### Saints, Vikings Regionally Ranked

PORTLAND, Ore. – Saint Martin's is ranked sixth and Western Washington is ranked 10<sup>th</sup> in the inaugural NCAA Division II West Regional softball poll of the 2015 season.

The poll will eventually determine which five at-large teams join the GNAC, PacWest and CCAA champions in the eight-team regional tournament in May.

If the three conference champions all wind up in the top eight in the final poll, the top eight teams will advance to the regional tournament, which will be divided into two four-team sub-regionals.

Dixie State, which is the defending West Regional champion, is the No. 1 ranked team in the inaugural poll followed by Cal State Monterey Bay, Humboldt State, Sonoma State and Cal Baptist.

Saint Martin's (32-16, 12-4), which hosts defending GNAC champion Western Oregon (18-23, 10-6) Friday and Central Washington (18-17, 9-7) Saturday, currently has a 1 ½ game lead over Western Washington (24-16, 13-7) and Montana State Billings (23-18, 13-7) in the GNAC race.

Western Oregon is in fourth place, two games back of the Saints and one game ahead of fifth-place Central Washington as five teams compete for the GNAC's four berths in the conference tournament which will be played April 30-May 2 at Yakima, Wash.

The winner of the tournament will earn the GNAC's automatic berth in the NCAA West Regionals.

## CWU's Campbell Ranks 10<sup>th</sup> in RBIs

Central Washington first baseman Kailyn Campbell ranks 10<sup>th</sup> in RBIs in this week's NCAA Division II national statistical report.

Campbell is averaging 1.31 RBI per contest. In total RBIs, she ranks 24<sup>th</sup> with 46, two fewer than Tavia Jenkins of Saint Martin's who ranks 19<sup>th</sup> with 48. SMU has played 13 more games than CWU.

The highest ranked GNAC players this week are Aubrey Conceicao of Montana State Billings and Alicia Fine of Western Washington. They are tied for sixth in sacrifice flies with five each.

Saint Martin's Dani Wall is eighth in fewest strikeouts, fanning just once in every 71 official at bats.

In team categories, Western Oregon ranks seventh in double plays per game (0.54). MSUB leads the GNAC and ranks 19<sup>th</sup> in Division II in batting with a .344 average. Saint Martin's 20<sup>th</sup> with a .339 team batting average.

## Team Notes

**Central Washington:** Kailyn Campbell and Austin Wilkerson will take three-game homer streaks into CWU's Saturday's doubleheader at Saint Martin's. The GNAC record is four. CWU was idle last week after posting a 1-3 record in a series the previous week at Billings.

**Montana State Billings:** Shortstop Taylor Hoke battled .667 (8-of-12) as the Yellowjackets swept a four-game series at Northwest Nazarene, rallying from a 7-0 deficit to win Game 3 by a score of 13-7. Cameron Cassinelli batted .545 (6-of-11) and also walked four times. She drove in seven runs. Brittney Sanders and Kelsey Devlin had nine and eight RBI. In the circle Jessyka MacDonald allowed just one run in eight innings recording two victories.

**Northwest Nazarene:** Ashley Pesek batted .462 (6-of-13) and had two home runs, including a grand slam, in a four-game home series with MSU Billings. She had six of the Crusaders' 18 RBI. Kiahna Brown hit .455 with five hits in 11 at bats. Gatalina Schuster hit .300 (3-of-10) and drive in five runs.

**Saint Martin's:** Sam Munger had 12 hits in 23 at bats and extended her hitting streak to a GNAC season-best 17 games. She now has two of the six longest streaks in GNAC history, including a 26-game streak over her sophomore (25 games) and junior (1 game) seasons. Tavia Jenkins had 10 hits in 23 at bats and drove in 13 runs as the Saints won four of six games, sweeping home-and-home twinbills with Simon Fraser before losing twice at Western Washington.

**Simon Fraser:** Taylor Lundrigan accounted for 18 percent of the Clan's hits (11 of 61) during an eight-game week. Lundrigan, who had five of her team's 10 doubles, batted .393. Stefanie Sheard led Simon Fraser with seven of her team's 27 RBIs.

**Western Oregon:** Kelsie Gardner had 11 hits in 16 at bats as the Wolves won three of four games on a trip to Bellingham and Burnaby. Gardner also drove in seven runs, a number matched by Emma Alfonso. Destiny Kuehl had eight hits in 10 at bats as the Wolves scored 39 runs batting at a .389 clip. In the circle, Jourdan Williams posted two victories. At the plate Lexi Jennings hit two home runs.

**Western Washington:** Alexie Levin batted .471 as the Vikings won five of six games, sweeping twinbills with Simon Fraser and Saint Martin's and dividing two games with Western Oregon. Levin hit three home runs and drove in 11 runs. Makinlee Sellevold won four games, posting a 2.41 DFZ.

