PFL PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Offensive Player of the Week



Bryce Patterson, Morehead State | Freshman (RS), Quarterback, Versailles, Kentucky

Making his first career start, Patterson threw six touchdowns to lead Morehead State's 47-17 PFL victory against Davidson, Saturday. The six touchdown throws are tied for most in the FCS and are the most by a PFL quarterback this season. Patterson needed just 10 completions for his six touchdowns and passed for 240 yards. Each of his six touchdowns went for 25-plus yards, including three throws to wide receiver Ryan Upp.

OTHER NOTABLES

LUKE HANSEN, DAYTON (Freshman, Running Back, Indianapolis, Ind.) rushed for 111 yards and two touchdowns on 17 carries against Marist.

RYAN MANN, VALPARAISO (Sophomore, Running Back, Vernon Hills, Ill.) carried the ball 25 times for 121 yards and a touchdown against Stetson.

HOPE ADEBAYO, ST. THOMAS (Junior, Running Back, Inver Grove Heights, Minn.) rushed for the game-winning touchdown in overtime at San Diego, finishing the game with nine carries for 85 yards and two touchdowns.

MATT STIANCHE, MARIST (Junior (RS), Wide Receiver, Northampton, Pa.) had seven receptions for 105 yards and a touchdown against Dayton.

DORIAN BOYLAND, DRAKE (Junior, Running Back, Muskego, Wis.) finished with 21 carries for 77 yards and a touchdown against Presbyterian.

Defensive Player of the Week



Kaleb Lyons, Morehead State | Sophomore, Defensive Back, Antioch, Tennessee

Lyons picked off three passes, tying the PFL single-game record, to help Morehead State defeat Davidson 47-17 Saturday. His first two interceptions came deep in Davidson territory in the second quarter and helped set up Morehead State touchdowns in a 26-point quarter. Lyons nabbed his third interception in the fourth quarter just on the MSU side of the field and led to the Eagles' final touchdown. He also had four tackles, including a sack to force a Davidson punt in the second quarter.

OTHER NOTABLES

NATHAN ARTHUR, DAYTON (Senior, Linebacker, Cincinnati, Ohio) recorded 14 tackles (seven solo) with two tackles for loss, including a sack, as part of a defensive effort that held Marist to six points.

BRADLEY RUSS-MARTIN, PRESBYTERIAN (Junior, Defensive Back, Travelers Rest, S.C.) picked off a pass and blocked a field goal – both in the first half – and had three tackles as part of a defensive unit that held Drake without a touchdown for more than 50 minutes.

EVAN ANNIS, VALPARAISO (Senior (RS), Linebacker, Seattle, Wash.) had a key sack in overtime as part of a nine-tackle effort that included 3.0 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks against Stetson.

FINN CLAYPOOL, DRAKE (Sophomore (RS), Defensive Lineman, Des Moines, Iowa) had five tackles for loss, including three sacks, as part of an eight-tackle outing against Presbyterian.

Special Teams Player of the Week



Max Samuel, Valparaiso | Freshman, Linebacker, Edina, Minnesota

Samuel became the eighth FCS player to block two kicks in a game, helping Valparaiso claim a 23-20 overtime victory against Stetson Saturday. He blocked a punt in the first quarter that Valparaiso recovered in the end zone for its first touchdown. Samuel blocked another punt in the fourth quarter, which the Beacons recovered and returned 51 yards to set up a go-ahead touchdown.

OTHER NOTABLES

LOGAN FORCUM, DAYTON (Freshman (RS), Punter, Cincinnati, Ohio) averaged 43.7 yards on three punts with a career-best 53-yard punt and saw two downed inside the 20-yard line against Marist.

MAX SAMUEL, VALPARAISO (Freshman, Linebacker, Edina, Minn.) blocked two punts, both leading to quick Valparaiso touchdowns, becoming the eighth FCS player with two blocked kicks in a game this season.

SHANE DUNNING, DRAKE (Senior, Kicker/Punter, Muskego, Wis.) was responsible for 10 points against Presbyterian, making 3-for-4 field goals and an extra point. He also averaged 33.0 yards on five punts with one downed inside the 20-yard line.

