Condensed Conference Campaign Begins Tuesday With Four Matches

PORTLAND, Ore. – A condensed Great Northwest Athletic Conference league campaign gets underway tonight with four matches including an early season showdown between Western Washington and Alaska Anchorage, which were picked to finish 1-2 in the GNAC Coaches pre-season poll.

The Seawolves (6-2) and Vikings (7-2) take to the court tonight at Bellingham. Elsewhere, Alaska (0-8) visits Simon Fraser (6-2), Western Oregon (2-6) plays at Montana State Billings (5-3) and Saint Martin's (2-8) opens at Seattle Pacific (6-2).

The two teams that have the best records in the GNAC going into the conference slate – Central Washington (7-1) and Northwest Nazarene (7-1) – are idle before opening their conference schedules against each other Thursday in Nampa.

The GNAC season is condensed this fall – from 10 weeks to nine – due to the NCAA Falls Sports Festival which will be held in Louisville the first week of December.

Thus, GNAC teams will combine “three weeks into two”, playing contests this week on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday and next week on Monday, Thursday and Saturday.

Western Washington opens its league schedule as the No. 10 ranked team in NCAA Division II. The Vikings slipped one spot after winning three of four matches last weekend in the GNAC/PacWest Challenge at Riverside.

Leading the Vikings is libero Samantha Hutchinson who tops Division II in digs averaging 6.83 per set. She needs 83 this week to become the fourth player in GNAC history to record 2000 career digs.

Central Washington is ranked 11th – up two spots this week – after also winning three of four at Riverside.

Northwest Nazarene and Alaska Anchorage are among “others receiving votes” in this week’s AVCA poll.

The Crusaders posted a perfect 4-0 record at the GNAC/PacWest Challenge in Riverside, a record only matched by Fresno Pacific in the San Rafael portion. NNU is 28th overall in the AVCA poll.

Alaska Anchorage posted a 3-1 record last weekend at Riverside and is 34th overall in the AVCA poll.

GNAC teams take a combined 48-35 record into conference play after posting a 20-12 mark in the two GNAC/PacWest tournaments.

That record is the best-ever for the GNAC in non-conference play, bettering its 47-36 in 2012.

GNAC teams finished their non-conference slates with a 22-13 record against PacWest teams after going 9-19 last year. They ended up 10-8 against the CCAA.

From Redshirt to League Leader

From redshirt to league leader.

That was the story for Alaska Anchorage middle blocker Kayla McGlathery last weekend.

McGlathery (MB, 6-0, So., Coeur d’Alene, ID – Texas A&M-Kingsville) was set to redshirt this season and sat out all four of UAA’s matches Sept. 4-6 in the UAA Spring Hills Suite Invitational.

But, coach Chris Green removed her redshirt last weekend.

Smart move as it turned out as McGlathery had a team-high 26 blocks and finished the week ranked first in the GNAC in blocks per set averaging 1.62.

That earned her GNAC Defensive Player of the Week honors.

Also earning all-tournament honors were Chelsey Walter of Montana State Billings and Kelsey Robinson of Simon Fraser.

Kathleen Anderson, who led Fresno Pacific to a 4-0 record was named the MVP. No all-tournament team was chosen at the Riverside site.

For both Walter and Biondi it was their second all-tournament award in two weeks.

GNAC 48-35 In Non-Conference

GNAC teams posted a 48-35 record in non-conference matches – its best record in conference history.

Three non-conference matches remain to be played as MSU Billings host Rocky Mountain Oct. 28 and Saint Martin’s has a home-and-home series with Evergreen State Sept. 24 (at Lacey) and Oct. 22 (at Olympia).

Conference teams were 10-8 against CCAA opponents and 22-13 against PacWest foes. A year ago, GNAC teams were 9-19 against the PacWest.

Team Notes

Alaska: Sam Harthun had a team-high 50 kills to lead the Nanooks who were winless in four matches at the Colorado State – Pueblo – UC-Colorado Springs Classic. UAF was outthit .323 to .142 in the tournament to fall to 0-8 on the season. Riley Podowicz led the Nanooks with eight blocks. Harthun leads the GNAC in kills per set averaging 4.46.

Alaska Anchorage: Julia Mackey and Katelynn Zanders each had 46 kills to lead the Seawolves to three wins in four matches at

Riverside. Mackey reached that total in 114 swings. Zanders, who also had 32 digs, 11 blocks and three aces, needed 143. Though UAA won 11 of 16 sets, the total number of kills (183 each) were even. The Seawolves, however, had a big edge (55-32) in blocks, including 26 by *GNAC Defensive Player of the Week* Kayla McGlathery, a transfer from Texas A&M – Kingsville.

Central Washington: Kiah Jones came off the bench in all four matches to lead the Wildcats with a .304 hitting percentage and a 3-1 record. Her 51 kills ranked second only to 52 by Linden Firethorne. Meanwhile, Kaitlin Quirk had a team-high 18 blocks and Catie Fry had 151 assists increasing her career total to 1,956. She'll need 44 this week to become the 26th player in GNAC history to register 2,000 career assists.

