#MarchMadness The GNAC Championships begin on Thursday at Saint Martin's University's Marcus Pavilion in Lacey, Wash. The tournament champion will earn the league's automatic qualifier to the NCAA Division II Tournament.

#TeamWolf Western Oregon enters the GNAC Championships as the No. 1 seed. The two-time regular season champion, the Wolves are No. 4 in the D2SIDA Media Poll and No. 6 in the NABC Poll.

#FalconsCrest? Seattle Pacific enters the GNAC Championships as the No. 4 seed, but has won the last three GNAC Championships tournaments. The Falcons are currently ranked No. 5 in the NCAA West Region Rankings.

#TwiceAsNice Western Oregon's **Andy Avgi** repeated as the coaches' selection for GNAC Player of the Year. The senior forward earned all 10 possible first place votes in both Player of the Year voting and all-conference voting (coaches cannot vote for their own teams).

#OnTheAir Saturday's men's and women's championship games will be aired by the American Sports Network as part of their Division II Basketball Showcase.

Penner closed his final regular season week with 39 points and 17 rebounds to lead the Falcons to two wins as they secured the No. 4 seed in the GNAC Championships. He finished with 12 points and six rebounds in Thursday's 58-51 win over Western Washington and then finished with 27 points and 11 rebounds on senior night as SPU beat Simon Fraser

85-62. It was Penner's 12th game this season with 20 points or more.

TOURNAMENT PREVIEW

NOTHING CERTAIN AS GNAC CHAMPIONSHIPS BEGIN: The only that is certain entering the 2016 Great Northwest Athletic Conference Men's Basketball Championships is that nothing is certain.



In the first five years of the tournament, only twice has the top seed emerged as the champion. And with only the No. 1 seed secured before the final week of the season, there are no guarantees for any team as action begins on Thursday afternoon at Saint Martin's University's Marcus Pavilion.

If there is any certainty in the tournament field it is that the No. 1 seed will be hard to beat. Western

Oregon won its second straight GNAC regular season championship with an 18-2 record (25-3 overall) and at one point owned a 13-game win streak. The Wolves are currently the No. 1 ranked team in the West Region and this week ranked fourth in the D2SIDA Division II Media Poll and No. 6 in the NABC Division II Poll.

Led by two-time GNAC Player of the Year **Andy Avgi**, who averages 20.6 points per game, the Wolves have succeeded with defense and taking care of the ball. Western Oregon is limiting teams to 69.2 points per game and leads the GNAC in steals (8.64 per game), paced by **Tanner Omlid's** 2.38 steals per game, which ranks ninth in Division II. On the offensive end, the Wolves are second in Division II in fewest turnovers with 254, averaging just over nine per game.

While Western Oregon hopes to return a No. 1 seed to the podium, Seattle Pacific aims to continue its tournament dominance. The No. 4 seed, the Falcons are the three-time defending champions and won last year as the No. 2 seed. Seattle Pacific finished the regular season at 21-7 and tied with Alaska Anchorage for third in the GNAC standings at 14-6. The Falcons enter the tournament ranked No. 24 in the D2SIDA Division II Media Poll.

The Falcons are the strongest defensive team in the league. They enter the tournament leading Division II in rebounding margin (12.5) and are ranked second in three-point defense (.292), fourth in scoring defense (64.9 points allowed per game) and 13th in field goal defense (.401). First Team All-GNAC

forward **Mitch Penner** leads the team offensively, averaging 18 points per game, while senior center **Gilles Dierickx** is fourth in the league in field goal shooting (.572) and fifth in rebounding (6.9 per game).

Alaska used a strong second half to secure the No. 2 seed, winning eight of its last nine games. The Nanooks have also benefitted from stingy defense, ranking 16th in Division II in field goal defense (.403), 18th in turnover margin (+4.7) and 25th in scoring margin (10.5). Alaska also leads the GNAC and is 21st in Division II in assists, averaging 17 per game.

Senior forward **Travante Williams** earned First Team All-GNAC honors. The transfer from Adams State College ranks third in the GNAC in scoring at 18.4 points per game and is second with 7.6 rebounds per game. Defensively, Williams leads the GNAC and is eighth in Division II with 2.39 steals per game. Senior center **Almic Hadzisehovic** is the conference's most accurate shooter with his .622 field goal percentage ranking 13th in Division II.

