#SeawolfSweep Alaska Anchorage swept the men's and women's team titles at the GNAC Indoor Track and Field Championships, with both teams scoring 164 points. It is the first time that one school has swept both the men's and women's titles.

#AllTimePerformer Alaska Anchorage's Karolin Anders was named the Female Outstanding Performer of the Meet after winning the pentathlon and long jump, placing third in the triple jump and fourth in the high jump. She led all scorers with 31 team points and became the all-time career female point scorer in meet history (112).

#HometownHero Northwest Nazarene's **Payton Lewis** was named the Male Outstanding Performer of the Meet after winning the heptathlon and the pole vault within 90 minutes of each other. Lewis' score of 5,163 points in the heptahlon was a meet record and third best in GNAC history.

#SplittingHairs The women's 60-meter hurdles final at the GNAC Indoor Track and Field Championships was one of the closest races in meet history with the top three finishers separated by four-thousandths of a second.

Lewis won both the heptathlon and the pole vault. His 20 team points tied him for top point scorer in the men's meet. Lewis won the heptathlon with a score of 5,163 points, the third best point total in GNAC history. In the process, he set the GNAC heptathlon record in the pole vault with a mark of 16

feet, 6.75 inches. Not long after the heptathlon, Lewis came back to repeat as champion in the pole vault as he cleared a height of 15 feet, 10 inches.

Anders' 31 team points were the most of any athlete in the meet. The scoring also made her the top women's pointer scorer in GNAC Women's Track and Field Championship history (112). Anders became a three-time champion in the pentathlon with a score of 3,711 points, in the process setting a GNAC

pentathlon record in the long jump at 18 feet, 8.75 inches. She went on to repeat as long jump champion the same day with her mark of 18 feet, 5.75 inches. Anders also placed third in the triple jump and fourth in the high jump.

GNAC Indoor Track & Field Championships Recaps

Men: Seawolves Outdistance Pack For Second Straight Title

NAMPA, Idaho – Distance performers led the way for Alaska Anchorage Saturday as the Seawolves won the 2016 Great Northwest Athletic Conference Men's Indoor Track and Field Championships at the Jackson Track at the Ford Idaho Center.

Alaska Anchorage finished with 164 points to win their second straight team title, with 80 of those coming in the distance events. The Seawolves easily out-pointed second place Western Oregon, who finished with 93 points. Western Washington was third with 92 points.

Dominik Notz led the Seawolves individually with wins in the 3,000 meters and 5,000 meters. He led five UAA finishers in the top-five in the 5,000 on Friday with a meet record time of 14:36.42 before outdistancing teammate and defending champion **Henry Cheseto** in the 3,000 meters in 8:31.91. Alaska Anchorage ended the meet by winning the 4x400-meter relay in a time of 3:16.76.

Payton Lewis of host Northwest Nazarene was honored as the Outstanding Male Athlete of the Meet. The sophomore claimed his first GNAC heptathlon title with a score of 5,163 points that is the third best performance in GNAC history. He won the long jump on the opening day before setting a GNAC heptathlon record in the pole vault with his mark of 16 feet, 6.75 inches. Lewis went on to repeat as pole vault champion later in the day with a clearance of 15 feet, 10 inches.

Lewis was one of seven repeat men's champions in the meet. Simon Fraser's **Joel Webster** repeated in the 200 meters with a GNAC record of 47.80 seconds, surpassing the mark of 48.27 set by Simon Fraser's Andrew Boss in 2011. Western Oregon's **Cody Warner** won his second 200-meter title with a time of 21.78 seconds while Simon Fraser's **Cameron Proceviat** repeated in the 800 meters with a time of 1:55.86. **Luke Plummer** became a three-time champion for Central Washington in the triple jump with his mark of 49 feet, 2.25 inches. On Friday, the Clan's **Vladislav Tsygankov** repeated in the long jump with a GNAC record of 24 feet, 2.5 inches.

Montana State Billings' **Robert Peterson** prevented an Alaska Anchorage sweep with a meet record in the mile, running 4:10.13 to out-lean Western Oregon's **David Ribich** by one-hundreth of a second. In all Peterson raced in four events, placing third in the 3,000 meters while anchoring the Yellowjackets' winning distance medley relay and 4x400-relay squads.

Saint Martin's **Mikel Smith** and Northwest Nazarene's **Cole Hoberg** tied the meet record in the high jump at 6 feet, 9 inches, with Smith claiming the championship on fewest misses. Central Washington's **Kent McKinney** won the 60 meters in a time 6.91 seconds while Josh Koch completed a throwing sweep for Concordia with his win in the shot put at 53 feet, 7.5 inches. His teammate, **Tyler Lamott**, set a meet record in the weight throw on Friday with his throw of 61 feet. 1.5 inches.

