#### GNAC RED LION PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

**Offense** – Lucas Ferritto, Simon Fraser (F, 5-5, Jr., Hamilton, ON – St. Jean De Brebeuf) earned GNAC *Red Lion Offensive Player of the Week* honors scoring a pair of game-winning goals including one at 75:01 to snap a 2-2 tie in the Clan's 3-2 win over Hawaii Pacific Sunday as the Clan extended their two-season unbeaten streak to 23 games. Ferritto also had the game-winner in Friday's 6-1 home win against Azusa Pacific.

**Defense** - Kurtis Pederson, Western Washington (D, 6-1, 180, Fr., Puyallup, WA) keyed the Viking defense that helped produce 1-0 shutout victories over Hawaii Pacific and Dixie State forcing goalkeeper Keegan Rogers to make just five saves to claim the GNAC *Red Lion Defensive Player of the Week* award. "Kurtis played two complete games," WWU coach Travis Connell said. "He defended well, was dominant in the air and consistently put our attack on the right foot with his distribution out of the back."

#### Honorable Mention

Blaine Carver, Seattle Pacific (F, 5-10, 155, Jr., Soldotna, AK) scored the lone goal in the Falcons 1-0 win over Dixie State. That was Carver's team-leading third goal and his second game-winning strike of the season.

Rory Pratt, U-Mary (F, 6-2, So., Dublin, Ireland – St. Michaels College) scored a pair of goals against Rocky Mountain in a 3-3 tie. Pratt scored the first goal of the game in the 16th minute and finished the U-Mary scoring putting them up 3-2 in the 56th minute. He also helped lead U-Mary to a 2-0 win over South Dakota School of Mines and Technology to give the Marauders their first win of the season.

Dylan Gaydosh, Saint Martin's (F, 6-1, 190, Jr., Federal Way, WA - Stadium) scored two goals recording his first career multi-goal game in guiding the Saints to a 3-0 win over Colorado Christian. His two goals were just 30 seconds apart which will put him into the NCAA Division II record books with the fifth fastest time between goals scored by the same player. He added a third goal in SMU's 4-1 loss at Metro State.

Jon Pearman, Seattle Pacific (D, 6-2, 185, Sr., Glendale, AZ – Cactus) anchored a defense that shutout Dixie State and limited the Red Storm to just four shots, none of them directly on goal.

**AROUND THE GNAC:** John Hodnett had five points in Simon Fraser's two wins, scoring two goals and adding an assist. Carlo Basso also had two goals increasing his season total to seven. . .Western Washington's two shutouts were its first since it blanked Northwest Nazarene 1-0 on Sept. 22, 2011. They were also the first two career shutouts for Viking goalkeeper Keegan Rogers. . .Montana State Billings outshot Hawaii Hilo 19-3 as it completed its Hawaii road trip with a 3-0 record. . .Alfredo Ontiveros posted a 0.93 GAA and had a .824 save percentage (14-17) as Northwest Nazarene had a 1-1-1 record against three California teams. . .Blake Moreland scored Saint Martin's game-winning goal against Colorado Christian in the 44<sup>th</sup> minute. Ivan Gonzalez added assists on both of Gaydosh's goals against Colorado Christian. . .Sioux Falls forward Brice Holiday and midfielder Ryan Keohane earned all-tournament honors in the Days Inn Fort Hays State soccer classic. Holiday contributed to both of USF's goals in the tournament, scoring one and assisting on the other.

## **PREVIOUS RED LION PLAYERS OF THE WEEK**

**Week of Aug. 27-Sept. 2: Offense** - Danny Olivas, Seattle Pacific (F, 6-1, Fr., Phoenix, AZ – O'Connor) scored the game-winning goal on a 20-yard free kick in the Falcons' 3-1 win over 23<sup>rd</sup> ranked Chico State and also earned an assist on Blaine Carver's game-winner Thursday in a 4-2 victory at Notre Dame de Namur as the Falcons opened their season with two wins for the first time since 2002. **Defense** – Michael Winter, Simon Fraser (D, 5-11, Sr., Vancouver, BC - Capilano) led the Clan defense that posted two shutouts and held Thompson Rivers and Vancouver Island to a total of 11 shots in two victories. Winter also scored a goal as SFU outscored its two opponents by a 9-0 count.
