Balog Starts Inaugural Recruiting Class with Six Signees (4/3/2013)

Montana State Billings head coach Alex Balog has signed six players to start his inaugural recruiting class. The Yellowjackets will welcome one high school standout, two junior college transfers, two international talents and one Division III transfer to the 2013 fall roster.

Bryan Marinaccio (Great Falls, MT/ C.M. Russell HS) 6-0 – 165 – Defender Clubs: Electric City Soccer and Montana United

Marinaccio is an extremely solid defender who was a three year letter winner at C.M. Russell. During his senior season he helped his team record six shutouts and finish fourth in the state tournament. Marinaccio earned all-conference honors in 2012.

Jesper Fries (Horsens, Denmark/ Horsens Gymnasium) 6-2 – 165 – Midfielder Club: AC Horsens

Omar Ambrocio-Vasquez (Leavenworth, WA/ Cascade HS/Peninsula Community College) 5-9 – 155 – Midfielder Club: Wenatchee Fire & Chelah Warriors

Ambrocio-Vasquez is a very experienced midfielder with two years of collegiate soccer under his belt. While at Peninsula he helped his team to a 2012 NWAACC championship and West Division championships in 2011 and 2012. In 2012 Ambrocio-Vasquez recorded four goals and seven assists.

Prior to Peninsula, he was a four year letter winner in soccer and helped the 2010 team to a league and district championship. Ambrocio-Vasquez was a first team all-league selection in 2010 and 2011.

Michael Aringer (Passau, Germany/ Adalbert-Shister Gymnasium/ University of Passau) 6-1 – 174 – Defender Club: SV Schalding-Heining

Britton Jolley (Ravensdale, WA/ Tahoma HS/ Highline Community College)

5-9 – 170 – Forward Club: Federal Way United Storm, Eastside FC, and Crossfire FC

Jolley is a dynamic forward who knows the field very well. In this past season at Highline, he recorded 12 goals and 15 assists en route to earning first team allleague honors. He helped the Thunderbirds to a 12-5-3 record and an appearance in the NWAACC semifinals.

Prior to Highline, Jolley was a dual sport athlete, lettering in soccer and football. In soccer he earned first team all-league honors 2008-09, 2009-10, and 2010-11. He was named the offensive most valuable player 2008-09 and 2009-10.

Bryson brings quality collegiate experience to the Jackets' program, spending two years at Pacific University (Division III – Forest Grove, OR). In his Boxers' career he has appeared in 24 matches while starting 13. Bryson has recorded three goals, including one game winner, and one assist at Pacific. In 2012, he helped the back unit record 89 saves.

Prior to his time at Pacific University, Bryson was a three year starter at Helena High School. In 2011 he was selected to play for the West Team in the Shadair Classic All-Star game; and in 2010 he received first team all-conference honors while helping his team to a 13-0-3 overall record and first place finish in the state. During this season Bryson tallied two goals and helped the defense only allow 10 goals.

Men's Soccer Add Six More Signees to 2013 Recruitment Class (4/19/2013)

Six additional recruits including three junior college rosters and and three international players - have been added to Montana State University Billings roster.

Aodhan Brownlee (Ossett, Wakefield (United Kingdom)/ Ossett School) 5-8 – 163 – Midfield Club: Sheffield United, West County FA, and Ossett Albion

Brownlee's attention to detail allows him to have an impact on both sides of the pitch. In 2012-13 while playing for Ossett Albion, he started 26 contests and tallied six goals and 15 assists. Brownlee was a part of the Northern Ireland U17 national team; and helped his club team to two national British Colleges Finals, and a FA County Youth Cup Final.

Thorge Jess (Kiel, Schleswig-Holstein (Germany)/ Gymnasium Hebbelschule) 6-2 – 187 – Forward Club: Holstein Kiel and TSV Kronshagen

The Yellowjackets increase their versatility and athleticism with the addition of Jess. During his time at Gymnasium Hebbelschule he participated in six different sports: basketball, baseball, volleyball, tennis, swimming and soccer.

