## GNAC RED LION PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

**Offense** - Lucas Ferrito, Simon Fraser (F, 5-6, Sr., Hamilton, ON – St. Jean De Brebeuf) scored twice last week helping the Clan to a pair of tight victories to open the season. The senior forward scored No. 3 SFU's first goal of the season on Thursday in the 10th minute of a 2-1 victory over Cal State East Bay, and then doubled his season tally with the goahead goal in a 4-3 win against Holy Names on Saturday.

**Defense** – Juan Perez, Northwest Nazarene (D, 6-0, Jr., Los Angeles, CA - LA Harbor College), anchored the Crusaders' back line for 110 minutes and scored the game-tying goal with six minutes remaining in regulation in a 1-1 draw against Cal State Stanislaus on Thursday. "Juan was not only exceptional defensively but he showed great leadership as well," said head coach Coe Michaelson. "To add in a gametying toal on top of that late in the game he is definitely deserving of this honor."

Honorable Mention – Andrew Weishaar, WWU (F, 6-1, Sr., Puyallup, WA – Puyallup) scored once on Thursday and recorded two assists on Saturday while notching a conference-high eight shots in the two-game span...Bailey Martin, WWU (D, 6-0, Sr., Tacoma, WA – Stadium) held the back line together for the Vikings, logging 152 minutes on the weekend.

FOUR SCORE AND SEVEN POST POINTS FOR SFU: Four different Clan players scored and three more assisted in Simon Fraser's 4-3 victory over Holy Names on Saturday. The complete team effort helped SFU to its second win of the week and supported its No. 3 preseason national ranking.

**TWO EARN ALL-TOURNAMENT HONORS:** Aodhan Brownlee and Sam Butterworth of MSU Billings earned All-Tournament honors as the Yellowjackets participated in the Seawolf Classic, hosted by Sonoma State. The two-day event featured three California schools as well as MSU Billings.

**TIME AND A HALF:** Three GNAC schools logged more than 90 minutes in contests last weekend, with two battling to draws and one suffering a defeat. Northwest Nazarene scored late in regulation then fought Cal State Stanislaus to a 1-1 deadlock on Friday, and Montana State Billings spoiled Sonoma State's hopes for a second home tournament win with a 1-1 draw on Saturday in 110 minutes. Western Washington came up on the short end against Metro State on Friday, as the Roadrunners scored early in overtime to take the game 2-1.

**TRENDS:** Seattle Pacific has notched double-digit wins in each of the past four seasons highlighted by a 14-4-2 overall mark in 2011...Simon Fraser has improved on its goals scored tally in each of its first three seasons in GNAC play, with 59 in 2010, 63 in '11 and 75 in '12.

**RECORD WATCH:** Carlo Basso of Simon Fraser entered the season with 39 career goals and 88 total points, notching him in fourth place all-time in both of those categories in the GNAC record book...He is just three goals and 13 points away from moving into second place all-time in both categories...Sam Charles of Montana State Billings, the alltime leader in goals (62) and points (140) is safe for now atop the record book...In 2012 Simon Fraser set conference records for goals scored (49), assists (40), points (138), and shots attempted (305) and have already begun the march to repeat these figures with six goals and four assists in two games in 2013.
