SAINTS SHUTDOWN SEAWOLVES: Holding the eighth-leading offense in the NCAA to just 46 points on Thursday, Saint Martin's grabbed a huge 56-46 win over Alaska Anchorage inside Marcus Pavilion in Lacey. On Saturday, the Saints edged Alaska Fairbanks by the narrowest of margins to collect a 67-66 victory and remain alive and well in the hunt for a GNAC tournament berth. Chelsea Haskey earned her first Red Lion Player of the Week honors of her senior campaign by facilitating SMU's offense and defense on all fronts. Joining her in double figures on Thursday was Angela Gelhar, who contributed a dozen points, two rebounds, two assists and a pair of steals. On Saturday, Krista Stabler and Jordyn Richardson came up big for the Saints off the bench with 14 and 13 points, respectively. Megan Wiedeman's bench effort was instrumental as well, as she fell just shy of a double-double with 10 rebounds and eight points while adding three blocks.

The victories were a big momentum shifter for SMU, which now sits in sole possession of fourth place in the GNAC standings and has won three games in a row. SMU has lost just once at home this season, but will have to carry its hot play on the road this week as the Saints challenge Western

Washington in Bellingham on Thursday and Simon Fraser across the border on Saturday.

COLARD HARDLY COLD FROM DOWNTOWN:

Behind 11 3-pointers from junior Katie Colard, Western Washington got back into the win column with two decisive victories last weekend. On Thursday, Colard unleashed 15 shots from long distance, converting eight as she finished with a game-high 26 points in a 94-81 WWU win over Northwest Nazarene. The point total was the Vikings' highest of 2013-14 so far, as five total players scored in double figures and Sarah Hill collected a game-high 11 rebounds. On Saturday, WWU separated itself from Central Washington in the second half to win 82-61, after leading just 45-41 at the break. Colard contributed 16 more points on 3of-5 from beyond the arc, and Tia Briggs led all scorers with 19 points off the bench. WWU junior Sydney Donaldson posted 16 points and 10 rebounds for her third double-double of the season, and Jenni White had 17 points, four rebounds, four steals, and two assists for WWU in the win.

The Vikings kept pace with Simon Fraser to hold a share of second place in the GNAC standings, as WWU has now won eight of its last 10 games and sits at 9-4 in conference action. The Vikings welcome a hot Saint Martin's team on Thursday before hosting Western Oregon on Saturday inside Sam Carver Gym.

Building on the WOU campus. The victory followed a tough 56-46 loss to Saint Martin's, as the GNAC's best offense fell victim to the league's best defense. No UAA player reached double digits in the scoring column on Thursday, as UAA was stone cold from beyond the arc at just 1-for-16. Kylie Burns hauled in 11 rebounds for the Seawolves and Christina Davis notched five assists in the loss. UAA found its stride on Monday, as Jessica Madison led her team with 15 points and Alli Madison (12) and Kiki Robertson (11) also scored in double figures. Burns once again logged 11 rebounds and Davis also repeated Thursday's performance with five more assists. The Seawolves unleashed from long range, lifting 28 shots from the arc and converting seven.

UAA hosts three games in a row before closing the season on the road. The Seawolves take on rival Alaska Fairbanks in a 2 p.m. Alaska time tip-off on Saturday, before welcoming Simon Fraser and Western Washington to Anchorage the following week.

A two-day delay for the Wolves' matchup with UAA didn't benefit the former, as WOU fell to the Seawolves 73-47 on Monday. Goularte led her team again with 14 points, while notching five rebounds, an assist, two steals and a block as well. No other Wolves player scored in double figures, as WOU shot just 27.8 percent (15-of-54) from the field in the defeat.

Megan Hingston led the way with 20 points and 11 rebounds for NNU, while also dishing out two assists and grabbing four steals. Chelsie Luke was 3-for-5 from beyond the arc and 7-of-11 overall from the floor for 19 points on Thursday. Simon Fraser quieted NNU on Saturday, holding the Crusaders to just 57 points in the loss. Luke proved resilient however with 17 more points and a teamhigh seven rebounds, while Taylor Simmons turned in 14 points and Hingston had 10. The Crusaders, who on the season are the fourth-best free-throw shooting team in the NCAA (79.4), shot just 65.2 percent (15-of-23) from the foul line in Saturday's loss. After starting the season a perfect 8-0 at home, the Crusaders have dropped their last four contests inside the Johnson Sports Center in Nampa.

