RED LION PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Week of Dec. 2-8: Dana Goularte, WOU (F, Jr., Port Orchard, WA - South Kitsap) averaged a double-double last week with 22.5 points and 12 rebounds in the Wolves' loss to No. 18 Northwest Nazarene and victory over Central Washington. Goularte averaged 36.0 minutes, shooting .538 from the floor and .800 from the free-throw line. She racked up four assists and six blocks and became the first WOU player since 2005 to grab 17 rebounds in a game when she accomplished the feat against NNU on Thursday. "She had one of the best all around performances I've ever seen,' WOU head coach Holli Howard-Carpenter commented on Goularte's performance against NNU. "She defended, made some great passes and was a beast on the boards." The double-figure scoring performances gave her 22 total in her career, and her double-double on Thursday was the eighth of Goularte's career and third this season.

HALOS UP, SAINTS START 2-0: For the first time since the 2004-05 season Saint Martin's began GNAC play 2-0, including a 61-56 victory over No. 18 Northwest Nazarene last week. The Saints held NNU, the second-leading scoring team in the conference, to its lowest point total of the season as SMU is now the top team in the conference in points allowed at just 58.0 per game. SMU's Angela Gelhar contributed a career-high 27 points in the victory over NNU, knocking down 6-of-15 shots from the floor and shooting a perfect 12-for-12 from the free-throw line. SMU took care of Central Washington on Thursday 64-49, as the Saints are 4-0 this season at home.

SMU heads to Hawaii this weekend for a pair of nonconference games against Hawaii-Hilo. The Saints return home to host South Dakota Mines on Dec. 20, and will resume GNAC play on Jan. 4 with a home game against Western Oregon.

SEAWOLVES TAKE CHARGE: Facing the preseason favorite to win the GNAC did not bother Alaska Anchorage as the Seawolves downed Montana State Billings 90-59 in Anchorage on Thursday. UAA followed up the impressive showing by beating No. 6-ranked Seattle Pacific, which was picked second in the GNAC preseason coaches' poll, 77-65 to establish positioning atop the early-season standings. Alli Madison led UAA with 17.0 points including 16-of-18 from the free-throw line over the two-game stretch, while Emily Craft turned in 26 points, 19 rebounds four blocks and three steals in the victories. With a 7-1 start, UAA appears it will prove its GNAC preseason coaches' poll ranking of sixth to be a major underestimation.

UAA will host the AT&T Hoops Classic on Dec. 20-21 as it welcomes Brevard, Saint Leo and Cameron into the Wells Fargo Sports Complex in Anchorage. The Seawolves pick up GNAC play in January on the road, visiting Northwest Nazarene on Jan. 2 and Central Washington two days later.

GOULARTE SHINES FOR WOU: Dana Goularte earned Red Lion Player of the Week honors after a pair of standout games against Northwest Nazarene and Central Washington. The junior averaged 22.5 points and 12.0 rebounds last week, helping the Wolves to a split in their first two GNAC games. Goularte's three double-doubles are tied for second-most in the GNAC this season, and she currently ranks sixth in the conference in points with 17.4. WOU also received a strong performance from Chantel Divilbiss, who turned in 15.5 points and 5.5 rebounds while sinking 7-of-18 shots from beyond the arc. As a team WOU went 19-for-49 from 3-point range, a mark of .388.