Jess is a very accomplished athlete with an extensive list of accolades. In three years with TSV Kronshagen, he has scored a total of 103 goals. During his 2009-10 campaign, he was the No. 1 scorer in the German junior league, recording 42 goals in a single season, helping his team to a first place finish in State Schleswig Holstein.

In 2012-13, Jess started 19 games and scored 15 goals while dishing nine assists. On March 15, he was honored by TSV Kronshagen as the best youth scorer in the club's history.

Nicholas Rasmussen (Allyn, WA/ North Mason HS/ Olympic College) 6-0 – 155 – Defender Club: West Sound FC and North Kitsap Storm

Rasmussen looks to bring a strong defensive presence to MSUB's back line. In one season with Olympic College, he started all 16 matches and recorded three assists. Prior to Olympic, Rasmussen was a four year letter winner in soccer for North Mason High School. During 2011-12 he recorded five assists and one goal, while earning All-Olympic League honors and the team's Defensive Player of the Year.

Thomas Saltwell (Chelmsford, Essex (United Kingdom)/ Great Baddow HS) 6-3 – 184 – Defender/ Midfielder Club: Southend United, Chelmsford City, Tilbury FC and Maldon and Tiptree FC

Saltwell's frame will be a valuable asset on both sides of the ball for the Jackets. Playing for Chelmsford City he helped his team win the Essex Cup once and the Mid-Essex cup four separate times. In 2012 Saltwell received Chelmsford City Player of the Year honors, and during his 2009-10 campaign he was selected as the Sportsman of the Year.

Cameron Stanek (Casper, WY/ Kelly Walsh HS/ Northwest College) 6-4 – 180 – Goalkeeper Club: Wyoming ODP, Wyoming State Select, Laramie Blizzard and Gillette Edge

MSUB welcomes a keeper with collegiate championship experience with Stanek's addition. In 2012 at Northwest College he recorded 161 saves and a 1.34 goal against average as he helped his team to a

9-3 record and a West District Championship. Stanek earned second team All-Region IX honors in 2012 and 2011, and was a key member of the 2011 Region IX Championship team. During his 2011 campaign he tallied 121 saves and a 1.28 goal against average.

Prior to Northwest College, Stanek was a three sport letter winner at Kelly Walsh High School; staring in football for three years and soccer and track for four years. In 2011 he received first team all-state and allconference honors, and in 2010 he received second team all-state and first team all-conference honors. Stanek also received second team all-conference honors in 2009 as a sophomore.

Parker Vacura (Healy, AK/ Tri-Valley HS/ Peninsula College) 5-11 – 175 – Defender Club: Alaska Rush 92 and Alaska ODP 92

Vacura also brings a championship pedigree with him to the Yellowjacket program. As a defender for Peninsula College, he was an integral part of two NWAACC Championship teams (2012, 2010), and two West Division Championship teams (2012, 2010). In 2012 he scored one goal and registered six assists en route to earning all-region merits.

At Tri-Valley High School, Vacura was a dual sport athlete, receiving four letters in hockey and soccer. During his senior campaign he recorded 19 goals and 12 assists. Vacura also has championship experience at the high school level, winning the 2A Region Championship four years straight, 2006-2009.

Balog Adds Trio to 2013 Class (5/21/13)

Men's soccer coach Alex Balog continues to impress with his recruiting efforts for Montana State Billings, adding three additional signees to an already start studded 2013 recruiting class.

The Yellowjackets will welcome one international standout, one division II transfer and one interscholastic talent to the 2013 roster.

"I am extremely pleased with our 2013 recruiting class; all of the student-athletes we signed are very talented and will be a great addition to our program," stated Balog.

"It's been a long and hard process to bring in this quality group. I want to thank our assistants Thomas Chameraud and Conner Moe for their efforts, and they will also be vital in helping to assimilate the new signees."

Daniel Moss (Perth, Australia/ Sacred Heart College)

Club: Balcatta SC, Perth Glory, Greenock Morton 6-0 – 162 – Forward/ Midfielder Moss is a very skilled attacker who looks to increase the Yellowjackets offensive efficiency. During his 2011 campaign he helped Sacred Heart win the NAS League Championship and the Interzone Championship. During this year, Moss also received the *Referees' Player of the Tournament* award at the Great Wall Cup Tournament in Beijing, China.

