## WOU Percentage Points Ahead of WWU, CWU, MSUB

PORTLAND, Ore. -Saint Martin's opened up a threegame lead in the GNAC softball race Monday with a 10-8, 8-2 doubleheader sweep of Simon Fraser.

The Saints lead four teams by the same three-game margin.

Western Oregon (15-22, 7-5) is percentage points ahead of Western Washington (19-15, 8-6), Central Washington (18-17, 9-7) and Montana State Billings (19-18, 9-7) for second place as the four battle for the final three playoff spots.

Simon Fraser is also still in the hunt for the post-season trailing that quartet by two games.

It's a make or break week for the Clan as they play six more games this week, all at home. The homestand begins Wednesday against border-rival Washington.

The Vikings also play six contests, hosting Western Oregon and Saint Martin's Saturday and Sunday.

The Wolves play four taking on SFU Sunday to complete a four-game road trip to Bellingham and Burnaby.

MSU Billings, which won three of four home games last weekend against Central Washington, also plays four as it takes its final road trip of the season traveling to Nampa to face Northwest Nazarene.

CWU is idle this week before finishing its regular-season the next two weeks with doubleheaders at Saint Martin's and Western Oregon and home twin bills against Western Washington and Simon Fraser.

Once the dust has cleared four teams will advance to the GNAC Championships April 30-May 2 at Yakima, Wash.

The winner of the double-elimination tournament earns an automatic berth in the NCAA West Regionals the following week.

# Campbell Climbs Into 11th Place In RBIs with 46

A huge 15 RBI performance last weekend in a series against MSU Billings has catapulted Central Washington first baseman Kailyn Campbell into 11th place in NCAA Division II in RBIs with a total of 46.

In addition to ranking 11th in total RBI, she also ranks 12th in RBI per game with a 1.35 average.

MSUB's Emily Osborn also had a big series slamming three home runs to raise her season total to 12. She ranks 13th in Division II.

She also has 28 career slams and needs one more to jump from 13th into a tie for ninth along with Western Oregon's Amanda Evola.

Three other players rank in the Top 10 in this week's NCAA Division II national report - Alyssa Slate of Saint Martin's, Alicia Fine of Western Washington and MSUB's Aubrey Conceicao. They are tied for eighth in sacrifice flies with four each.

In team categories, Western Oregon and Western Oregon are eighth and ninth, respectively, in double plays averaging, 0.54 and 0.53, respectively. Saint Martin's is 18th in batting with a .342 average.

## **Last Week's Team Notes**

Central Washington: Kailyn Campbell and Austin Wilkerson each hit four home runs as the Wildcats had nine in their four-game series at MSUB. The Yellowjackets, meanwhile, hit 12. Both CWU players will take three-game homer streaks into CWU's April 18 doubleheader at Saint Martin's. The GNAC record is four.

Montana State Billings: The Yellowjackets hit for a .400 average and a .693 slugging percentage, doubling five times and homering a dozen times in their four-game home series against Central Washington. Taylor Hoke and Emily Osborn "touched them all" three times apiece. The two also led their team with eight and seven RBI. Bella Rovens had eight hits in 17 at bats, including a gameending three-run home run in a 12-10 Friday win as MSUB overcame a mercy-rule 9-1 situation in the fifth. Jessyka Macdonald earned three wins in the circle.

Northwest Nazarene: Gatalina Schuster and Whitney Carlton combined for 13 hits in 30 at bats in NNU's fourgame series at Simon Fraser. Both Schuster (7-of-15) and Carlton (6-of-15) had two doubles, one home run and three RBI in their 15 official at bats. Ashley Pesek also homered and drove in a team-high five runs.

Saint Martin's: Alyssa Slate and Sam Munger combined for 10 hits – the Saints had just 17 in the doubleheader – in 12 at bats as SMU split a twinbill with Western Oregon Saturday. Slate was 5-of-5 and Munger, who had four of her team's nine RBI, went 5-of-7. Munger extended her hitting streak to 13 games Monday, the second longest this spring in the GNAC. Earlier this season she had an 11game streak.

