Saints, Vikings Take Win Streaks into Championship

PORTLAND, Ore. – Top-seed Saint Martin's and second-seed Western Washington will take eight and six-game win streaks, respectively, into the third annual Great Northwest Athletic Conference Softball Championships at the Gateway Sports Complex in Yakima.

The championships begin Thursday as Western Washington (28-16) opens against third-seed Montana State Billings (26-21) at 4:30 p.m. Pacific time.

The second game will send defending champion Western Oregon (21-26) up against top-seed and 2013 champion Saint Martin's (40-16) at 7 p.m.

The Saints haven't lost since dropping a doubleheader (5-4, 4-1) at Western Washington on April 12. Those two wins began a six-game streak for the Vikings, who have won 10 of their last 11.

WWU's last two losses (8-5 on April 11 and 4-2 on April 2) both came against Western Oregon.

WWU is 10-2 in the month of April and has been led in that time by pitcher Makinlee Sellevold, outfielder Autumn Isaacson and shortstop Alicia Fine.

Sellevold is 9-1 in April, winning her last nine decisions, including all six during WWU's current win streak. Her ERA in April is 1.79.

Isaacson is hitting .368 in April and has stolen 13 bases in the month increasing her season total to 30, one shy of her own GNAC record.

She has 61 career steals, which ranks third in GNAC history. On the season she is batting .316 and has five triples.

Fine leads WWU in batting with a .373 average and is also tied for the team lead in home runs with 6 and RBI with 37. Alexie Levin also has six home runs and 37 RBI and Emily Benson also has gone deep six times.

Sellevold takes a 23-7 record to Yakima. Her victory total is one more than *GNAC Pitcher of the Year* Sam Munger.

Munger, who has 82 career wins (No. 2 in GNAC history), brings a 22-4 record and a league-best 2.24 ERA to Yakima.

Munger, who was also voted the *GNAC Co-Player of the Year* along with Montana State Billings shortstop Taylor Hoke, ranks second in the GNAC in batting with a .431 average.

The Saints, whose 40 victories are just one shy of their school record, are also led by Tavia Jenkins who is hitting .388 and has 11 home runs and a league-best 56 RBI.

Hoke, first baseman Emily Osborn, outfielder Bella Rovens and pitcher Jessyka MacDonald lead MSUB.

Hoke is batting .390 and has 10 home runs and a team-best 46 RBI. Osborn is batting .377 and has a GNAC-best 12 home runs and 35 RBI and Rovens is batting a team-best .393 and brings a 12-game hitting streak into the tournament.

Macdonald is MSUB's pitching ace. She is 16-5 and has a 2.77 ERA. She also has fanned 118 batters.

Western Oregon has two of the GNAC's three .400 hitters. Second baseman Kelsie Gardner leads the conference with a .438 average and outfielder Amanda Evola ranks third with a .404 average.

WOU's top pitchers are Alyson Boytz (9-11, 3.95 ERA) and Jourdan Williams (7-2, 4.49 ERA). Williams had a 14-game win streak over two seasons before losing her final two decisions.

The winner of this weekend's tournament automatically qualifies for the NCAA West Regionals which begin next Thursday.

The regionals will be contested as two four-team sub-regionals. Five at-large teams will join the GNAC, PacWest and California Collegiate champions in the tournament.

The at-large participants will be determined by the NCAA Regional Advisory Committee.

In this week's RAC poll, Saint Martin's was ranked sixth and Western Washington was ranked 10th for the third week in a row.

The eight participating schools and the two hosts for the sub-regionals will be announced Monday morning at 7 a.m. via a news release on the NCAA official web site (ncaa.com).

Saints Fifth in Batting

Saint Martin's ranks fifth in batting in this week's NCAA Division II national statistical report with a .348 average.

That equals the GNAC record set last year by Western Washington. The Saints also rank 10th in on-base percentage (.419).

Also ranked in the Top 10 in this week's report are Western Oregon (6th in double plays, 0.53) and Western Washington (9th in double plays, 0.50).

In individual categories, Heather Tracy of MSU Billings ranks sixth in toughest to strikeout, fanning just once every 66 official at bats.

Kailyn Campbell of Central Washington ranks 10th in RBI per game. She finished her season with a 1.23 average.

Team Notes

Central Washington: Celine Fowler batted .571 (8-of-14) as the Wildcats split four games. Kailyn Campbell had seven hits in 13 at bats and drove in a team-best six runs. Kiana Wood and Lindsey Kamphuis each had 1.75 ERAs and 1-1 records, allowing three earned runs in 12 innings. Wood also was effective with a stick going five for seven.