Andreas Moreano (Quito, Ecuador/ Univ. of Texas of the Permian Basin) 5-9 – 158 – Defender/ Midfielder

Moreano brings collegiate experience with him to the Yellowjackets' backline. Last season at the University of Texas of the Permian Basin, he helped the defense record 75 saves and three shutouts. Moreano also helped the offense register 26 goals and 17 assists.

Colin Ralston (Belfair, WA/ North Mason HS) Club: WestSound FC 6-4 – 178 – Forward

Ralston's extreme athleticism helped him excel at North Mason High School. A dual sport athlete, he lettered in soccer for four years and basketball for one. Ralston scored 21 goals his junior year en route to earning the team's Offensive Most Valuable Player award and first team All-District honors. He led his club team, WestSound FC, in goals and assists.

Ralston also brought home the team's Offensive Most Valuable Player award and first team all-district honors during his sophomore campaign.

Seattle Pacific

Five Fantastic Recruits Commit to Play SPU Men's Soccer (2/22/13)

Five standout student-athletes, including four from high schools in the state of Washington have committed to attend Seattle Pacific University.

The quartet of local signees includes defender Jeffrey Collings from Seattle's Ballard High School, the son of Falcons coach Mark Collings.

Also from Washington are midfielder Chaz Jenkins from Everett High, midfielder Jordan Kollars from Central Kitsap High in Silverdale and forward Jordan Thompson from Newport High in Bellevue.

"One thing that we've been working hard on is establishing ourselves locally and locking down some of the top local talent," Coach Collings said. "We believe this class has done that with Jordan Kollars coming to us from the Sounders Academy, Chaz and Jeffrey from the Crossfire Academy, and Jordan Thompson from last year's national finalist Eastside FC." The Falcons have had great success with players from Arizona. They raided the Grand Canyon state again, this time getting forward Stephen MacDonald from Sandra Day O'Connor High School in Phoenix.

"Of course we're always looking to snag a couple of impact guys from outside of Washington and once again we were able to convince someone to leave Arizona for the Pacific Northwest in Stephen MacDonald," Collings exclaimed.

"All five of these guys are great students and came highly recommended as young men. During the recruiting process we spoke to a variety of people about each of these student athletes and each one of these guys received glowing reviews from everyone we spoke to.

Kollars is currently a member of the Seattle Sounders Academy, a club that recruiting classmates Collings and Thompson played with in the past.

Ten seniors departed from last year's team, leaving the squad with five returning starters.

"We're really happy with our recruiting class for 2013. We lost 10 players to graduation and another one to injury so this group of players is really important not only to the future of SPU soccer, but also to our team next fall.

"We've covered several areas of need with these players. Jordan Thompson and Stephen MacDonald give us two proven goal scorers up front. Jordan Kollars is an anchor for the midfield and Chaz Jenkins gives us some toughness and a ball winner in the middle of the park. We lost three of our starting backs and we believe Jeffrey Collings is going to give our back line a boost with his ability to play anywhere across the back four."

JEFFREY COLLINGS

Defender, 5-9, 175, Seattle, Wash. (Ballard HS/Crossfire Academy)

Jeffrey Collings currently plays under Coach Bernie James at Crossfire Academy along with SPU signee Chaz Jenkins. He was a member of the Sounders Academy squad that placed fifth in the nation at the 2011 Academy Finals. Collings participated with the Olympic Development program from 2007-10. He is a three-star recruit in the rankings produced by TopDrawerSoccer.com. As a freshman and sophomore at Ballard High School, Collings garnered All-KingCo honorable mention acclaim. The son of Seattle Pacific head coach Mark Collings, he compiled an outstanding 3.98 grade point average.

