Conference Championship Looms In Final 2 Weeks

A CINCH TO CLINCH: With three wins this week, Western Washington pushed its win streak to 12 matches and clinched its berth in the GNAC Championships. The Vikings are undefeated in conference play with a 9-0-0 record. The final three spots remain open for the taking.

BATTLE FOR FOURTH: Simon Fraser hosts the GNAC Championships starting on Nov. 5 in Burnaby, B.C. The Clan are tied for fourth with Montana State Billings with 13 points, looking to solidify their spot in the championship with four matches remaining.

HOLDING THE FORT: Concordia and Seattle Pacific hold down the two and three spots in the standings with 19 and 16 points respectively. Concordia is on a two-match winning streak after defeating Simon Fraser and Western Oregon last week. Seattle Pacific has been ranked in the NSCAA Top-25 this season.

STILL IN THE HUNT: Central Washington, Western Oregon and Northwest Nazarene are each within two wins of fourth place. However, with two weekends remaining on the conference schedule, time is short for these teams to make their move.

GNAC News & Notes

CENTRAL WASHINGTON:

- The Wildcats battled with No.2-ranked Western Washington for the second week in a row, falling 1-0 in another tight contest between the in-state rivals.
- Central Washington rebounded with a 2-1 win overtime win at Northwest Nazarene. **Alexis Manning** tied the match in the 81 first minute and **Mackenzie Nolte** scored the game-winner just 34 seconds into overtime.
- **Whitney Lowe** leads the team with four goals and is tied with Nolte for the team lead in points (10). Nolte is second in the GNAC in assists (6).
- The Wildcats are third in the GNAC in points (61) and tied for fourth in goals (20). They are also second in the conference in saves (74). Goalkeeper **Amanda White** is second in saves per game (5.56).
- Central Washington host two home matches this week. They welcome Seattle Pacific on Thursday and Simon Fraser on Saturday. The Wildcats are 3-5-0 in conference with nine points. They are in sixth place, with both opponents in the top-four.

CONCORDIA:

- The Cavaliers pitched two shutouts last week, defeating Simon Fraser and Western Oregon each by the score of 2-0. With the wins, Concordia moved up to second place in the conference standings with 19 points.
- Goalkeeper **Olivia Brock** made 10 combined saves in the shutouts. She is second in the conference in goals against average (0.45) and first in save percentage (.909). She is also tied for the conference lead in shutouts (7).
- **Amanda Klep** was the GNAC Offensive Player of the Week with both game-winning goals, her first two goals of the season. The team's nine game-winning goals have arrived from eight different players.
- Freshman **Sydney Van Steenberge** has taken over the team lead in goals with four scores this season. **Shannon McMahon** is tied with Van Steenberge for the team lead in points (9).
- The Concordia defense has posted eight shutouts in 13 matches this season.
- The Cavaliers host fifth place Montana State Billings on Thursday and visit Western Oregon on Saturday. They look to hold onto their spot in the GNAC Championship, beginning Nov. 5.

MONTANA STATE BILLINGS:

- The Yellowjackets split their two matches last week, losing to Seattle Pacific 1-0 on Thursday before defeating Saint Martin's 2-0 on Saturday.
- Against the Saints, the Yellowjackets got two early goals from **Alycia Wright** and **Bailey Griglio** to lead them to victory.
- **Jessica Spang** leads the team with five goals and 15 points. She is also tied for second in the GNAC in points, fourth in assists (5) and tied for sixth in goals. Wright is also tied with Spang with five goals.

- Goalkeeper **Chloe Hopps** is fourth in the conference in goals against average (0.96).
- The Yellowjackets are tied for fourth place with Simon Fraser in the conference standings with 13 points. The top four teams make the GNAC Championships on Nov. 4.
- Montana State Billings will play one home and one road match this week. They are at Concordia on Thursday and host Western Oregon on Saturday.

NORTHWEST NAZARENE:

- The Crusaders fell in their lone match of the week 2-1 against Central Washington in overtime. It was their second straight loss.
- Northwest Nazarene led 1-0 through the first 80 minutes, but allowed a late goal to Central Washington before eventually falling in overtime, allowing a quick goal in 34 seconds into the extra period.
- With seven points, the Crusaders are tied for seventh in the conference. They are just six points back of fourth place, but will need to string wins together with the season past the halfway point.
- **Nicole Nsa** leads the team in goals (6) and points (14). She is tied for second in the conference in goals.
- Goalkeeper **Daniele Ortiz** has been tested this season, leading the GNAC in saves (90) by 40. She made 10 more saves against Central Washington.
- The Crusaders will play one home and one road match. They travel to Western Oregon on Thursday and host Concordia on Saturday.