Simon Fraser: Alex Baylak (8-of-16) and Robyn Mogavero (6-of-12) hit for .500 averages as the Clan won three of four against NNU. Both players also drove in six runs. Baylak went deep twice. Kelsie Hawkins came out of the bullpen to win the final game 12-5, allowing three hits and one run in 5 1/3 innings.

Western Oregon: Amanda Evola scored her 150th career run as the Wolves split four games. Evola reached home plate three times and had five hits in 13 at bats. Jourdan Williams led WOU with six hits in 13 at bats and had a team-best five runs scored. She also scattered seven hits in a 6-1 win at Saint Martin's, earning GNAC Pitcher of the Week honors. Lexi Jennings, who had her team's only two home runs, drove in six.

Western Washington: Kali Patterson led the Vikings with three hits and was one of three players with home runs as they split a doubleheader with Western Oregon. Jordan Walley and Emily Benson also homered. Makinlee Sellevold, who allowed eight hints and five runs in 10 2/3 innings, earned both decisions and now has a 15-7 record. Her 15 wins ranks 23rd in Division II.

For the week, she batted .400 (14-of-35) and drove in 15 runs in 10 games. **Pitcher** – Lindsey Kamphuis, Central Washington (5-10, Fr., Kennewick, WA - Kamiakin) won two games allowing just 15 hits in 18 innings as the Wildcats won four of five games to open its season. Her first win was a 10-3 complete-game conquest of No. 19 ranked Humboldt State.

Week of Feb. 16-22: Player – Sam Munger, Saint Martin's (P-SS, Sr., Everett, WA) led the Saints to a 5-0 record both at the plate and in the circle. She had 10 hits – increasing her career total to 219 which is the seventh highest in GNAC history – in 21 at bats. Among her hits were four doubles and two home runs. She drove in 10 runs including six in a 10-3 win over Northwest Christian. She also recorded her 64<sup>th</sup> and 65<sup>th</sup> career wins – No. 3 all-time in the conference – allowing just four runs (two earned) in 13 innings. Pitcher – Kiana Wood, Central Washington (5-6, So., Aloha, OR) won two games defeating Dominican 6-0 and Holy Names 13-1. She pitched six innings and allowed just two hits against the Penguins, then pitched a five-inning complete-game against Holy Names.

Week of Feb. 23-March 1: Player – Emily Osborn, MSU Billings (1B, 5-8, Sr., Las Vegas, NV – Bonanza) had nine hits in 21 at bats, including two doubles and three home runs, as the Yellowjackets won four of six games in the College of Idaho/Northwest Nazarene Classic. Osborn had a total of five RBIs including three in a 5-3 win Saturday against College of Idaho. Pitcher – Jessyka MacDonald, MSU Billings (5-8, Sr., Billings, MT) recorded three victories and also earned a save, allowing just 10 hits in 15 innings. She walked eight and fanned 12 in posting a 2.80 ERA in the tournament.

Week of March 2-8: Player - Amanda Evola, Western Oregon (CF, 5-7, Sr., Beaverton, OR - Westview), had nine hits in 19 at bats, including two doubles and two home runs to lead the Wolves to a four-game sweep against Northwest Nazarene during which it outscored the Wolves 31-8. Evola also drove in six runs in raising her career batting average to .399. That ranks sixth in GNAC history. Only four players in conference history have finished their careers with a .400 average. She currently ranks sixth in career hits with 234 and fourth in RBI with 152. Pitcher -Makinlee Sellevold, Western Washington (5-4, Fr., Everett, WA - Cascade) posted a 4-0 record as the Vikings began their conference season winning four of six contests. Among the victories was a 5-0 shutout of Central Washington Sunday. In 32 1/3 innings, she allowed just eight runs, seven earned. She gave up 30 hits and walked 13, but only 18.6 percent of the runners who reached on a hit or walk ended up scoring.

