## **RED LION PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

Suzanna Ohlsen, Seattle Pacific (G, 5-7, Jr., Monroe, WA – Monroe) pumped in a career-high 25 points – accounting for nearly half of the Falcons' total of 54 – and also grabbed a career-high eight rebounds on Thursday night, leading them to a 54-44 victory at Saint Martin's. Ohlsen hit 10-of-12 from the floor, including 3-of-4 from downtown, handed out three assists, and had four steals – converting all four into coast-tocoast lay-ups, and scored seven points during a decisive 10-0 run that snapped a 28-28 tie and put SPU in front for good at 38-28. She followed that with 12 points, six rebounds, five assists, and one steal on Saturday as the Falcons won at Western Oregon, 76-64. Ohlsen also hit all four of her free throws for the week, extending her streak to 31 in a row and pushing her GNAC-leading average above 90 percent to .904.

FALCONS WRAP UP TOURNAMENT BERTH: Behind the play of Red Lion Player of the Week Suzanna Ohlsen, Seattle Pacific clinched a postseason berth with a pair of victories last week. On Thursday, SPU held Saint Martin's to just 44 points in the 54-44 road triumph. Ohlsen went off for 25 points on 10-of-12 shooting including 3-of-4 from behind the 3-point line. The junior also had eight rebounds, four steals and three assists. Betsy Kingma also scored in double figures for SPU with 12 points on 4-of-5 from 3-point range. On Saturday, the Falcons rode 26 points from Katie Benson to the 76-64 win over Western Oregon, and the senior also hauled in a dozen rebounds en route to her GNAC-high eighth double-double of the season. Ohlsen followed with 12 points, six rebounds, five assists and a steal, and Kingma made four 3-pointers for her second-straight 12-point game. This week, SPU hosts Alaska Anchorage on Thursday and Alaska Fairbanks on Saturday to close the 2013-14 regular season. SPU is guaranteed at least the sixth seed heading into the GNAC tournament, and could finish as high as second place in the GNAC standings depending on this week's results.

ANCHORED IN THE POSTSEASON: With a pair of wins last week, Alaska Anchorage ensured itself a GNAC tournament berth, as the Seawolves defeated visiting Simon Fraser on Thursday and Western Washington on Saturday. UAA's two opponents are tied for second place in the GNAC standings, but with the big victories the Seawolves are now just half of a game out of second place and still have a chance for the regular season title. On Thursday, Jenna Buchanan logged a double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds, and freshman Kiki Robertson led the Seawolves with 14 points, five rebounds, seven assists and three steals. Emily Craft turned in 16 points off the bench, and Jessica Madison (13) and Kylie Burns (12) were UAA's other double-digit scorers. The Seawolves followed with a strong 79-75 win over Western Washington on Saturday evening, as Robertson added 14 more points and Buchanan and Jessica Madison each matched the total.

UAA faces one final road trip this week, taking on Seattle Pacific on Thursday and Montana State Billings on Saturday. If the cards play into the Seawolves' favor, Saturday's bout against the Yellowjackets could have GNAC regular-season title implications.

# SAINTS CLINCH FIRST-EVER PLAYOFF SPOT: With

a 69-59 upset over visiting Montana State Billings on Saturday, Saint Martin's ensured itself a spot in the six-team GNAC tournament for the first time in program history. Megan Wiedeman came through with a 14-point, 15-rebound double-double, while senior Chelsea Haskey scored a teamhigh 17 points in the victory. The Saints held a slim 27-25 halftime lead over MSUB, and finished strong in the second half to snap the Yellowjackets' 11-game winning streak. The victory came two days after a 54-44 loss at the hands of Seattle Pacific, marking the lowest point total for the Saints this season. Wiedeman had 11 rebounds in SMU's first game of the week, but no Saint scored in double figures in the loss to SPU.

SMU embarks on its final road trip of the season this weekend, facing Northwest Nazarene on Thursday and Central Washington on Saturday. The Saints will return to Lacey the following week to host the GNAC tournament for the third consecutive season.

