#### RED LION PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Week of Nov. 18-24: Katie Benson, SPU (F, 6-1, Sr., Snohomish, WA – Snohomish) led the GNAC in scoring (28.5) and rebounding (11.5), and was second in blocks (3.0) and field goal percentage (.667) last week as the Falcons won a pair of games to improve to 6-0 in 2013. Benson also shot 83 percent from the free throw line and turned in seven steals while converting three-of-four attempts from long distance.

SPU followed the dramatic 66-63 triumph with a solid 83-74 win over Azusa Pacific the next day, preserving its perfect record at 6-0. Katie Benson earned GNAC Player of the Week honors for the second straight week, as she took over the second game with 31 points and 14 rebounds. Benson leads the GNAC with three double-doubles already this season.

Overall, the senior shot 14-of-25 from the field and drained 7-of-8 free throws while averaging 25 minutes of action per game. Benson's 17 rebounds on Saturday night against Point Loma Nazarene tied her career high, and she was named tournament Most Valuable Player for the SPUhosted Sodexo Tip-Off Classic.
