RED LION PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Week of Dec. 9-15: Krista Stabler, SMU (G, 5-6, So., Silverdale, WA – Central Kitsap) finished with a career-high 18 points on 5-of-9 shooting from the field while she was 8-of-10 from the line against Hawaii Hilo on Saturday. She also had career highs in rebounds with six and assists with four while adding two steals and committing zero turnovers in 27 minutes off the bench.

SAINTS ROLL TO FOUR STRAIGHT WINS: After defeating Hawaii-Hilo on Friday 59-45, SMU's bench came alive on Saturday to score 60 of the team's 80 points in a big win over UHH. Four players scored in double figures off of the SMU bench on Saturday while no starter had more than nine points. Joining leading scorer Krista Stabler (18) were reserves Megan Wiedeman (15), Angela Gelhar (13) and Liz Mills (12). Chelsea Haskey led the charge on Friday evening with 18 points, while Brooke Paulson turned in 15 off the bench in the Saints' first game of the week. Overall, SMU has won four straight games after opening its GNAC schedule 2-0 for the first time since the 2004-05 season.

SMU is set for one more home game on Friday before enjoying a break until GNAC play resumes in the first week of January.

WILDCATS RECOVER WITH TWO WINS: Central Washington responded to an 0-2 start to its conference schedule with a pair of victories over Evergreen State and Hawaii-Pacific. Courtney Johnson and Jessica VanDyke each scored in double-digits on Saturday to propel the Wildcats to a 20-point victory. A trio of players scored in double figures on Monday as CWU welcomed Hawaii-Pacific to Ellensburg. Jasmine Parker led the way with an 18-point 12-rebound double-double, while VanDyke contributed 19 and Erika Locker came off of the bench with 10 points. Ally Schmitt notched a game-high 11 assists as CWU moved above .500 on the season at 5-4 overall.

CWU hosts a rematch against Hawaii-Pacific on Tuesday evening, before enjoying a two-week break until GNAC play resumes in early January.

Despite Annie DePuydt's 12 points being MSUB's high, 62 points were all the 'Jackets needed as they held Carroll to just 47 on the evening in Billings. Bobbi Knudsen dished out six assists, grabbed six rebounds and five steals, and scored nine points. Her streak of 32 straight free throws remained intact as she did not attempt a shot from the foul line on Friday. The Yellowjackets also played an exhibition game against the MSUB Alumni team, with the current players emerging on top with an 81-53 win.

MSUB heads to Las Vegas this week for a pair of games on Thursday and Friday before the holiday break. The Yellowjackets will battle Texas Woman's and Drury in the Las Vegas South Point Holiday Hoops Classic.

PREVIOUS RED LION PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Week of Dec. 2-8: Dana Goularte, WOU (F, Jr., Port Orchard, WA – South Kitsap) averaged a double-double last week with 22.5 points and 12 rebounds in the Wolves' loss to No. 18 Northwest Nazarene and victory over Central Washington. Goularte averaged 36.0 minutes, shooting .538 from the floor and .800 from the free-throw line. She racked up four assists and six blocks and became the first WOU player since 2005 to grab 17 rebounds in a game when she accomplished the feat against NNU on Thursday. "She had one of the best all around performances I've ever seen," WOU head coach Holli Howard-Carpenter commented on Goularte's performance against NNU. "She defended, made some great passes and was a beast on the boards." The double-figure scoring performances gave her 22 total in her career, and her double-double on Thursday was the eighth of Goularte's career and third this season. **Honorable Mention** – Jessica VanDyke, CWU; Emily Craft, UAA; Marcell Pounds, WWU; Angela Gelhar, SMU; Megan Hingston, NNU; Janiel Olson, MSUB. **Week of Nov. 25 – Dec. 1:** Kiki Robertson, UAA (G, 5-7, Fr., Honolulu, HI – Mid-Pacific) averaged 16.5 points and grabbed a dozen rebounds in a pair of games against Division I competition last week in the Great Alaska Shootout. Robertson averaged 34 minutes on the court, contributing a GNAC-high 12 steals and 11 assists in a victory against UC Riverside and a loss to Georgetown. Robertson shot 39 percent from the field, while turning in a solid 1.6 assist-turnover ratio. **Honorable Mention** – Annie DePuydt, MSUB; Chantel Divilbiss, WOU; Tia Briggs, WWU; Jessica VanDyke, CWU; Megan Hingston, NNU. **Week of Nov. 18-24:** Katie Benson, SPU (F, 6-1, Sr., Snohomish, WA – Snohomish) led the GNAC in scoring (28.5) and rebounding (11.5), and was second in blocks (3.0) and field goal percentage (.667) last week as the Falcons won a pair of games to improve to 6-0 in 2013. Benson also shot 83 percent from the free throw line and turned in seven steals while converting three-of-four attempts from long distance. **Honorable Mention** – Chelsea Haskey, SMU; Megan Hingston, NNU. **Week of Nov. 11-17:** Katie Benson, SPU (F, 6-1, Sr., Snohomish, WA - Snohomish) averaged a double-double with 18 points and 12.5 rebounds in a pair of Falcon wins last week as SPU has started the 2013-14 campaign 4-0. Sixteen of Benson's 25 total rebounds were defensive, and she also turned in six steals and four blocks while committing just two turnovers. Overall, the senior shot 14-of-25 from the field and drained 7-of-8 free throws while averaging 25 minutes of action per game. Benson's 17 rebounds on Saturday night against Point Loma Nazarene tied her career high, and she was named tournament Most Valuable Player for the SPU-hosted Sodexo Tip-Off Classic. **Honorable Mention** – Jordan Wilson, UAF; Dana Goularte, WOU; Jessica VanDyke, CWU; Megan Hingston, NNU. **Week of Nov. 4-10:** Jordan Wilson, UAF (F, 5-11 Fr., Henderson, CO – Prairie View) posted a double-double with 27 points and 12 rebounds in her first career collegiate game. Wilson helped the Nanooks to an 87-72 victory over Western New Mexico, marking the first time UAF has won its season opener in four seasons.
