin's in 2002. In two games, he made 27 of 46 field goal attempts and also had 11 assists.

Jan. 19-Jan. 25: Jordan Wiley, Western Oregon (G, 6-6, Jr., McKenzie River, OR) scored 26 points in a 114-75 win at Simon Fraser and had 15 points including a key three-pointer with 1:49 left in a 90-87 victory at Western Washington as the Wolves completed the first half of the conference race with an 8-1 record and a one-game lead over Seattle Pacific and Central Washington. Wiley shot 75.0 from the field (12-of-16) and also had nine rebounds, four assists and three steals in the two wins. He made 7-of-8 three-pointers against SFU equaling the second highest total for three-pointers made in a game with just one miss in GNAC history.

Jan. 26-Feb. 1: Andy Avgi, Western Oregon (F, 6-6, Jr., Woodburn, OR) and Derrick Fain, Alaska Anchorage (G, 6-4, Sr., Dallas, TX – The Master's) ... Avgi scored 46 points, including a career-high 33 in a 94-84 overtime win against Seattle Pacific Saturday as the Wolves opened up a two-game in the conference race with wins over Montana State Billings and the Falcons. Avgi made 17 of 28 shots and 11 of 12 foul shots. He also had nine rebounds, five assists, three steals and two blocks. WOU extended its win streak to eight games and its home win streak to 11 with the two wins ... Fain scored 42 points and also had 15 rebounds as Alaska Anchorage, which plays five of its final seven games at home, improved to 5-2 in conference road contests with wins at Western Washington and Simon Fraser. Fain made 13-of-22 shots, including 9-of-15 from the three-point line. He also converted on 7-of-8 free throws as the Seawolves shot 81.2 percent (56-of-69) from the line.

Feb. 2-8: Anye Turner, Western Washington (F, 6-7, Sr., Olympia, WA – Black Hills) scored 23 points and also had 23 rebounds and nine blocks in leading the Vikings to a pair of 10-point road wins at Seattle Pacific (82-72) and MSU Billings (75-65). Turner played a key role defensively in WWU's win at SPU. He had all five of the Vikings' blocked shots as WWU held SPU to a 44.4 shooting percentage. The Falcons came into the game ranked fourth nationally in field goal percentage shooting 52.1 percent. Turner, who ranks sixth in GNAC history in career blocked shots with 152, converted 58.8 percent of his attempts, making 10 of 17. He also had four assists and a steal without committing a turnover.

Feb. 9-15 - Cory Hutsen, Seattle Pacific (C, 6-8, Sr., Sammamish, WA - Skyline) scored 43 points, including 23 in a 73-72 overtime win at Alaska Anchorage Saturday as the Falcons kept alive their chances to earn a first-round bye in next month's conference playoffs with two victories. Hutsen, who made 11 of 15 shots against the Seawolves, scored a basket with 2:18 left in overtime to give SPU its final lead at 70-68. In two wins in Alaska, Hutsen made 20 of 29 field goal attempts and also had nine rebounds and a team-best three blocks helping SPU limit the Seawolves and Alaska Nanooks to a combined 40.7 shooting percentage.

Feb. 16-22: Jeffrey Parker, Western Washington (F, 6-6, So., Richmond, CA - Salesian) led the Vikings to two wins, including a 73-50 victory at Western Oregon snapping the Wolves' 11-game win streak. In the two contests, Parker scored 42 points, connecting on 16 of 25 shots, including 9-of-15 three-pointers. He also had six rebounds and three assists. WWU has won seven straight, six by double-digit margins.

Feb. 23-March 1: Antoine Hosley, MSU Billings (G, 6-0, Sr., Portland, OR – Utah Valley) and Matt Borton, Seattle Pacific (G, 6-5, Sr., Yakima, WA – West Valley) ... Both Hosley and Borton put up unbelievable numbers as the GNAC regular-season came to a close. Hosley scored a GNAC-record 50 points as the Yellowjackets forced playoff-bound Central Washington into overtime before losing 104-99. In that game, Hosley made 16 of 25 shots, including 2-of-3 treys. He also converted on 16 of 18 foul shots before fouling out late in the final period. In two games, Hosley scored 64 points and shot 60.0 percent from the floor (21-of-35) and 90 percent from the foul line (18-of-20). Borton scored 28 points and pulled down 30 rebounds in home wins over Central Washington and Northwest Nazarene as SPU secured the No. 2 seed for the conference playoffs. His efforts on the backboards helped SPU take the national leading in rebound margin (13.6).