**Week of Feb. 2-8: Player** – Amanda Evola, Western Oregon (OF, 5-7, Sr., Beaverton, OR) had 10 hits in 23 at bats as the Wolves won two of six games in the NFCA Division II Leadoff Classic at Tucson, Ariz. Evola also scored six runs and stole a pair of bases. Two of WOU's losses were in extra innings. **Pitcher** – Makinlee Sellevold, Western Washington (Fr., Everett, WA - Cascade), making her collegiate debut, allowed just one hit – a one-out infield single in the first inning – in a 3-0 shutout of Chaminade. Sellevold walked one batter, hit one and fanned four.

**Week of Feb. 9-15: Player** – Alicia Fine, Western Washington (SS, 5-6, Sr., Mount Vernon, WA – Portland State), batted .500 (10-of-20) and drove in 14 runs as the Vikings won four of six games in Las Vegas. Among her 10 hits, were four doubles and three home runs as she posted a 1.150 slugging percentage. She walked three times and didn't strikeout out. For the week, she batted .400 (14-of-35) and drove in 15 runs in 10 games. **Pitcher** – Lindsey Kamphuis, Central Washington (5-10, Fr., Kennewick, WA - Kamiakin) won two games allowing just 15 hits in 18 innings as the Wildcats won four of five games to open its season. Her first win was a 10-3 complete-game conquest of No. 19 ranked Humboldt State.

**Week of Feb. 16-22: Player** – Sam Munger, Saint Martin's (P-SS, Sr., Everett, WA) led the Saints to a 5-0 record both at the plate and in the circle. She had 10 hits – increasing her career total to 219 which is the seventh highest in GNAC history – in 21 at bats. Among her hits were four doubles and two home runs. She drove in 10 runs including six in a 10-3 win over Northwest Christian. She also recorded her 64<sup>th</sup> and 65<sup>th</sup> career wins – No. 3 all-time in the conference – allowing just four runs (two earned) in 13 innings. **Pitcher** – Kiana Wood, Central Washington (5-6, So., Aloha, OR) won two games defeating Dominican 6-0 and Holy Names 13-1. She pitched six innings and allowed just two hits against the Penguins, then pitched a five-inning complete-game against Holy Names.

**Week of Feb. 23-March 1: Player** – Emily Osborn, MSU Billings (1B, 5-8, Sr., Las Vegas, NV – Bonanza) had nine hits in 21 at bats, including two doubles and three home runs, as the Yellowjackets won four of six games in the College of Idaho/Northwest Nazarene Classic. Osborn had a total of five RBIs including three in a 5-3 win Saturday against College of Idaho. **Pitcher** – Jessyka MacDonald, MSU Billings (5-8, Sr., Billings, MT) recorded three victories and also earned a save, allowing just 10 hits in 15 innings. She walked eight and fanned 12 in posting a 2.80 ERA in the tournament.

**Week of March 2-8: Player** – Amanda Evola, Western Oregon (CF, 5-7, Sr., Beaverton, OR - Westview), had nine hits in 19 at bats, including two doubles and two home runs to lead the Wolves to a four-game sweep against Northwest Nazarene during which it outscored the Wolves 31-8. Evola also drove in six runs in raising her career batting average to .399. That ranks sixth in GNAC history. Only four players in conference history have finished their careers with a .400 average. She currently ranks sixth in career hits with 234 and fourth in RBI with 152. **Pitcher** – Makinlee Sellevold, Western Washington (5-4, Fr., Everett, WA - Cascade) posted a 4-0 record as the Vikings began their conference season winning four of six contests. Among the victories was a 5-0 shutout of Central Washington Sunday. In 32 1/3 innings, she allowed just eight runs, seven earned. She gave up 30 hits and walked 13, but only 18.6 percent of the runners who reached on a hit or walk ended up scoring.

**Week of March 9-15: Player** – Alexa Olague, Central Washington (3B, 5-6, Jr., Tacoma, WA - Wilson) and Taviyah Jenkins, Saint Martin's (OF, 5-8, Sr., Castle Rock, WA) ... Olague led the Wildcats to a four-game sweep of Northwest Nazarene, banging out six hits, including two doubles and the only triple in the GNAC last week. She also had six RBI. In Saturday's sweep, her two-out RBI single in the bottom of the seventh gave CWU a 6-5 victory in the first game. In the second contest, she led off the bottom of the sixth with a single and the Wildcats went on to score six runs to break a 2-2 tie in an 8-2 win ... Jenkins had eight hits in 16 at bats, including a double and home run, and also drove in eight runs as the Saints won five of six games including a 5-0, 2-1 sweep Saturday against Western Washington. **Pitcher** – Sam Munger, Saint Martin's (P-SS, 5-6, Sr., Everett, WA - Cascade) won three games and had a save and didn't allow a run in 20 innings pitching two shutouts against both Notre Dame de Namur (9-0, 2-0) and Western Washington (5-0). She allowed just 13 hits and fanned 16. She hasn't allowed a run in 21 consecutive innings.

