Bulldogs head to D-II West Alabama

Cumberland plays the first of two NCAA Division II and Gulf South Conference opponents this season with Thursday's contest at West Alabama. The Bulldogs and Tigers have never met on the gridiron and in fact, CU has played only one team from the state of Alabama since reviving the program in 1990 – Faulkner University.

Jernigan earns MSC, TSWA honors

Cumberland linebacker Nathan Jernigan was voted the Mid-South Conference as well as the Tennessee Sports Writers Association Defensive Player of the Week after posting 15 tackles in CU's 33-26 victory over No. 11 Georgetown College. The Eagleville, Tenn., native collected his seventh career double-figure tackle outing and sixth in the last 12 games overall. The red-shirt junior also registered 15 stops last year versus the University of the Cumberlands and tallied a career-best 16 tackles in last season's finale at Alderson Broaddus. Jernigan also recorded 1.5 sacks against Georgetown, with one late in the first half and another with Justus Dauscha in the fourth quarter. The Bulldog defense held Georgetown to 1-of-9 on third down in the second half and 0-for-2 on fourth down in the fourth quarter.

Snyder makes quite a debut as starter

Redshirt junior Justin Snyder was very impressive in his first career start for the Bulldogs in Saturday's win over Georgetown College. The

Jonesborough, Tenn., native completed 20-of-28 passes for 260 yards and three touchdowns, with five of those completions for 29 yards or more. Even more important, he did not throw an interception. Snyder took over at QB for departed seniors Broc Loveless and Reed Gurchiek. He played in a pair of games last season in relief – at Faulkner University and Bethel University – completing 6-of-13 passes for 58 yards and one interception and rushing four times for 12 yards. Snyder is learning his third offense since enrolling at CU in 2012, this one more of the Mike Leach Air Raid-variety under first-year offensive coordinator Klay Koester.

in Saturday's win over Georgetown College. Jernigan registered a game-high 15 tackles with 1.5 sacks. It marks the seventh double-figure tackle game of his career and sixth over the last two seasons. He also recorded 15 tackles in last year's season-opener against the University of the Cumberlands and netted a career-best 16 stops in last season finale at Alderson Broaddus. Dauscha collected nine tackles versus Georgetown along with two sacks and two quarterback hurries. It marks his fourth multi-sack outing over the last two years and he has 11.5 sacks in his last 12 games overall.

Green does a little of everything

Redshirt junior Michael Green accounted for three of Cumberland's five touchdowns in Saturday's win over Georgetown College. The Nashville, Tenn., native caught five passes for 93 yards and two scores, including 31- and 34-yard scoring catches in the first half. Then on the first play of the second half, Green took a reverse and tossed a 58-yard TD pass to Trevon Jones, giving CU its first lead of the game.

Byrd makes immediate impact

Despite missing some of preseason camp with an injury, Marshall University transfer Brandon Byrd made an immediate impact for the Bulldogs in Saturday's win over Georgetown College. The Riverview, Fla., native rushed seven times for 77 yards, including a 71-yard TD scamper in the fourth quarter that proved to be the winning points. He also caught three passes for 59 yards. Byrd spent the last two seasons at Marshall, redshirting in 2013 before seeing action in six games last season. He rushed 23 times for 94 yards, including a 19-yard TD run against Akron. He also fell on a blocked punt in the end zone versus Old Dominion. Byrd posted for 470 yards on 85 carries and caught 11 passes for 191 yards with 12 total touchdowns as a senior at East Bay High School. He posted 768 yards on the ground and six touchdowns as a junior, earning Honorable Mention All-Hillsborough County by the *Tampa Tribune*.

Stewart delivers in first start

Redshirt sophomore Tyler Stewart made his first appearance in a Cumberland uniform a memorable one in Saturday's season-opener against Georgetown College. The Baltimore, Md., native posted 11 tackles, including seven solo, with many of those in the first half. Stewart also took control of the defensive backfield with

the absence of redshirt junior Tyler Burr, who missed Saturday's game with an ankle injury. Stewart transferred to Cumberland after spending the last two years at Carson-Newman. He appeared in five games last season for the Eagles, making four tackles, including two at Catawba and one each versus Wayne State and Brevard. He attended Knox Karns High School in Knoxville, Tenn., earning First Team All-District honors as a junior and senior and Second Team Prep XTra accolades from the *Knoxville News-Sentinel* as a senior.