CHAZ JENKINS

Midfielder, 5-11, 180, Marysville, Wash. (Everett HS/Crossfire Academy)

Chaz Jenkins currently plays under Coach Bernie James at Crossfire Academy along with SPU signee Jeffrey Collings. He is a three-star recruit in the rankings produced by TopDrawerSoccer.com. Jenkins participated with the U.S. Soccer Development Academy and traveled to Italy in 2010 to compete against the Inter Milan Academy. He has a 3.5 grade point average.

JORDAN KOLLARS

Midfielder, 5-10, 160, Silverdale, Wash. (Central Kitsap HS/WestSound FC)

Jordan Kollars currently plays club soccer at the Seattle Sounders Academy. He participated in the Olympic Development Program in 2010. Kollars compiled 13 goals and 18 assists his junior season at Central Kitsap High School after an eight-goal, 11assist sophomore season. He was a second-team Class 4A All-Washington state selection last year after leading his prep squad to the state final. Kollars is a three-time All-Narrows League honoree. He is a threestar recruit in the rankings produced by TopDrawerSoccer.com. Kollars has an impressive 3.96 grade point average.

STEPHEN MacDONALD

Forward, 6-2, 180, Phoenix, Ariz. (Sandra Day O'Connor/SC del Sol)

Stephen MacDonald amassed 23 goals in 19 games during his senior season at Sandra Day O'Connor High School. That is the same school that produced current Seattle Pacific freshman midfielder Danny Olivas. MacDonald is a standout club performer for the SC del Sol, which was the state league champion in 2012. He boasts a 3.58 grade point average.

JORDAN THOMPSON

Forward, 5-8, 150, Bellevue, Wash. (Newport HS/Eastside FC)

Jordan Thompson currently plays under Coach Dan Strom at Eastside FC. He was a member of the Sounders Academy squad in 2011 and participated in the Olympic Development program from 2008-10. Thompson is a three-star recruit in the rankings produced by TopDrawerSoccer.com. He received the KingCo Class 4A Most Valuable Player award after amassing 25 goals and three assists during his junior season at Newport High School. Thompson garnered all-state prep honors in 2012.

Simon Fraser

Division I transfer Shewfelt comes home to Canada to play for SFU (4/15/13)

The Simon Fraser University men's soccer team has added transfer goalkeeper Scott Shewfelt who played last season with the Division I Coastal Carolina Chanticleers and is a native of London, ON.

"I'm eager to join the squad at Simon Fraser University," said Shewfelt. "I look forward to being able to work hard and contribute towards a run for the NCAA Championship in the fall. This is a great program with an experienced coaching staff that has history of success and I can hardly wait to be a part of it all."

In 2012, Shewfelt was part of a Coastal Carolina team that boasted a 20-3-2 record and made it all the way to the 'Sweet 16.'

His team was the Big South regular season champion with a 16-1-2 record and he earned the conference defensive player of the week honour on one occasion.

He spent the previous two seasons at Schoolcraft College where he was a National Soccer Coaches Association of America junior college All-American in 2011.

His team was region 12 champions with a perfect 22-0-0 record and Shewfelt posted a 0.28 goals against average that season.

Locally, he played in London with Forest City London in the professional development league in 2012 when the team won the North American Championship.

In 2011, he was named the Ontario Soccer Association's goalkeeper of the year.

"Scott is a keeper with some incredibly diverse experiences," said Head Coach Alan Koch. "He has all the physical tools to be successful with our program. I am excited for him to come finish his college career with us, and of course earn his SFU degree. He has the potential to win some big games for us this fall."

Clan add five international players to 2013 recruiting class (5/10/13)

Simon Fraser has added five international recruits for the 2013 season, signing four players out of Europe and one from the United States.

"Every player in this group is an elite level player and we expect all of them to compete for starting positions right away," said head coach Alan Koch. "Our recruiting classes continue to get better every year. As the success of our team continues, we are able to attract a higher level of student-athlete."

Coming to the Clan from the Division I Oregon State Beavers is forward Glenn Paden (Lake Forest Park, WA).

Paden, who also plays with the Seattle Sounders under-23 team, played in 13 games for the Beavers last year, scoring three goals and notching two assists. "I am excited to have the opportunity to join an established and successful soccer program," said Paden. "It will be great to experience some of the many things the greater Vancouver area has to offer and to attend such an impressive university."

