RED LION PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Offense – Fredy Razo, NNU (F, 5-10, Jr., Irvine Valley, CA – Irvine Valley) led the GNAC with three goals last week. Razo scored the Crusaders' only goal in a 2-1 overtime loss to the University of Mary, and contributed both of NNU's goals in a 2-0 victory over South Dakota Mines on Saturday. Razo leads the GNAC in goals scored this season with 12 and total points with 26.

Defense – Brandon Watson, SFU (GK, 6-1, Fr., Victoria, BC – Coastal Carolina) posted a pair of shutouts, including a stellar overtime performance in the Clan's biggest game of the year against Seattle Pacific on Saturday. Watson's effort gave SFU a chance to win both games, and helped his team clinch its third consecutive GNAC championship title.

Honorable Mention – Matt Temple, WWU M, 5-8, So., Beaverton, OR – Beaverton) scored two goals as the Vikings cruised to a 3-0 victory over Saint Martin's in Bellingham on Saturday; Jovan Blagojevic, SFU (M, 6-0, Jr., Coquitlam, BC – Centennial Secondary) scored the game-winning goal in the waning minutes of overtime as SFU sealed its fourth-straight GNAC championship with a 1-0 victory over SPU; Luke Broz, NNU (D, 5-11, So., Boise, ID – Boise) helped anchor the Crusaders' back line in a 2-0 victory over SD Mines on Saturday; Keegan Rogers, WWU (GK, 6-1, Jr., Portland, OR – Portland Christian) earned a shutout on Saturday in WWU's 3-0 victory over SMU

and played solid in a tough 1-0 defeat at the hands of SPU on Thursday.

CLAN CLINCH TITLE: Jovan Blagojevic punched home the game-winning goal as time ran down in the second period of overtime Saturday, simultaneously propelling SFU to its fourth consecutive GNAC title while putting a major dent in Seattle Pacific's postseason chances.

Blagojevic has seven goals this season, one behind Colin Jacques' team-leading mark of eight. The Clan were in danger of losing to a GNAC opponent more than once in the same season for the first time since joining the conference in 2010, but the dramatic victory also silenced the doubt surrounding that streak's security.

RAZO BACK IN FORM: Fredy Razo got back to his scoring ways last week, twice finding the net against South Dakota Mines to propel his team to a 2-0 victory. Razo also scored against Mary on Thursday in a tough 2-1 loss for the Crusaders. Without a goal from Razo in its previous three games, NNU had gone scoreless, posting an 0-3 record and dropping down the GNAC standings.

WWU'S WANING PLAYOFF HOPES: Western Washington fell behind early to SPU on Thursday, and could not recover despite taking nine shots and putting four on target. The 1-0 loss pushed the Vikings' postseason hopes from slim to microscopic, but a solid 3-0 victory over SMU on Saturday pushed the team towards ending the season on a high note.

TWO TOUGH TIES: MSU Billings battled through a pair of double-overtime draws last week, receiving a goal in the 67th minute from Thorge Jess that salvaged a point against SD Mines on Thursday. The Yellowjackets could not find the net on Saturday against Mary and were outshot by the Marauders despite taking 14 shots over 110 minutes.

HARD-EARNED FOR HARDROCKERS: SD Mines earned its first point of the season

last week, as team-leader Michael McGraw scored his fourth goal of the season in the 1-1 draw. The Hardrockers are in their first season competing at the Division II level.

TOP SCORERS: Razo and WWU's Matt Temple were the only players to score more than once last week, as Razo pushed himself back into the NCAA leaders with three goals and Temple scored his first two goals of the season. Razo also led the GNAC with 11 shots last week, while Mary's Rory Pratt was close behind with 10.

Razo was twice assisted by Luke Broz, who was the only player besides Pratt to collect multiple assists last week.