Week of March 9-15: Player - Alexa Olague, Central Washington (3B, 5-6, Jr., Tacoma, WA - Wilson) and Taviah Jenkins, Saint Martin's (OF, 5-8, Sr., Castle Rock, WA) ... Olague led the Wildcats to a four-game sweep of

Northwest Nazarene, banging out six hits, including two doubles and the only triple in the GNAC last week. She also had six RBI. In Saturday's sweep, her two-out RBI single in the bottom of the seventh gave CWU a 6-5 victory in the first game. In the second contest, she led off the bottom of the sixth with a single and the Wildcats went on to score six runs to break a 2-2 tie in an 8-2 win ... Jenkins had eight hits in 16 at bats, including a double and home run, and also drove in eight runs as the Saints won five of six games including a 5-0, 2-1 sweep Saturday against Western Washington. Pitcher - Sam Munger, Saint Martin's (P-SS, 5-6, Sr., Everett, WA - Cascade) won three games and had a save and didn't allow a run in 20 innings pitching two shutouts against both Notre Dame de Namur (9-0, 2-0) and Western Washington (5-0). She allowed just 13 hits and fanned 16. She hasn't allowed a run in 21 consecutive innings.

Week of March 16-22: Player – Megan Miller, Saint Martin's (3B, 5-3, Jr., Everett, WA - Cascade) led the Saint offense which produced 36 runs in two games against Central Washington's pitching staff, CWU came into the weekend ranked No. 1 in the GNAC in ERA. Miller, who drove in six runs and hit for the cycle in the second game, had six hits in eight at bats, including two doubles, a triple and a home run. Her slugging average for the doubleheader with a phenomenal 1.625 as she drove in eight runs. Pitcher - Jessyka MacDonald, MSU Billings (5-8, Sr., Billings, MT - West) allowed just four runs in 21 2/3 innings, surrendering 15 hits and striking out 15 in winning three of four decisions including a two-hit 8-0 shutout of Simon Fraser Sunday. MacDonald pitched all 10 innings of MSUB's two five-inning wins Sunday, allowing just five hits and one run. She needed just 113 pitches combined in throwing two complete games.

Week of March 23-29: Player - Sam Munger, Saint Martin's (P-SS, Everett, WA - Cascade) was selected the MVP in the Cal State Stanislaus Tournament of Champions as she led the Saints to six straight wins and the second best record (6-1) in the 24-team event. Whether from the batter's box or the circle, she was spectacular. At the plate she had 14 hits in 24 at bats, including two home runs. She drove home eight, twice plating the gamewinner. Her RBI single in the bottom of the eighth gave SMU a 2-1 win Friday against Azusa Pacific. On Sunday in the Silver Bracket championship game, her sixth inning sacrifice fly snapped a 5-5 tie in a 6-5 win against nationally fourth-ranked Cal State Monterey Bay. She then went to the circle in the bottom of the inning and retired the final five hitters to earn a save. She also had three wins and a 0.83 ERA, allowing just four runs (three earned) and 22 hits in 25 1/3 innings. Pitcher - Sammi Cadwallader, Western Oregon (5-8, So, Toledo, OR) earned a win as a starter against San Francisco State and as a reliever with four scoreless innings in Sunday's Consolation championship game against Academy of Art. She also was a tough-luck 2-1 loser Friday to Academy of Art and

finished the week with a 1.72 ERA allowing just five runs in  $20\ 1/3$  innings.

Week of March 30-Apr. 5: Player - Bella Rovens, MSU Billings (OF, 5-7, So., Sparks, NV) and Kailyn Campbell, Central Washington (1B, 6-0, So., Duvall, WA - Cedarcrest) led their respective offenses as the Yellowjackets outscored the Wildcats 42-36 in a four-game series at Billings. Rovens had eight hits in 17 at bats, including a game-winning home run in the eighth inning of a 12-10 victory Friday, as the Yellowjackets rallied from a 9-1 deficit in the fifth. It was the first home run of the season for Rovens, who ranks second in the conference in walks with 20. Campbell drove in 15 runs in the four-game series, slamming four home runs and batting .556 (10-of-18). She also had a double and finished the trip with a 1.278 slugging average. On the season she has 46 RBI, 10 more than anyone else in the conference. Pitcher -Jourdan Williams, Western Oregon (5-8, Sr., McMinnville, OR).... In a week that was dominated by hitters - 178 runs were scored in 12 games (14.8 per game) - Williams had one of the few standout pitching performances limiting league-leading Saint Martin's to a single-run and seven hits in a 6-1 complete-game victory. Williams also led the Wolves in batting with a .462 average (6-of-13) as WOU split a pair of twin bills with Western Washington and Saint Martin's.