The European contingent includes two players from Germany, one from Norway and one from Sweden.

Alexander Kleefeldt (Frankfurt, Germany) and Pius Mohr (Waldorf, Germany) join fellow German, Chris Bargholz (Fuessen, Germany), who will play his third season at SFU next season.

Kleefeldt is a 6'3 defender who plays for FC Eddersheim.

Mohr is a midfielder and stands 6'0 tall. He played his club soccer with Astoria Walldorf.

From Norway, the Clan are adding Magnus Kristensen (Stavanger, Norway), a 6'3 defender who comes to the Clan from the Viking Stavenger Club.

He continues the history of Norwegian defenders on the Clan roster after Helge Neumann (Oslo, Norway) finished his Clan career last season.

Johannes Hallman (Lidkoping, Sweden) brings Division II experience to the Clan. He will join the team as a junior after playing the last two years with Hawaii Pacific University. He stands 6'3 and is a defender.

He is a dynamic player with and without the ball who will be a contributor in the Hardrockers attack. CJ has the abilities to beat players 1v1, finish opportunities, and combine well with other players. He is a hardworking determined individual who is always looking for ways to improve his game. Zuraitis is a versatile player who plays both sides of the ball well. At SD School of Mines, CJ will pursue a degree in Mining Engineering.

Benjamin Bishop: is a 6-foot-1-inch midfielder who possesses the attacking abilities to also play forward. He is a full-time US Soccer Development Academy player for the Colorado Rush. In 2011, Tribbett was nationally ranked 63 in Top Drawer Soccer's 2013 recruiting class. Currently, Tribbett is regionally ranked 20 in the Rocky Mountains and Southwest Region according to Top Drawer Soccer. Tim is a solid shot stopper with good technique and responds well on services. He is comfortable with the ball at his feet when played back to. Tribbett is the type of player who will give his heart and soul to keep the ball out of the back of the net. He is a strong presence in net for the Colorado Rush Academy. Tim is a great team player who will put the group first. At SD School of Mines, Tim will pursue a degree in Computer Science.

Darren Parke: is a 6-foot-4-inch goalkeeper from Colorado Springs, Colo and attends Rampart high school. Parke is an Academic All-State first team recipient in soccer and basketball. Parke spent the majority of his senior year battling an injury that prevented him from playing in net for part of the season, but has since recovered and back in goal. During his junior year, Parke only allowed 14 goals against and made 75 saves. He plays club soccer for the Western College Development Association Pride Predators '95. Nathan Fricke: is a 5-foot-11-inch midfielder from Grimes, Iowa, who will graduate from Dallas Center-Grimes high school in the spring of 2013. Fricke was All-State and team MVP in 2011. "Kyle reminds me of our senior captain last year, Chris Andre," McNally said. "He is quick with outstanding technique. If he continues to develop, Kyle has the potential to be one of the top forwards in our conference."

Brink also attended Billings Senior High School where he played mainly at the center back position. Brink scored 10 goals and one assist his senior year helping the Broncs to a third place finish at state in 2010. He lettered four years in soccer, earning all-state honors in 2010. He was an all-conference selection in 2009 and was named Most Valuable Player in 2009-2010. As a freshman, he was named Rookie of the Year. "Matt is a great defender," McNally said. "He is very competitive and is definitely a leader of the players around him. Matt plays with the passion you need to be successful."

Frank played at Billings West where he earned four letters in soccer. He went 26-3 as a goalkeeper with an impressive 0.65 goals against average. Frank helped Billings West to two state titles in 2008 and 2009. He started 30 of 31 varsity matches with 17 shutouts. He earned all-state honors as a junior and all-conference honors as a senior.

"Joe has the size and agility to be an excellent goalkeeper for us," McNally said. "I have seen Joe play at a high level against great competition in big club tournament and at regionals."

McNally went on to comment on how rewarding it has been to watch these four players grow from a young age.