Montana State Billings: Chelsey Walter had 59 kills and nine blocks in earning all-tournament honors at San Rafael. Her 19 kills against Fresno Pacific was a career-high. She had 14 kills and five blocks as MSUB recorded its first win over Chaminade since 2009. Monica Grimsrud had 38 kills to climb into 18th place on the GNAC career kill list with 1,169,

Northwest Nazarene: The Crusaders outthit their four opponents .270 to .164 in sweeping four matches at Riverside. Andrea Terpstra (50 kills, 20 blocks), Kendra Bodine (41 kills) and Michelle Terpstra (159 assists) led the offense. Taylor Roberts earned her 1000th career dig with her 101st and final dig of the tournament to key the defensive effort. She is the 46th player in GNAC history to record 1000 career digs.

Saint Martin's: Kristyn Ross had a team-high 67 kills as the Saints posted a 1-5 record, including 1-3 in the Colorado State – Pueblo – UC-Colorado Springs Classic. She needs 33 more kills to join the 1000 Career Club, becoming the 33rd member. Ross also had 58 digs and a team-high seven service aces. Jessica Riddle led the Saint defense with 82 digs.

Seattle Pacific: Madi Cavell had 61 kills – 23 more than any other Falcon – as SPU won three of four matches at San Rafael. Brianna Leenders had 83 digs to move from 29th place to 21st (1,259) on the GNAC all-time dig list. Hannah Lautenbach led SPU in the tournament with 15 blocks.

Simon Fraser: Kelsey Robinson had 49 kills and 29 digs to earn all-tournament honors at San Rafael as the Clan split four matches. The Saints also got 30 kills and nine blocks from Amanda Renkema. Mackenzie Dunham had 27 kills and a team-high 10 blocks.

Western Oregon: Cherene O'Hara led the Wolves with 51 kills and ranked second in blocks with 16 as WOU posted a 2-3 record including 1-3 in the GNAC/PacWest Challenge at San Rafael. Samantha Moore, who ranks 13th nationally in blocks (1.18), had 20 rejections. Alisha Bettinson had 13 service aces to take the GNAC lead in that category (0.56).

Western Washington: Samantha Hutchinson leads Division II in digs, averaging 6.83 per set. In four matches last week, she had 115 averaging 7.19. Offensively, the Vikings were led by Kelsey Moore and Rachel Roeder with 56 and 52 kills, respectively. Kayla Erickson had 40 kills and a team-best 14 blocks.

Week of Sept. 1-7: Offense – Linden Firethorne, Central Washington (OH, 5-11, Jr., Clinton, WA – South Whidbey) had 49 kills, seven blocks and hit for a .280 percentage leading the Wildcats to four wins, including three over nationally Top 20 ranked teams in the Hampton Inn Wildcat Volleyball Invitational. Firethorne, who was selected the tournament MVP, had 17 kills, including eight in the final set, in a 3-1 win over eighth-ranked Cal State San Bernardino. She also had 13 kills in a 3-1 defeat of No. 11 UC-San Diego and 12 kills and a .417 hitting percentage in a 3-0 sweep of Cal State Stanislaus. CWU finished off the tournament defeating 16th ranked Sonoma State 3-0. **Defense** – Haley Wells, MSU Billings (L, 5-5, Fr., Albany, OR) had 70 digs leading the Yellowjackets, who posted a 7-20 record last season, to four wins, including a 3-2 come-from-behind victory over Minot State. In that match, Wells had 21 digs as MSUB overcame a 2-0 set deficit. Wells also had a team-high six service aces in the tournament.

Week of Sept. 8-14: Offense - Michelle Terpstra, Northwest Nazarene (S, 5-9, Sr., Ripon, CA – Ripon Christian) and Sara Biondi, Seattle Pacific (S, 5-10, Sr., Sacramento, CA – Christian Brothers) each had triple doubles – the first triple-doubles in the GNAC in two years - in leading their teams to impressive performances at the GNAC/PacWest Challenge at Riverside and San Rafael, Calif., respectively ... Terpstra had 159 assists, 29 kills, 43 digs and eight blocks as NNU won four straight matches. She earned her triple double – the sixth of her career - in a 3-1 win against Point Loma Nazarene producing 10 kills, 14 digs and 34 assists ... Biondi had 143 assists, 28 kills, 38 digs and 12 blocks as the Falcons won three of four matches. She had 12 kills, 41 assists, and 18 digs in a five-set win over the Academy of Art on Thursday. Her kill and dig totals were both career highs, as was her total of 19 attacks in that match, in which she hit .526. It was the first SPU triple-double in seven years. The next afternoon in a four-set win against Chaminade, Biondi had four service aces – another career high. She hit for a .420 percentage in the tournament to raise her season hitting mark to .365, which ranks first in the conference. **Defense** – Kayla McGlathery, Alaska Anchorage (MB, 6-0, So., Coeur d'Alene, ID), who was scheduled to redshirt, made her season debut producing 26 blocks as the Seawolves won three of four matches in the GNAC/PacWest Challenge. Her 1.62 block average leads the GNAC. In addition to her defensive contributions, she also had 27 kills and hit for a .305 percentage helping lead UAA to wins over Azusa Pacific, Cal Baptist and Point Loma before losing in five sets to Dixie State.