THE TITLE AND THE AQ

Drake clinched a share of the 2023 PFL title last week with its 16-14 victory against Presbyterian and Davidson's loss at Morehead State. Drake can clinch the PFL Championship outright and claim the league's AQ spot in the FCS Playoffs with a win this weekend at Butler and would make its first postseason appearance since winning the 2004 PFL Championship Game against Morehead State. Davidson remains in the hunt for its fourth straight postseason appearance but must defeat Dayton and see Butler defeat Drake. St. Thomas would win a share of its second-straight PFL Championship with a win against Valparaiso and a Drake loss at Butler.

PREVIEWING WEEK 12

DRAKE AT BUTLER: In control of its destiny, Drake travels to Butler for the annual meeting of the Bulldogs. Drake has won the last seven meetings in the series but narrowly escaped with a win last season, 24-23, in Des Moines. Drake's defense has been up to the task throughout PFL play this season, allowing just 88 points (12.6 ppg). Sophomore defensive lineman Finn Claypool, the reigning Freshman Defensive Player of the Year, is pacing that defensive effort with 14.5 tackles for loss (2.07 per game) and 9.5 sacks (1.36 per game) in seven PFL games. Butler returns to action following its off week and seeks to build on a 482-yard offensive effort at Morehead State the week prior. Senior quarterback Bret Bushka threw for five touchdowns on 16-of-17 passing against the Eagles, while graduate running back Jyrn Mitchell posted his fourth straight 100-yard rushing performance.

BUCKNELL AT MARIST: Marist concludes its 2023 campaign with a nonconference tilt against Bucknell. The Red Foxes turned the ball over to Logan Brabham for his first career start against Dayton last week, and he completed 18 of his first 19 passes on the way to a 26-of-38, 259-yard passing performance. Bucknell makes the trip to Poughkeepsie after dropping an offensive shootout, 50-47 in overtime, to Georgetown last week. Marist dropped a 49-7 decision to the Hoyas to open the 2023 season.

SAN DIEGO AT STETSON: Two teams that dropped overtime decisions in Week 11 meet in a Week 12 meeting. Stetson returns home after falling to an overtime field goal at Valparaiso last week. Meanwhile, San Diego makes its fourth trip across the country after losing to a walk-off touchdown at home against St. Thomas. San Diego running back Isaiah Williams looks to join the 1,000-rushing club this season in North Carolina, entering the weekend needing 67 yards. He is 16th among FCS running backs with 933 yards - third among PFL backs. Meanwhile,

MOREHEAD STATE AT PRESBYTERIAN: After an impressive all-round effort to down Davidson in Week 11, Morehead State heads south to face the other half of the PFL's Carolina-base duo when it meets Presbyterian. The Eagles set a program record with six interceptions against the Wildcats last week, including defensive back Kaleb Lyons's PFL record-tying three-pick performance. Their third-straight multi-interception effort catapulted the MSU defense to No. 3 among FCS teams with 15 interceptions this season. Presbyterian quarterback Tyler Wesley looks to claim the lesser-known PFL quarterback rushing title this week. He enters the weekend second among PFL QBs with 439 rushing yards and trails Butler's Bret Bushka's 444 yards this season. Meanwhile, the Blue Hose defense has held four of their last five opponents to 23 points or less but is 1-3 when doing so.

VALPARAISO AT ST. THOMAS: St. Thomas puts a 31-game home winning streak on the line and seeks a share of its second-straight PFL title when it hosts a surging Valparaiso squad. The Tommies have responded to their Oct. 14 loss at Drake by winning three straight, with the defense leading that push, allowing only 34 points in those three wins after allowing 52 points to Drake. The Tommies offense has turned to its run game since an Oct. 14 injury to quarterback Tak Takeoka, amassing 756 yards and 10 touchdowns in the three wins. Valparaiso has wins against Dayton and Stetson to open the month, and a victory this week would give the Beacons their longest win streak since 2003. Valparaiso's defense proved the difference last week with two blocked kicks and nine pass breakups against the Hatters.