SFU STILL TIED FOR 2ND AFTER SPLIT: After falling to Alaska Anchorage on Thursday, Simon Fraser recovered with a narrow 69-67 win over Alaska Fairbanks on Saturday evening. Erin Chambers was excellent in both games, scoring 22 points in each. On Thursday, Katie Lowen was SFU's other double-figure scorer with 13 points, and Meg Wilson had a big game off the bench with nine points, six rebounds, five assists and four blocks. Lowen had 12 more points on Saturday, and also added five rebounds, three assists, two steals and a block for SFU. Chelsea Reist added 14 points, and Ellen Kett had a team-high five assists off the bench in the win. SFU trailed Alaska Fairbanks 36-32 at the half, but came back with a strong 37-31 performance in the second to secure the win and keep pace with Western Washington.

With one game left on the schedule, SFU currently sits in strong position in the GNAC standings, tied for second with Western Washington. The two schools will face off on Saturday to close their regular seasons, and the game will be broadcast live on ROOT SPORTS at 3 p.m. Pacific time.

**'JACKETS HOLD TOP SPOT AFTER SPLIT:** After defeating Western Oregon 77-67 on Thursday, Montana State Billings' 11-game winning streak came to an end with a 69-59 loss to Saint Martin's on Saturday evening in Lacey. During the streak, MSUB assumed command of first place in the GNAC standings, and last week became the first GNAC

team to appear in the WBCA top-25 (No. 25) since Northwest Nazarene was No. 18 during Week 8.

On Thursday, Bobbi Knudsen logged a team-high 18 points and also had six assists and four rebounds in the win over Western Oregon. Janiel Olson kept pace with her GNACleading rebound average of 10.4 per game as she grabbed 11. Quinn Peoples had a big game off the bench with 16 points, and Alisha Breen contributed 11 points, seven rebounds an assist and a steal in 24 minutes of action. Knudsen topped her point total with 19 more on Saturday, but even 10 rebounds to complete a double-double for the senior weren't enough in the loss to SMU. Knudsen also had five assists and two steals, and Chelsea Banis turned in a strong 11-point 14rebound double-double. Breen earned the start in the Yellowjackets' second game of the week and nearly notched a double-double, as she had 11 points and nine boards in 28 minutes of action.

MSUB closes the season against Alaska Anchorage and Alaska Fairbanks this weekend, and can clinch the regular season title with a victory in either game.

Colard finished with 20 points on Thursday and was one of six double-digit scorers for WWU in the decisive 91-65 win over the Nanooks. Sarah Hill logged her fourth double-double of the season as the senior had 18 points and 14 rebounds, and Taylor Peacocke nearly completed the feat with 13 points and eight boards. Sydney Donaldson (12), Tia Briggs (11), and Jenni White (10) were WWU's other double-figure scorers on Thursday.

WWU battled Alaska Anchorage until the end on Saturday, but came up four points short in the 79-75 setback. The Vikings matched the Seawolves point-for-point in the second half at 42-42, but a 37-33 halftime deficit proved to be the difference. Colard totaled 23 points and Hill had another double-double with 12 points and 16 rebounds in the defeat. White totaled a dozen points, five assists, two steals and a pair of blocks, and Peacocke had her second-straight doubledigit game with 11 points.

WWU wraps up its regular season on Saturday against Simon Fraser on the ROOT SPORTS Game of the Week in Bellingham at 3 p.m. Pacific time. The Vikings could end up as high as second place in the GNAC standings depending on this weekend's outcomes.

# 2013-14 RED LION PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Week of Feb. 10-16: Megan Hingston, Northwest Nazarene (G, 5-9, Sr., Keizer, OR – McNary) scored 20 points in the Crusaders' first-ever win at Seattle Pacific on Saturday, and also logged four rebounds and an assist in the critical victory to help keep NNU's hopes for a GNAC tournament berth alive. The instrumental performance came two nights after a 14-point 7-rebound effort against conference-leading MSUB. Hingston currently leads the Crusaders in scoring average (16.0) and rebounding (7.7), and ranks fifth in the GNAC in both categories.

