#### GNAC RED LION PLAYERS-OF-THE-WEEK

**Offense** - Danny Olivas, Seattle Pacific (F, 6-1, Fr., Phoenix, AZ – O'Connor) scored the game-winning goal on a 20-yard free kick in the Falcons' 3-1 win over 23<sup>rd</sup> ranked Chico State and also earned an assist on Blaine Carver's game-winner Thursday in a 4-2 victory at Notre Dame de Namur as the Falcons opened their season with two wins for the first time since 2002.

**Defense** – Michael Winter, Simon Fraser (D, 5-11, Sr., Vancouver, BC - Capilano) led the Clan defense that posted two shutouts and held Thompson Rivers and Vancouver Island to a total of 11 shots in two victories. Winter also scored a goal as SFU outscored its two opponents by a 9-0 count.

#### Honorable Mention

**Offense** – Carlo Basso, Simon Fraser (F, 6-3, Jr., Coquitlam, BC – Archbishop Carney) scored five goals, one shy of the GNAC single-game record of six, to lead the Clan to a 6-0 win over Thompson Rivers. Basso had an opportunity to tie the record, but missed a penalty kick opportunity. The Clan also beat Vancouver Island 3-0 to extend its two-season unbeaten streak to 22 games (21 wins, 1 tie). . .Legofi Crawford, Montana State Billings (F, Jr., Lakeland, FL – Northwest) came off the bench to score the Yellowjackets' first goal in a 2-1 win Thursday at Chaminade. He then had two goals, including the game-winner, and an assist in a 4-2 win Saturday at Hawaii Pacific.

**YELLOWJACKETS 3-0 IN HAWAII:** With Tuesday's 2-0 win against Hawaii Hilo, Montana State Billings is off to its best start since 2007. Prior to beating UHH, the Yellowjackets opened their Hawaii road trip with wins over Chaminade (2-1) and Hawaii Pacific (3-2). In 2007, MSUB opened its season with seven wins, then played to a draw before losing their first game of the season. . .Thomas Chameraud had three assists in last week's two victories, then added a fourth – his 11<sup>th</sup> career assist – in Tuesday's victory.

**IMPRESSIVE STARTS FOR SPU, SFU:** Seattle Pacific and Simon Fraser are off to 2-0 starts as well and earned the 1-2 rankings in this week's NSCAA West Regional poll. The Falcons are ranked fifth nationally and Simon Fraser is ranked seventh. MSUB earned a No. 9 regional ranking in the first poll. The NSCAA poll is unofficial as later this fall the NCAA will conduct three official polls that will determine which teams advance to the six-team West Regional playoffs. No automatic bids are awarded to the regional.

**CARVER SCORES TWICE AS SPU GOES 2-0:** Blaine Carver scored a goal in each of Seattle Pacific's two wins, getting the game-winner in Thursday's 4-2 victory over Notre Dame de Namur. It's been a decade (2002) since the Falcons have opened the season with two victories. SPU won twice despite being outshot 27-25 in the two contests, which included one against Chico State, which came into the game ranked 23<sup>rd</sup>.

**BASSO'S BARAGE:** Carlo Basso's five goals fell one shy of the GNAC single-game record of six set by Samir Vejo of Western Washington against Colorado Christian in 2008. Four players previously have scored four goals in a

single contest. In his third season, Basso already ranks 14<sup>th</sup> in GNAC history with 63 career points, including 30 goals. Jovan Blagojevic had two goals in the Clan's victories, while Chris Bargholz earned three assists.