The Seawolves scored 33 of their in the 5,000 meters on Friday. Notz edged out teammate and defending champion Cheseto to win his first GNAC indoor title in a meet record time of 14:36.46. Cheseto also finished his former meet record in second at 14:36.51. **Edwin Kangogo** placed third in 14:57.63 followed by **Michel Ramirez** (15:00.16) and **Victor Samoei** (15:07.50).

Montana State Billings rallied in the final two laps to win their first distance medley relay title with a time of 10:06.41, finishing just a second ahead of Simon Fraser and two seconds ahead of Alaska Anchorage. The team of **Josh Panasuk**, **Landon Polkow**, **Liam McKay** and Peterson claimed just the Yellowjackets' fourth indoor individual event title.

Women: Anders, Chelimo Lead UAA Back To Top Of Podium

NAMPA, Idaho – Alaska Anchorage climbed back to the top of the podium Saturday, using six individual championships to win the 2016 Great Northwest Athletic Conference Indoor Track and Field Championships at the Jackson Track at the Ford Idaho Center.

The Seawolves finished the meet with 164 points, scoring 28 points more than defending champion Seattle Pacific. Simon Fraser finished third with 82.5 points. It is Alaska Anchorage's third GNAC indoor title, all of which have come in the last four years.

Alaska Anchorage's **Karolin Anders** was named the Women's Outstanding Athlete of the Meet after she won two events and scored 31 points in the meet to became the GNAC's all-time leading indoor meet point scorer with a career total of 112 points. After winning the pentathlon (3,711 points) and the long jump (18-5.75) and placing fourth in the high jump on Friday, Anders added a third place finish in the triple jump with an effort of 38 feet.

Anders' teammate **Rosie Smith** led the pentathlon through the first two meets, but Anders took over with wins in the high jump (5-3.75), shot put (38-4) and the long jump, where she broke her own heptathlon record with her mark of 18 feet, 7.75 inches. Smith earned eight additional team points for the Seawolves with her second place score of 3,468 points, improving her No. 5 mark on the GNAC all-time list. Central Washington's **Ali Anderson** won the final event, the 800 meters, in a GNAC pentathlon record of 2:22.15.

Teammate **Joyce Chelimo**, meanwhile, swept the individual titles in the distance events to earn 30 points for the Seawolves. After winning the 5,000 meters on Friday (17:05.65), Chelimo took the mile in a time of 5:00.28 and the 3,000 meters in 9:15.70.

The race of the day, however, was the 60-meter hurdles where the top-three finishers were separated by four-thousandths of a second. A 10-minute delay to review the finish photo crowned Central Washington's **Mariyah Vongsaveng** the champion with a time of 8.713 seconds. Smith was second in 8.714 seconds and Seattle Pacific's **Mailea Luquin** was third in 8.717 seconds.

Seattle Pacific's **Jahzelle Ambus** won both the 200 meters and 400 meters in impressive fashion. She opened the day by blowing away the GNAC record in the 400 meters in a time of 54.87 seconds, bettering the 55.54 seconds run by Central Washington's **Terran Legard** in 2005. Ambus returned to edge out Alaska Anchorage's Jamie Ashcroft for the title with a time of 24.35 seconds while also anchoring the Falcons' second place 4x400-relay team. Ashcroft captured her third straight championship in the 60 meters, just missing her GNAC record in 7.61 seconds.

McKenzie Warren secured a sweep of both the men's and women's throws for Concordia. After winning the weight throw on Friday, she notched a five-foot meet record in the shot put with her winning mark of 53 feet, 7.5 inches.

Western Washington's **Jasmine McMullin** set a meet record to repeat as triple jump champion with her mark of 40 feet, 1.25 inches. **Addy Townsend** gave Simon Fraser their fourth straight champion in the 800 meters with a time of 2:11.54. Then Clan then used a lightning fast anchor leg by **Chantel Desch** to win the 4x400-meter relay in a time of 3:46.41.

Chelimo and **Caroline Kurgat** spent much of their time drafting off of Saint Martin's **Shannon Porter** in the 5,000 meters before overtaking her in the final two laps. Chelimo, the 2014 champion in the event, cruised to a winning time of 17:05.05. Kurgat was second in 17:06.20 while Porter was a respectable third in 17:15.87.

Other event winners from Friday's competition include Concordia's Tori **Johnson** in the high jump (5-7.25), Seattle Pacific's **Michaella Kahns** in the pole vault (11-6.25) and Simon Fraser's distance medley relay team (11:58.28).

GNAC News & Notes

TOO CLOSE FOR COMFORT: Everyone loves to watch a close race, but the women's 60-meter hurdles final was a little too close. After the women has crossed the line, times of 8.72 seconds popped up on the scoreboard for Central Washington's Mariyah Vongsaveng, Seattle Pacific's Mailea Luquin and Alaska Anchorage's Rosie Smith. It took 10 minutes for the timers to evaluate the finish line photo to determine that Vongsaveng was the winner and the GNAC champion.

How close was it? The three athletes crossed the line within four-thousandths of a second of each other. Vongsaveng won in a time of 8.713 seconds. Smith was second in 8.714 seconds and Luquin was third in 8.717 seconds. Lexi Tubbs of Northwest Nazarene was fourth in 8.75 seconds.