DAYTON AT DAVIDSON: Davidson will have the opportunity to watch the action unfold before taking the field for the PFL's regular-season finale against Dayton. The Wildcats look to rebound after an uncharacteristically turnover-prone game at Morehead State. Davidson entered last week ranked No. 1 in the FCS with only five turnovers lost but saw six passes intercepted by the Eagles. Running back Mari Adams enters the weekend seeking a 1,000-yard season, needing only 61 yards to reach the milestone. Dayton makes the trip to North Carolina seeking to end its season positively after picking up a win against Marist last weekend. Luke Hansen ran for two touchdowns and 111 yards against the Red Foxes; he has a rushing touchdown in each of the Flyers' previous three games.

FCS SELECTION SHOW, SUNDAY

The 2023 FCS championship selection show will air at 12:30 p.m. (ET) on Sunday, Nov. 19, live on ESPNU. The complete tournament field and official bracket will be posted at NCAA.com shortly after it is unveiled. Twenty-four teams will be selected for the championship, with 10 teams automatically qualifying by winning their conference title, and the remaining 14 spots will be picked at large. The championship begins Saturday, Nov. 25, at campus sites and concludes Sunday, Jan. 7, at Toyota Stadium in Frisco, Texas.

PFL AWARDS SEASON

The 31st Pioneer Football League awards will be announced starting with the league's Major Award Winners on Monday, Nov. 27. The following day, the 31st edition of the All-PFL teams will be presented. The league's awards schedule concludes with Wednesday's 2023 PFL Scholar-Athlete of the Year release and the 31st Academic All-PFL squads.

MITCHELL PASSES 1,000 YARD MARK

Butler running back Jyrn Mitchell became the first PFL running back to surpass 1,000 yards this season, finishing Week 9 with 1,088 rushing yards. With 1,213 rushing yards entering the final weekend, he is third in the FCS rushing race, five yards behind UT Martin's Sam Franklin. He leads the PFL rushing yard race by 274 yards, with Davidson's Mari Adams ranking second in the league with 939 rushing yards.

RUNNING BACK REVIVAL

Mitchell is one of four league running backs entering the final weekend ranked among the FCS Top 25 in rushing yards per game. Mitchell is ranked fourth in the FCS with 121.3 yards per game. San Diego's Isaiah Williams moved to 11th, averaging 103.7 yards per game, while Davidson's Mari Adams (93.9 ypg) and Mason Sheron (84.4 ypg) are ranked 19th and 21st, respectively.

TROUBLE UNDER CENTER

It's been a year of uncertainty at quarterback across the PFL this season, with the league's 11 members using 22 quarterbacks who have thrown for both 20 pass attempts and a touchdown during the season. Butler and Drake, who meet in a pivotal season-ending meeting, have had steady hands at quarterback, with Bret Bushka and Luke Bailey, respectively, leading the way for nearly the entire season. Meanwhile, Dayton and Valparaiso have used three quarterbacks to muster their way through the season.

FIELD GOAL RACE A FOUR-WAY BATTLE

The race for the league's top field goal kicker will enter the final weekend seeking a decisive answer. Drake's Shane Dunning used a three field-goal day against Presbyterian to join Presbyterian's Mack Mikko atop the field goal leaderboard with 15 made this season. Butler's Luka Zurak, who was off last week, sits third in the race with 14 field goals made. San Diego's Aidan Lehman sits fourth in the race with 10 made this season. All four rank among the FCS top 40 in field goals made per game, while Dunning (83.3 percent) and Zurak (82.4 percent) rank 11th and 13th nationally in field goal percentage.

WATCH THESE RETURN(ER)S

Marist's Tristan Shannon and Valparaiso's Jashon Butler are among the FCS kick-return corps leaders in 2023. Shannon is No. 4 in the nation with 624 combined kick return yards this season. Butler is No. 7 nationally at 615 combined kick return yards, all in kickoff returns, where he ranks No. 4 nationally with 30.8 yards per return.

