Overall Record: 27-16 **GNAC:** 16-8

Mallory Holtman-Fletcher, who guided CWU to GNAC titles in 2010 and 2011, brings a 100-91 career record in four seasons into the tournament after recording her 100th career win last Saturday at Nampa.

Top players for the Wildcats include pitcher Maria Gau, second baseman Jill McDaniels and first baseman Mai Galusha. Gau has a 16-6 record and leads the GNAC in strikeouts with 124. Her 2.27 ERA ranks third.

McDaniels is batting .341 and ranks second in the GNAC in home runs with nine. She leads CWU in RBI with 36. Galusha is batting .339, coming off an 11-for-16 performance last weekend. Catcher Austin Wilkerson leads the Wildcats with a .360 batting average.

Fourth-year Saints' head coach Rick Noren earned his 500th career victory earlier this season and brings a 511-229-1 record into the tournament. In four seasons at SMU, he has a 113-74-1 and is the only coach in school history to post a winning season.

Among the key players for the Saints is second baseman Lacey McGladrey, outfielder Tavia Jenkins and pitcher Sam Munger. McGladrey was a first team NFCA All-American last season and is batting .382.


Munger leads the conference in victories (19) and shutouts (4) and ranks second in earned run average (2.23). Jenkins is hitting .351 for the Saints and is also the team leader in home runs (7) and RBI (42). In addition to starring in the circle, Munger is also batting .355.

Lonnie Sargent guided the Wolves to a 30-20 record and the GNAC regular-season title this spring in his second season at Monmouth. In each of his two seasons at WOU (57-46) he has led the Wolves into the conference playoffs.

Outfielder Amanda Evola leads the Wolves in batting with a .407 average and is also the team leader in doubles (16), home runs (7) and RBI (48). Evola and shortstop Melanie Pfeiffer are tied for the team lead in both runs scored (47) and hits (72). They are the GNAC co-leaders in hits. Pfeiffer is hitting .398.

Pitcher Kelli Demianew leads the conference in earned run average (1.77) and also has a 14-9 record. Demianew has tossed 16 complete games and is tied for the conference lead in most shutouts with four.

Amy Suiter (106-88, 3 years), who was voted the GNAC Coach of the Year in 2011, led the Vikings to a 30-12 record and a second-place regular-season finish this season after being picked to finish fifth in the preseason poll. WWU comes into the tournament having won seven of its last eight games and 19 of 23.

Alexie Levin is making a bid to win the GNAC Triple Crown. She leads the conference in hitting (.433), home runs (10) and RBIs (46). Jenna DeRosier has the conference's top winning percentage (.809) posting a 17-4 record and a 3.05 ERA. She had won 12 straight before losing last Sunday.

Meghan Carrillo is battling Levin for the batting title. Her .432 average is just one back of her. Autumn Isaacson has stolen a GNAC-record 30 stolen bases. The Vikings are one of the top hitting teams in Division II, batting .353.

Tournament Preview

A berth in next weekend's NCAA Division II West Regionals will be up for grabs in the second annual Great Northwest Athletic Conference softball tournament this weekend at Columbia Playfield.

Saint Martin's, which is the No. 4 seed in the tournament, is the defending champion.

Joining the Saints in the double-elimination tournament will be regular-season champion Western Oregon, second-seed Western Washington and third-seed Central Washington.

All four teams have won GNAC softball titles since 2007 when Western Washington won its only championship.

Western Oregon shared the crown with Seattle University in 2008 and went on to reach the NCAA West Regional title game before losing to Humboldt State.

Central Washington won conference titles in both 2010 and 2011 to earn berths in the regional tournament.

In 2010 the Wildcats reached the title game of the Honolulu sub-regional before losing to eventual national champion Hawaii Pacific 1-0 finishing the tournament with a 3-2 record. In 2011 CWU won one of three games in the Chico sub-regional.

Last year Saint Martin's advanced to the title game of the sub-regional before losing to eventual West Region champion Humboldt State. The Lumberjacks are ranked third in the latest West Region poll in back of top-ranked Cal Monterey Bay and second-ranked Dixie State.

The West Regional is divided into two four-team sub-regionals with the winners advancing to a best-of-three series. The winner of that series qualifies for the eight-team national championship tournament May 22-26 at Moyer Complex in Salem, Virginia.

In addition to champions from the GNAC, PacWest and California Collegiate conferences, five West Region teams will be awarded at-large berths in the tournament. The qualifying teams will be announced Monday.
