RED LION PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Offense – Juan Sanchez (M, 5-9, Sr., Armenia, Columbia - Jenks) of SFU scored in the 86th minute against the University of Mary on Thursday to tie the game and help the Clan salvage a point on the road in a 2-2 overtime draw. Two days later, Sanchez scored and provided an assist in SFU's lopsided 7-0 triumph over South Dakota Mines. Sanchez' effort helped SFU to four points and more importantly kept his team in sole possession of first place in the GNAC standings.

Defense – Bailey Martin (D, 6-0, Sr., Tacoma, WA - Stadium) of WWU anchored the Vikings' defense for 90 minutes in Thursday's 1-0 victory over South Dakota Mines. Martin's effort helped keep the Hardrockers scoreless and set up Andrew Weishaar's game-winning goal with less than 30 seconds remaining. On Saturday, Martin again turned in 90 minutes of solid defense, as WWU collected a 3-1 victory over Mary and picked up six points to remain just four points out of first place in the GNAC standings.

Honorable Mention – Fredy Razo (F, 5-10, Jr., Irvine, CA – Irvine Valley) of NNU scored the game-tying goal with 45 seconds left in a 2-2 tie with Seattle Pacific on Thursday...Luke Broz (D, 5-11, So., Boise, ID – Highline CC) of NNU played all 110 minutes on defense in the Crusaders 2-2 tie with Seattle Pacific on Thursday, and all 90 minutes in Saturday's 1-0 loss to St. Martin's...Eric Owen (GK, 6-2, Jr., Tacoma, WA - Stadium) of SMU tallied his second shutout of the season in impressive fashion helping the Saints pick up a 1-0 win on the road while making 10 saves in a win against Northwest Nazarene...Jeremy Wentzel (D, 5-5, So., Edmonds, WA – Shoreline CC) of WWU scored a pair of goals to help the Vikings to two solid victories.

POINT-FOR-POINT: With a win and a draw each, Simon Fraser and Seattle Pacific matched each other with four points apiece and remain in first and second in the GNAC standings. SPU had a golden opportunity to leapfrog SFU, but the Falcons allowed a goal in the final minute of regulation on Thursday before battling NNU to a double-overtime draw.

TWO-FOR-ONE: Simon Fraser saw its grip on first place flash before its eyes on Thursday, as it took two goals in the final 10 minutes against the University of Mary to salvage a single point. The Clan scored in the 81st minute to tie the game, only to see Mary respond with a go-ahead goal three minutes later. Juan Sanchez stepped up in a last-ditch effort to tie the game once again in the 86th, and neither team broke through in overtime in the 2-2 draw.

WINNING WESTERN WASHINGTON: The Vikings took advantage of the draws by SPU and SFU, grabbing a full six points to move within four points of first place in the GNAC standings. Late-game heroics from Andrew Weishaar led WWU to victory on Thursday, while a solid all-around team effort gave WWU a 3-1 victory against host Mary on Saturday.

FREDY SAVES THE DAY: Fredy Razo's goal against SPU in the final minute salvaged a point for NNU, but the Crusaders failed to gain any further ground with a frustrating 1-0 defeat against Saint Martin's on Saturday. The Crusaders outshot the Saints 23-13, including eight shots by Razo, but somehow came up empty handed despite SMU being down a player for the final 20 minutes.

TWIN-BILL SPLIT FOR BILLINGS: The Yellowjackets notched their most dominant performance of the season on Thursday, as four different players scored in a 4-0 rout of Saint Martin's. MSUB's luck shifted on Saturday however, as SPU took care of business in shutout fashion with a 2-0 decision that left MSUB in sixth place in the GNAC.

GONE IN 60 SECONDS: Both South Dakota Mines and Seattle Pacific watched games slip away in the final minute on Thursday. Razo spoiled SPU's chance for a win with a goal with 45 seconds remaining, while Weishaar's tally against SD Mines came with just 26 ticks remaining.

CLAN TRIO GETS TWO: Three Simon Fraser players scored a pair of goals last week, as Carlo Basso, Sanchez and Jovan Blagojevic each completed the feat. Basso tacked on a pair of assists to post a GNAC-high six points on the week.

COLIN'S COMPLIMENTS: Colin Jacques of SFU dished out passes left and right last week, totaling four assists to move him up the national ranks to No. 7 with eight total in 2013. Jacques added a goal as well, tying him with Basso for the most GNAC points on the week with six.

Montana State Billings' Aodhan Brownlee and Basso were the other two GNAC players to record multiple assists with two apiece.

HARDROCKER SHOT-STOPPER: No one across NCAA Division II averages more saves per game than SD Mines' Timothy Tribbett, who collects 7.17 per contest. Last week, he notched 17 and gave the Hardrockers a chance for their first NCAA victory on Thursday in a disappointing 1-0 loss to WWU.

WESTERN'S WEISHAAR MOVES UP: With his team-leading eighth goal of the season on Thursday, Weishaar moved into sole possession of seventh place in the WWU all-time scoring record book. The senior has collected 24 career goals.