The No. 3 seed in the tournament, Alaska Anchorage brings a very athletic lineup to Lacey. The Seawolves are led by junior transfer guard **Sekou Wiggs**, who was named First Team All-GNAC selection and the league's Newcomer of the Year. Wiggs leads the GNAC and is ninth in Division II in scoring at 24.2 points per game while also ranking third in rebounding with 7.2 boards per contest. He is bolstered by the league's top rebounder in junior **Corey Hammell** (10.2 rebounds per game) and one of the top three-point shooters in **Diante Mitchell** (.453).

The Seawolves enters the week ranked 28th in Division II in scoring margin, outscoring teams by an average of 10.1 points per game, but do their most damage at the free throw line. Alaska Anchorage is second in Division II, having made 80.2 percent of their free throws, and leads the nation with 680 free throws made.

Central Washington is the No. 5 seed and is one of the most potent offensive teams in the league. The Wildcats enter the tournament second in the GNAC in scoring (84.0 points per game), field goal percentage (.475) and three-point percentage (.374). The Wildcats are also a solid defensive team, ranking third in rebounding (39.4 rebounds per game) while ranking 25th in Division II with 4.6 blocked shots per game.

Senior forward **Joseph Stroud** picked up First Team All-GNAC honors and was selected as the league's Defensive Player of the Year. The Wildcats' leading

scorer and rebounder with averages of 16.6 points and 6.8 rebounds per game, Stroud enters the week 11th in Division II with 2.68 blocked shots per game. Senior guard **Gary Jacobs** adds significant support, averaging 14.2 points and 6.5 rebounds per game.

Western Washington enters as the No. 6 seed, but proved a year ago that anything can happen in the tournament as it advanced to the championship game as the No. 5 seed. The Vikings lead the GNAC with an average of 84.1 points per game while ranking third in the GNAC in field goal percentage (.473).

The Vikings are the only GNAC team with three players in the conference's top-10 in scoring. Senior forward **Jeffrey Parker** is fifth with 17.7 points per game and led the GNAC with 2.48 three-pointers made per game, earning First Team All-GNAC honors. Senior guard **Ricardo Maxwell** is seventh at 16.1 points per game while senior guard Kyle Impero is ninth at 15.1 points per game while also ranking fourth in rebounding at seven per game.

GNAC MEN'S BASKETBALL ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM

AVGI UNANIMOUSLY REPEATS AS PLAYER OF THE YEAR: He was the unanimous selection for the conference's Preseason Player of Year. And by the end of the regular season, coaches' opinion of Western Oregon forward **Andy Avgi** hasn't changed.

The senior was a unanimous selection to the 2015-16 Great Northwest Athletic Conference Men's Basketball Team and ran away in the voting to earn his second straight Player of the Year award. Avgi earned 10 of 11 possible first place votes in both all-conference voting and Player of the year voting (coaches may not vote for players from their own teams).

Avgi leads four Western Oregon selections to the All-GNAC Team, including second teamers Julian Nichols and Tanner Omlid and honorable mention Jordan Wiley. The four are joined by first year head coach Jim Shaw, who was selected by his peers as the GNAC Coach of the Year. Avgi was joined on the first team by four other unanimous selections: **Sekou Wiggs** of Alaska Anchorage, **Travante Williams** of Alaska, **Mitch Penner** of Seattle Pacific and **Joseph Stroud** of Central Washington. Also earning first team selection was Western Washington's **Jeffrey Parker**.

Avgi was elected to the All-GNAC for the fourth consecutive season, earning first team selection last year and honorable mention as a freshman and sophomore. Stroud and Parker moved up from second team selections last year while Penner jumps up from an honorable mention in 2015.

Named the GNAC Preseason Player of the Year as well as a preseason All-American by both the NABC and the D2 Basketball Bulletin, Avgi has lived up to expectations. The Woodburn, Ore., native leads the Wolves and is second in the GNAC in scoring, averaging 20.6 points per game, and ranks sixth in the league in field goal percentage (.537). His output includes three games of 30 or more points allowed Western Oregon to finish the regular season at 25-3 overall and 18-2 in the GNAC, earning the Wolves the No. 1 seed and a first round bye in this week's GNAC Championships.

The athletic Wiggs, a transfer from the University of Idaho, was selected as the conference's Newcomer of the Year after leading Alaska Anchorage to a 21-10 overall record, a 14-6 GNAC mark and the No. 3 seed in the GNAC Championships. Known for his ability to create, Wiggs leads the GNAC in scoring at 24.2 points per game and is third in the league with 7.2 rebounds and 1.5 steals per game. Adept at getting to the free throw line, Wiggs enters the week ranked second in Division II with his 305 free throws attempted and third with 234 made. Like Avgi, Wiggs also has six games of 30 or more points on his ledger.