Catlin lettered all four years at West High School, earning all-conference honors at left back in the fall of 2010. Catlin scored 13 goals and 10 assists during his high school career for the Bears. Catlin helped lead the Bears to a third place finish at state as a freshman and back-to-back state championships as a sophomore and junior.

"Sam has really improved over the last two years," McNally said. "He has a great left foot and he gets forward really well from the fullback position."

Taylor Backous, whose father was a four-year Falcons letterman, is among three athletes who have committed to play soccer this fall for Seattle Pacific University.

Backous is a graduate of Sammamish High School in Bellevue, Wash. He joins the Falcons along with Liviu Bird from Fairbanks, Alaska and Kodiac Gamble from Tucson, Ariz.

"The recruiting process continues to amaze me and we feel really fortunate to be able to add three quality student athletes to our roster for 2010," says Mark Collings, who begins his third season as SPU's head coach.

"Sal's technical ability and character will help him have an immediate impact for us." Michaelson said.

Bechtel joins the Crusaders from Chrysalis High School. DJ was a starting center back and captain for Eastside FC in Seattle where he helped Eastside to a first-place league finish and a championship at the prestigious Surf Cup Showcase in San Diego, Calif. this past fall.

DJ was also a two-year member of the Washington State Olympic Development Program (ODP) team. "DJ brings added steel and character to the defensive line for the Crusaders," Michaelson added.

Fishbaugher has captured three youth state title in the past five years. Most recently, he helped lead Emerald City to the U-18 title this year. In 2002, he won the U-16 state crown with Tynecastle II. Fishbaugher was also a member of the Crossfire Sounders U-14 state championship team in 2002.

A four-year starter at Redmond High, Fishbaugher has helped the Mustangs to a 5-2-1 start in league play, 6-3-1 overall. He is second on the team with four goals and four assists. Last year, Fishbaugher was a first team All-State and first team All-Eastside selection after earning honors as the KingCo 4A Player of the Year. A resident of Bothell, he was a member of the regional Olympic Development Program pool in 2001 and played on the state ODP team since 1999. Morris is the captain of the Crossfire Sounders, state champions in 2000 '01 and '02 under Alan Hinton.

Morris is the first recruit signed by Coach Cliff McCrath. SPU, a five-time NCAA Division II champion, returns eight starters from a team which went 11-6-2 last season. It has qualified for the playoffs 28 times while posting 32 consecutive winning seasons.

Western Washington

Vikings Add Two Transfers, Four Freshmen (5/28/03)

Jeff Lane (Yakima - West Valley), a junior midfielder who lettered the past two years at NCAA Division I Gonzaga, is one of six players who have enrolled at Western Washington University and plan to play men's soccer for the Vikings this fall.

Lane is one of two transfers in the group, the other being sophomore defender Ben Robison (Shoreline -Shorecrest), who was at Edmonds CC. The others are all freshmen – goalkeeper Brian Gullikson (Monroe), midfielder/forward Dan Macaya (Camas), midfielder John Hoogestraat (Bremerton/Olympic) and defender Brian Emory (Boise, ID/Centennial). "We're really excited about this class of recruits," WWU coach Travis Connell said. "This group of players makes our team faster and our attack more creative."

Lane made four starts for Gonzaga last year, notching two assists in 13 games. He was a four-year letter winner at West Valley, playing on two Class 3A state championship teams and twice earning Mid-Valley League all-star status.

"Jeff will be able to give us that dynamic attacking player in midfield we're looking for," said Connell. Robison, who also attended the University of Washington, was a first-team all-NWAACC North Region pick at Edmonds CC and a three-time Western Conference all-star at Shorecrest.

Gullikson was the goalkeeper for the Washington State Select Team in 2001, and also earned secondteam Wesco honors as a midfielder at Monroe. Macaya has more than 70 career goals for Camas, helping it reach the state tournament all four years.

Hoogestraat was a four-time, first-team Narrows League Bridge Division all-star at Olympic, and Emory earned all-conference honors as a senior on a Centennial team that finished 14-2 and placed fourth at state.