REPEAT CHAMPIONS: The GNAC Indoor Track and Field Championships produced a total of 15 repeat champions. Alaska Anchorage's **Karolin Anders** and **Jamie Ashcroft** were the two three-time champions. Anders won her third straight title the women's pentathlon, along with her second consecutive long jump title, while Ashcroft became a three-time winner in the women's 60 meters.

Men's repeat champions included Western Washington's **Travis Milbrandt** in the 60-meter hurdles, Western Oregon's **Cody Warner** in the 200 meters, Simon Fraser's **Joel Webster** in the 400 meters, **Cameron Proceviat** in the 800 meters and **Vladislav Tsygankov** in the long jump; Montana State Billings' **Robert Peterson** in the mile (won in 2014) and Northwest Nazarene's **Payton Lewis** in the pole vault.

Other women's repeat winners included Seattle Pacific's **Jahzelle Ambus** in the 400 meters, Alaska Anchorage's **Joyce Chelimo** in the 3,000 meters and 5,000 meters (won both events in 2014), Western Washington's **Jasmine McMullin** in the triple jump and the Simon Fraser distance medley relay team.

SMASHING RECORDS: It is one thing to break a conference record. It is another thing to smash it by a large margin. And it is yet another thing to have two athletes from the same school both coast under the record by siginficant margins.

That is what happened with Seattle Pacific's **Jahzelle Ambus** and **Jalen Tims** in the women's 400 meters. Ambus successfully defended her title in record-smashing fashion. Her winning time of 54.87 seconds was over a half second under the record of 55.54 seconds set by Central Washington's Terran Legard in 2005. Tims, meanwhile, was also a half second under the record as she finished second with a time of 55.21 seconds as she dropped over two seconds off of her previous lifetime best.

The performances line the Falcons' duo up for a trip to the NCAA Division II Championships in Pittsburg, Kan. Ambus currently sits No. 7 on the NCAA provisional qualifier list while Tims is ninth.

WICKED FOUR-EVENT PROGRAM: Perhaps the most grueling and most gutsy performance of the GNAC Indoor Track and Field Championships belonged to Montana State Billings' Robert Peterson. The senior competed in four events in the two days, performing well in all.

On Friday, Peterson led most of the way in a strategic men's 3,000-meter final, only being overtaken by Alaska Anchorage's **Dominik Notz** and **Henry Cheseto** in the final three laps as he finished third in 8:33.39. Peterson turned right around and ran the anchor leg on the Yellowjackets' distance medley relay team, surging from fifth place to lead Billings to victory in a time of 10:06.41. It was only the fourth individual event title for the school in conference indoor meet history.

Until the next day, that is. Peterson again ran a gutsy race and held off a challenge by Western Oregon's **David Ribich** to win in 4:10.13, earning his second mile conference title with a meet record. Peterson closed his final indoor championship with by anchoring the Yellowjackets' 4x400 meter relay.

Of the 30 points scored by Montana State Billings in the meet, Peterson was involved with 26 of them.

CHELIMO'S TRIPLE: Alaska Anchorage's **Joyce Chelimo** became just the second athlete in GNAC history, male or female, to sweep the distance events in an indoor track and field championship meet. The senior was barely challenged as she cruised to victories in the mile (5:00.28), the 3,000 meters (9:50.70) and the 5,000 meters (17:05.05). The other person to complete the triple? Her husband, Micah Chelimo, who swept all three events in 2013 (the 3,000 was first contested at the conference meet in 2013).

BROKEN RECORDS: The GNAC Indoor Track and Field Championships yielded GNAC records from Jahzelle Ambus in the women's 400 meters, Simon Fraser's Joel Webster in the men's 400 meters and the Clan's Vladislav Tsygankov in the men's long jump. In addition to those marks, conference meet records were broken by Montana State Billings' Robert Peterson in the men's mile, Alaska Anchorage's Dominik Notz in the men's 5,000 meters, Western Washington's Jasmine McMullin in the women's triple jump and Concordia's McKenzie Warren in the women's shot put. Saint Martin's Mikel Smith and Northwest Nazarene's Cole Hoberg tied three other competitiors for the conference meet record in the men's high jump at 6-9.

LAST CHANCE, BEST CHANCE: Teams will have one more chance to hit a qualifying mark for the NCAA Division II Indoor Track and Field Championships this weekend, with five GNAC teams scheduled to take part in the SPU Final Qualifier at the Dempsey Indoor Center in Seattle. Qualifying marks will be accepted nationally until Sun., Mar. 6. It is expected that fields for the NCAA Division II Indoor Track and Field Championships will be 20-22 qualifiers. To date, three GNAC athletes have automatically qualified for nationals in four events while 31 others are provisionally qualified and currently in the top-20 in 20 different events. In addition, nine GNAC relays currently rank within the top-20.