Offensive line brings more experience

After starting at least three freshman in every game and playing as many as five at one time last season, Cumberland's offensive line heads into the 2015 campaign with a good amount of experience. Sophomore Chandler Peebles started every game at center last season, as did senior Will Boler (though he moves from right tackle to left tackle, at least at the beginning of the season). Redshirt junior Chris Escamilla saw action at both guard spots, starting nine contests, while redshirt sophomore Zac Carter played in nine games with a pair of starts, also at guard. Sophomore Nick Bodden was last season's starter at left tackle, but the Hoover, Ala., native has missed all of fall camp with mono and his return to the field will be taken slowly.

EKU transfer Smith starts at tackle

Redshirt sophomore Jason Smith started at right tackle for the Bulldogs in Saturday's season-opener against Georgetown College after transferring from Eastern Kentucky University. The Paducah, Ky., native appeared in one game last season for the Colonels, versus Morehead State, after redshirting in 2013. Smith was a two-time Honorable Mention All-State selection by the *Louisville Courier-Journal* at Lone Oak High School in Paducah, playing on the offensive and defensive lines for the Purple Flash.

Green also dangerous kick returner

Redshirt junior Michael Green averaged 22.9 yards per kickoff return last season and his big-play ability setup short fields for the Bulldogs on several occasions. The Nashville, Tenn., native registered five returns of 32 yards or more, including 36 yards at the University of Pikeville, 38 versus Campbellsville University and a career-long 75-yard return at Union College. Green collected six returns of 37 yards or more in 2013, including 41 yards at Tennessee Tech, 46 versus Union College, 56 against Bluefield College and 65 versus Bethel University. He has 1,493 kickoff return yards over the last two seasons, averaging 25.7 yards per attempt.

Defensive scores are the norm for CU

Under head coach and defensive coordinator Donnie Suber, Cumberland has registered 27 defensive touchdowns in seven-plus seasons, which includes interceptions, fumble returns and blocked punts, as well as forced four safeties. The Bulldogs posted five touchdowns with a safety in 2014. Anthony Knight returned an interception 74 yards for a touchdown against the University of the Cumberlands and then had a 54-yard INT return for a score at the University of Pikeville. Kendall Trice forced a fumble on a sack and Donovan Norfleet picked up the loose ball and raced 35 yards for the score at Union College. Norfleet also picked up a fumble and covered 61 yards for a TD versus Campbellsville University and Rickey Dowdy registered a 70-yard interception return for a score in the season finale against Alderson Broaddus. The chart at the top of page three has a complete listing of all defensive scores under Suber.

Cross makes return to field

Redshirt junior Fredrel Cross made his first appearance on the field for the Bulldogs in Saturday's season-opener against Georgetown College since November 15, 2013, at Alderson Broaddus. The Bolivar, Tenn., native was shot in the leg during the summer of 2014, forcing him to miss all of last season. Cross was a versatile contributor to the team's success two years ago, making 32 tackles on defense in the first seven games before taking over at running back due to injuries in the last four outings. He rushed for 138 yards and one touchdown at Reinhardt University and 170 yards and two scores at Alderson Broaddus. Cross racked up 450 yards on just 67 attempts in the last four games of that season. He played on special teams against Georgetown but may see more action at cornerback this week at West Alabama due to an injury to Anthony Knight.

Defensive depth chart has experience

While the offensive side of the ball has several new faces, especially at the skill positions, many of the Cumberland defensive starters and some backups have seen extensive action over the last two seasons. Redshirt senior Cayman Russell has started 17 of 22 contests over the last two years, while redshirt junior Justus Dauscha has 22 games of experience while starting all 11 outings in 2014. Redshirt junior Nathan Jernigan has started 10-of-11 games in each of the last two campaigns and junior

Redshirt junior Tyler Burr started all 11 contests in 2014 and has played in 21 games with 16 starts, and redshirt senior Anthony Knight has seen action in 24 games with 16 starts over the last three years. Redshirt junior Anthony Leonard played in all 11 games in 2012 and 2014 as well.

Dauscha, Jernigan, Russell named Preseason All-Americans

Cumberland's Justus Dauscha and Nathan Jernigan were both First Team honorees and Cayman Russell earned Second Team honors on the USA College Football NAIA Division Pre-Season All-American teams released in June. Dauscha registered 69 tackles with 16 tackles for loss and 9.5 sacks last season, ranking eighth nationally in sacks and 19th in tackles for loss. The Murfreesboro, Tenn., native recorded three sacks versus the University of Pikeville and posted two sacks apiece against Belhaven University and Campbellsville University. Jernigan led the Bulldogs in tackles for the second straight year, finishing with 99 stops along with eight tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks. The Eagleville, Tenn., native also registered three pass breakups, three quarterback hurries, one forced fumble and one blocked punt. He tallied double-digit tackles in five contests, including 15 in the season opener against the University of the Cumberlands and 16 in the season finale versus Alderson Broaddus. Russell registered 76 tackles with 10.0 tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks, adding three blocked extra points, three quarterback hurries, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. The Hendersonville, Tenn., native recorded 10 stops at Pikeville and blocked two extra points at Union College, helping the Bulldogs win in overtime. He also had eight tackles at Bethel University and 10 stops versus Alderson Broaddus.

