#### GNAC RED LION PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

**Offense** – Glenn Paden, SFU (F, 6-0, Jr., Lake Forest Park, WA – Shorecrest) notched Simon Fraser's first hat trick of the season in a decisive 9-0 victory over Trinity Lutheran that helped the Clan remain undefeated at 4-0 on the season. The junior forward who transferred to SFU from Oregon State scored all three of his goals in a span of 18 minutes, as four of his five shots were on target.

**Defense** – Troy McCarty, WWU (D, 6-0, Fr., Snohomish, WA – Snohomish) played 161 minutes of solid defense and scored a goal on the only shot he took in two games last week. The freshman has stepped into an important role on the back line and has handled the responsibility of extensive playing time exceptionally well.

**Honorable Mention** – Andrew Weishaar, WWU (F, 6-1, Sr., Puyallup, WA – Puyallup) scored the game-winning goal in WWU's 2-1 win over Notre Dame de Namur on Thursday and logged 168 minutes in two games up top...Fredy Razo, NNU (F, 5-10, Jr., Irvine, CA – Irvine Valley CC) scored twice and played 110 minutes to keep NNU afloat in a 2-2 draw against Dixie State on Saturday...Magnus Kristensen, SFU (D, 6-3, Fr., Stavanger, Norway) saw action in 158 minutes and helped SFU keep its shape during a close 2-1 victory over Hawaii Pacific on Thursday.

**CLAN IN CONTROL:** Simon Fraser came up one goal short of the all-time GNAC record in a single game in its 9-0 rout of Trinity Lutheran. In 2002, former member Seattle set the record with 10 goals against Northwest Nazarene, and Western Washington matched the mark in a 2008 contest against Colorado Christian. SFU already has 17 goals this season - nearly a quarter of last season's GNAC record 73 - after just four games played.

**BULK SCORING:** Four players turned in multi-goal performances in single games last week, including the first GNAC hat trick of the year by SFU's GNAC Offensive Player of the Week Glenn Paden. Fellow teammates Colin Jacques and Lucas Ferritto each notched a pair of goals in SFU's 9-0 win, giving the Clan three multi-goal scorers in a single game. Fredy Razo of NNU also scored twice, with his goals providing the Crusaders the necessary firepower to foster a draw against Dixie State.

**SAVING THE DAY:** Ryan Foo made a dozen saves for NNU in 110 minutes on Thursday to ensure Razo's two goals would hold up for the tie. Also making double-digit saves were MSU Billings' Eoin Hurley who denied 15 shots in more than 204 minutes, and Timothy Tribbett of SD Mines who turned away 14 shots in the Hardrockers' two games.

**OVER TIME, UNDER PAID:** MSU Billings played more than 200 minutes of soccer in two games last week and came away with nothing to show for it. The Yellowjackets lost a pair of overtime matches – both by a score of 2-1 – and fell to 0-2-1 in extra time contests this season.

**CONFERENCE PLAY GETS UNDER WAY:**

All eight teams are set to play two conference games this week with four matches each on Thursday and Saturday. After the conclusion of preseason play, the current standings are almost identical to the GNAC preseason coaches' poll. The only difference lies in the three and four slots, as WWU is currently one place higher than NNU. Considering these two face each other on Thursday, that should be one of the matches to follow closely this week.
