Riley Hanson, Concordia University, St. Paul, MB

Stats: 3.29 K/S, .386 hitting percentage, 0.91 B/S Alongside her two teammates, become the 19th, 20th and 21st Golden Bears to earn AVCA All-American accolades...She is the 22nd player in program history to earn AVCA First-Team All-American honors.

Stats: 3.78 K/S, .238 hitting percentage, 0.72 B/S First AVCA All-American for Cal Baptist since joining NCAA Division II...Only freshman selected to this year's All-American class.

Haley Kindall, Wheeling Jesuit University, MB

Stats: 3.45 K/S, .379 hitting percentage, 1.13 B/S Third player in Wheeling Jesuit history to earn AVCA All-American honors (Jenna Pew in 2013 and Keysha Allison 2010).

Iona Lofrano, California State University, L.A., OH

Stats: 4.22 K/S, 4.69 Pts/S, 2.71 D/S, 0.44 B/S 11th player in program history to earn AVCA All-American honors...All but two All-Americans including Lofrano (Marquis Mora, 2012) have come prior to 2008.

Stats: 2.42 K/S, .389 hitting percentage, 0.94 B/S

Alongside teammate Alison Cooke, become fifth and sixth players in program history to win AVCA All-American honors.

Stats: 5.60 D/S

Becomes first player since 2009 to earn AVCA All-American accolades...Fifth different player in program history to earn All-American honors.

Stephanie Sfara, Armstrong State University, OH

Stats: 3.48 K/S, .280 hitting percentage, 3.14 D/S Fifth player in program history to earn AVCA All-American honors...All players have come since 2011.

Haley Thompson, University of Central Missouri, MB

Stats: 2.98 K/S, .318 hitting percentage, 2.83 D/S, 0.43 B/S Alongside teammate Carly Sojka become the 26th and 27th players to earn AVCA All-American honors.

Kasey Williams, Concordia University, St. Paul, S

Stats: 12.44 A/S, .296 team hitting percentage, 2.76 D/S Alongside her two teammates, become the 19th, 20th and 21st Golden Bears to earn AVCA All-American accolades

Alanna Winfield, Colorado School of Mines, RS

Stats: 3.87 K/S, .271 hitting percentage, 0.64 B/S Fifth different player in program history to earn AVCA All-American honors.