Week of Feb. 3-9: Chelsea Haskey, SMU (F, 6-1, Sr., Olympia, WA – Black Hills) scored 28 points and also had 12 rebounds, four steals and a pair of blocks leading the Saints to home wins over Alaska Anchorage and Alaska Fairbanks. She had 13 points, five rebounds, two assists, two blocks and three steals in Thursday's 56-46 win over UAA. On Saturday, she netted 15 points and also had seven rebounds to key a 67-66 win over UAF.

Week of Jan. 27 – Feb. 2 - Taylor Simmons, NNU (G, 5-8, So., Middleton, ID – Middleton) scored 36 points and grabbed 10 rebounds last week as the Crusaders defeated Alaska Fairbanks 86-81 and lost by just two to Alaska Anchorage on the road. Simmons was instrumental in both victories, dishing out 13 assists and providing a conference-high 12 steals on the weekend. The sophomore point guard also shot .476 (10-for-21) from the field and .789 (15-for-19) from the foul line in the victories. Simmons also played a team-high 68 minutes in the two games.

Week of Jan. 20-26: Erin Chambers, SFU (G/F, 6-1, Jr., Mission, BC – Heritage Park) led Simon Fraser to a pair of victories as she scored 64 points while shooting .629 (22-for-35) from the floor and .412 (7-for-17) from 3-point range. Chambers also converted 13-of-14 free throws and grabbed 10 rebounds while playing all 80 minutes for the Clan last week. On Thursday, the junior helped SFU edge Alaska Fairbanks by two points as she scored 30 points and hauled in five rebounds. Chambers was even better in a four-point victory over Alaska Anchorage on Saturday, notching 34 points, five more rebounds and three assists. Chambers maintained her spot atop the GNAC scoring leaders, boosting her average to 22.8 points per game as she has scored a conference-high 387 points so far in 2013-14.

Week of Jan. 13-19: Sarah Hill, WWU (F, 6-3, Sr., Richmond, VA – Maryland-Baltimore County) scored 27 points and grabbed a GNAC-high 30 rebounds to help WWU to a pair of victories that extended the Vikings' winning streak to four games. Hill shot 10-for-22 from the field while averaging 32.0 minutes per contest last week. The senior also contributed three blocks, three steals and an assist. On Thursday, Hill notched a big double-double as she led all scorers and rebounders with 18 points and 16 boards in a 78-58 triumph over Western Oregon. Hill just missed a doubledouble on Saturday, scoring nine points and turning in a game-high 14 rebounds in WWU's 79-73 win over first-place Saint Martin's in Lacey. The wins propelled WWU into a four-way tie atop the GNAC standings, and Hill now ranks No. 8 in the conference in rebounds per game with 7.5.

Week of Jan. 6-12: Sydney Donaldson, WWU (F, 6-0, Jr., Edmonds, WA - Edmonds-Woodway) averaged a doubledouble with 18.0 points and 12.0 rebounds in a pair of WWU victories last week that extended the Vikings' home win streak to 24 straight and pushed them over .500 on the season at 7-6 overall and 3-2 in GNAC play. Donaldson powered WWU in a 71-64 victory over Central Washington on Thursday, leading all scorers with 21 points while grabbing nine rebounds, blocking five shots and dishing out five assists. The junior shot 8-for-10 from the field and 4-for-6 from beyond the 3-point line. On Saturday, Donaldson turned in 15 points while collecting 15 rebounds and posting four blocks and four assists in a 81-68 win over Northwest Nazarene. In all, Donaldson shot .583 from the field (14-for-24) and totaled nine assists and nine blocks against just three turnovers in 68 minutes on the floor last week.

Week of Dec. 30 – Jan. 5: Bobbi Knudsen, MSUB (G, 5-8, Sr., Malta, MT) had 55 points, 12 assists, and four steals and was a perfect 10-for-10 from the free-throw line with five rebounds. She led the team to an 81-63 win over Simon Fraser University and an 82-69 win over Western Washington University. In the game against SFU Knudsen had a team-high 18 points, six assists and two steals. In the win over WWU, Knudsen had a career-high 37 points, making 14-of-21 shots, including 3-of-4 from 3-point territory, for a shooting percentage of 66.6. Her 37 points is the highest by a women's player in the GNAC this season. "Bobbi Knudsen played a special game tonight," head coach Kevin Woodin said. "She had 37 points, and had six assists to only one turnover. It is probably one of the best perimeter games I have ever witnessed."