SAINT MARTIN'S:

- The Saints fell in three matches, being shut out 2-0 by both Western Oregon on Thursday and Montana State Billings on Saturday.
- The Saints almost came away with the upset of the season, playing their best match of the year on Tuesday, hosting No.2-ranked Western Washington.
- Saint Martin's led early in the match, scoring two goals in the first six minutes to take a 2-0 lead, which they held through the first half. Western Washington responded in the second half, scoring three unanswered goals to down the Saints.
- **Abby McFaul** leads the team with 11 points. After scoring her fourth goal against WWU, she took over the team lead for goals. Teammate **Kelli Bannerman** is second with 3 goals.
- Due to injury, the Saints have used three different goalkeepers this season. **Chelsie Still** has stepped in as the starting goalkeeper, starting the last three matches. She made 10 saves against Western Washington.
- The Saints look for their first conference win this week, traveling to Seattle Pacific on Saturday for their lone match.

SEATTLE PACIFIC:

- The Falcons split their week against two tough GNAC opponents. They began with a 1-0 win over Montana State Billings, but fell 3-1 to No. 2-ranked Western Washington on Saturday.
- Sophomore forward **Mickayla Mury** had a four-game assist streak stopped Saturday at Western Washington. She set up the game-winning goal in three straight contests prior to the setback in Bellingham
- **Hannah Huesers** amassed seven goals during the last five games. She leads the GNAC in points (24) and goals (11).
- Huesers took over the No. 4 spot among all-time SPU scorers on Saturday with her 32nd career goal. She passed **Jocelyn Charette**, who compiled 31 goals between 2007-09.
- **Laura Moore** scored the game-winner against MSUB. Four of her five goals have been game-winners this season.
- The Falcons dropped out the NSCAA Top-25, but are still receiving votes. They are ranked fourth in the West Region.
- With 16 points in third place, the Falcons are in good position to make the GNAC Championships on Nov. 5. They will be at Central Washington on Thursday and at home hosting Saint Martin's on Saturday.

SIMON FRASER:

- The Clan played one match last week, falling to Concordia 2-0 in Portland.
- Simon Fraser is tied for fourth place with Montana State Billings with 13 points. The top-four teams make the GNAC Championships on Nov. 5. The Clan are hosting the event.
- **Christina Dickson** is second in the conference in goals (6) and points (15). She has scored almost half of the Clan's 14 goals this season.
- **Priya Sandhu** is fourth in the GNAC in saves (48) and save percentage (.800).
- Simon Fraser will be on the road this week for both matches. They will be at Western Washington on Thursday and at Central Washington on Saturday.

WESTERN OREGON:

- The Wolves split their matches last week, defeating Saint Martin's 2-0 on Thursday and falling to Concordia 2-0 on Saturday.
- Western Oregon is tied for seventh in the conference with seven points. With two weeks remaining on the schedule, the Wolves will need to stack wins in order to make the conference championship.
- **Vicky Cruz Rosales** and **Machaela Rapozo** scored the two goals for the Wolves against Saint Martin's. Goalkeeper **Nicole Tejada** made 10 saves to earn the shutout.
- Rosales leads the team in points (12) and goals (5). The Wolves have been missing other leading scorer **Makana Pundyke** (five goals, 11 points) due to injury.
- The Wolves host two home matches against Northwest Nazarene on Thursday and Montana State Billings on Saturday.

WESTERN WASHINGTON

- The Vikings continue to dominate the GNAC with an unblemished 9-0-0 record in conference. They have also won 12 straight matches.
- The Vikings defeated Central Washington 1-0 on Thursday and Seattle Pacific 3-1 on Saturday. They were then almost upset by Saint Martin's, needing a comeback to close out a 3-2 win.
- **Catherine Miles** leads the Vikings offensively this season. After Tuesday's match, she is second in the GNAC in points (18) and goals (7). She scored the game-winner against Saint Martin's.
- Goalkeeper **Ashley Haden** leads the GNAC in goals against average (0.32) and is second in save percentage (.902).
- The Vikings stayed put in the NSCAA Top-25 Rankings, holding their No. 2 spot. They are No. 1 in the West Region.
- With 27 points and three matches remaining for the Vikings, the team has already punched their ticket to the GNAC Championship on Nov. 5 in Burnaby, B.C.
- The Vikings play one more match this week, hosting Simon Fraser on Thursday.