In addition to his first team selection, Stroud was named the league's Defensive Player of the Year. Stroud leads Central Washington in both scoring and rebounding, averaging 17.7 points and 6.8 rebounds per game and is second in the league in field goal accuracy at 61.5 percent. His defensive laurels were sealed in the swat department as Stroud leads the league and is 11th in Division II with his 67 blocked shots and 2.7 blocks per game.

Williams, a senior transfer from Adams State College in Colorado, led the Nanooks to second place in the GNAC standings and the No. 2 seed in the GNAC Championships. Another two-way threat, Williams is third in the GNAC in scoring, averaging 18.4 points per game, and is second in rebounding at 7.6 rebounds per game. Another top defensive threat, Williams is tied with Omlid for the league lead and is eighth in Division II at 2.4 steals per game.

Penner paced Seattle Pacific to the No. 4 seed in this week's GNAC Championships as the Falcons aim for their fourth straight tournament championship. The senior leads the Falcons and is fourth in the GNAC in scoring, averaging 18 points per game. His season ledger includes a pair of 30-point games, topped by a 37-point performance against Concordia on Feb. 4. Penner was named the GNAC Player of the Week three times this season, the most of any player this season.

Parker led Western Washington in scoring and is one of the top three-point threats in the league as he led the Vikings to the No. 6 seed in the GNAC Championships. Parker is fifth in the GNAC in scoring, averaging 17.7 points per game, and leads the league in both three-pointers made (72) and three-pointers made per game (2.5). Parker has the highest scoring game in the GNAC to date, having scored 39 points against Alaska on Jan. 7.

Montana State Billings' **Preston Beverly** joins the special award winners as the Freshman of the Year. A honorable mention all-conference selection, Beverly leads the Yellowjackets and is tied fifth in the GNAC in rebounding with an average of 6.9 rebounds per game. Beverly ranks third in balanced scoring attack for the Yellowjackets, averaging 13 points per game.

IN THE NATIONAL POLLS: Western Oregon maintained both of its positions in the two national Division II polls. The Wolves remained at No. 4 in the D2SIDA Division II Media Poll and stayed at No. 6 in the NABC Division II Rankings. Seattle Pacific moved up on spot to No. 24 in the D2SIDA poll and was second among teams receiving votes in the NABC poll with 25 points. Alaska received votes in both polls, earning two in the NABC poll and one in the D2SIDA poll.

IN THE REGIONAL RANKINGS: Western Oregon is expected to maintain their No. 1 ranking in the upcoming NCAA West Region Rankings, which will be released Wednesday afternoon. The Wolves have been ranked No. 1 in both regional rankings this season. In last week's rankings, Seattle Pacific was No. 5, Alaska Anchorage was No. 9 and Alaska was No. 10.

WHO WILL FILL THEIR DANCE CARD: The winner of the GNAC Championships will earn the conference's automatic qualifier to the NCAA Division II Men's Basketball Tournament, which begins next weekend. GNAC ALL-ACADEMIC TEAM: Saint Martin's sophomore forward **Victor Ieronymides** leads the list of 21 players selected to the Great Northwest Athletic Conference Men's Basketball All-Academic Team.

Ieronymides, from Nicosia, Cyprus, has compiled a 3.95 cumulative grade point average while majoring in business. He has played a leading role in keeping the Saints alive for the sixth and final spot in the GNAC Men's Basketball Championships, which Saint Martin's will host next week. Ieronymides is one of eight players on the squad with a grade point average of 3.70 or better.

Conference newcomer Concordia leads the teams honored with four selections, including three players with a 3.70 GPA or better. Sophomore Taylor Harris leads the Cavaliers with a 3.90 grade point average as a business administration major.

Six of the 21 honorees are repeat selections. Seattle Pacific senior guard **Brendan Carroll** is the only three-time selection to the team with a 3.50 grade point average as a business management major. Other repeat selections include Central Washington junior guard **Terry Dawn** and senior guard **Joey Roppo**, Northwest Nazarene junior guard **Pol Olivier**, Saint Martin's junior guard **Isaac Bianchini** and Western Oregon junior center **Connor Thompson**.

To qualify for the GNAC All-Academic teams, a student-athlete must be in their sophomore year of eligibility with a cumulative grade point average of 3.20 or better.
