Week of Nov. 25 – Dec. 1: Kiki Robertson, UAA (G, 5-7, Fr., Honolulu, HI – Mid-Pacific) averaged 16.5 points and grabbed a dozen rebounds in a pair of games against Division I competition last week in the Great Alaska Shootout. Robertson averaged 34 minutes on the court, contributing a GNAC-high 12 steals and 11 assists in a victory against UC Riverside and a loss to Georgetown. Robertson shot 39 percent from the field, while turning in a solid 1.6 assist-turnover ratio.

HINGSTON'S 30 WIN NNU A TOURNEY: It took a spectacular performance from NNU's best player to keep the team undefeated and earn it a victory over Cal Baptist in the Finals of the Northwest Nazarene Invitational. Megan Hingston unleashed for 30 points on 15-of-16 from the floor and 10-of-10 from the free-throw line to help the Crusaders to a 94-88 win that pushed the team's record to 6-0 this season. Hingston turned in 18 points in NNU's win over Colorado Christian the day before, and teammate Chelsie Luke and Taylor Simmons were close behind with 16 and 15 points respectively in the victory.

NNU hits the road to begin its GNAC schedule, facing Western Oregon and Saint Martin's this week. The Crusaders, picked to finish tied for fourth in the 2013-14 GNAC preseason coaches' poll, sneaked into the WBCA top-25 last week.

Leading the way for WOU were Chantel Divilbiss and Dana Goularte, who helped the Wolves to a 71-46 win over Willamette on Friday and a 64-46 triumph over Cal Maritime on Saturday. On the weekend, Goularte averaged 15 points and seven rebounds while shooting 67 percent from the field. Divilbiss notched five buckets from long range as she shot an even .500 from the field and averaged 13.5 over the two-game stretch. Friday's victory marked the first in the collegiate coaching career of Wolves head coach Holli Howard-Carpenter.
