RED LION PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Offense – Catherine Miles, Western Washington (F, 5-7, So., Anacortes, WA – Anacortes) notched the second hat trick in the GNAC this season and pushed her conference-leading goal total to 12 on Saturday against Northwest Nazarene. The sophomore needed just 23 minutes to complete the hat trick, scoring all three goals in the second half of a 6-0 victory over NNU that kept the Vikings in first place in the GNAC standings.

Defense – Morgan Wood, Central Washington (M, 5-5, Sr., Maple Valley, WA – Tacoma CC) played 200 minutes on CWU's back line last week, helping the Wildcats earn four points with a win and a draw. On Thursday, the senior helped shut out Western Oregon, and on Saturday she played 90 minutes and limited Saint Martin's to just three shots on goal in CWU's 2-1 victory. Both wins came on the road and helped CWU maintain a grip on second place in the GNAC standings.

Honorable Mention - Kelli Bannerman, SMU (F, 5-5, Fr., Ferndale, WA - Ferndale) scored twice against SPU on Thursday and added a third goal against CWU on Saturday as she was the only Saint to score in SMU's losses last week. Bannerman now leads the team with 10 goals this season, and is the secondleading scorer in the GNAC behind WWU's Miles as a freshman...Reilly Retz, CWU (M, 5-7, So., Kent, WA – Kentwood) notched the game-winning goal against SMU on Saturday, helping the Wildcats to a 2-1 victory and helping her team maintain a grip on 2nd place in the standings...Laura Moore, SPU (F, 5-3, So., Kent, WA - Kentwood) scored with less than a minute remaining in the first half against WOU on Saturday, and her goal would prove to be the gamewinner and helped SPU collect a full six points last week...Amanda Rose Johnson, WOU (GK, 5-8, Jr., Montrose, CA - New Mexico Highlands) held Central Washington scoreless through 110 minutes on Thursday for her GNAC-leading 9th shutout of 2013...Brianna Jones, WWU (D, 5-8, Jr., Bonney Lake, WA - Bonney Lake) anchored a Viking defense that recorded a pair of shutouts and picked up six points with two wins to remain in first place.

PLAYOFF BOUND: The field for the 2013 GNAC women's soccer championship tournament became solidified on Thursday, as Western Washington, Central Washington, Seattle Pacific and Western Oregon each clinched berths in the tournament. With the teams determined, the battle for seeding will ensue with SPU just one point behind CWU for second place with two conference games remaining.

VIKINGS RECOVER: A week after its first loss of the 2013 season, WWU collected a pair of shutout victories last week over MSU Billings (1-0) and Northwest Nazarene (6-0). It only took three Vikings to do all of the scoring last week, as Red Lion Offensive Player of the Week Catherine Miles scored a hat trick against NNU on Saturday, and Jessica Bertucci and Delanee Nilles each had a pair of goals on the weekend. Nilles' goal against MSU Billings in the 43rd minute on Thursday proved to be the deciding factor in an otherwise tight matchup.

FALCONS HEATING UP: Since losing to Western Washington on Oct. 12, SPU has won four consecutive contests and is peaking at the right time. SPU found itself in a 2-0 hole on Thursday against SMU, but the Falcons persisted with three second-half goals to simultaneously record the win and dash the Saints' final hope to remain in the playoff hunt. On Saturday, Laura Moore became the first opposing player to score in Monmouth this season as her goal just before halftime was enough for the Falcons to hand WOU its first home loss of 2013.

SAINTS BEATEN FROM BEHIND TWICE:

Freshman phenom Kelli Bannerman continued her goal-scoring spree with three more tallies last week for the Saints. Unfortunately, her two goals against SPU and one against Central Washington were not enough as no other Saint scored in the pair of defeats. Bannerman got her team ahead within the first 17 minutes of each match, but watched as SMU relinquished the lead in both games.

CLAN EARNS COMEBACK WIN: Kate Pearsall drilled home the golden goal for SFU in the 100th minute on Thursday as the Clan battled back to collect a 2-1 victory over visiting NNU. It was the first win of 2013 for SFU, and goalkeeper Simone Tessler recorded six crucial saves to give her team a chance for the victory. ALEXA'S ASSISTS: SPU junior defender Alexa Diaz assisted on three of the Falcons' four goals last week, including both game-winners in the Falcons' pair of victories. Diaz now leads the GNAC in assists with seven, and is averaging .58 per contest.

MILES AHEAD: With the second GNAC hat trick of 2013, WWU's Catherine Miles separated herself atop the conference in terms of total points. The sophomore forward has 27 points and is averaging nearly a goal per contest, with her figure of .80 leading the GNAC. Miles is also tied for the conference lead in game-winning goals with four, a figure matched only by SPU's Moore.

GOAL MACHINES: While Miles has a steady grip on the lead in total points, SMU's Bannerman is the lead challenger in the goals category with 10. The Saint freshman temporarily took over the GNAC lead, as her goal on Saturday came before Miles netted her three scores.

ROCK SOLID: Western Oregon's Amanda Rose Johnson leads the GNAC in goals-against average, shutouts, and save percentage, but WWU's Alyssa Beauchamp is right on her heels in all three categories. Johnson allows .35 goals per contest while Beauchamp sits at .37; Johnson's save percentage is .896 with Beauchamp's at .872, and Johnson has nine shutouts while Beauchamp has seven.

BRINA'S BACK: After missing two weeks with an injury, 2012 GNAC Defender of the Year Brina Sych returned to WWU's lineup last week. Sych has been an instrumental figure on the Vikings' back line over the last three seasons, and did not play in WWU's lone defeat this season at the hands of WOU.