YOU'RE IN GOOD HANDS WITH THESE PFL TEAMS

Butler, Davidson, Drake, and Morehead State enter their 11th game having lost just 11 turnovers this season. Davidson has lost just two fumbles this season (third in the FCS) and Morehead State has just three lost fumbles (sixth in the FCS).

TOP OF TAKEAWAYS

Marist, San Diego, and Stetson have each forced 20 or more turnovers in 2023. Marist leads the PFL and is eighth in the FCS with 21 turnovers forced, including 13 fumbles recovered which is tied with Drake for most in the FCS. San Diego and Stetson each have 20 turnovers gained, including 12 interceptions. Morehead State leads the PFL with 15 interceptions this season, third most among FCS teams.

FREE FOOTBALL ABOUND

PFL members have been involved in seven of the FCS' 34 overtime games in 2023. Week 11 saw two PFL outings take extra time with Valparaiso hitting a walk-off field goal to down Stetson while St. Thomas prevailed at San Diego courtesy a walk-off touchdown. Road teams are 5-2 in the PFL's overtime games this season, including Valparaiso's win last week. Stetson and Valparaiso are lone home teams to win an overtime game in the PFL this season.

UST'S TATEOKA, PC'S MIKKO NAMED TO JERRY RICE AWARD WATCH LIST

St. Thomas quarterback Tak Tateoka and Presbyterian kicker Mack Mikko were two of 22 FCS freshman student-athletes named to the Jerry Rice Award Watch List Wednesday. The Jerry Rice Award, presented by FedEx Ground, is presented to the national freshman of the year in the NCAA's Football Championship Subdivision. Tateoka is the first St. Thomas student-athlete named to one of the FCS STATS / FedEx Ground national watch lists since the Tommies joined Division I. Mikko was the lone special teams representative on the 22-freshman list.

THREE PFL STUDENT-ATHLETES AMONG RECORDING-BREAKING CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALISTS GROUP

The 2023 season marks the 31st year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Subdivision conference. The league will feature 11 teams – tied for most in league history – each playing an eight-game schedule to determine the league champion and recipient of the automatic bid to the 2023 NCAA FCS Championship. Three Pioneer Football League student-athletes were among a record 201 semifinalists for the 2023 William V. Campbell Trophy, announced Wednesday by the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame. Butler offensive lineman Bryan Bystol, Dayton wide receiver Derek Willits, and Marist linebacker/long snapper Justin Iaccio were among the group of 39 NCAA FCS student-athletes named to the semifinalist group. Celebrating its 34th year, the Campbell Trophy® recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation for his combined academic success, football performance, and exemplary leadership.

DEFENDING CHAMPION ST. THOMAS PICKED TO WIN PFL

St. Thomas, the defending Pioneer Football League champion, was the choice to win the league's 2023 title as selected in the league's Preseason Coaches' poll released Tuesday and voted upon by the league's head coaches.

St. Thomas received 98 of the maximum 100 points available, with coaches unable to vote for their teams. Davidson followed closely with 92 points – putting the Tommies and Wildcats as the league's clear frontrunners entering the 2023 season. Dayton and San Diego, perennial league favorites, were picked to finish third and fourth, respectively.

PFL SEES FOUR 2022 MAJOR AWARD WINNERS RETURN FOR 2023

Four of the PFL's five major award winners from 2022 return for the 2023 season, led by reigning PFL Offensive Player of the Year quarterback Bret Bushka of Butler. He is joined by Butler's punter and kicker Luka Zurak, who returns after claiming PFL Special Teams Player of the Year last season. Drake defensive lineman Finn Claypool also returns after earning Freshman Defensive Player of the Year recognition in 2022. Stetson quarterback Brady Meitz also returns after claiming Freshman Offensive Player of the Year honors.

WEALTH OF EXPERIENCE RETURNS ACROSS THE PFL

Eighty-six student-athletes recognized on the 2022 All-PFL Teams and honorable mention lists return for the 2023 season, including 12 returning First Team All-PFL selections and 15 returning Second Team All-PFL honorees.

