#### GNAC RED LION PLAYER-OF-THE-WEEK:

**Player** – Jill McDaniels, Central Washington (2B, 5-8, Jr., Walla Walla, WA – WWCC) had eight hits in 12 at bats, including four home runs and 11 RBI as the Wildcats won three of four conference games. Seven of her RBI came in Sunday's 15-14 win over Western Oregon, tying a CWU single-game record. **Pitcher** – Sam Munger, Saint Martin's (5-6, So., Everett, WA) and Kelsey Hawkins, Simon Fraser (5-8, Jr., Victoria, BC) ... Munger made three appearances including one in relief recording two wins and a 0.45 ERA. In 15 2/3 innings she allowed 11 singles and three runs (one earned). She walked two and fanned nine. In Saturday's 2-1 win over Central Washington, she gave up three hits and a run in the first inning, but went on to retire 17 of the next 18 batters before giving up a two-out single to a pinch hitter in the bottom of seventh. Hawkins allowed just two hits in pitching the Clan to a 7-0 shutout

of Western Washington. She didn't walk a batter and fanned 10.

**HONORABLE MENTION:** Saint Martin's Taviah Jenkins had six hits in 13 at and also stole five bases as the Saints won three of four road games ... Alex Baylak had three hits, scored three runs and had five RBI in Simon Fraser's doubleheader sweep of Western Washington ... Maria Gau of Central Washington posted a 2-1 record as the Wildcats won five of six games. In 21 1/3 innings she gave up just 16 hits and two earned runs while fanning 19 finishing the week with a 0.66 ERA. She did allow 10 unearned runs ... Western Oregon's Jourdan Williams had nine hits in 15 at bats and drove in nine runs as the Wolves split four games. Among her hits were a double and two home runs. She also scored seven runs.

**FROM THE RECORD BOOK:** Saint Martin's Lacey McGladrey is currently on a 14-game hitting streak which equals the 10<sup>th</sup> longest in GNAC history ... Simon Fraser's Cara Lukawesky tossed a three-hitter Sunday defeating Western Washington 7-2. In the process, she extended her streak of consecutive innings without allowing an earned run to 31. That's among the Top 10 streaks in GNAC history ... McDaniels' seven RBIs in CWU's 15-14 win over WOU was one off the GNAC record.

**AROUND THE GNAC:** Michael Hazlett had 10 hits in 18 at bats and stole four bases in Central Washington's six contests, including two non-conference games with Northwest University. The Wildcats out-hit their opponents .394 to .235 during the week ... Desiree Villegas of Western Oregon batted .533 (8 of 15 with three doubles) on the Wolves' road trip to Nampa and Ellensburg ... Anisa Wingness made two relief appearances and pitched four scoreless innings in Western Washington's double-header loss at Simon Fraser ... Noelle Wright pitched 26 2/3 innings (out of a total of 29) and had a 3.94 ERA in Northwest Nazarene's four losses.

#### GNAC RED LION PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

**Week of Jan. 28-Feb. 3:** **Player** – Camille DePew, Western Washington (OF, 5-9, Sr., Seattle, WA – Seattle Lutheran) had 10 hits in 22 at bats to lead the Vikings to a 3-3 record in the Hawaii Hilo Invitational softball tournament last week. Five of DePew's hits were for extra bases as the North Dakota State transfer had four doubles and a one home run. She also drove in six runs while batting .455. **Pitcher** – Taylor Bakos, Saint Martin's (P, Sr., Kennewick, WA – CBC) had a win and a save and

carved out a 2.41 earned run average in the Hawaii Hilo Invitational. She pitched three complete games, allowing just 16 hits and seven earned runs in 20 1/3 innings.