Week of Dec. 16-22: Bobbi Knudsen, MSUB (G, 5-8, Sr., Malta, MT) scored 32 points while dishing out 17 assists and grabbing 14 rebounds in a pair of South Point Holiday Hoops Classic games last week in Las Vegas. Knudsen led the Yellowjackets to a 78-58 win over Texas Woman's and was instrumental in MSUB's one-point loss to No. 6 Drury. Trailing by two points in the final minute against the Panthers, Knudsen drove into the paint, scored a layup and drew a foul. After converting the free throw to give MSUB a one-point lead with six seconds left, Drury scored a buzzerbeater from 18 feet to shock the Yellowjackets and escape with the victory. "Bobbi played some incredible basketball over the two games," MSUB head coach Kevin Woodin said. "Our team played the two best games we have all season, and Bobbi was a top contributor in both contests."

Week of Dec. 9-15: Krista Stabler, SMU (G, 5-6, So., Silverdale, WA – Central Kitsap) finished with a career-high 18 points on 5-of-9 shooting from the field while she was 8of-10 from the line against Hawaii Hilo on Saturday. She also had career highs in rebounds with six and assists with four while adding two steals and committing zero turnovers in 27 minutes off the bench.

Week of Dec. 2-8: Dana Goularte, WOU (F, Jr., Port Orchard, WA – South Kitsap) averaged a double-double last week with 22.5 points and 12 rebounds in the Wolves' loss to No. 18 Northwest Nazarene and victory over Central Washington. Goularte averaged 36.0 minutes, shooting .538 from the floor and .800 from the free-throw line. She racked up four assists and six blocks and became the first WOU player since 2005 to grab 17 rebounds in a game when she accomplished the feat against NNU on Thursday. "She had one of the best all around performances I've ever seen," WOU head coach Holli Howard-Carpenter commented on Goularte's performance against NNU. "She defended, made some great passes and was a beast on the boards." The double-figure scoring performances gave her 22 total in her career, and her double-double on Thursday was the eighth of Goularte's career and third this season.

Week of Nov. 25 – Dec. 1: Kiki Robertson, UAA (G, 5-7, Fr., Honolulu, HI – Mid-Pacific) averaged 16.5 points and grabbed a dozen rebounds in a pair of games against Division I competition last week in the Great Alaska Shootout. Robertson averaged 34 minutes on the court, contributing a GNAC-high 12 steals and 11 assists in a victory against UC Riverside and a loss to Georgetown. Robertson shot 39 percent from the field, while turning in a solid 1.6 assist-turnover ratio.

Week of Nov. 18-24: Katie Benson, SPU (F, 6-1, Sr., Snohomish, WA – Snohomish) led the GNAC in scoring (28.5) and rebounding (11.5), and was second in blocks (3.0) and field goal percentage (.667) last week as the Falcons won a pair of games to improve to 6-0 in 2013. Benson also shot 83 percent from the free throw line and turned in seven steals while converting three-of-four attempts from long distance.

Week of Nov. 11-17: Katie Benson, SPU (F, 6-1, Sr., Snohomish, WA - Snohomish) averaged a double-double with 18 points and 12.5 rebounds in a pair of Falcon wins last week as SPU has started the 2013-14 campaign 4-0. Sixteen of Benson's 25 total rebounds were defensive, and she also turned in six steals and four blocks while committing just two turnovers. Overall, the senior shot 14-of-25 from the field and drained 7-of-8 free throws while averaging 25 minutes of action per game. Benson's 17 rebounds on Saturday night against Point Loma Nazarene tied her career high, and she was named tournament Most Valuable Player for the SPUhosted Sodexo Tip-Off Classic.

Week of Nov. 4-10: Jordan Wilson, UAF (F, 5-11 Fr., Henderson, CO – Prairie View) posted a double-double with 27 points and 12 rebounds in her first career collegiate game. Wilson helped the Nanooks to an 87-72 victory over Western New Mexico, marking the first time UAF has won its season opener in four seasons. Wilson also notched an assist while shooting 10-of-11 from the field and sinking seven free throws on 10 attempts.
