# Western Washington Edges SPU to Top GNAC Pre-Season Poll

PORTLAND, Ore. - The GNAC coaches voted the Western Washington Vikings to finish first in the 2014 GNAC preseason coaches poll.

The No. 3 nationally ranked Vikings, coming off their best season in school history with a 20-2-1 record, look to improve upon last year's overtime loss in the NCAA semifinals.

Western Washington, which tallied 62 points and six first place votes, returns 13 letter winners from 2013, directed by GNAC Coach of the Year Travis Connell.

The reigning GNAC regular season champions have team points and goals leader Catherine Miles coming back as well as GNAC Defensive Player of the Year and Daktronics first team All-American Brianna Jones.

Seattle Pacific comes in right behind Western Washington in the coaches poll, having totaled 56 points and receiving two first place votes.

After its own trip to the NCAA tournament last year, head coach Chuck Sekyra and the Falcons look to repeat as GNAC tournament champions.

The Falcons knocked off the regular season champs, WWU, in a penalty kick shootout 2-1 in the GNAC conference tournament last year.

This is the seventh year in a row that SPU and Western Washington has topped the pre-season poll.

The only other team to reach double digit wins in 2013 was Central Washington, coming in third in this year's poll.

First team GNAC midfielder Danielle Brandi returns to improve upon her nine goal performance from 2013.

Newcomer of the Year and first team GNAC goalkeeper Amanda Rose Johnson leads Western Oregon to the fourth spot with 40 points.

The Wolves finished 11<sup>th</sup> in the nation in goals against average and ninth in save percentage last year.

Tying fifth in the poll are Montana State Billings and Saint Martins, each with 29 points.

Montana State Billings finished the 2013 GNAC season in fifth place with 5-8-1 conference record.

MSUB returns the most starters of any team in the conference with 10 led by senior midfielder and second team GNAC member Chelsea Shuman.

Saint Martin's is looking to break through the top four of the conference as it returns 18 letter winners to the team. The Saints will look to flip the results of last year as the team lost six games by one goal.

Second year coach Mary Trigg will look to improve a Northwest Nazarene team that finished seventh in conference play last year.

The Crusaders return their top two scorers in second team GNAC forward Kelsey Martin and junior forward Lexi Fresenbek.

Placing eighth in the coaches poll is Simon Fraser where there is a new face in the head coaching position for the first time in 25 years as Annie Hamel takes over for longtime coach Shelley Howieson.

# Outlook

Western Washington is coming off its best season in program history. After going 13-1-0 in GNAC play and winning the regular season conference championship, the Vikings won the west regional in the NCAA Tournament before suffering a heartbreaking loss in the national semifinal.

The Vikings finished in the top 25 nationally in assists, scoring offense, goals against average, save percentage, shutout percentage and won-lost-tied percentage.

A big part of that team was GNAC Player of the Year and first team All-American Kristin Maris, who leaves Western Washington eighth on its career scoring list.

With 13 letter winners and six starters returning however, 2014 looks to be just as promising as last year.

First team GNAC Defensive Player of the Year and Daktronics first team All-American Brianna Jones (D, 5-8, Sr., Bonney Lake, WA) is back to try and lead the Vikings to their first national title appearance.

Also returning is leading goal scorer Catherine Miles (F, 5-7, Jr., Anacortes, WA). Miles finished 2013 with a conference high 15 goals and 33 points.

Coach of the Year Travis Connell will be looking to team Miles up with Elise Aylward (F, 5-9, So., Renton, WA) and incoming transfer Anna DeWeirdt (F, 5-7, So., Samammish, WA) for a powerful attack in 2014. Aylward had two goals and seven assists last year while DeWeirdt started 13 games at Division I New Hampshire.

Seniors Kim Cooper (M, 5-1, Sr., Bellingham, WA), who earned second team west-region honors, and Katherine Miccile (D, 5-5, Sr., Kent, WA) bring experience and depth after playing in all 23 games last season.

Stephanie Hamilton (F, 5-2, Jr., Orting, WA) and Jessica Bertucci (F, 5-8, Jr., Bellingham, WA) combined for six goals and eight assists in a collective 39 games.

This will be the first time in 15 years the Vikings will play home games on its campus. Western Washington has gone 91-25-13 since 2001 and 26-2-3 the last three seasons playing at "home."

## Outlook

With a 15-6-1 record in 2013, the 25<sup>th</sup> ranked Seattle Pacific Falcons enter this season with the hopes of winning another conference championship.

The Falcons upended the 10<sup>th</sup> ranked and regular season champion Western Washington Vikings 2-1 on penalty kicks for their first conference tournament title. The team advanced to the NCAA west region semifinals before being eliminated by the Vikings.

Seattle Pacific placed one player on the GNAC first team, three on the second team and four players were honorable mentions. Seven of these eight players return to the Falcons in 2014.

First team GNAC forward Laura Moore (F, 5-3, Jr., Kent, WA) returns after leading the Falcons in goals (eight) and points (20) while gaining the second most assists (four).

Four other players return that played in all 22 matches last season.

Juniors Shayla Page (D, 5-6, Jr., Redmond, WA) and Taylor Hauck (D, 5-4, Jr., Shoreline, WA) are back on the defensive side of the ball. The two played more minutes than anyone else on the team last season.

Second team GNAC player Alexa Diaz (D, 5-4, Sr., Burien, WA) will join Page and Hauck on a defense that allowed 16 goals in 2013. Diaz was also second in the conference with 8 assists.

Despite only playing in 14 games, Hannah Huesers (F, 5-10, So., Lake Stevens, WA) was second on the team in goals (six) and points (15).

Isabel Farrell (M, 5-6, Jr., Redmond, WA), transferring from the nearby University of Washington, will press for significant playing time after starting 18 games last season for the Huskies. Farrell was second on the team in assists (four) and points (six).

## Outlook

The end of the regular season was fantastic for Central Washington which won six of its last eight conference games. In that span the Wildcats scored 11 goals while only giving up four and completing five shutouts.

Central Washington saw its season end by Seattle Pacific in the GNAC conference tournament. The Falcons scored in the 89<sup>th</sup> minute to dash the Wildcats chances for an NCAA tournament appearance.

The team's 11-6-1 record was the best since head coach Michael Farrand took over the Wildcats team in 2000.

CWU has nine starters and 13 letter winners returning to the lineup.

The duo of Danielle Brandi (M, 5-4, Sr., Bellevue, WA) and Reilly Retz (M, 5-7, Jr., Kent, WA) combined for seven game-winning goals last year. Brandi garnered first team GNAC honors with nine goals and had three games recording at least four points. Retz earned honorable mention GNAC with three goals and two assists in 18 games started.

Joining Retz on the honorable mention team was Hadli Farrand (F, 5-7, Sr., Ellensburg, WA) who contributed one goal and two assists in 17 games played.

A big reason the Wildcats were able to finish the way they did was because of Kayla Lipston (GK, 5-11, Sr., Federal Way, WA). Lipston, who earned second team GNAC honors, completed five shutouts and allowed 12 goals in her 14 games played. She ranks second in school history with 1.11 goals allowed per game and is fifth on Central Washington's all-time saves list with 184 stops.

#### Outlook