**Week of March 16-22: Player** – Megan Miller, Saint Martin's (3B, 5-3, Jr., Everett, WA - Cascade) led the Saint offense which produced 36 runs in two games against Central Washington's pitching staff, CWU came into the weekend ranked No. 1 in the GNAC in ERA. Miller, who drove in six runs and hit for the cycle in the second game, had six hits in eight at bats, including two doubles, a triple and a home run. Her slugging average for the doubleheader with a phenomenal 1.625 as she drove in eight runs. **Pitcher** – Jessyka MacDonald, MSU Billings (5-8, Sr., Billings, MT – West) allowed just four runs in 21 2/3 innings, surrendering 15 hits and striking out 15 in winning three of four decisions including a two-hit 8-0 shutout of Simon Fraser Sunday. MacDonald pitched all 10 innings of MSUB's two five-inning wins Sunday, allowing just five hits and one run. She needed just 113 pitches combined in throwing two complete games.

**Week of March 23-29: Player** – Sam Munger, Saint Martin's (P-SS, Everett, WA – Cascade) was selected the MVP in the Cal State Stanislaus Tournament of Champions as she led the Saints to six straight wins and the second best record (6-1) in the 24-team event. Whether from the batter's box or the circle, she was spectacular. At the plate she had 14 hits in 24 at bats, including two home runs. She drove home eight, twice plating the game-winner. Her RBI single in the bottom of the eighth gave SMU a 2-1 win Friday against Azusa Pacific. On Sunday in the Silver Bracket championship game, her sixth inning sacrifice fly snapped a 5-5 tie in a 6-5 win against nationally fourth-ranked Cal State Monterey Bay. She then went to the circle in the bottom of the inning and retired the final five hitters to earn a save. She also had three wins and a 0.83 ERA, allowing just four runs (three earned) and 22 hits in 25 1/3 innings. **Pitcher** – Sammi Cadwallader, Western Oregon (5-8, So, Toledo, OR) earned a win as a starter against San Francisco State and as a reliever with four scoreless innings in Sunday's Consolation championship game against Academy of Art. She also was a tough-luck 2-1 loser Friday to Academy of Art and finished the week with a 1.72 ERA allowing just five runs in 20 1/3 innings.

**Week of March 30-Apr. 5: Player** – Bella Rovens, MSU Billings (OF, 5-7, So., Sparks, NV) and Kailyn Campbell, Central Washington (1B, 6-0, So., Duvall, WA - Cedarcrest) led their respective offenses as the Yellowjackets outscored the Wildcats 42-36 in a four-game series at Billings. Rovens had eight hits in 17 at bats, including a game-winning home run in the eighth inning of a 12-10 victory Friday, as the Yellowjackets rallied from a 9-1 deficit in the fifth. It was the first home run of the season for Rovens, who ranks second in the conference in walks with 20. Campbell drove in 15 runs in the four-game series, slamming four home runs and batting .556 (10-of-18). She also had a double and finished the trip with a 1.278 slugging average. On the season she has 46 RBI, 10 more than anyone else in the conference. **Pitcher** – Jourdan Williams, Western Oregon (5-8, Sr., McMinnville, OR).... In a week that was dominated by hitters – 178 runs were scored in 12 games (14.8 per game) – Williams had one of the few standout pitching performances limiting league-leading Saint Martin's to a single-run and seven hits in a 6-1 complete-game victory. Williams also led the Wolves in batting with a .462 average (6-of-13) as WOU split a pair of twin bills with Western Washington and Saint Martin's.

**Week of April 6-12: Player** – Alexie Levin, Western Washington (OF-DH, 5-7, Jr., Everett, WA) and Destiny Kuehl, Western Oregon (3B, 5-8, So., Portland, OR – David Douglas) ... Levin hit three home runs and drove in 11 runs as the Vikings won five of six games, including a sweep of first-place Saint Martin's Sunday to move within one game of the Saints in the conference standings. Levin had eight hits, including a pair of doubles, in 17 at bats. She also

drew four walks ... Western Washington's lone loss during the week came against Western Oregon as the Wolves earned a split of a doubleheader with an 8-5 victory Saturday. WOU's key hit in that win was a two-run home run by Kuehl extending a 6-5 lead to 8-5. In four games including a sweep of Simon Fraser Sunday, Kuehl had eight hits in 10 at bats, scored seven runs and drove in four. **Pitcher** – Makinlee Sellevold, Western Washington (5-4, Fr., Everett, WA - Cascade) posted four victories to improve her season record to 19-7. She allowed 21 hits in 29 innings, walking nine and fanning 12. Sellevold, who leads the GNAC in victories, finished the week with a 4-0 record and a 2.41 earned run average.

**GNAC Championships:** The GNAC will determine its automatic berth for the NCAA National Championships with a four-team double elimination tournament Apr. 30 – May 2 at Yakima.