Montana State Billings: Bella Rovens had six hits in seven at bats to extend her hitting streak to 12 games as the Yellowjackets divided a doubleheader with Western Oregon to earn the No. 3 seed in the conference playoffs. The final two games of the series were canceled due to unplayable field conditions. Jessyka MacDonald fanned 13 in eight inning in the two games, picking up the win.

Northwest Nazarene: Ali Schauer, Kiahna Brown and Lily Paschal all had five hits in NNU's four-game series last weekend against Saint Martin's. Schauer and Gatalina Schuster each had a home run and five RBI. Ashley Pesek also hit a home run in the series.

Saint Martin's: Dani Wall had seven hits in 13 at bats in SMU's series at Nampa. Wall (.538) was one of three players to bat .500 or better in the series as Mary Dettling and Jackie Schmaeling each had six hits in 12 at bats. Sam Munger drove in a team-best seven runs, but had her 21-game hitting streak, which is the third longest in GNAC history, snapped. In the circle, Munger posted a 2-0 record and a 0.98 ERA, allowing eight hits and two runs in 14 1/3 innings.

Simon Fraser: Kaitlyn Cameron, Nicole Ratel and Danielle Raison all had three hits. Ratel had the team's only home run during the week and two of their five RBIs. Cameron also drove in a pair of runs.

Western Oregon: Alyson Boytz scattered 10 hits in pitching the Wolves to a 5-1 win at Montana State Billings. She didn't walk a batter and fanned three. Zoe Clark and Lexi Jennings hit home runs as WOU split Friday's doubleheader.

Western Washington: Arianna Barrio had six hits in 10 at bats in the Vikings' four victories. Autumn Isaacson had five hits in 11 at bats, scored seven runs and stole six bases. Makinlee Sellevold, who has allowed just three runs in her last 26 innings, won all four games, three as a starter and one in relief.

Week of Feb. 2-8: Player – Amanda Evola, Western Oregon (OF, 5-7, Sr., Beaverton, OR) had 10 hits in 23 at bats as the Wolves won two of six games in the NFCA Division II Leadoff Classic at Tucson, Ariz. Evola also scored six runs and stole a pair of bases. Two of WOU's losses were in extra innings. **Pitcher** - Makinlee Sellevold, Western Washington (Fr., Everett, WA - Cascade), making her collegiate debut, allowed just one hit – a one-out infield single in the first inning – in a 3-0 shutout of Chaminade. Sellevold walked one batter, hit one and fanned four.

Week of Feb. 9-15: Player - Alicia Fine, Western Washington (SS, 5-6, Sr., Mount Vernon, WA – Portland State), batted .500 (10-of-20) and drove in 14 runs as the Vikings won four of six games in Las Vegas. Among her 10 hits, were four doubles and three home runs as she posted a 1.150 slugging percentage. She walked three times and didn't strikeout out. For the week, she batted .400 (14-of-35) and drove in 15 runs in 10 games. **Pitcher** – Lindsey Kamphuis, Central Washington (5-10, Fr., Kennewick, WA - Kamiakin) won two games allowing just 15 hits in 18 innings as the Wildcats won four of five games to open its

season. Her first win was a 10-3 complete-game conquest of No. 19 ranked Humboldt State.

Week of Feb. 16-22: Player – Sam Munger, Saint Martin's (P-SS, Sr., Everett, WA) led the Saints to a 5-0 record both at the plate and in the circle. She had 10 hits – increasing her career total to 219 which is the seventh highest in GNAC history – in 21 at bats. Among her hits were four doubles and two home runs. She drove in 10 runs including six in a 10-3 win over Northwest Christian. She also recorded her 64th and 65th career wins – No. 3 all-time in the conference – allowing just four runs (two earned) in 13 innings. **Pitcher** – Kiana Wood, Central Washington (5-6, So., Aloha, OR) won two games defeating Dominican 6-0 and Holy Names 13-1. She pitched six innings and allowed just two hits against the Penguins, then pitched a five-inning complete-game against Holy Names.

Week of Feb. 23-March 1: Player – Emily Osborn, MSU Billings (1B, 5-8, Sr., Las Vegas, NV – Bonanza) had nine hits in 21 at bats, including two doubles and three home runs, as the Yellowjackets won four of six games in the College of Idaho/Northwest Nazarene Classic. Osborn had a total of five RBIs including three in a 5-3 win Saturday against College of Idaho. **Pitcher** – Jessyka MacDonald, MSU Billings (5-8, Sr., Billings, MT) recorded three victories and also earned a save, allowing just 10 hits in 15 innings. She walked eight and fanned 12 in posting a 2.80 ERA in the tournament.