"Robison and Emory will be able to step in and provide depth on our back line," Connell said. "Gullikson is an outstanding goalkeeper who is going to do great things at this level. Hoogestraat and Macaya both will play a role in our attack this year, and in the future."

Seattle University

McAlister To Transfer to Seattle U (5/16/02)

Former Kennedy High School standout Bobby McAlister (So., Federal Way) will transfer from the University of Washington to play men's soccer at Seattle University.

"We are excited to bring in a player of Bobby's level," Seattle University coach Peter Fewing said. "He is going to make an immediate impact and do a lot of great things for our team."

McAlister played in four games this season and made two starts for the Huskies before sitting out the rest of the year as a medical redshirt due to a groin injury. Last year, McAlister made his way into the UW lineup five times as a true freshman. He still has three years of eligibility left.

McAlister lettered four seasons for Kennedy High School in Burien, helping the Lancers to class 3A state championships in his freshman and senior seasons. He recorded a hat trick in both the semifinals and championship match of the state tournament as a senior.

McAlister earned first team all-SPSL and team offensive MVP honors in both his sophomore and senior seasons and was named the South County Journal all-area Player of the Year.

He tallied 38 goals and 22 assists his senior season after a 22-goal, 15-assist sophomore campaign. McAlister missed his entire junior season due to a knee injury.

McAlister also helped his club team, Solaris, to seven straight Washington State Cup championships. In 1997, he helped Solaris become the first American team to win the prestigious Newcastle (England) Invitational Youth Tournament. He was a member of the state and regional Olympic Development Program teams and was named MVP of the state tournament in 1994 with Solaris.

Bobby is the son of former Seattle Sounder great and current Decatur head coach Jimmy McAlister, who is seeking his second straight undefeated season and class 4A state championship as the skipper of the Gators.

"With Bobby, Seattle University is getting a great student-athlete and person," Fewing said. "I think this will be a good fit for him academically, and he will be reuniting with a lot of friends he grew up playing soccer with."

Doran Third Signee for Redhawks (4/8/02)

Pat Doran (Bellingham, Wash./Sehome HS) has signed a national letter of intent to play soccer at Seattle University. Doran becomes head coach Peter Fewing's third signing for next season.

Doran is currently lettering in his fourth season for the Sehome varsity soccer team. He was a first team all-WesCo 4A selection last season after leading Sehome with 16 goals. A four-year starter, he finished second in scoring as a sophomore, finding the back of the net 13 times that season.

Doran has also played with the Whatcom Football Club Rangers since the U-12 age level. He has led the Rangers in scoring for the past five years and has served as the team's captain the past two.

Doran has helped the Rangers to numerous tournament championships, including back-to-back victories in the Baker Blast and three straight Pacific Coast Challenge titles. This past season he was a member of the Washington Olympic Development Program state pool.

"Pat is a strong player with good vision and great touch on the ball. He can flat out score goals," Fewing said. "I think he will adjust well to the college game. He has tremendous upside and will get better for us every year.

"Pat reminds me a lot of a young Peter Hattrup coming out of Seattle Prep," Fewing added. "Between he and (fellow incoming freshman) Alex Chursky, we have two very potent goal scorers coming in next season."

Kentwood's Easterbrook Signs With Redhawks (3/29/02)

The Seattle University men's soccer team landed its second local recruit for next season with the signing of Ethan Easterbrook (Kent, Wash./Kentwood HS).

"Ethan Easterbrook is a good soccer player. We are excited to have him," SU coach Peter Fewing said. "He should contribute for us as soon as he gets here."

In three complete seasons at Kentwood, Easterbrook was selected to the all-South Puget Sound League North Team twice. He was named his school's MVP as a freshman and led them in scoring last year as a junior.

After finishing fifth in the SPSL North last season, Easterbrook helped the Conquerors to a 5-1 start and recognition as one of the contenders for the league title.

Easterbrook also helped his club team, the Federal Way Storm, to consecutive Premier 1 league

championships and state berths. This past season, the Storm finished as the Washington State runner-up, and advanced to the semifinal round of the state tournament last year. Easterbrook has been a member of the Washington State Olympic Development Program and was named to the state team in 2000.