Bulldogs look to continue winning ways

Cumberland has compiled a 36-18 mark over the previous five seasons, the best five-year run in program history. The Bulldogs posted 8-3 records in 2010 and 2012 and a 7-3 mark in 2011, playing for the division championship in all three campaigns. The squad was 7-4 overall in 2013, winning seven of its final nine outings, but struggled down the stretch last season, dropping its last three games en route to a 6-5 mark. CU ranks second among the 18 football-playing schools in the state of Tennessee in

The football-playing schools in the state include Austin Peay, Carson-Newman, Chattanooga, Cumberland, Lane College, Rhodes College, Maryville College, Memphis, Middle Tennessee, Tennessee, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech, Tusculum College, University of the South, UT Martin and Vanderbilt. East Tennessee State is also restarting football this season after a 12-year absence.

Head Coach Donnie Suber



**Third Season as HC/
Eighth Season as
Defensive Coordinator/
Defensive Backs Coach**

Donnie Suber was named head coach at Cumberland University on January 28, 2013, the fifth head coach of the program since it was revived in 1990. He just finished his seventh season in his third stint at Cumberland, serving as the defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach. He has worked as an assistant coach at the collegiate level for the past 22 years, 11 of those at CU.

The Bulldogs continued their recent winning ways in Suber's first year at the helm of the program, posting four straight victories in the middle of the year and seven of the final nine outings to finish 7-4, the club's fourth consecutive winning season. Nathan Jernigan was voted Mid-South Conference West Division Freshman of the Year while four players earned First Team All-Mid-South West honors and five more garnered Second Team accolades.

Cumberland also led the Mid-South Conference with 28 Scholar-Athletes and ranked No. 1 in the nation for the second straight year with 16 Daktronics-NAIA Scholar-Athletes.

Last season the Bulldogs ended the year 6-5 overall, with five players garnering All-Mid-South Conference recognition, including defenders Grant Jones, Justus Dauscha and Nathan Jernigan.

Cumberland's defense has made significant improvements in Suber's six years at CU. The Bulldogs were ranked 47th or lower in every defensive statistical category in his first season as coordinator in 2008 but improved to 16th nationally in scoring defense along with eighth in pass defense, 21st in opponent first downs and 28th in total defense in 2009. Cumberland led the Mid-South Conference in almost every defensive cat-



egory in 2010 and ranked in the Top 10 nationally in scoring defense, total defense, rush defense, pass defense, sacks, third down conversions and opponent first downs.

The unit forced 32 turnovers in 2009 and 2011 and 29 in 2010, a big jump over the 19 opponent miscues in his first year back at CU. The squad racked up 52 interceptions during that span, including 18 in 2009, 15 in 2010 and 19 in 2011. The defense played a major role in the team's offensive production in 2011 as well, with the Bulldogs scoring 120 points (17 touchdowns, 1 field goal) off opponent miscues. Cumberland scored off an opponent turnover in 16 straight games from October 23, 2010, at Bethel University until September 22, 2012, at UVA-Wise. From 2008-11, Cumberland posted 95 total sacks, including 32 in 2010 and 24 in 2009.

Cumberland has scored 16 defensive touchdowns, forced five safeties and blocked two punts recovered for touchdowns during Suber's tenure. Thirty-three Bulldogs have earned All-Mid-South Conference defensive honors during Suber's seven seasons as well, including two National Defensive Players of the Week in 2010 and one in 2014.

Suber earned his bachelor's in Recreation and Hotel Management from Georgia Southern in 1990 and played on NCAA Division I-AA national championship teams as a defensive back in 1986, 1989 and 1990.

His first coaching position was at Cumberland University as the defensive backs coach and strength coach as a graduate assistant. Suber earned his master's from Cumberland in Organizational Behavior in 1993.

He returned to his alma mater in 1994 as the restricted earnings coach in charge of defensive backs before coming back to Cumberland for two years in 1995-96 as defensive backs coach and men's and women's golf coach. The Columbia, S.C., native then spent four seasons as the defensive coordinator, defensive backs coach and recruiting coordinator at Newberry College. In 2001 he held the same positions at Benedict College before serving as the linebackers coach in 2002 and then the receivers coach from 2003-06 at Presbyterian College.

Suber is married to the former Brandy Norris of Atlanta, Ga., and they have two boys, Bryce (18) and Quinn (14).