Week of March 2-8: Player – Amanda Evola, Western Oregon (CF, 5-7, Sr., Beaverton, OR - Westview), had nine hits in 19 at bats, including two doubles and two home runs to lead the Wolves to a four-game sweep against Northwest Nazarene during which it outscored the Wolves 31-8. Evola also drove in six runs in raising her career batting average to .399. That ranks sixth in GNAC history. Only four players in conference history have finished their careers with a .400 average. She currently ranks sixth in career hits with 234 and fourth in RBI with 152. **Pitcher** – Makinlee Sellevold, Western Washington (5-4, Fr., Everett, WA - Cascade) posted a 4-0 record as the Vikings began their conference season winning four of six contests. Among the victories was a 5-0 shutout of Central Washington Sunday. In 32 1/3 innings, she allowed just eight runs, seven earned. She gave up 30 hits and walked 13, but only 18.6 percent of the runners who reached on a hit or walk ended up scoring.

Week of March 9-15: Player - Alexa Olague, Central Washington (3B, 5-6, Jr., Tacoma, WA - Wilson) and Tavia Jenkins, Saint Martin's (OF, 5-8, Sr., Castle Rock, WA) ... Olague led the Wildcats to a four-game sweep of Northwest Nazarene, banging out six hits, including two doubles and the only triple in the GNAC last week. She also had six RBI. In Saturday's sweep, her two-out RBI single in the bottom of the seventh gave CWU a 6-5 victory in the first game. In the second contest, she led off the

bottom of the sixth with a single and the Wildcats went on to score six runs to break a 2-2 tie in an 8-2 win ... Jenkins had eight hits in 16 at bats, including a double and home run, and also drove in eight runs as the Saints won five of six games including a 5-0, 2-1 sweep Saturday against Western Washington. **Pitcher** – Sam Munger, Saint Martin's (P-SS, 5-6, Sr., Everett, WA - Cascade) won three games and had a save and didn't allow a run in 20 innings pitching two shutouts against both Notre Dame de Namur (9-0, 2-0) and Western Washington (5-0). She allowed just 13 hits and fanned 16. She hasn't allowed a run in 21 consecutive innings.

Week of March 16-22: Player – Megan Miller, Saint Martin's (3B, 5-3, Jr., Everett, WA - Cascade) led the Saint offense which produced 36 runs in two games against Central Washington's pitching staff, CWU came into the weekend ranked No. 1 in the GNAC in ERA. Miller, who drove in six runs and hit for the cycle in the second game, had six hits in eight at bats, including two doubles, a triple and a home run. Her slugging average for the doubleheader with a phenomenal 1.625 as she drove in eight runs. **Pitcher** – Jessyka MacDonald, MSU Billings (5-8, Sr., Billings, MT – West) allowed just four runs in 21 2/3 innings, surrendering 15 hits and striking out 15 in winning three of four decisions including a two-hit 8-0 shutout of Simon Fraser Sunday. MacDonald pitched all 10 innings of MSUB's two five-inning wins Sunday, allowing just five hits and one run. She needed just 113 pitches combined in throwing two complete games.

Week of March 23-29: Player – Sam Munger, Saint Martin's (P-SS, Everett, WA – Cascade) was selected the MVP in the Cal State Stanislaus Tournament of Champions as she led the Saints to six straight wins and the second best record (6-1) in the 24-team event. Whether from the batter's box or the circle, she was spectacular. At the plate she had 14 hits in 24 at bats, including two home runs. She drove home eight, twice plating the game-winner. Her RBI single in the bottom of the eighth gave SMU a 2-1 win Friday against Azusa Pacific. On Sunday in the Silver Bracket championship game, her sixth inning sacrifice fly snapped a 5-5 tie in a 6-5 win against nationally fourth-ranked Cal State Monterey Bay. She then went to the circle in the bottom of the inning and retired the final five hitters to earn a save. She also had three wins and a 0.83 ERA, allowing just four runs (three earned) and 22 hits in 25 1/3 innings. **Pitcher** – Sammi Cadwallader, Western Oregon (5-8, So, Toledo, OR) earned a win as a starter against San Francisco State and as a reliever with four scoreless innings in Sunday's Consolation championship game against Academy of Art. She also was a tough-luck 2-1 loser Friday to Academy of Art and finished the week with a 1.72 ERA allowing just five runs in 20 1/3 innings.