"I'm looking forward to playing soccer at Seattle University," Easterbrook said. "This gives me the opportunity to stay local and play at a good school with a good soccer program. I'm not a player who likes to watch from the bench, so I hope I can come in and be a contributor right away."

Another Chursky Signs With Redhawks (2/8/02)

Local standout Alex Chursky (Federal Way, Wash./Decatur HS) has signed a national letter of intent to play men's soccer at Seattle University.

"We are very excited to bring Alex to Seattle University. He is going to be an impact player for us," SU coach Peter Fewing said. "But at the same time he is going to have to earn his spot on the team and he knows that."

Last season, Chursky was named the South Puget Sound League MVP and to the Tacoma News Tribune All-Area Team after breaking the school's singleseason scoring record with 29 goals in 21 games and leading the Gators to a class 4A state championship. With Alex playing in his senior season this spring, Decatur is one of the favorites to take the title again.

"Alex gives us a very talented forward that understands how to put himself into positions to score goals," Fewing said. "He is a hard working, blue collar athlete-out type of player. He wants to win."

Chursky chose Seattle University despite offers from NCAA Division I schools, including the University of Washington and 2001 national semifinalist St. John's University. He will be reunited with brother Ian Chursky, who will be a senior on the team next season. Fewing expects Alex to have the same impact as his older brother did after transferring from Tacoma Community College in 2000. It was Ian's high school record that Alex broke last season as a junior.

Ian scored 12 goals in seven games before suffering a season-ending broken leg as a sophomore. This past year, Ian played in just seven games again, but tallied four goals, including three game winners.

"They will compliment each other well," Fewing said. "Aside from the fact that they are brothers and read each other well, they will also make a great scoring tandem up front. Alex is a great post up player and is tremendous in the air, and Ian is a guy that likes to make runs in open spaces."

The younger Chursky marks the fifth son of a former Seattle Sounder to play for Seattle U. The two brothers are the sons of former Sounder standout Tony Chursky. SU junior Jeff Stock, Jr., who is also Ian's roommate, is the son of Jeff Stock, Sr., a teammate of Tony Chursky's with the Sounders. Soccer alumni Kelly Barton, a member of the 1997 NAIA national championship team, is the son of Frank Barton, and Eddie Fernandez was preceded by Sounder great Pepe Fernandez.

"Humble is a great word to describe both Alex and Ian, much like their father," Fewing said. "They are very coach able, good team players. I expect a lot of good things out of Alex."

Seattle Pacific

Top Scorer From Illinois Prep Powerhouse Signs at SPU (6/7/02)

Tom Funk, the top scorer for Illinois state champion Sandburg High School in Orland Park, has signed a national letter of intent to play soccer at Seattle Pacific University beginning this fall.

Funk, a 6-foot-1 forward, scored 16 goals and had 11 assists for Sandburg, which went 27-1-1 en route to the class AA state title and was ranked No. 6 in the nation. He was selected to the all-SICA West team as a junior and senior.

Funk also plays for the Windy City Pride, twice winner of the Busch tournament and a state cup semifinalist, and was that club's top scorer for five seasons. He played briefly for the Chicago Magic earlier this year.

Falcons Ink Parade All-American (3/18/02)

Ross Vaillancourt, a two-time Parade All-America selection from New Hampshire's Manchester West High School, has signed a national letter of intent to play soccer for Seattle Pacific University.

Vaillancourt, a center midfielder, was the Gatorade state player of the year the last two seasons and a fouryear starter for the Blue Knights. He scored 21 goals and added 13 assists in his final two seasons at West, that despite missing eight games of his senior season due to injury.

Vaillancourt was one of only four repeat selections for Parade All-America. The team consisted of 39 boys from 18 states this year. He was also a two-time All-America as chosen by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) and member of the Olympic Development regional pool. He becomes the first prep All-America to play for SPU since Jason Dunn (1991-93). West won the New Hampshire state title with an unbeaten record (20-0) in 2000 and was runner-up (18-1-1) last fall.