GREG WALTER NAMED SECOND PFL COMMISSIONER

The Pioneer Football League's Presidents Council named Greg Walter the league's second commissioner, effective August 1. Walter, who served as the PFL's associate commissioner since 2013, brings two decades of collegiate athletics experience, including an extensive background in leadership roles within the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS), into his new role with the league. In addition, Patty Viverito will remain an advisor to the Pioneer Football League after serving as commissioner since the league's founding in 1993.

MARIST'S PARADY GETS 150TH FCS WIN

Marist head coach James Parady picked up his 150th FCS victory in the Red Foxes' Week 8 victory against Presbyterian. He becomes the 15th head coach since the NCAA created the FCS in 1978 to win 150 or more FCS games, including five active head coaches. FCS wins are only counted for head coaches when the NCAA lists their program as a Division I FCS program.

ST. THOMAS' CARUSO NOTCHES 150TH WIN IN SEASON OPENER

St. Thomas head coach Glenn Caruso secured his 150th career victory in the Tommies' season-opening victory against Black Hills State. Now he turns his attention to his 150th victory as St. Thomas head coach, entering this week with 144 wins in St. Paul.

DAYTON & SAN DIEGO HELMED BY NEW HEAD COACHES

San Diego and Dayton each made changes at head coach during the offseason, marking the second consecutive year two league members have made changes at the top of their programs. Dayton turns to Trevor Andrews, a former Flyer safety who has coached at the collegiate level for 25 years. Andrews returns to Dayton from Western Michigan, where he coached the Bronco linebackers for four seasons. Before that, he was at William & Mary for 18 years in various capacities. San Diego hired Brandon Moore from the Colorado School of Mines, where he took the Orediggers to their first-ever appearance in the NCAA Division II Championship Game. Moore was a linebacker at Oklahoma and a Sooners' 2001 National Championship team member. Moore then spent seven years in the NFL, including six with the San Francisco 49ers.

VALPARAISO'S MATTHES, BUTLER'S ZURAK ON PUNTER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

PFL punters Evan Matthes of Valparaiso and Luka Zurak of Butler were among 17 candidates named by The Augusta Sports Council to its 2023 FCS Punter of the Year Award Watch List. Zurak is the reigning PFL Special Teams Player of the Year after earning First Team All-PFL recognition as a punter and placekicker. He averaged 41.8 yards on 37 punts to lead the league while also booting a league-best 67-yard punt – one of his seven punts of 50-plus yards. Matthes, the Second Team All-PFL punter, averaged 41.4 yards on his 57 punts and had 10 punts of 50-plus yards, including a 67-yarder to match Zurak for longest punt of the 2022 season.

BUTLER'S BUSHKA LANDS ON PAYTON AWARD WATCH LIST

Butler quarterback Bret Bushka was one of 35 players named to the 2023 Walter Payton Award Preseason Watch List, presented by FedEx Ground. The 2022 Pioneer Football League Offensive Player of the Year threw for 2,377 yards and 20 touchdowns while leading Butler with 627 rushing yards and five rushing touchdowns. Bushka led the PFL in completion percentage (64%), passing efficiency, passing touchdowns, total offense, and yards per pass attempt. Butler also led all FCS teams in red zone offense with Bushka under center.

DRAKE'S CLAYPOOL NAMED TO BUCK BUCHANAN AWARD WATCH LIST

Drake sophomore linebacker Finn Claypool, the reigning Pioneer Football League Freshman Defensive Player of the Year, was one of 35 athletes named to the preseason watch list for the 2023 Buck Buchanan Award, presented by FedEx Ground and given annually to the National Defensive Player of the Year in Division I FCS college football. Claypool was a Preseason All-PFL selection this season after earning First Team All-PFL honors in 2022 as a freshman. Claypool finished third among PFL tacklers in both tackles for loss (14.5) and sacks (8.0) while also ranking among the FCS' top 25 in each category last season.

UST'S MCELROY NAMED TO PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SQUAD

St. Thomas wide receiver Andrew McElroy was named to the 2023 Stats Perform FCS Preseason All-America Team, presented by FedEx Ground. McElroy garnered Third Team Preseason All-America honors as an all-purpose back after a breakout sophomore season in 2022, where he earned First Team All-PFL honors. In 11 games, he accumulated 1,162 all-purpose yards between receptions and kick returns, including 717 receiving yards with seven touchdowns.