Week of Jan. 27 – Feb. 2 - Taylor Simmons, NNU (G, 5-8, So., Middleton, ID – Middleton) scored 36 points and grabbed 10 rebounds last week as the Crusaders defeated Alaska Fairbanks 86-81 and lost by just two to Alaska Anchorage on the road. Simmons was instrumental in both victories, dishing out 13 assists and providing a conferencehigh 12 steals on the weekend. The sophomore point guard also shot .476 (10-for-21) from the field and .789 (15-for-19) from the foul line in the victories. Simmons also played a team-high 68 minutes in the two games.

Week of Jan. 20-26: Erin Chambers, SFU (G/F, 6-1, Jr., Mission, BC – Heritage Park) led Simon Fraser to a pair of victories as she scored 64 points while shooting .629 (22-for-35) from the floor and .412 (7-for-17) from 3-point range. Chambers also converted 13-of-14 free throws and grabbed 10 rebounds while playing all 80 minutes for the Clan last week. On Thursday, the junior helped SFU edge Alaska Fairbanks by two points as she scored 30 points and hauled in five rebounds. Chambers was even better in a four-point victory over Alaska Anchorage on Saturday, notching 34 points, five more rebounds and three assists. Chambers maintained her spot atop the GNAC scoring leaders, boosting her average to 22.8 points per game as she has scored a conference-high 387 points so far in 2013-14.

Week of Jan. 13-19: Sarah Hill, WWU (F, 6-3, Sr., Richmond, VA – Maryland-Baltimore County) scored 27 points and grabbed a GNAC-high 30 rebounds to help WWU to a pair of victories that extended the Vikings' winning streak to four games. Hill shot 10-for-22 from the field while averaging 32.0 minutes per contest last week. The senior also contributed three blocks, three steals and an assist. On Thursday, Hill notched a big double-double as she led all scorers and rebounders with 18 points and 16 boards in a 78-58 triumph over Western Oregon. Hill just missed a double-double on Saturday, scoring nine points and turning in a game-high 14 rebounds in WWU's 79-73 win over first-place Saint Martin's in Lacey. The wins propelled WWU into a four-way tie atop the GNAC standings, and Hill now ranks No. 8 in the conference in rebounds per game with 7.5.

Week of Jan. 6-12: Sydney Donaldson, WWU (F, 6-0, Jr., Edmonds, WA – Edmonds-Woodway) averaged a double-double with 18.0 points and 12.0 rebounds in a pair of WWU victories last week that extended the Vikings' home win

streak to 24 straight and pushed them over .500 on the season at 7-6 overall and 3-2 in GNAC play. Donaldson powered WWU in a 71-64 victory over Central Washington on Thursday, leading all scorers with 21 points while grabbing nine rebounds, blocking five shots and dishing out five assists. The junior shot 8-for-10 from the field and 4-for-6 from beyond the 3-point line. On Saturday, Donaldson turned in 15 points while collecting 15 rebounds and posting four blocks and four assists in a 81-68 win over Northwest Nazarene. In all, Donaldson shot .583 from the field (14-for-24) and totaled nine assists and nine blocks against just three turnovers in 68 minutes on the floor last week.

Week of Dec. 30 – Jan. 5: Bobbi Knudsen, MSUB (G, 5-8, Sr., Malta, MT) had 55 points, 12 assists, and four steals and was a perfect 10-for-10 from the free-throw line with five rebounds. She led the team to an 81-63 win over Simon Fraser University and an 82-69 win over Western Washington University. In the game against SFU Knudsen had a team-high 18 points, six assists and two steals. In the win over WWU, Knudsen had a career-high 37 points, making 14-of-21 shots, including 3-of-4 from 3-point territory, for a shooting percentage of 66.6. Her 37 points is the highest by a women's player in the GNAC this season. "Bobbi Knudsen played a special game tonight," head coach Kevin Woodin said. "She had 37 points, and had six assists to only one turnover. It is probably one of the best perimeter games I have ever witnessed."