Week of March 30-Apr. 5: Player – Bella Rovens, MSU Billings (OF, 5-7, So., Sparks, NV) and Kailyn Campbell,

Central Washington (1B, 6-0, So., Duvall, WA - Cedarcrest) led their respective offenses as the Yellowjackets outscored the Wildcats 42-36 in a four-game series at Billings. Rovens had eight hits in 17 at bats, including a game-winning home run in the eighth inning of a 12-10 victory Friday, as the Yellowjackets rallied from a 9-1 deficit in the fifth. It was the first home run of the season for Rovens, who ranks second in the conference in walks with 20. Campbell drove in 15 runs in the four-game series, slamming four home runs and batting .556 (10-of-18). She also had a double and finished the trip with a 1.278 slugging average. On the season she has 46 RBI, 10 more than anyone else in the conference. **Pitcher** – Jourdan Williams, Western Oregon (5-8, Sr., McMinnville, OR).... In a week that was dominated by hitters – 178 runs were scored in 12 games (14.8 per game) – Williams had one of the few standout pitching performances limiting league-leading Saint Martin's to a single-run and seven hits in a 6-1 complete-game victory. Williams also led the Wolves in batting with a .462 average (6-of-13) as WOU split a pair of twin bills with Western Washington and Saint Martin's.

Week of April 6-12: Player – Alexie Levin, Western Washington (OF-DH, 5-7, Jr., Everett, WA) and Destiny Kuehl, Western Oregon (3B, 5-8, So., Portland, OR – David Douglas) ... Levin hit three home runs and drove in 11 runs as the Vikings won five of six games, including a sweep of first-place Saint Martin's Sunday to move within one game of the Saints in the conference standings. Levin had eight hits, including a pair of doubles, in 17 at bats. She also drew four walks ... Western Washington's lone loss during the week came against Western Oregon as the Wolves earned a split of a doubleheader with an 8-5 victory Saturday. WOU's key hit in that win was a two-run home run by Kuehl extending a 6-5 lead to 8-5. In four games including a sweep of Simon Fraser Sunday, Kuehl had eight hits in 10 at bats, scored seven runs and drove in four. **Pitcher** – Makinlee Sellevold, Western Washington (5-4, Fr., Everett, WA - Cascade) posted four victories to improve her season record to 19-7. She allowed 21 hits in 29 innings, walking nine and fanning 12. Sellevold, who leads the GNAC in victories, finished the week with a 4-0 record and a 2.41 earned run average.

Week of April 13-19: Player – Amanda Evola, Western Oregon (OF, 5-7, Sr., Portland, OR – Westview) had eight hits in 15 at bats, including 5-of-8 in a 2-1, 4-3 doubleheader sweep of Central Washington Sunday reducing the Wolves' magic number for clinching a post-season playoff berth to one. She scored the winning run in the 2-1 victory and drove in the winning run in the 4-3 victory with her fourth hit of the game. **Pitcher** – Sam Munger, Saint Martin's (P-SS, 5-6, Sr., Everett, WA – Cascade) earned three victories – her 78th, 79th and 80th of her career - as the Saints reduced their magic number for clinching at least a tie for the GNAC regular-season title to one. Munger, who now ranks second in GNAC history in

career wins, had a 2.28 ERA allowing five earned runs in 15 1/3 innings. She also led the Saints offensively with nine hits increasing her career total to 281 to break the GNAC record of 279 set by Brandi Harrison of Humboldt State between 2002 and 2006. Munger also had three doubles and five RBI.

Week of April 20-26: Player – Autumn Isaacson, Western Washington (OF, 5-5, Sr., Lake Stevens, WA – Bellevue CC) and Bella Rovens, MSU Billings (OF, 5-7, So., Sparks, NV – Spanish Springs) ... Isaacson stole six bases to increase her season total to 30, one shy of her own GNAC record she set last season. She had five hits in 11 at bats in doubleheader sweeps of Central Washington and Simon Fraser and also scored seven runs. Rovens, MSUB's lead-off hitter, had six hits in seven at bats as the Yellowjackets split two games to earn the No. 3 seed in the conference playoffs. Among her six hits were a pair of doubles. On the season, Rovens leads the GNAC in on-base percentage (.488) and ranks fourth in batting (.393), runs scored (44) and stolen bases (12). **Pitching** – Makinlee Sellevold, Western Washington (P, 5-4, Fr., Everett, WA - Cascade) won four games to finish the regular-season with a league-best 23 victories. Sellevold allowed just two runs and 15 hits in 19 innings.

The qualifiers for the tournament and the two sites will be announced Monday morning at 7 a.m. Pacific with a news release on ncaa.com.