**Week of Feb. 4-10: Player** - Alexie Levin, Western Washington (P-1B-OF, 5-7, Fr., Everett, WA) led the Vikings at the plate and in the circle to a 4-3 record, including 4-1 in the MSUB Desert Stinger in Las Vegas. Levin had 11 hits in 26 at bats, including four doubles and three triples, and also drove in a team-leading 10 runs. She had a 2-1 record and a 2.30 ERA in the circle, allowing just nine runs and 22 hits in 21 1/3 innings. **Pitcher** – Sam Munger, Saint Martin’s (5-6, So., Everett, WA – Cascade) pitched a three-hitter in a 3-1 win at BYU-Hawaii last Tuesday as the Saints completed their Hawaii road trip with a pair of victories. Munger didn’t walk a batter and fanned six in her win. She also had two of SMU’s 13 hits in the twinbill.

**Week of Feb. 10-17: Player** – Danielle Raison, Simon Fraser (SS, 5-7, So., Langley, BC – Garibaldi) had seven hits in 19 at bats and drove in six runs as the Clan won four of six road games in Hawaii. Raison scored a team-high seven runs and also hit two home runs, both in a 8-0 shutout of Chaminade. **Pitcher** – Kelsey Hawkins, Simon Fraser (5-8, Jr., Victoria, BC – Oak Bay) tossed a pair of shutouts. Hawkins balked BYU-Hawaii 8-0 on Wednesday, allowing six hits in six innings. She walked two and fanned nine. She then blanked Chaminade on Friday by the same score, allowing just three hits in five innings. She didn’t walk a batter and struck out seven. For the week, she posted a 2.19 earned run average, allowing 16 hits and five runs and fanning 18 in 16 innings.

**Week of Feb. 18-24: Player** – Lexi Orteza, Western Oregon (2B, 5-2, Sr., Bremerton, WA - Olympic) and Sam Munger, Saint Martin’s (SS-P, 5-6, So., Everett, WA - Cascade) ... Orteza batted .385 as the Wolves split eight games in Hawaii. She had 10 hits in 26 at bats, scored a team-high seven runs and also drove in six runs. She also played errorless softball at second base, handling 35 chances (20 putouts, 15 assists). Munger had seven hits, including four doubles, in 15 at bats leading the Saints to three wins in a four-game series at the College of Idaho. She scored five runs and drove in four. In the circle, she posted a 1-1 record, posting a 3.23 ERA in 13 innings. **Pitcher** – Hannah Pomeroy, Western Oregon (5-6, Sr., Mossyrock, WA) had a 3-0 record and a 1.84 earned run average in Hawaii. She walked six and fanned 15 batters in 19 innings, allowing 20 hits and seven runs, five of them earned.

**Week of Feb. 25-Mar. 3: Player** – Amanda Evola, Western Oregon (OF, 5-7, So., Beaverton, OR) had eight hits in 13 at bats, including a pair of doubles and a pair of home runs as the Wolves split four games, losing twice to Corban before sweeping Concordia. Evola, who drove in four runs and scored four, posted a 1.231 slugging average. **Pitcher** – Amanda Todd, Montana State Billings (5-5, Jr., Billings, MT) made her season debut tossing a three-hit shutout in a 4-0 shutout of Northwest Nazarene. Todd didn’t walk a batter and fanned 10 in the win.

**Week of Mar. 4-10: Player** – Hannah Pomeroy, Western Oregon (P-1B, 5-6, Sr., Mossyrock, WA) hit three home runs and drove in six runs to power the Wolves to sweeps of MSU Billings and Saint Martin’s. She had two blasts, including a grand slam in Friday’s 6-0 win over MSUB, then had a solo blast in Sunday’s 6-2 win against Saint Martin’s. She also earned two wins in the circle, allowing just eight hits and two runs in 14 innings. **Pitcher** – Cara Lukawesky, Simon Fraser (5-10, Sr., Coquitlam, BC) didn’t allow an earned run in 21 innings in pitching the Clan to wins over MSU Billings (7-1), Central Washington (6-0) and Northwest Nazarene (3-1). She allowed just nine hits and a pair of unearned runs, while walking eight and fanning 13.