PFL TRIO NOMINATED TO AFCA ALLSTATE GOOD WORKS TEAM

Davidson's Malik McDaniel, Marist's Kolbe Benham, and St. Thomas' Will Burke were among the 136 student-athletes named to the 2023 Allstate American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Good Works Team.® Established in 1992, the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team is one of college football's most coveted community service awards. From the 135 nominees, the final roster of 23 award recipients will bring together 11 FBS players, 11 FCS players, Divisions II, III, and the NAIA, and one honorary head coach. To be considered for a spot on the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team, each player must be actively involved with a charitable organization or service group while maintaining strong academic standing.

42 PFL STUDENT-ATHLETES NAMED TO 2023 NFF HAMPSHIRE HONOR SOCIETY

In April, the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF) announced the 2023 NFF Hampshire Honor Society members, with 42 Pioneer Football League student-athletes among the 1,762 qualified for membership. Dayton and St. Thomas each had 14 student-athletes recognized, with Valparaiso (8), Marist (2), Morehead State (2), Davidson (1), and Stetson (1) also seeing student-athletes recognized in the list. Members of the NFF Hampshire Society must be a senior or graduate college football player from all divisions of the NCAA, NAIA, and Spring Football who maintained a cumulative 3.2 GPA or better during their college careers.

PFL TIEBREAKER PROCEDURE

The Pioneer Football League uses the following tiebreaker system to determine its automatic qualifier (AQ) for the Division I Football Championship. In no instance is this tiebreaker used to break a tie for the league championship, all teams tied for first place at the end of the regular season will share the title and be designated co-champions.

WHEN TWO TEAMS ARE TIED

1. If there is a two-team tie in conference play and the two tied teams played each other, the winner of the head-to-head competition shall be declared the automatic qualifier (AQ).
2. If the tied teams did not play each other, then each team's record against all common opponents in the league shall be used to break the tie and declare the AQ.
3. If the teams are still tied, then each team's record against the next highest common opponent in the league standings shall be used to break the tie and declare the AQ. [Clarification: The record comparison against common opponents shall continue in descending order until the tie is broken.]
4. If common teams played are tied in the standings, they will be regarded as a unit when determining records against. [Example: If A/B/C are tied for first and next highest common opponents, D & E are tied, combined records against D & E will be used.]
5. If the teams are still tied, then the PFL "Strength of Victory" (combined record of PFL teams defeated) shall be used to break the tie and declare the AQ;
6. If the teams are still tied, then the PFL "Strength of Schedule" (combined record of PFL teams played) shall be used to break the tie and declare the AQ;
7. If the teams are still tied, a coin toss shall be used as the final tiebreaker.

WHEN THREE OR MORE TEAMS ARE TIED:

NOTE: If at any point a tie is broken using the multiple-team tiebreaker procedures and only two teams remain tied, the remaining teams shall revert to the two-team tiebreaker procedures.

1. If the tied teams all played one another, the team with the best cumulative record involving games with the tied teams shall be declared the AQ. For example, if a team is 2-0 against two other tied teams, that team shall be declared champion.
2. If the tied teams did not play each other, but one team played and defeated all the other teams involved in the tie, that team is the AQ.
3. If the tied teams all played one another and have identical records against the other tied teams, then each team's record against all common opponents in the league shall be used to determine the AQ. If teams are still tied, then each team's record against the next highest common opponent in the league standings shall be used to determine the AQ.
4. If the tied teams did not play each other, then each team's record against all common league opponents shall be used to determine the champion. If teams are still tied and did not play each other, then each team's record against the next highest common opponent in the league standings shall be used to determine the AQ.
5. If the teams are still tied, then the PFL "Strength of Victory" (combined record of PFL teams defeated) shall be used to break the tie and declare the AQ;
6. If the teams are still tied, then the PFL "Strength of Schedule" (combined record of PFL teams played) shall be used to break the tie and declare the AQ;
7. If the teams are still tied, the AQ shall be drawn by lot as the final tiebreaker.