Week of Dec. 16-22: Bobbi Knudsen, MSUB (G, 5-8, Sr., Malta, MT) scored 32 points while dishing out 17 assists and grabbing 14 rebounds in a pair of South Point Holiday Hoops Classic games last week in Las Vegas. Knudsen led the Yellowjackets to a 78-58 win over Texas Woman's and was instrumental in MSUB's one-point loss to No. 6 Drury. Trailing by two points in the final minute against the Panthers, Knudsen drove into the paint, scored a layup and drew a foul. After converting the free throw to give MSUB a one-point lead with six seconds left, Drury scored a buzzerbeater from 18 feet to shock the Yellowjackets and escape with the victory. "Bobbi played some incredible basketball over the two games," MSUB head coach Kevin Woodin said. "Our team played the two best games we have all season, and Bobbi was a top contributor in both contests."

Week of Dec. 9-15: Krista Stabler, SMU (G, 5-6, So., Silverdale, WA – Central Kitsap) finished with a career-high 18 points on 5-of-9 shooting from the field while she was 8-of-10 from the line against Hawaii Hilo on Saturday. She also had career highs in rebounds with six and assists with four while adding two steals and committing zero turnovers in 27 minutes off the bench.

Week of Dec. 2-8: Dana Goularte, WOU (F, Jr., Port Orchard, WA - South Kitsap) averaged a double-double last week with 22.5 points and 12 rebounds in the Wolves' loss to No. 18 Northwest Nazarene and victory over Central Washington. Goularte averaged 36.0 minutes, shooting .538 from the floor and .800 from the free-throw line. She racked up four assists and six blocks and became the first WOU player since 2005 to grab 17 rebounds in a game when she accomplished the feat against NNU on Thursday. "She had one of the best all around performances I've ever seen," WOU head coach Holli Howard-Carpenter commented on Goularte's performance against NNU. "She defended, made some great passes and was a beast on the boards." The double-figure scoring performances gave her 22 total in her career, and her double-double on Thursday was the eighth of Goularte's career and third this season.

Week of Nov. 25 – Dec. 1: Kiki Robertson, UAA (G, 5-7, Fr., Honolulu, HI – Mid-Pacific) averaged 16.5 points and grabbed a dozen rebounds in a pair of games against Division I competition last week in the Great Alaska Shootout. Robertson averaged 34 minutes on the court, contributing a GNAC-high 12 steals and 11 assists in a victory against UC Riverside and a loss to Georgetown. Robertson shot 39 percent from the field, while turning in a solid 1.6 assist-turnover ratio.

Week of Nov. 18-24: Katie Benson, SPU (F, 6-1, Sr., Snohomish, WA – Snohomish) led the GNAC in scoring (28.5) and rebounding (11.5), and was second in blocks (3.0) and field goal percentage (.667) last week as the Falcons won a pair of games to improve to 6-0 in 2013. Benson also shot 83 percent from the free throw line and turned in seven steals while converting three-of-four attempts from long distance.

Week of Nov. 11-17: Katie Benson, SPU (F, 6-1, Sr., Snohomish, WA - Snohomish) averaged a double-double with 18 points and 12.5 rebounds in a pair of Falcon wins last week as SPU has started the 2013-14 campaign 4-0. Sixteen of Benson's 25 total rebounds were defensive, and she also turned in six steals and four blocks while committing just two turnovers. Overall, the senior shot 14-of-25 from the field and drained 7-of-8 free throws while averaging 25 minutes of action per game. Benson's 17 rebounds on Saturday night against Point Loma Nazarene tied her career high, and she was named tournament Most Valuable Player for the SPUhosted Sodexo Tip-Off Classic.

Week of Nov. 4-10: Jordan Wilson, UAF (F, 5-11 Fr., Henderson, CO – Prairie View) posted a double-double with 27 points and 12 rebounds in her first career collegiate game. Wilson helped the Nanooks to an 87-72 victory over Western New Mexico, marking the first time UAF has won its season opener in four seasons. Wilson also notched an assist while shooting 10-of-11 from the field and sinking seven free throws on 10 attempts.
